Marshall Ann is subject to a Supervision Requirement Section 70 Children (Scotland) Act 1995.

Since being in placement contact between Marshall Ann and her parents and family has been an issue. At the last review it was agreed that contact should be increased with a view to Marshall Ann returning home.

In terms of placement Marshall Ann appears to be more settled and happy.

I am still of the opinion that Marshall Ann 'blames' herself for all the upset in her family and work needs to continue to boost her self-esteem.

The Residential Report will address this above headings.

RECORD OF DISCUSSION:

CARE PLAN AT PREVIOUS REVIEW

Marshall Ann to return home within 3 months, and to remain with Mr and Mrs Bottomly whilst this plan is carried out. Marshall Ann to remain at Dalbeattie High School and transfer to Langholm Academy on her return home. Her legal status continues to be Section 70 Children (Scotland) Act. Contact between Marshall Ann and her family to be build up in anticipation of her return home.

DECISION OF LAST REVIEW

Marshall Ann to return home within 3 months

This plan has become unrealistic. There have been difficulties in the relationship between Marshall Ann and her father whilst Marshall Ann has been at home. It was originally anticipated that contact would be weekly, at weekends, with a view to building up to Marshall Ann's ultimate return home. Contact has, in fact, happened on a fortnightly basis with difficulties experienced.

Teresa Kerr to undertake work with Marshall Ann and Family

Work with the family has continued. Teresa's view of Marshall Ann is that she is currently under a great deal of pressure to do with some of the difficulties that are currently happening at home. She at times feels frustrated and does not cope well with this. Both Marshall Ann and her father agreed with this.

The main thrust of Teresa's work will be to help Marshall Ann cope with the family situation and with the emotional upset that it can cause. This work is individually with Marshall Ann, and also in the family home.

Marshall Ann to be Looked After by Mr and Mrs Bottomly whilst Care Plan is carried out

Marshall Ann's placement is going very well. She experiences normal teenage squabbles with other young people within the placement, but nothing out of the ordinary. Marshall Ann's health is good. She sleeps well and has a healthy appetite.

Orthodontist appointment to be made.

RECORD OF DISCUSSION (Continued)

UPDATE INFORMATION

Mr Brown from Dalbeattie High attended the meeting and gave information about Marshall Ann's progress at school. Marshall Ann has settled in well and has had a positive attitude to her school work. She has been involved in the social activities including the school show and singing at school assembly. Her work experience has gone well.

Academically, some of the course have proven not to quite match up for example, her history curriculum has involved some repetition. Marshall Ann has recently sat her Prelim exams and is performing at around foundation / general but predominantly general. She will sit her Standard Grades around April / May and the school is positive about her prospects.

Marshall Ann fits in well with her peers. One point of note, is that Marshall Ann can "talk herself down" and underrate her performance at school. This could be to do with a general lack of self confidence. Mr Brown wished to highlight the need to be mindful that 5th year orientation will start around the beginning of June. This is important if Marshall Ann intends to complete a 5th year following her transfer to Langholm Academy.

CARE PLAN DISCUSSION

The meeting agreed that the current Care Plan that Marshall Ann would return to her family by the end of January was not realistic. However, it was agreed that the long term plan - Marshall Ann returning to her family - still applied.

The meeting acknowledged the need to allow Marshall Ann to concentrate on sitting her Standard Grades in April / May. Therefore, any change in placement (and subsequent change in school) needed to happen either immediately or following her exams. It was agreed that it would be more beneficial for any movement to happen after exams were completed. This effectively means that Marshall Ann would remain with Mr and Mrs Bottomly until June.

The meeting also discussed options around contact. Two options were :

1. Contact is increased over the next 5 - 6 months with a view to building up towards going home
2. Contact remained at the current level of once a fortnight for a weekend.

Again it was felt that, in the interests of stability, that contact should be maintained fortnightly with no increase at the moment.

REVIEW CARE PLAN

Marshall Ann to return to her family in 6 months time. In the meantime, she is to be looked after by Mr and Mrs Bottomly and continue to attend Dalbeattie High School in order to sit her exams. Legal status remains Section 70 Children (Scotland) Act. Contact will happen fortnightly, over night at the weekend.

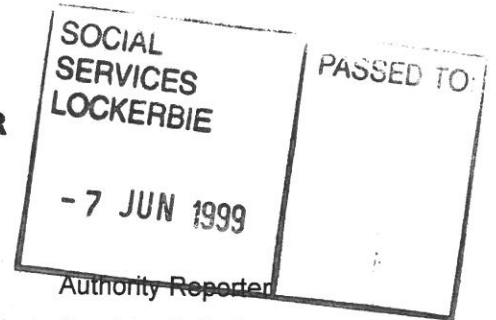

1. **Family History & Home Circumstances**

Social Services first became involved with Marshall-Ann in January 1997 when Mrs Douglas contacted the duty system stating that the family were having difficulty coping with Marshall-Ann.

