

**Health:**

Andrew suffers from Asthma but has been fine over the last few months.

**Contact:**

Andrew's contact with his mother was going well but following the incident on Thursday night, his mother has told Ms Adams he doesn't want to see him again.

**Andrew and Carol Downie joined the meeting at this point.**

**Andrew:**

Andrew advised that the weekend did not go well. He doesn't want to be in Woodside. Mrs Downie advised that Woodside is full now with Andrew and another two residents. Over the weekend he has caused no management problems, coming in on time and behaving reasonably with staff. He had an unsettled night last night and was not too well this morning so decided he could not go to work. Staff are prepared to take him to work later if he feels better.

So far as the incident with Nacha's car is concerned, Andrew stated that his mother put the idea into his head on Thursday and he thought he was helping her out.

Andrew visited his mother yesterday and in addition Woodside staff helped her out when Michelle sliced her thumb on a tin. Mrs Murray could not get a doctor to call or obtain a lift into Perth. Woodside staff got someone to pick Michelle up and take her into hospital and Andrew accompanied them back to Stanley.

Mrs Downie advised that Mrs Murray stated she would not be at the Hearing on 29 August as she could not get anyone to look after Michelle.

**FUTURE PLANNING:**

Nacha advised that Andrew is still welcome to visit the placement but he must telephone first. Andrew is still friendly with the other boy in placement and his girlfriend lives just down the road.


A Children's Hearing has been scheduled for 29 August 1996. Ms Adams intends requesting a continuation for four weeks during which time Network meetings will be held to discuss options for Andrew's future, including one immediately after this Movement in Care Meeting. An In Care Review will be scheduled prior to the reconvened Hearing.

**TASKS & DECISIONS:**

- 1 Andrew will remain in Woodside Crescent RU meantime.
- 2 A Children's Hearing is due to take place on 29 August and it is Ms Adams' intention to request a 4 week continuation.

- 3 During the continuation period a series of Network meetings will be held, the first of which is immediately following this meeting. These meeting will discuss viable options for Andrew's future.
- 4 An In Care Review will take place at 9am on Monday 16 September 1996 at Colonsay Resource Centre to discuss plans for Andrew's future.

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## ADDENDUM TO HEARING REPORT FOR

**ANDREW MURRAY, DoB 19.09.80, c/o 36 Woodside Crescent, Perth**

### Current Situation

Following an incident on Thursday, 22nd August, Mr O'Mairthini has said that he is no longer in a position to care for Andrew. He has, therefore, returned to Woodside Crescent.

At a Movement in Care Meeting on 26th August, Andrew stated that he is unhappy about being back at Woodside Crescent and has clearly stated that he does not wish to continue to live there. However, there is no alternative accommodation available for Andrew either in residential units or in Mainstay. Given Andrew's age, a referral has been made to the Independent Living Team so that they can meet with Andrew and discuss the options available to him through independent living.

Given the recent change in the plans for Andrew's care, a further In-Care Review has been arranged for 16th September 1996 to allow us time to explore the options available to Andrew and formulate an alternative care plan.

I would, therefore, recommend that the Hearing be continued for a period of four weeks to allow us to formulate an alternative care plan and make a clear recommendation regarding Andrew's future care.

Further to my report of 22nd August 1996, I am writing to update you following the breakdown of Andrew's Mainstay Placement with Nacha [redacted]. Although the return to live with Nacha had been well planned and prepared for and the re-introductions had gone very well, Andrew was involved in an incident on Thursday 22nd August which has resulted in his placement being irretrievable.

A network meeting has already taken place on the 26 August 1996 to look at the future options for Andrew, however it has not been possible to make a decision as yet. Another meeting has been planned for 2 September 1996 to follow this up and begin to identify what support Andrew needs. I am therefore recommending that the Hearing is continued in order to allow time for a clearer plan for the future to be established.

Meeting arranged at short notice to look at future options following the breakdown of Andrew's Mainstay Placement.

Andrew unhappy about being at Woodside and wanted to know what the options are. Rosie said main options were to remain at Woodside or Independent Living. Andrew making a clear statement that he is not ready for Independent Living. Rosie suggested supported lodgings is also an option - Andrew unsure - said would need to know more about it.

Andrew stated again he did not want to remain and Woodside and suggested Mainstay. Heather let Andrew know that there was no placement available and it would not be a future option for him. Andrew then suggesting that the only place would be mum's. It was suggested to Andrew that this would be unlikely to last given that things have not yet progressed to overnights.

A general discussion was raised about whether or not Andrew still required to be on supervision - Rosie explained briefly to Andrew what the differences would be. Discussed the possibility of Andrew staying at Woodside while he does the 12 week training for Independent Living. Carol said this may be possible even though it is not an ideal arrangement.

Andrew clearly unhappy about the breakdown of his placement and felt that he did not deserve any support. Andrew was told that while his behaviour had been unacceptable, there was still support for him and that Nacha had also made a commitment to future contact. Andrew said he would like to see an I.L. worker to find out more.

Andrew encouraged to use support to discuss any problems he has at work.

Tasks

- Rosie to arrange for Andrew to see an I.L. worker and also make a referral to I.L.
- Rosie to invite Andrew's mum to the next network meeting to discuss whether Andrew staying with her is an option.
- Andrew to think through options before the next meeting.

Next meeting 9 a.m. on 2 September 1996 at NCH providing Andrew has been able to speak to someone from I.L. before this.

The purpose of the meeting was to look at future options following the continuation of the Children's Hearing. Panel members were unsure about Andrew staying at Woodside meantime. Andrew has re-inforced this concern by absconding on Saturday and taking the bus to Glasgow. Andrew Pennycook made clear Andrew should not be in Glasgow while he is on supervision.

Steve has had an opportunity to see Andrew regarding Independent Living. Andrew has decided he wants supported accomodation - Andrew is being realistic about not currently being able to care for himself. Steve said the main issue will be Andrew sticking to the 'flexible' rules. Andrew currently does some cooking and dishes and washing at Woodside. Steve emphasised the need for Andrew to take his time with I.L.

Re supervision - Steve suggesting it does not make sense for a Young Person on Independent Living to be on supervision .

Pros/Cons of Supervision

Until last week Independent Living not on the agenda for Andrew - no preparation for this as he may have been in Mainstay for a considerable time.

If on supervision - court will have to consult with Hearing system. If not, offences will be dealt with through the courts.

Steve suggesting I.L. will not protect Andrew from the legal system. Rosie said this was not the basis for choice as Andrew still a vulnerable Young Person. At present it couldn't be argued that Andrew doesn't need supervision but it could be argued he is not co-operating with it.

Independent Living offers support for Young People - they don't get told what to do. However if Andrew decides he does not require support, supervision provides a safety net and may prevent Andrew getting involved in other things.

Isla and Woodside to cover pros and cons of supervision with Andrew.

### 1. Future Plans

The purpose of the meeting was to follow up the previous network meeting and look at future options.

Jake said that Andrew was clearly recognising the benefits of staying at Woodside, particularly the level of support available from the staff. Andrew is also handling situations at Woodside better and chooses not to get involved in things. However this could also be Andrew 'opting out' and not addressing the issue with one of the other residents which he sees as the only difficulty if he remains at Woodside.

Steve and Isla agreed with the above from their contact with Andrew. Also that Andrew is feeling he needs to find out more about what is involved in Independent Living and feels he could do this while he remains at Woodside.

At this stage in the meeting Andrew agreed with what had been said and that he still felt that Woodside was the best option. Rosie also agreed and felt that if Andrew had decided on supported lodgings and then rejected the support available, he may have found it difficult to ask to support once off supervision. However Rosie also challenged Andrew about absconding at the week-end and reinforced it will be difficult to convince the Hearing that Woodside is the best option if this continues.

Discussed preparation for Independent Living. Andrew can be involved in a gradual process of beginning to go shopping, budgeting, cooking for himself and planning a menu while he remains at Woodside. Andrew also needs support to plan a balanced/nutritious diet. Steve and Andrew will plan a timetable for this. A locked cupboard should be made available for Andrew. Also staff at Woodside to help Andrew separate his washing and use the washing machine properly, however Andrew must do his own washing. Overall aim will be to maximise time at Woodside to prepare Andrew for Independent Living.

### 2. Work

Andrew has had a few problems at work - late yesterday morning and accidentally broke the tractor door. Andrew reminded he is on his last warning.

### 3. Access

Jake said that if Andrew absconds when he has access, he has been going to visit mum himself at other times without agreement. Agreed any access needs to be clearly agreed with staff at Woodside as well as with mum. Access was agreed for Sunday this week.

Access contd./

Andrew found this difficult as he feels he should be able to go to his mums or visit anyone else anytime he likes, including overnights. Rosie explained to Andrew that things can be more flexible given his age but while he remains on supervision there will still be some restrictions. This resulted in Andrew saying he was no longer sure about staying at Woodside. Rosie asked Andrew to let her know by Friday what his decision was. Also agreed Isla would follow this up with Andrew tonight.

4. Offender Services

Rosie will follow this up again. Jake said that Andrew is initiating more discussion with staff re his offences and checked out how this should be handled. Agreed it was fine for Andrew to want to discuss this but staff should be wary about giving personal opinion as it is better for Offender Services to pick this up.

Andrew also needs the advice of a solicitor - staff at Woodside to make sure Andrew arranges this.

#### Current Situation

A Network meeting was held immediately following the movement in care meeting on 26th August 1996. At this time Andrew was making a clear statement that he did not wish to remain in Woodside but did not feel he was ready to live on his own. He was informed by Heather Reid that a further Mainstay placement was not an option, as there were no carers available and, given Andrew's recent behaviour, it is unlikely that Rhod Napier would allow Andrew to be considered for a further Mainstay placement.

Following some discussion regarding the various options that may be available via the independent living route, without Andrew actually living alone, it was agreed that a referral should be made to the Independent Living Team to allow Andrew to fully explore these options with the independent living worker. It was also agreed that we would recommend a continuation to the forthcoming Hearing in order to allow us to discuss and formulate a new care plan for Andrew. This recommendation was upheld by the Panel.

At the Network meeting the following week, Andrew stated that he had made up his mind and he did wish to go into supported lodgings and wanted to be taken off supervision. However, there was some concern from professionals involved that Andrew could be very vulnerable under these circumstances, especially if he decided to tell the independent living worker that he did not want any further support from him, which Andrew is very likely to do as soon as they had any kind of disagreement on what was and wasn't acceptable behaviour.

It was, therefore, agreed that both Isla McDonald and staff from Woodside would spend time with Andrew discussing the pros and cons of both Woodside Crescent and remaining on Supervision and supported accommodation.

**Case Review - Children in Care - Andrew Murray. dob 19.09.80**

From this Andrew was able to identify that the only con for Woodside Crescent was the problems he was having with one of the other residents. He, therefore, came to the Network meeting on Wednesday, 11th September, and agreed that the best plan for his immediate future was for him to remain in Woodside on Supervision and while there, begin training for independent living.

Shortly before the end of the Network meeting, however, there was a discussion regarding Andrew's access, when he was told that this needed to be planned and staff needed to know that is where he was going. In response to this he said he needed to think a bit more about being on supervision as it meant too many restrictions because he wouldn't be able to stay out overnight if he wanted. Andrew was told that as long as this was planned and staff were happy with the arrangements then overnights would not automatically be ruled out. Andrew agreed that he would talk to staff about this and they would be in a position to let me know by Friday, 13th September 1996.

Carol Downie informed the author that Andrew is now saying he is unsure about whether he wants to be on supervision or not and would like others to make this decision for him. He is quite clear that he is not ready for independent living of any kind and is not even sure that he wants to begin his independent living training yet. He still remains unhappy about the other resident in Woodside. Staff will endeavour to give Andrew one to one time in order to give him some space from this young person.

It is, therefore, proposed that we will be recommending to the Children's Hearing that Andrew remains on a Section 44 (1) (b) at Woodside Crescent, continuing the condition that he has no contact with his Uncle Chris. We will also make them aware that Andrew is likely to have overnights with his mother and may have overnights with friends' parents, if negotiated beforehand and sanctioned by Jim McCarroll.

There has also been an indication from Andrew that he has been having some difficulties with his work over the last few weeks. He has had a discussion with his boss and it appears that they have resolved their differences but it seems Andrew needs the support of staff to continue to attend work regularly.

**Future Plans**

Andrew continues to reside in Woodside Crescent on a Section 44 (1)(b).

He continues to have regular and, where possible, pre-planned access with his mother.

We explore the possibility of Andrew beginning overnights with his mother (these must be pre-planned).

#### UPDATE.

Andrew returned to Woodside on the 23/8/96 following a breakdown in his mainstay placement.

Andrew's return to Woodside has been viewed by Andrew to be a step backwards. He is managing, for the most part, to work with the structure and expectations of the unit, and he maintains positive relationships with the staff team. Andrew's two main areas of difficulty include maintaining positive relationships with other residents in the unit and his absconding, which usually occurs around the weekend.

#### Work Experience.

Andrew continues with his placement on the skillseekers course, working on an Ostrich farm. Andrew enjoys the work at the farm and has good relationship with his supervisor. This placement is seen as a positive part of Andrew's life both by Andrew and staff at Woodside.

#### Family contact.

Supervised access with mum and siblings has not been happening as regularly as we would like due to Andrew's absconding at the weekends causing arrangements to fall through. Andrew has however been going to visit his mum in Stanley on his own.

#### Health.

Andrew is a healthy young man who likes to take a pride in his appearance. There have however been some concerns expressed over Andrews eating habits just lately and staff are trying to encourage him to eat a healthier diet.

### Conclusion.

Staff at Woodside have discussed with Andrew the various possibilities that are available to him. Andrew and staff feel it would be best for him to remain at Woodside where he has the support and guidance of the staff group if he requires it. Andrew has been informed that if he remains at Woodside it may be a good idea for him to prepare to do a bit more for himself in preparation for when he eventually moves to Independent Living.

#### Pen Picture

Andrew is a tall slim young man with short dark hair and glasses.

#### Social Work Involvement

In late March Andrew's behaviour became somewhat erratic and a cause for concern. This began with Andrew going out without his carer's permission and failing to return at his normal coming in times. However, this escalated in early April when he began absconding and offending. The offending in the main involved him stealing and driving cars and, on one occasion, was involved in a high speed car chase. He also broke into premises in order to obtain keys to these cars and stole from his carer.

Following the initial incidents of stealing and driving a car, the possibility of Andrew going to secure accommodation was explored. Although a place eventually became available, by that time Andrew's behaviour had improved somewhat and it was decided that although Andrew's behaviour was still inappropriate, it didn't quite warrant this department making the decision that secure accommodation was necessary. However, a Review Children's Hearing was requested and following the car chase, a secure bed was held for Andrew in case the Hearing decided he required it.

Due to the difficulties Andrew was presenting, support was given to Mr O'Mairthini by residential staff. This primarily was in the form of caring for Andrew when Mr O'Mairthini had other commitments. However, as Andrew's behaviour became more demanding, periods of respite were also included.

In early May his carer, reluctantly, indicated that he would not be in a position to care for Andrew after 15th June 1996. However, in a discussion with Andrew on Friday, 17th May, he did agree to give some thought to reconsidering his position depending on Andrew's behaviour.

At a meeting on 17th May it was agreed that there was not only a need to intensify the package of work being done with Andrew but also a need to isolate him in order to reduce the likelihood of him absconding. Andrew went with residential staff to an isolated farm cottage 2 miles from Alyth where he began working with residential staff and Isla McDonald on an assessment of his perception of his current situation and what he thought had led to the recent deterioration in his behaviour. From information obtained an intensive package of work was designed to help Andrew change his behaviour. Andrew co-operated well with this package and because of his initial co-operation the Children's Hearing agreed to continue his initial Review Hearing for four weeks to allow time for this package of work to be carried out.

Following the continued Hearing, a network meeting on 31st May agreed that Andrew should reside in Woodside Crescent residential establishment, with the proviso that should there be concerns regarding his behaviour and the staff's ability to retain him, then he would be taken away to another remote location, at short notice. However, this did not prove necessary.

A clear plan of how Andrew's time was to be spent was arranged including work with Isla McDonald, access with his mother and Mr O'Mairthini. It was agreed at this time that contracts should be drawn up in relation to Andrew's access with his mother and Mr O'Mairthini.

At the subsequent Hearing Andrew was placed at Woodside Crescent with the clear understanding that re-introductions to Mr O'Mairthini's care would resume as soon as he returned from his summer holiday.

**Suitability of Placement**

Although at the time of the last Review Andrew stated clearly that he wanted to remain with Mr O'Mairthini, his deteriorating behaviour meant it was necessary for there to be a temporary break in this arrangement.

Re-introductions to Mr O'Mairthini's care began the week beginning 1st July 1996. Andrew had two mid week evening visits which proved quite difficult for him. However, he had his first overnight access on Saturday, 13th and Sunday, 14th July, which were very successful. Following this Andrew had a number of pre-planned visits, both at weekends and mid-week for a two week period. This was reviewed on Thursday, 1st August, when both Andrew and Mr O'Mairthini agreed that things had

gone well and they did not require a further period of re-introduction. Arrangements were, therefore, made for Andrew to return to Mr O'Mairthini's on Friday, 2nd August, for an extended period of leave, until such time as this arrangement can be ratified by a Children's Hearing.

**Andrew's Behaviour**

From late March to mid May, Andrew's behaviour was extremely erratic and unpredictable. During this time he accumulated a large number of charges against him, the majority of which the Procurator Fiscal has retained and will be heard before the Courts. A number of different approaches were used to attempt to engage Andrew, sometimes this would appear to be in some way successful and then for no apparent reason Andrew would abscond or offend again. From his move to the cottage in Alyth in mid May, Andrew's behaviour and co-operation improved considerably. Although there were times when he was somewhat abusive to both staff and Isla McDonald, when he was not happy with their expectation of him. When he was challenged regarding this, he eventually agreed to co-operate.

Due to this positive change in Andrew's behaviour it was agreed in mid June that Andrew would be allowed some free time in the evenings and no longer required to be supervised by staff when outwith the unit. In the main Andrew responded well to this increased trust.