The family home is a four bedroomed property in Langholm, it is furnished to a high standard. The family have lived there for approximately 12 years.

2. **Information from other Agencies**

Dalbeattie High School.

Marshall-Ann has settled well in her new school and is currently taking her exams.

Marshall-Ann feels she enjoys school and has made friends there (also see school report).

Marshall-Ann is not involved with any other agency at this point.

3. **Pen Picture of Child/Young Person**

Marshall-Ann is a healthy young person who is the oldest of five children. Since moving to Dalbeattie Marshall-Ann has become more confident and secure in herself which is very positive.

It has always been acknowledged that Marshall-Ann has low self-esteem and is still often quick to put herself down. Marshall-Ann acknowledges that she at times has an 'attitude problem' and although she looks mature for her years she can often struggle to cope with situations in a mature way. I believe that recent months have been very unsettling for Marshall-Ann and she has struggled with the issues in her family (

At times Marshall-Ann has expressed frustration at not being part of her family and it has been recognised that contact time at Langholm can still be problematic.

However, on a more positive note Marshall-Ann tells me that she is happy in her placement and wishes to remain there for the time being.

Marshall-Ann has stated that she wishes to remain in her current placement for the time being, she is keen to increased family contact time but recognises this is still a difficult area.

Update Information

No major issues surrounding Marshall-Ann's placement with Mr and Mrs Bottomly. Marshall-Ann was upset at not receiving a letter from her mother. She was also angry whilst on the phone to father.

Contact has been mixed, but has not increased as anticipated. This is due to some reported difficulties when Marshall-Ann is at home. She is aggressive and cheeky to her siblings and fights constantly with Shelley.

Educationally, Marshall-Ann's doing well. She sat her prelims, six in all. Marshall-Ann has had a Career's interview where future options were discussed. She is considering applying for College for a Beauty Therapy Course.

Although the overall plan remains for Marshall-Ann to return home, no substantial progress is being made. Events at home have been unpredictable to the point where planning for Marshall-Ann has been very difficult. However, longer term decisions need to be made.

Care Plan

Marshall-Ann will be Looked After by Mr and Mrs Bottomly. An early Review will be arranged for June in the hope that Marshall-Ann's family situation has stabilised and longer term plans can be made.

RECORD OF DISCUSSION:

Update

Marshall Ann remains looked after by Mr and Mrs Bottomly. Contact has not increased since last review on 21 April 1999.

In placement, Marshall Ann has had a mixed experience. Overall, she is settling, and making friends locally in Dalbeattie. However, she has had unsettled periods and, on one occasion, had threatened to hit Kim. This issue was discussed and resolved.

Kim feels that Marshall Ann's wider family situation is doubtlessly having an impact on her, both in placement and at school. Kim believes that the uncertain and confusing aspects of the relationship between her parents affects Marshall Ann. She deals with her parents problems. Kim and Teresa are trying to work with this.

The quality of contact is variable. It still happens fortnightly and is of mixed benefit.

Mr and Mrs Douglas were present at the meeting. [REDACTED]

David Charnock noted that, in his discussions with Kim, Marshall Ann changed around contact time from a happy and chatty young person to one more troubled.

Marshall Ann has recently completed her standard grades, and intends to stay on at school for a 5th year. Results are awaited.

The meeting discussed options for the future. There was a general agreement that the previous care plan - for Marshall Ann to return to her father - was not progressing. The uncertainty around her parents situation was understandably having an effect on the inability of the care plan and Marshall Ann herself.

It was felt that Marshall Ann needs would be best met by ensuring a stable environment for her whilst she finished schooling, and in some respects to protect her from the difficulties by her parents.

Social Worker's Report:

Since being in this placement there have been no major health concerns as regards Marshall-Ann, however, it would be appropriate to offer Marshall-Ann the opportunity (as a young person who is 'looked after') to have a medical with Dr Irving if she wishes.

Marshall-Ann continues to attend Dalbeattie High School and is fairly happy and settled and attends regularly. Marshall-Ann hopes to stay on at school and perhaps move onto a further education course - it has been recognised that if Marshall-Ann increases her home study her grades could be increased.

Since the last Review there have been significant changes within Marshall-Ann's family, [redacted]

[redacted] Contact with her father has not always been as regular as Marshall-Ann would have liked and has also been an issue for her at times.

I have spoken with Marshall-Ann and her carers at length as regards family and contacts and this is obviously an area which has, at times, been very 'fraught' and confusing for Marshall-Ann.