Following a careers interview Andrew began working at an Ostrich Farm just outside Methven on Monday, 10th June 1996. He has been very positive about this job and it is my view that this has made a significant difference to Andrew's attitude and behaviour.

At the Review on 1st August Andrew stated that he now wished to continue to live with Mr O'Mairthini beyond his sixteenth birthday. This decision is a major move forward for Andrew who has always previously stated that he could cope on his own and as soon as he was sixteen, he would no longer wish any involvement or support from this department.

**Health**

On 14th June 1996 Andrew went to P.R.I. complaining of pains in his neck. There were concerns that Andrew had Meningitis. He was, therefore, given a lumbar puncture and retained overnight. Tests results were all clear and Andrew was discharged on the Sunday, 15th June 1996. There have been no further concerns regarding this.

Attempts were made following the last Review to re-establish pre-planned access. However, initially Andrew refused to discuss access with his mother following her statement at the In-care Review that, given Andrew's behaviour and her own situation, she was not prepared to consider Andrew's return to her care. At Andrew's request a further meeting was arranged for 28th March when access times and days were arranged. When Andrew's behaviour deteriorated further in early April, his mother refused to see him. She did, however, maintain regular contact with his carer.

Following the Children's Hearing in late May access was again resumed. This initially took place at Woodside and then progressed to Andrew making visits to his mother's home in Stanley. At the commencement of this access, agreement was made between Andrew and his mother regarding topics which were not to be discussed i.e. Joey and Uncle Chris. The current situation is that Andrew should see his mother and sisters twice a week - once mid-week and once on a Sunday. This will now take place in Perth.

At the Hearing on 27th March 1996 there was a condition included in Andrew's Supervision Order that he has no contact with his Uncle Chris. Andrew did, however, have a number of contacts while he was absconding and it was in his Uncle Chris' car, with his Uncle Chris in the driver's seat that Andrew was involved in the high speed chase. The last known contact between Andrew and his Uncle Chris was 9th June 1996, when Andrew returned from Glasgow of his own accord.



Carol Downie informed the author that Andrew is now saying he is unsure about whether he wants to be on supervision or not and would like others to make this decision for him. He is quite clear that he is not ready for independent living of any kind and is not even sure that he wants to begin his independent living training yet. He still remains unhappy about the other resident in Woodside. Staff will endeavour to give Andrew one to one time in order to give him some space from this young person.

It is, therefore, proposed that we will be recommending to the Children's Hearing that Andrew remains on a Section 44 (1) (b) at Woodside Crescent, continuing the condition that he has no contact with his Uncle Chris. We will also make them aware that Andrew is likely to have overnights with his mother and may have overnights with friends' parents, if negotiated beforehand and sanctioned by Jim McCarroll.

There has also been an indication from Andrew that he has been having some difficulties with his work over the last few weeks. He has had a discussion with his boss and it appears that they have resolved their differences but it seems Andrew needs the support of staff to continue to attend work regularly.

**Future Plans**

Andrew continues to reside in Woodside Crescent on a Section 44 (1)(b).

He continues to have regular and, where possible, pre-planned access with his mother.

We explore the possibility of Andrew beginning overnights with his mother (these must be pre-planned).

#### Introductions:

Mrs Irvine made introductions and explained that today's meeting was a continuation of the Review held three weeks ago

The Social Worker and Residential Resource Worker submitted reports.

#### Current Situation:

Ms Adams explained that at the Movement in Care meeting in August, future plans for Andrew's placement had been unclear. His mainstay placement had broken down and he had returned to Woodside, which at the time Andrew had not been happy about. He had said that he would have preferred a Mainstay placement, but since none were available the decision was taken that he return to Woodside until the various options could be considered.

Independent Living was looked at but Andrew said that he was not ready to do this but agreed to have a talk with someone from the Independent Living Team. After speaking with Steve Waugh and consultation with staff from Woodside and NCH, it was agreed to discuss the pros and cons of both Woodside and remaining on Supervision and supported accommodation. From this it appeared that the only problem Andrew appeared to be having at Woodside was with one of the other residents and Andrew agreed that the best plan for his immediate future was for him to remain in Woodside on Supervision and while there, begin training for independent living.

Since that time there have been three Network Meeting and Andrew agreed that his placement at Woodside has worked out OK. He was unsure whether he wanted to be on a Supervision Order or not but said that he was not ready for Independent Living and is happy at present

with his Woodside placement. There had been a problem with another youngster at Woodside but Andrew said that things are resolved and everything is all right.

Ms Adams said that the recommendation to the Children's Hearing will be that Andrew remains at Woodside Crescent and that he still requires supervision. It will be recommended that this be under Section 44(1) (b), which would give a bit more leeway than 44(1) (a). One of the recommendations to the Children's Hearing will be that Andrew can start to have some overnight stays at his mum's. Recently there has been a problem with him disappearing to his Uncle Chris's in Glasgow at weekends and it was explained to him that any overnights he had with his mum or friends would require to be at weekends because of his job and that for this reason he should not be leaving Perth at the weekends.

At this point Isla McDonald joined the meeting.

**Andrew's Work with Skill Seekers:**

There have been a couple of problems at work but Andrew has had discussions with his boss and these have been resolved. The meeting felt that if Andrew was living on his own he might find it more difficult to keep his job as he may not be able to get himself up and ready in time in the mornings.

It was emphasised to Andrew that his job was an important part of his programme for the future. He will remain on Skill Seekers for 2 years and he was encouraged to keep working with Skill Seekers until he decides what he wants to do with his future.

Within the next week he will be starting a residential placement at a college in Lothian.

**Mrs Murray:**

Mrs Murray agreed that Andrew should stay in Woodside and that some overnight visits should start to happen. She said that these would need to happen at weekends. She said that things are fine just now and that the only problem she has is with Andrew going to Glasgow at the weekends to see Uncle Chris. This is not acceptable to her or Social Work Department.

Andrew said he gets bored at weekends and is not too happy when all the others are around at Woodside, so he goes off to Glasgow. Things have improved in that he has taken to staying away only 1 night whereas he used to be away 2 nights.

**Future Plans:**

It was agreed that Andrew required help to work out a structure for the weekends so that he is not so bored and having problems with the others at Woodside. As this would be the proposed time for him to have overnight visits, it would require him staying in Perth and not disappearing to Glasgow - Andrew agreed.

Mr Waugh said that Andrew is saying quite clearly that he is not ready for Independent Living, but wished supported accommodation. Mr Waugh is drawing up plans to help Andrew with his future and getting ready for the time when he feels able to go for Independent Living. He said that Andrew is a likeable young lad and as long as he stays in work there will be quite a lot of help available to him.

**NCH:**

Ms McDonald reported that since the Hearing she has met with Andrew and has been helping him to look at his present situation and she thinks he has made the best decision is agreeing that Woodside is the best placement for him.

**Health:**

It was noted that Andrew has recently started smoking. He is asthmatic and he was strongly advised that he should try to give smoking up as soon as possible. He agreed to think about this.

Ms Caldwell reported that Andrew does not eat proper meals, mainly rolls, sandwiches, chips or beans and sausages. She said that he checks out all the food at Woodside to make sure they do not contain 'E' ingredients and will not eat anything with 'E' in it.

Mr Waugh commented that once Andrew is in Independent Living he will be eating as he wishes so they will be giving him help and advice on the best kind of food to buy from his limited financial resources.

**Tasks and Decisions:**

1. Andrew is presently staying at Woodside Residential Unit and will remain there meantime.
2. Mr Waugh is supporting Andrew and working with him towards him eventually being able to move to Independent Living.
3. A new weekend structure for Andrew will be considered which may include overnight stays with his mother.
4. NCH Rural Youth Project will continue to work with Andrew on relationships.
5. Ms Adams will continue to see Andrew until the end of October,  Another Social Worker will require to be allocated to Andrew's case.
6. Workers at Woodside will continue to support and help train Andrew for moving to Independent Living.
7. A new date for a Children's Hearing will require to be arranged as Mrs Murray is not available for the original date.
8. An In Care Review will take place at 9.15 am on Wednesday 29 January 1997 at Colonsay Resource Centre.

### Reasons for Referral

Andrew was originally referred to the Project in February 1995 following a breakdown in family relationships, in particular Andrew's relationship with his mother's partner at that time, Joseph Waddell. This was coupled with increasing difficulties at school and in the community.

Andrew was again referred to the Project in February 1996 and April 1996. On the first occasion the reason for referral was to offer Andrew support to resolve some of the issues in relation to the breakdown of his Mainstay placement. On the second occasion, the reason for referral was in relation to Andrew's recent difficulties and offending behaviour.

### Programmes of Work

#### February 1995 - June 1995

At the time of the initial referral, Andrew's home situation was very unsettled and family relationships were extremely difficult. A joint Intensive Community Assessment was undertaken to ascertain Andrew's future needs. Alongside recommendations to support Andrew at school and in the community, the main outcome of this assessment was that if Andrew could not feel 'safe' at home with Joseph Waddell, a 'shared care' package through mainstay would provide security for Andrew at identified times when he felt most vulnerable and scared. Unfortunately Andrew was received into Care through a Place of Safety order before this could be established following an alleged assault on him by Joseph Waddell.

#### June 1995 - January 1996

The main focus of work during this period was to raise Andrew's self-esteem and begin addressing some of the difficulties in relation to school and peer group relationships.

Over the summer period this included Andrew being involved in a residential survival week to raise his self-esteem. This was then followed by involvement in the boys group to work on issues around peer group relationships and support the situation at school. Andrew found the peer group setting at that time difficult to manage and had to be withdrawn after attempting to establish his role in an inappropriate and aggressive manner.

The focus through individual work at that time was to assist Andrew to make links between his actions and the subsequent consequences in order for him to begin taking more responsibility for his behaviour.

Latterly individual work also focused on issues around Andrew's reception into care as this increasingly caused

Andrew a great deal of confusion and anger.

The conclusion from this work was that Andrew wished to remain with [redacted] (mainstay carers) and things became more settled. At that time it was agreed no further involvement with the project was necessary.

February 1996 - April 1996

Andrew was re-referred to the Project following the breakdown of his mainstay placement with the [redacted]. A short term programme of work was agreed which aimed to help Andrew resolve some of the feelings he had in relation to the breakdown of his placement so that he could move on. At this time Andrew was residing with Nacha O'Mairthini, (mainstay carer). I met with Andrew on three occasions to do this work before the start of a difficult period at the end of March/beginning of April when Andrew was involved in serious offending behaviour including the theft of project vehicles on two separate occasions.

In my opinion the significant changes in Andrew's behaviour can be linked to a statement made by Vanda Murray, Andrew's mother at an In-Care Review on 18 March 1996 when she stated she could not have Andrew back to live with her. Andrew had perhaps thought this was possible as Vanda had at that time separated from her partner, Joseph Waddell. Andrew indicated to me himself on 25 March prior to stealing a project vehicle the first time that he was upset and angry about not being able to live with his mother and felt like 'doing something' to get back at her. Andrew further stated he felt like 'running away' or 'stealing a car'.

April 1996 - May 1996

At the beginning of April a new programme of work was agreed to address the current areas of concern. I then met with Andrew on three occasions when the focus was on building up Andrew's self-esteem as a basis of a beginning to work on the other issues. Andrew was always willing to meet with me and be involved in this work, however things became disjointed when Andrew began absconding regularly. It was therefore agreed at a Network Meeting on 17 April 1996 that Andrew should be taken away and an intensive package of work put in place.

The outcome of the package of work was a clearer assessment of Andrew's perceptions about his earlier life history and experiences. This highlighted the need for Andrew to have a coherent story about his life and also the need to address issues of separation and loss relating to his mother and also the breakdown of his two mainstay placements. This helped make sense of the self-defeating behaviour which has forced the breakdown of Andrew's mainstay placements, ie. Andrew's

April 1996 - May 1996 cont

perceptions relating to the separation from his mother on two occasions has caused an inability to trust people and Andrew's subsequent belief that any care and love by adults will be followed by loss.

This work was coupled with ongoing work to raise Andrew's self-esteem and feeling of self-worth.

June 1996 - August 1996

During this time work was undertaken to follow up the assessment period and Andrew and I have addressed the issues of separation and loss and building a coherent story about his life. This was alongside work on Andrew's self-esteem. Andrew himself managed to find full-time employment during this time which was a significant achievement and greatly improved his feelings of self-worth.

As well as helping Andrew remember and understand what has happened to him in the past and assisting him with the formation of his identity, this work helped Andrew to some degree to resolve the issues of separation and loss. Andrew's perceptions of what happened on these occasions has changed considerably and he now acknowledges the way in which his own behaviour influenced the outcomes.

This, alongside the support from other agencies at this time helped Andrew move on and begin successful reintroductions to his Mainstay Carer, Nacha O'Mairthini. Although this return to mainstay was well planned and Andrew was well prepared, Andrew still had some unresolved feelings towards his mother. However it appeared Andrew had moved on significantly and would be able to build a trusting relationship with Nacha O'Mairthini.

Unfortunately, prior to the last Children's Hearing, Andrew was involved in an incident which resulted in the irretrievable breakdown of his mainstay placement.

September 1996

Following the continuation of the Hearing on 29th August 1996, Andrew and I have been involved in focusing on his future options. Initially this was looking at what the positive and negative factors would be for him of remaining at Woodside or going into Independent Living in the form of supported accomodation. Andrew clearly identified that there were a lot of benefits for him to remain at Woodside and that he was not ready for Independent Living at this stage.

However, it has also been relevant to help Andrew look at the implications of staying on supervision. Although Andrew wishes to continue living at Woodside, he has still found it difficult to accept the limits of this, such as having overnight visits with whom he chooses, particularly when he

turns 16.

I have also met with Andrew's mother, Vanda Murray who has written a letter for Andrew to add to his life story book. This seems to have helped Andrew further resolve his feelings about why he came into care and has enabled him to discuss some other issues with his mother. This relationship will continue to be very important for Andrew and further work in this area may be useful.

As yet the specific role of the Project in the future has not been agreed, however this will hopefully be agreed prior to the Hearing.

### Conclusions and Recommendations

Although recent plans for Andrew to return to Mainstay were unsuccessful, Andrew has still engaged reasonably well in looking at his future options. I believe Andrew has made the right decision to remain at Woodside and to begin looking at a programme which works towards independent living. This will offer Andrew the opportunity to gain the skills required for Independent Living while still receiving the necessary support. I am therefore recommending that Andrew remain at Woodside on a 44 (1) (b) supervision order.

### Background Information

For background information please refer to the Report prepared by Andrew's Social Worker, Rosie Adams.

Andrew came to live at Woodside Crescent on 29th May 1996. The focus of work at this time was to help Andrew return to his mainstay placement with Nacha O'Mairthini, to facilitate access with his mother. Andrew returned to his mainstay placement on 2nd August 1996, and seemed to be happy and settled until the placement broke down on 23rd August and he returned to Woodside.

### Focus of Work

#### Employment

Andrew was a Skillseekers work placement on an Ostrich Farm in Methven. He showed great enthusiasm for a commitment to his job, and he seemed to make a positive relationship with his employer. This seemed to boost his self-esteem and he was proud to be gainfully employed.

Since his return to Woodside however, he has been becoming gradually less motivated, and has been having problems with his employer.

At the time of writing Andrew has stated he will not go back to work. Staff at Woodside are actively trying to help Andrew to either return or arrange for another placement. Andrew has expressed an interest in an agricultural course at College.

#### Family Contact

Supervised access with his Mum and siblings has been infrequent of late due to Andrew regularly absconding at weekends, though Andrew occasionally goes through to Stanley on his own for brief visits. Andrew appears keen to see his mum and sisters, though sometimes has little to talk to mum about. He would like to have some overnights in the future and Woodside staff would have no major concerns. Ms Murray keeps in regular contact with the unit and visits are mainly pre-planned.

#### Health

Andrew suffers from Asthma and Excema but is an otherwise healthy young man who takes a pride in his appearance. He is a very fussy eater and staff are encouraging him to eat a more balanced diet.

Offences

To our knowledge Andrew has not been charged since returning to Woodside.

Absconsions

Andrew has been reported as an absconder on 5 occasions since his return to Woodside. On the first he was returned by the Police in the early hours, and on the others he has been missing on a Saturday night, overnight. Andrew says on most of these occasions he has been in Glasgow visiting his Uncle Chris. Staff continue to try and address this problem with Andrew and are clear that we think Andrew is vulnerable on these visits.

RECOMMENDATION

Andrew has been asked to give consideration to his future and has been made aware of his options.

He feels he is not presently ready for Independent Living, and residential staff agree with this. He agrees a return to his mum is unrealistic, and knows no alternative mainstay or residential placement is available. He has said he'd like to remain at Woodside, but is unsure about remaining on supervision, and dislikes one Woodside resident.

Residential staff feel we could help Andrew prepare for Independent Living, get back in employment or education, and help him work through the problems he has in relationships - with mum, with other residents and with employers.

We therefore feel it would be in his best interests to remain at Woodside Crescent under Section 44(1)(b) Social Work (Scotland) Act.

**Basis of Report**

The author has been Andrew's Social Worker since 29th November 1995 and has access to departmental records dated from December 1992.

**History of Case**

Andrew and his family moved from Glasgow to Perth in November 1992. At this time he and his two younger sisters were subject to a Section 44(1)(a) Home Supervision requirement. Andrew's supervision requirement was transferred to Perth on 8th January 1993 and supervised by Andrew Pennycook who at that time was a member of the Child Care team at Dunkeld Road, Perth.

Andrew and his family moved to Coupar Angus in August 1993 and the case was transferred to Alastair Park of the Blairgowrie team in December 1993.

Andrew remained on a Home Supervision Order due to problems in his relationship with his mother and step-father and problems with school non-attendance.

Andrew was received into the care of this department on 6th June 1995 on a Place of Safety following an assault by his step-father. At this time he was placed with [redacted] Mainstay carers in Glenalmond, where he remained until the placement broke down on 12th February 1996. On this date Andrew was moved to the care of Mr P O'Mairthini, 14 Ash Grove, Perth under Section 44(6).

This move was ratified by a Hearing on 27th March when Andrew's Supervision Order was varied accordingly. At this time Andrew was stating he was happy in his placement and wished to remain there although his behaviour did not always portray this wish.