Mrs Douglas returned to this country last month and Marshall-Ann has spent some time with her, [redacted]

[redacted] Marshall-Ann loves both her parents but is effected by these family matters for example, both parents have asked Marshall-Ann to spend Christmas with them and this is causing real 'stress' for Marshall-Ann who does not want to let either parent down - at the point of writing Marshall-Ann is opting to stay with her carers for the Christmas period. There is also the issue of Marshall-Ann having contact with her sisters and brother - I feel this is very important for all the children and have organised a worker to co-ordinate a session for all the children to spend time together - it is hoped that both parents will support this.

Socially Marshall-Ann has lots of friends and has a very active social life. Marshall-Ann remains subject to Statutory Supervision Section 70 Children Scotland Act. Next Children's Hearing due May 2000.

In terms of behaviour, I would suggest that Marshall-Ann has settled down considerably and is more able to reflect on her behaviour, however, carers have voiced concerns that emotionally Marshall-Ann is affected by changes within her family and I feel it is important for her parents to recognise that she is upset and unsettled, and at times feels very isolated from other family members.

Update.

Marshall-Ann has now been in placement with the Bottomly family for 18 months.

Review of the last 6 months from Marshall-Ann.

Feels the placement is going well though there have been the occasional argument.

Social work view.

Teresa stated that the placement appeared to be stable and Marshall-Ann presented as relaxed while living with the Bottomly family. The placement has given Marshall-Ann a real sense of stability and she has developed a wide circle of friends around her, who she has very regular contact with, and is involved in the local community.

Marshall-Ann has had to deal with a lot of change in her life especially over the last 18 months and this has had an effect on her. The changes in her family, (separation, emigration and return), and the competing demands of trying to please her acrimoniously separated parents; has left Marshall-Ann in the middle of a confused and hostile situation. At times Marshall-Ann has to deal with the issues her parents have with one another, rather than her parents feelings towards her.

RECORD OF DISCUSSION (Continued)

[REDACTED]

In trying to keep the family together through contact and support to both parents Marshall-Ann gets pulled into the middle of the arguments and Teresa recognises that this has a very detrimental effect on her behaviour and emotional well being.

Carers view.

They experience no more difficulties with Marshall-Ann than they would expect from any other teenager. In the 18 months there has only been one "blow out" between Marshall-Ann and, Kim and Jonathan.

Kim and Jonathon agree with Teresa that Marshall-Ann is caught in the middle of two warring factions and that this seriously affects her mood, leaving her often feeling very down. They see that the only problems they have with Marshall-Ann, and that Marshall-Ann has herself, are a direct consequence of the upset from her parents that she has to manage.

Contact.

At the last review it was agreed that contact would be encouraged between Marshall-Ann and her dad. This has not been successful and Marshall-Ann has only been to stay with her dad and sibling three or four times. The gaps between the contact have increased.

Time spent with mum and Marshall-Ann's siblings has been complicated by Mrs Douglas' decision to move to Turkey. Since she returned there has been little direct contact.

Contact has become an increasingly difficult issue as her parents expect Marshall-Ann to side with them against the other parent, in their ongoing disputes. Marshall-Ann is continually pulled between the two

[REDACTED]

This problem is made worse by the parents' failure to keep to the agreements.

Marshall-Ann stated that she would like to have time with her mother on her own, but would also like more contact with her siblings.

Jonathon and Kim explained that Marshall-Ann at times feels she is being pulled in lots of different directions. This is apparently due to the competing demands of her parents; her wish to see more of her siblings; and wanting to join in the local community activities with the friends she has made while in the placement. However, Marshall-Ann then feels guilty for wanting to put her own needs first in wanting to spend some weekends with her friends. All this pressure has a negative effect on Marshall-Ann's emotional health.

Christmas.

Both parents have asked Marshall-Ann to stay with them for Christmas and Marshall-Ann feels that in trying to make a choice she is going to upset the other parent she does not stay with. The whole experience is ruining the idea of Christmas for Marshall-Ann, as she feels unable to keep both sides happy.

Marshall-Ann would like to see her siblings on Christmas day but feels that she would upset her dad.

RECORD OF DISCUSSION (Continued)

Marshall-Ann has discussed this with Kim and Jonathon and arrived at a plan that she hopes will keep both mum and dad happy and at the same time is what she would like.

Conclusion.

Everyone agreed that the current situation regarding contact is not acceptable. Neither parent is able to look after Marshall-Ann but their actions continue to jeopardise her emotional well being and indirectly the stability of the placement. Marshall-Ann is drawn into the middle of her parent's disputes and placed in the intolerable situation of trying to keep them both happy

For example, whom Marshall-Ann chooses to stay with at Christmas, could be interpreted as an attempt to demonstrate to the other parent who Marshall-Ann prefers.