In early March Andrew visited his Uncle Chris in Glasgow, for a planned day visit, which he failed to return from and Mr O'Mairthini eventually had to go through to Glasgow and collect Andrew. He also began missing school on a regular basis. His behaviour at this stage, however, was not the cause of undue concern.

As Andrew's reception into care was a direct result on an assault by his step-father the issue was raised regarding Andrew's return to his mother's care. [redacted]

Andrew's behaviour deteriorated dramatically in early April, when Mr O'Mairthini was on holiday and Andrew should have been residing in departmental accommodation at James Street. He not only absconded but also broke into the NCH project, stole their keys and subsequently stole two of their vehicles. This was the beginning of a very unsettled period for Andrew when he absconded regularly and was involved in a large number of alleged offences. As a result of this very difficult behaviour Mr O'Mairthini indicated that he could no longer continue to care for Andrew after 15th June 1996, although he later agreed that he would reconsider his decision should there be a marked improvement in Andrew's behaviour.

At the request of this department a Hearing was arranged to discuss this behaviour, when serious consideration was given by Panel Members to Andrew being placed in secure accommodation. However, as Andrew had been working well with staff and Isla McDonald on a specific package of work for the previous twelve days and had given assurances that he would continue to do so, the Hearing was continued for a period of four weeks to allow for this and give Andrew the opportunity to turn things around.

At a subsequent Hearing on 25th June Andrew was placed on a Section 44(1)(b) at Woodside Crescent. This was primarily meant to be a short term arrangement while a package of re-introductions to Mr O'Mairthini's care could take place.

These introductions began at the beginning of July following Mr O'Mairthini's return from holiday. This consisted of a number of pre-planned visits both at weekends and mid-week. By 1st August 1996 both Andrew and Mr O'Mairthini agreed that things had gone well and they did not require a further period of re-introductions. Andrew therefore returned to Mr O'Mairthini's care on an extended period of leave until this move could be ratified by a Children's Hearing. This Hearing was arranged for Thursday 29th August. However, on the evening of 22nd August Andrew was again involved in an alleged offence and Mr O'Mairthini made the decision that he could no longer continue to care for Andrew under these circumstances. Andrew, therefore, very reluctantly returned to reside at Woodside Crescent.

The Hearing on 29th was therefore continued to allow time for Andrew and this department to discuss and agree a plan for Andrew's future care.

Following a careers interview Andrew began working at an Ostrich Farm just outside Methven on Monday 10th June 1996. Primarily Andrew was very positive about this job and in my view made a significant difference to Andrew's attitude and behaviour.

Despite Andrew's employer being made aware of the incident on 22nd August he agreed to allow Andrew to continue working there although he made it clear he would not do so a second time.

### **Current Situation**

At a Network Meeting on 26th August 1996 Andrew was making a clear statement that he did not wish to remain in Woodside but did not feel he was ready to live on his own. He was informed by Heather Reid, Mainstay Worker, that a further Mainstay placement was not an option.

Following some discussion regarding the various options that may be available via the independent living route, without Andrew actually living alone, it was agreed that a referral should be made to the Independent Living Team to allow Andrew to fully explore these options with the Independent Living Worker.

At the Network meeting the following week, Andrew stated that he had made up his mind and he did wish to go into supported lodgings and wanted to be taken off supervision. However, there was some concern from professionals involved that Andrew could be very vulnerable under these circumstances, especially if he decided to tell the independent living worker that he did not want any further support from him, which Andrew is very likely to do as soon as they had any kind of disagreement on what was and wasn't acceptable behaviour.

It was, therefore agreed that both Isla McDonald and staff from Woodside would spend time with Andrew discussing the pros and cons of both Woodside Crescent and remaining on Supervision and supported accommodation.

From this Andrew was able to identify that the only con for Woodside Crescent was the problems he was having with one of the other residents. He, therefore, came to the Network Meeting on Wednesday, 11th September and agreed that the best plan for his immediate future was for him to remain in Woodside on Supervision and while there, begin training for independent living.

Shortly before the end of the Network Meeting, however there was a discussion regarding Andrew's access with Mrs Murray, when he was told this needed to be planned and staff needed to know where he was going. In response to this he said he needed to think a bit more about being on a supervision as it mean too many restrictions because he wouldn't be able to stay out overnight if he wanted. Andrew was told that as long as this was planned and staff were happy with the arrangements then overnights would not automatically be ruled out. Andrew agreed that he would talk to staff about this and they would be in a position to let the author know by Friday, 13th September 1996.

Carol Downie, Residential Resource Worker, informed the author that Andrew is now saying he is unsure about whether he wants to be on supervision or not and would like others to make this decision for him. He is quite clear that he is not ready for independent living of any kind and is not even sure that he wants to begin his independent living training yet. He still remains unhappy about the other resident in Woodside. Staff will endeavour to give Andrew one to one time in order to give him some space from this young person.

**Future Plans**

It was therefore agreed by the In Care Review that it was in Andrew's best interest for him to remain on a Section 44(1)(b) at Woodside, with the continued condition that he has no contact with his Uncle Chris. Andrew was made aware that we would also be informing the Panel that it is likely that Andrew will have overnights with his mother and possible friends' parents providing this is negotiated beforehand and sanctioned by the Officer in Charge of Woodside.

There has also recently been some indication from Andrew that he has been having some difficulties with his work over the last few weeks. Although he has initially indicated that he had been able to resolve these difficulties himself it has become apparent in the last few days that this is not the case, and Andrew has not in fact been to work this week. A meeting has been arranged for Friday 20th September between Andrew, his employer and Guidance Staff from the Agricultural College which placed Andrew, his keyworker from Woodside will accompany Andrew to this meeting.

**Conclusion and Recommendation**

Andrew has been the subject of a Home Supervision Order through the Reporter's Office in Perth since January 1993.

He was received into the care of this department on 6th June 1995 following an assault by his step-father. Andrew was initially placed with Mainstay carers in Glenalmond and when that broke down in February 1996 he was placed with Mr P O'Mairthini in Perth.

Andrew's behaviour deteriorated dramatically in April 1996 and as a result of this his placement with Mr O'Mairthini broke down and serious consideration was given to Andrew being sent to secure accommodation. However, with the support of Isla McDonald from NCH and Woodside staff Andrew was able to turn things around and was formally placed in Woodside by the Hearing held on 25th June 1996. This was primarily meant to be a short term arrangement while a package of re-introductions to Mr O'Mairthini's care took place.

This began at the beginning of July and by 1st August 1996, it was agreed that Andrew should return to Mr O'Mairthini's care, however following an alleged offence by Andrew on 22nd August Mr O'Mairthini made the decision that he could no longer care for Andrew. He therefore returned reluctantly to Woodside Crescent while options for his future care were explored.

It was immediately clear that a Mainstay placement was no longer an option. This left the possibility of Andrew either remaining in Woodside, which he was initially refusing to consider or independent living which he was saying he was not ready for.

Staff at Woodside, Isla McDonald from NCH and the independent living worker spent some time with Andrew discussing the pros and cons of both these options and whether Andrew still needed to remain on Supervision, given his age.

Andrew was eventually able to made the decision that at present the best option for him is to remain at Woodside. During this time the process of preparing Andrew for independent living will begin.

Andrew was undecided whether or not he should remain on Supervision and asked that others make this decision for him. Everyone involved in Andrew's care are of the view that he continues to be a very vulnerable young man who is not yet ready to be without the security offered by a Supervision Order.

I therefore recommend that Andrew's current Section 44(1)(b) be renewed with conditions 1 to 5 remaining the same and condition 6 being removed.

INCIDENT REPORT Saturday 19th October

Staff on duty Paula Gilbert, Irene Wilson.

Young Person Andrew Murray.

Andrew returned to the unit at approximately 6pm. Andrew was requesting an overnight with his mum as his gran is staying with her this weekend and he wanted to see her. Staff explained to Andrew that due to recent events, and the fact that Vanda Murray has told staff on more than one occasion this week that Andrew cannot go to the house, we could not give permission for this to happen. Andrew was not happy about this but accepted what we were saying.

Shortly afterwards, at approximately 6.30pm, Andrew was standing at the back door having a cigarette. Paula and another resident [redacted] were also there and Irene was in the kitchen. Andrew threatened to hit Paula on at least two occasions, threatened to damage Paula's car, threatened to roll Paula's car down the hill, and also threatened to roll Irene's car down the hill. He also began to make sexual comments directed at Irene.

At approximately 7pm Andrew was heard spraying deodorant in the hallway. Paula went to investigate and found that Andrew and [redacted] had gone out into the garden. Andrew was asked to calm down at this point as his behaviour was rather high and silly (the spraying of the deodorant, his giggling, running in from the back garden with something hidden up his jumper). Andrew at this point moved into the hall asking Paula to watch this. He proceeded to spray deoderant onto the office door and set light to it. Having done this he asked Paula if she would like him to do it to her. Paula moved to get into the office and eventually managed to shut the door as Andrew attempted to follow her. The police were called and they duly arrived and spoke to Andrew about his behaviour. As Irene had not witnessed Andrew playing with the deodorant and lighter, and had not heard Andrew's comment immediately afterwards there was nothing they could do.

Possibly use this access to look at work on I.L. If successful in these access visits there are possibilities of future planned overnights.

Made clear that Andrew must not visit home and that Police will be involved if he does.

**Woodside**

Staff evidencing a change in behaviour with Andrew, currently evidencing more aggressive and threatening behaviour both in unit and at home (Alleged assault on Kirsty), and several violent outbursts directed toward staff in unit. This was viewed as a more recent change in behaviour by residential staff.

Agreed that Andrew is jeopardising his current placement at Woodside if this behaviour continues.

Woodside staff have been instructed that any of Andrew's visits to Mum should be reported to Police. Under no circumstances is Andrew allowed to stay overnight unless worker future agreement allows.

**N.C.H.**

Isla informed group that there is likely to be no service offered to Andrew after the following four week period. Andrew will no longer meet the criteria for N.C.Hs involvement. Isla also informed that Andrew's continued damage and vandalism of their vehicles has had an impact on the service they have been able to offer other young people.



Andrew spoke specifically to Andrew, in presence of Vanda, about his responsibility towards remaining at Woodside.

Following a discussion between Andy + David on 14th December the following were agreed:-

(1) Times -

Andy to return to James Street by 11pm. Will have the option at that time of having half an hour to chat to staff about how his day has gone and unwind for bed. Andy will go to his room by 11.30.

Later times can be negotiated with staff for special events etc, in particular the unwinding time at weekend may be extended.

Andy will be wakened at 9-00 am on weekdays and at 10-00 am at weekends. This will change to suit the circumstances when Andy either finds employment or goes to College.

2. Unit Routine -

Staff and Andy will co-operate with the routine housework and tasks, rather than be allocated a chore. We feel that this will assist in the development of Life Skills and Andy's ability to recognise tasks requiring to be done.

3. Room -

Have agreed that Andy can have the pine bedroom furniture for his room and that Andy can pick a colour scheme for his room - with assistance. Staff and Andy will then re-decorate the room in accordance with his scheme.

Andy will keep the room reasonably clean and tidy throughout the week and will have a weekly clean and change bedding on a Sunday morning.

4. TV + Video -

Andy to have a portable TV in his own room and will self-regulate how much TV he watches there. Andy agrees to keep the volume at a level that will not disturb others and will not leave the TV on all night - due to the fire risk. Andy can also listen to music with the same conditions.

The video will remain in the sitting room and Andy will negotiate it's use and what will be viewed in the sitting room.

5. Eating + Shopping -

Andy and staff will shop together in order to provide an appropriate, balanced diet which Andy will enjoy eating. Staff and Andy will obtain information on healthy eating and incorporate it's guidance into the above.

6. Fridge in Room -

Andy to retain the fridge in his room. When shopping can choose a couple of items a week for snacks and a bottle of diluting juice for drinking at night as he requires. Andy agrees to keep the fridge clean.

7. Health + Hygiene -

Andy has agreed to shower daily in order to maintain good personal hygiene and to improve his self-image and esteem.

Andy will continue to self-administer his medications for asthma and eczema.

**8. Smoking -**

In accordance with policy James Street is a no-smoking unit. Andy agrees not to smoke in the unit and to take responsibility for this.

**9. Activities + Staff Time -**



In accordance with Section 232 of the Criminal Procedure (Scotland) Act 1995 I have to report that the above named has failed to observe the conditions of their Probation Order.

### GROUND OF BREACH

Mr Murray is in Breach of this Probation Order on two counts. On 27 October 2000 he was convicted at Glasgow Sheriff Summary Court and sentenced to 4 months plus 2 months consecutively in a Young Offenders Institution for an offence committed in July 2000 to which he had plead guilty.

He failed to attend set appointments at my office regarding his Probation plus Unpaid Work on 23 October 2000.

Mr Murray has also failed to comply with the condition of Unpaid Work from 23 September 2000 until incarcerated. He failed to notify me of his whereabouts or any change of address or keep me advised regarding his circumstances.

### CONCLUSION/RECOMMENDATION

Social Background and Community Service Reports had been ordered by Glasgow Sheriff Summary Court for Mr Murray's original sentence date on 1 September 2000. He failed to appear on that date due to sickness, producing a medical certificate and his case was deferred until 22 September 2000. Mr Murray then failed to attend and a Warrant to Apprehend him was granted.

On 27 October 2000 he appeared at Glasgow Sheriff Summary Court and was sentenced to



imprisonment as detailed.

I understand that an earlier Community Service Order of 200 hours imposed in 1999 and supervised by the writer before transfer by this Court to Glasgow's jurisdiction was Breached by colleagues in Glasgow.

At the time of writing Mr Murray is due to appear for sentence for Breach of Supervised Attendance Order intimated to this Court by my colleague [redacted] I am currently due to see Mr Murray to undertake Social Background and Community Service Reports for his appearance in connection with these matters on 4 January 2001. The writer had not been made aware that Mr Murray had been apprehended and incarcerated until his whereabouts became known to this Court, due to the Breach of Supervised Attendance Order being intimated.

Given the current circumstances I would recommend that the Court consider revocation of this Order and imposition of an alternative sentence. It appears clear that Mr Murray is not motivated to perhaps comply with Probation or Unpaid Work condition and indeed a Community Service Order given his previous Breach by Glasgow and lack of completion locally. In the interim I shall be interviewing Mr Murray and reassessing his motivation and attitude. An updated Social Background and Community Service Report will be available for Court on 4 January 2001 and with this regard I have indicated to the Sheriff's Clerk the above information beforehand to enable the possibility of dealing with any outstanding matters simultaneously if appropriate.

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Mr Murray was ordered to undertake 200 hours Community Service when he appeared at Perth Sheriff Court on 09.06.99; he had been convicted of an offence contravening Section 103(1)(B) of the Road Traffic Act 1988. The case was eventually transferred to Glasgow North district on 30.06.99 and interview was arranged for 05.07.99 when the conditions and penalties of the Order were explained in full.

An agency placement was arranged at the Fernan Street Hostel in Shettleston, Glasgow, a project catering for special needs adults and Mr Murray was instructed to attend each Monday and Thursday from 10.00 am - 3.00 pm. Attendance at first was consistent with acceptable supervisors reports and by 12.08.99 a total of 44 hours had been completed, although a Formal Warning had been issued for a failure to attend for interview on 09.08.99.

Due to a problem with accommodation arrangements which had necessitated Mr Murray living temporarily with relatives in overcrowded conditions it was agreed that the Order would be suspended for 2 weeks; contact was made with the Housing department, the D.S.S. and 'Who Cares Scotland' in an attempt to have this issue resolved.

Mr Murray was expected to return to placement on 26.08.99 but failed to do so and it was the following week before contact was made with the office, with Mr Murray explaining that he was residing short-term with a friend in the Tollcross area of Glasgow. As he had failed to return to Fernan Street as instructed the placement there was withdrawn and he was allocated an alternative place with the Painting and Decorating team, to re-start on 14.09.99.

He failed to attend however and when a further absence was recorded on 21.09.99 a Final Warning was issued and the possible consequences of further non-compliance was clearly explained. A meeting was arranged for 08.10.99 to discuss the situation and although Mr Murray failed to attend he 'phoned later that day to say that he had been detained in hospital and would not be released until the following day. This was accepted, although he was instructed to make contact with the office on 18.10.99. He failed to do so and further absences from placement were recorded on 26.10.99 and 02.11.99. Since then there has been no contact from Mr Murray and the decision has been taken to institute Breach proceedings in view of continued non-compliance with the conditions of the Order.

### NIL REPORT

I sent Mr Murray a letter of appointment arranging for me to interview him at his previously given Glasgow address, 1250 Shettleston Road, Glasgow at 11 am on 30 March 2001. Mr Murray failed to keep this appointment. He did not notify me in advance of any change of address or circumstances affecting that appointment which was sent well in advance (13 March 2001) and reiterated to him when I spoke to Mr Murray by telephone beforehand.

### CONTACTS

Due to Mr Murray being on a deferred sentence his Order could not be formally transferred to Glasgow. However, I agreed with the local office there that they should caretake Mr Murray's Order. [REDACTED] Senior Social Worker, at the Springfield Road Office in Glasgow attempted to engage Mr Murray as did the Community Service/Unpaid Work section unsuccessfully. Mr Murray is also being sought by the Supervised Attendance Officer, locally responsible, in respect of that Order.


Following telephone conversations with Mr Brown I was advised that Mr Murray had reported to them that he had changed address to 41 Aitken Street, Glasgow, G32 7NG. However, Mr Murray neglected to also inform myself or indeed leave a message in this office regarding this change timeously enough to affect my home visit to see and interview him.

Mr Murray had also reported, by leaving a message with this office, that he had pleurisy. He did not state whether he had been hospitalised nor indicate whether he would provide a medical certificate to sign him off as unfit to undertake unpaid work. Mr Brown, Senior Social Worker, Glasgow confirms that they had not had sight of any medical certificate nor have further details or information regarding any hospitalisation. It is possible that such information or evidence may be produced when Mr Murray appears at Court today.

Mr Brown and Community Service colleagues in Glasgow can confirm that Mr Murray has not undertaken any further hours of unpaid work and the balance of 43 hours 25 minutes remain.