It was agreed that a meeting between the parents and social services needed to take place to make sure this stopped. If not then as Marshall-Ann is on a Supervision Order, it may be necessary to return to the Children's Panel to seek conditions on contact.

In the interim it was agreed that Marshall-Ann should direct her parent's requests for contact to her foster carers, who are happy to act as gatekeepers to take some of the pressure off Marshall-Ann. This should then give Marshall-Ann the opportunity to make plans as to how she can get the best out of contact with her parents without appearing to have to choose between them. This would also allow some space for Marshall-Ann to spend time with her friends.

Health.

A medical with Dr Irving will be arranged for the next review.

Education.

See attached text of a verbal report from MR Brown, Marshall-Ann's guidance teacher at Dalbeattie High School.

Marshall-Ann wants to remain in full-time education beyond this academic year and depending on her course work and results will either enter the 6th year at Dalbeattie High or look to undertaking a course at college in either in hair and beauty or child care related subject.

Next review

To take place in 3 months time in the placement. The reason for the timescale is to review the progress made with the issues of contact. Due to the negative impact on Marshall-Ann's well-being, if at the review there has been no improvement then the review will consider the need to use the Children's Panel to seek conditions on contact.

There has been no change of placement.

There have been no significant changes in terms of anybody entering or leaving the family unit. However there has been a decision made by Marshallanne's foster carers to finish foster caring after Marshallanne and her foster sibling have moved on at the end of the year.

Marshallanne has a very typical relationship with her foster carers in that she looks upon them as most adolescents look upon adults who are appropriately restricting the adolescent's behaviour. However, on further investigation, when speaking to Marshallanne, she has stated that she really appreciates everything that Kim and Jonathan have done for her and although she is frustrated, with her curfew time for example, she does understand the underlying reasons for it.

Marshallanne is an extremely sociable young woman who enjoys hanging out with her friends. She also goes ice skating and plays hockey at school. At the moment Marshallanne is trying to retrieve her National Insurance number in order to be able to start a part-time job.

At present there are no concerns about this young person's physical safety.

This placement has been appropriate for Marshallanne. It has provided her with a lot of stability especially in the light of her parents difficult relationship and difficulties within family life in general. However, Marshallanne will be moving on from this placement to go to college and intends staying in Halls of Residence. Myself as her Social Worker am investigating how to put together a care package to achieve this.

Marshallanne's health appears to be very good.

Please look at the School Report for further details however, Marshallanne has coped well with her progress in school especially with some obstacles faced in attending college. Marshallanne has worked these out very well and very ably by herself with a little input and support from myself and her foster carers.

- iii) What sense does the child / young person have of his / her identity, e.g. concerning gender, disability, sexuality, religion, culture, ethnicity, language, self-worth, knowledge and understanding of own and family circumstances ? What is being done to support the child / young person to achieve a positive sense of identity ?

Marshallanne has a strong sense of her own identity especially considering that Marshallanne's mother is a travelling person and Marshallanne herself considers herself to be a travelling person.

Marshallanne feels that she does not need Social Work to be involved in supporting her in terms of her own identity and culture as she has a good grasp of this herself.

- iv) With whom is contact taking place ? Is it taking place as often as planned ? What effect is it having on the child / young person ? What contribution do the parent(s) or people with parental responsibilities make to the child / young person's day-to-day care ?

Contact is taking place with mother. It is probably not taking place as often would be appropriate. She does not have contact with her father and while Marshallanne states that this does not bother her and she is quite comfortable with the situation.

Marshallanne appears to relate well with the members of her family. She is the oldest sibling and is now taking on the protective role of giving unwanted advice to some of her younger siblings.

Marshallanne presents herself very well socially. This is one of Marshallanne's major strengths and she can create a very positive impression on other people. At times however she does behave slightly immaturely but this is also pretty typical of someone her age.

vii) Describe the child / young person's behaviour. How is s/he developing emotionally ? Have there been any changes? If so, give details and possible reasons why you think they happened.

See above box. Marshallanne is obviously still struggling with the situation between her mother and father as would anybody in the same situation. Marshallanne does seem to be learning to deal with this appropriately and finds herself people to talk with about the situation.

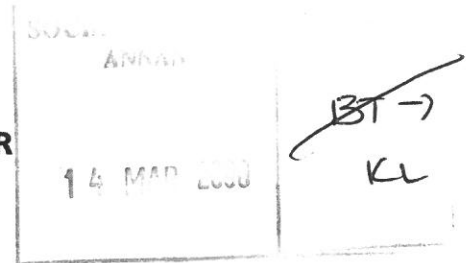