## CONCLUSION

Unless Mr Murray contacts me before he is due to appear I shall be unable to provide the Court even with a verbal report through the Court Officer. In such circumstances I have no new or updated information upon which to base an assessment or change my views or opinion in reference to the conclusion of the first recommendation made in the final paragraph of his Breach Application notified to the Court. A previous Court Report compiled for his appearance on 4 January 2001 is lodged in current Court papers. That is the most up to date information available at the time of writing this Supplementary Report. Unfortunately I am unable to assist the Court without Mr Murray's co-operation.

### INTRODUCTION/BASIS

This report is based on contact with Mr Murray dating from June 1999. Mr Murray was then subject to a 200 hour Community Service Order which was transferred to Glasgow and then was breached at Glasgow and sentenced to 4 months plus 2 months imprisonment following failure to appear.

Mr Murray was interviewed at HM Prison, YOI Glenochil where he was overt and co-operative. An up to date Scottish Criminal Records Office check was available at the time of writing but not at the time of interviewing Mr Murray. Our records were also perused. A colleague [redacted] was supervising Mr Murray on a separate Probation Order with a Condition of Unpaid Work. I supervised Mr Murray's unpaid work until September and I then supervised his Probation Order including said condition of unpaid work. [redacted]

[redacted] Mr Murray's last contact with this office was approximately mid-September 2000. Pending conviction in Glasgow for a further offence and his failure to appear there meant that Breach of Probation for the commission of the further offence was delayed until sentenced when apprehended on a warrant. The catalyst in bringing these matters to Court, which I now clarify, was the intimation by my colleague [redacted] of his Breach of Supervised Attendance Order.

## PERSONAL/FAMILY HISTORY

Mr Andrew Murray was born in Glasgow growing up in the Easterhouse area. He never knew his father. He has two younger step-sisters who are the children of a long-standing relationship between a Mr Joseph Waddell and his mother. The family moved numerous times around Glasgow and following difficulties in the community, they were rehoused in Perth in 1990. They moved to Coupar Angus shortly afterwards then to Stanley in north Perthshire. In October 1997 they moved to St Andrews in Fife. In January 1998 the family returned to the Muirton area of Perth where they remained until moving to Manchester in April 1998.

Andrew Murray's mother had separated from Mr Waddell. She has a history of drug and alcohol abuse. In June 1995 her ex-partner was charged with physically assaulting Andrew Murray and his mother. Mr Murray was placed in Local Authority Care at the age of fourteen years as a result of this assault plus continuing family difficulties. In the first eight months Mr Murray resided with his foster carers but due to his difficult behaviour he was then placed in residential care under the auspices of local Social Work Services.

Mr Murray later appeared at a Children's Panel Hearing and was discharged from Local Authority Care on 6 February 1997. Friction between Mr Murray and his mother led to Mr Murray leaving Perth and he then moved to Glasgow to reside with relatives.

As Mr Murray's record will show, when he appeared at this Court in March 1998 regarding numerous Road Traffic offences, he was imprisoned and also made the subject of Probation. Following release from his first incarceration and due to difficulties with his residency in Glasgow plus continued friction with his mother, Mr Murray agreed to be placed in supported accommodation. The placement broke down in July 1997 and after a period spent with relatives in Glasgow Mr Murray returned to the family home.

Mr Murray then commenced an agricultural course at Elmwood College in Cupar, Fife in October 1997. He lived in privately rented accommodation there. Due to his non-attendance Mr Murray's place on this course was withdrawn. In March 1998 he returned to the family home. Continuing difficulties in his relationship with his mother meant he moved residence and within a short period he was residing in Greyfriars Hostel Homeless Unit, Perth where he remained until he then moved to Anchor House, Crieff Road, Perth. He then left to live in other local addresses including a girlfriend and a flat which he shared with his tenant landlord.

For over the past year Mr Murray has been back and forth down to Glasgow and Manchester. He was not always particularly forthcoming in advance regarding his movements. Records indicate that his Probation Order imposed in March 1997 was partly supervised, on our behalf, by Manchester Probation Services. This was in his mother's home area. His record for non-appearance or failing to appear timeously at Court is not a positive one either. Although it should be said that he has at times made contact and on at least one occasion produced a medical certificate for a preceding Glasgow Court appearance. By August 1998 Mr Murray was residing in Glasgow again and had returned to Perth by October 1999. He led an itinerant lifestyle living with friends and/or other relatives, particularly in Glasgow. As Mr Murray's record indicates he became embroiled in further criminal activity, particularly Road Traffic matters when in Glasgow. The relative involved being the uncle, currently in HM Prison, Barlinnie with whom he stayed at times. Thereafter, he returned to Perth and in the interim had brief spells, certainly on two occasions in Glasgow, to the best of my knowledge and possibly one in Manchester. Mr Murray then failed to maintain contact, advise his address of whereabouts from mid-September this year.

He failed to attend deferred Court appearance for sentence following being sick at an earlier date having produced a medical certificate. However, a Warrant to Apprehend was granted at Glasgow and thereafter following apprehension he was sentenced to his current imprisonment. It appears that the only stable address that Mr Murray has in the local area is one at his girlfriend's family home. However, I am unaware whether he is welcome there for other than short brief periods.

### FINANCES/WEEKLY INCOME

Due to Mr Murray's incarceration he is not in receipt of any State Benefit. He would be due normal State Benefit. I understand this was reduced to a very low level of £61.40 per fortnight as he was repaying Social Fund Loans to the Benefits Agency and the period of repayment required was recorded at two years in March 2000. Mr Murray certainly, this year, has had the maximum benefit in kind and cash from this office given this departments previous connection with him and him not attaining the age of 21 years as well as his status as a known offender on Court Supervision Orders.

### OFFENCE/BEHAVIOUR/ATTITUDE

At interview, Mr Murray presented as physically looking unwell, the worst I have ever seen him. He states he had made two attempts on his life and is currently awaiting transfer to HM-YOI Polmont Hospital Wing. Records previously indicated concerns regarding his ability to cope with the pressures of custodial experience.

Mr Murray does not deny his culpability. He made certain disclosures for the first time. He appears to be at a very low ebb. Mr Murray had previously been subject to abuse. The flat which he sometime shared with the tenant landlord, not a relative, he states abused him by taking photographs whilst he was under the influence of mainly alcohol but sometimes drugs. He understands these photographs were manipulated and involved pornographic poses. Mr Murray feels vulnerable regarding this. He also disclosed in interview that upon my questioning directly he had sold "personal favours" meaning sexual practice in order to gain funds and to get himself down to his mother's home in Manchester on one previous occasion.

He is aware fully that the breaches he faces he is very likely to be incarcerated for due to his lack of compliance.

I believe Mr Murray is very reactive to situations or circumstance given his young age and vulnerability. He appears to have lived a very destabilised life from a younger age and has learnt how to survive "on the street" so to speak. However, records indicate that he stated previously that he would comply with Supervision and he has not. I have therefore indicated to him that he will have to face any penalty the Court decides as appropriate. Currently his expected date of liberation is 25 January 2001.

## HEALTH/SUBSTANCE MISUSE

Mr Murray states that he "fell to bits" at different times in the past few months. He alleges he overdosed on anything he could get his hands on, particularly pills, painkillers, antibiotics. He also apparently hoarded some tablets from previous prescriptions. He states he is currently depressed and admits to misusing alcohol at times. He states that he does not normally involve himself in illicit drug taking but that in relation to previous overdoses he has "obtained anything he could get his hands on".

Records indicate that in late January 1999 Mr Murray suffered from stomach and bowel problems partly due to an ulcer. He was apparently hospitalised in Glasgow Royal Infirmary for a period. He then suffered abscesses and was discharged from hospital in March last year. Mr Murray has also had a repair to a metal plate on the right side of his face, locally at Perth Royal Infirmary. Mr Murray had been assaulted and found himself as a victim on more than one occasion requiring hospital treatment. Alcohol consumption does appear to have been a regular occurrence but more so at the weekends according to Mr Murray. Mr Murray's offending behaviour is not specifically occurring as a result of alcohol misuse on every occasion as far as is known. Overall, he remains a vulnerable character given his previous history details and responses. He has sustained physical damage, probably due to his lack of self-care at a sufficient level compared to the average. As a practising Mental Health Officer I have longer term concerns regarding his vulnerability and mental capacity to cope or sustain himself.

## SUMMARY/RISK ASSESSMENT

Mr Murray's offending behaviour and record speaks for itself and it now appears to be increasing again. However, there have been intermittent periods of absence from criminal activity. Mr Murray did manage to co-operate for a large part of the two year Probation Order he previously undertook, even though this was made more difficult by his continued itinerant lifestyle. In my experience Mr Murray is a young, sometimes irrational and certainly at times, immature young man. One should be hopeful of him at least slowing down his criminal activity and slowly maturing. However, without any strong base or family support this looks like it will take a much longer period to achieve.

[REDACTED]

[REDACTED] We have briefly discussed potential plans or resources which could initiate some stability for the future when released. That has been offered whether he is subject to formal Court Supervision or not. Previously he was assessed as of medium risk, however, given recent events the prognosis is not good unless Mr Murray makes sustained efforts in the future.

## COMMUNITY BASED DISPOSALS

**Probation and Community Service or Unpaid Work:** Such disposals are difficult to recommend to the Court given Mr Murray's recent lack of compliance and also with Supervised Attendance Order. However, I would leave both options available and open to the Court and these of course may be included as a combinational part of a sentence. A vacancy is available on Community Service or Unpaid Work. Any action plan for Probation would include the obvious addressing of offending behaviour and suitable guidance and support. The main issues of permanent residence, financial guidance and compliance with any Court Order paramount. Should the Court wish to impose Probation with Unpaid Work or Community Service separately, I would ask the Court to consider revoking any Order currently in force and imposing a new Order(s).

I have not assessed Mr Murray for lesser disposals given their unlikely appropriateness. The Court, however, may chose to combinationally impose such sentences and whether these are deferred would remain to be seen whether they could be affective if he has to return to Court on a regular basis to assist with the monitoring process. However, I remain sceptical unless Mr Murray can do so without such pressure. One considers his previous institutionalisation and responses.

## **INCARCERATION**

Mr Murray has now had incarceration imposed on at least two occasions and my impression is that he does not cope well with such loss of liberty. Indeed, for his own protection, I understand he currently elects for protective or supervised custody. On previous occasions Mr Murray has stated he would never wish to return to serve a sentence of any kind, however, he now finds himself doing so and facing another potentially. He therefore knows adequately what he has to lose. My concern if that whilst it is not obviously easy for Mr Murray to cope with incarceration, it may in fact be easier than dealing with the problems living in the community or adhering to agreed supervision plans or instructions.

## **CONCLUSION**

Given such details it is very difficult to recommend a Community Based Disposal regarding this young, immature and vulnerable man. However, the Court may wish to consider the various optional or conditional disposals which might assist Mr Murray in the future, not withstanding he may yet have to serve a further period in custody unless the Court chooses to backdate such a period. This may give Mr Murray some hope for the future. It is clear that any Order imposed by the Court is not always likely to meet with any immediate success. A good deal of work, support and advocacy will be required to assist Mr Murray in the future should he decide he wishes to comply if given such opportunity. He is aware that even if incarcerated further that services are available to him in respect of throughcare plus aftercare from these offices. Finally, should the Court deem that further custodial and non-backdated sentence is the only appropriate one, I would urge the Court respectfully to consider limiting this period to give Mr Murray some little hope for the future.

**Andrew Joseph McPherson Murray (Dob 19-09-80, age 20)**  
**Review of Personal History Summary**

Andrew Murray was born in Glasgow and grew up in the Easterhouse area without knowing his father. He has two younger stepsisters following his mother's relationship with his stepfather. His family moved around Glasgow following difficulties in the community they were re-housed in Perth in 1990. They have resided in the Cupar Angus and Stanley areas of North Perthshire before moving to St Andrews in Fife in 1997. The family returned to Perth in January 1998 before Mr Murray's mother and half siblings moved to Manchester in April 1998.

Mr Murray was physically assaulted at the same time as his mother by his stepfather. He was received into Local Authority care in this area when fourteen as a result of that assault plus continuing family difficulties. He resided with foster carers for eight months but returned to residential care in a group home due to his difficult behaviour. He was later discharged from Local Authority care in February 1997. At times Mr Murray's relationship with his mother has been fractious. At times Mr Murray visits an uncle in Glasgow where he usually ends up in trouble, generally regarding Road Traffic Act contraventions. His uncle was recently incarcerated. Mr Murray has visited his mother in Manchester but usually for short periods and again there is a risk of his re-offending where their relationship experiences friction.

It appears that Mr Murray was first incarcerated around 1997 and following his release he agreed to be placed in supported accommodation, this later broke down and Mr Murray then spent a period with relatives in Glasgow and then returned to the family home. He commenced an agricultural course at Elmwood College, Cupar, Fife in October 1997. He resided in privately rented accommodation there but due to his non-attendance his place on the course was withdrawn. In March 1998 he returned to the family home and he then was placed in supported accommodation at Greyfriars Hostel, Perth, where he remained until he moved to Anchor House, Crieff Road, Perth. He then left and lived in other local addresses, including a girlfriend, and his most recent address, a flat that he shared with his tenant/landlord. In March 1998, however, he was incarcerated and simultaneously placed on Probation supervision.

In the past year Mr Murray has been back and forth to Manchester. His earlier Probation Order, imposed in March 1997, was partly supervised by Manchester Probation Service in his mother's home area. His record is not a positive one, there has only usually been partial compliance.

In August 1998, again residing in Glasgow, Mr Murray returned to Perth in October 1999. He had led some kind of itinerant lifestyle with friends and or relatives or acquaintances in Glasgow. Unfortunately he became embroiled in further criminal activity, usually Road Traffic matters, especially in Glasgow. In September last year he failed to maintain contact with this office and was then apprehended and incarcerated. Numerous Court matters were brought to a head at our local Court on 4 January 2001. Mr Murray's release date is currently 25 January 2001.

Mr Murray was recently incarcerated at HM YOI Glenochil where he apparently attempted suicide on two occasions and was later transferred to HM YOI Polmont's

hospital wing, where he could be more suitably supervised and encouraged. In my opinion this young man suffers from periodic depression and feelings of hopelessness, tied to recent disclosures of more than one type of abuse. I would propose that following settled accommodation that he be worked with and moved on in terms of both employment and independent living accommodation. He needs to make a clean break from former associates and acquaintances. As his record shows only partial compliance there are risks in any work undertaken with him that these will not be fully successful. However, I firmly believe that continued perseverance, effort and encouragement will improve Mr Murray's future and a reduction in poorer behaviour plus hopefully realise more positive results for the future.

### BASIS OF REPORT

The information in this report is derived from two interviews with Mr Murray at this office. I have spoken with Mr Beck who is Mr Murray's Community Service supervisor and he has liaised with Glasgow Social Work Services regarding this current Breach of Community Service. I have further accessed departmental files regarding Mr Murray and seen a copy of his previous convictions as detailed by the Scottish Criminal Records Office. Furthermore, I have significant background knowledge of Mr Murray as I am his Probation Supervisor.

### PERSONAL HISTORY

Mr Murray was born in Glasgow growing up in Easterhouse area. He never knew his father. He has two younger step-sisters who are the children of a long-standing relationship between a Mr Joseph Waddell and his mother. The family moved numerous times in Glasgow and as a result of difficulties in the community, they were re-housed in Perth in 1990. The family then moved to Coupar Angus shortly afterwards and again moved on to Stanley in north Perthshire. In October 1997 they then moved to St Andrews in Fife. In January 1998 the family returned to the Muirton area of Perth where they remained until moving to Manchester area in April 1998.

Andrew Murray's mother then separated from Mr Waddell. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] In June 1995 her ex-partner was charged with physically assaulting Andrew Murray and his mother. As a result of this assault and continuing family difficulties Mr Murray was placed in Local Authority Care at the age of fourteen years. In the first eight months Mr Murray resided with his foster carers but due to his difficult behaviour he was then placed in a residential unit run by local Social Work Services.

He then appeared at Children's Panel Hearing and was discharged from Local Authority Care on 6 February 1997. Friction between Mr Murray and his mother led Mr Murray to immediately leave Perth and move to Glasgow to reside with relatives.

On 19 March 1997 Mr Murray appeared at Perth Sheriff Court in relation to a number of Road Traffic offences when he was imprisoned for three months and made the subject of a Probation Order totalling two years. Following his release on 2 May 1997 and again due to difficulties with his residency, this time in Glasgow, plus continued friction with his mother, Mr Murray agreed to be placed in supported accommodation. That placement, however, broke down in July 1997 and following a period spent with relatives in Glasgow Mr Murray then returned to the family home.

Mr Murray commenced an agricultural course at Elmwood College in Cupar, Fife in October 1997. He lived in privately rented accommodation there. Primarily due to his non-attendance Mr Murray's place on that course was withdrawn and in March 1998 he returned again to the family home. Continuing difficulties in his relationship with his mother meant he moved residence again and within a short period he was residing in Greyfriars Hostel Homeless Unit where he remained until he moved to Anchor House, Crieff Road in Perth, an independent unit for the homeless with substance misuse problems. He then left there to live locally in Perth, Letham area with a friend. Over the past few months, Mr Murray has been essentially homeless, staying for periods with his girlfriend and her parents, sometimes with friends, or with his uncle. However, none of these situations could be described in any way as ideal and the issue of housing continues to be a major focus of Probation work.

## PRESENT CIRCUMSTANCES

At this time Mr Murray resides with his uncle in Perth. He advises me that he also is in a steady relationship and that his partner lives locally. However, I understand that his frequent offending has caused strain for this relationship as his partner does not condone his behaviour. Mr Murray maintains sporadic contact with his mother who continues to live in the Manchester area

## FINANCES

Mr Murray is in receipt of Jobseekers Allowance at £61.40 per fortnight. He would normally be due a further £20 per fortnight but is repaying Social Fund Loans to the Benefits Agency and this will take him a period of two years to repay these. He informs me that his finances generally are at this time in a state of total disarray as a result of Benefits Agency stopping his payments since his release from prison when he was on remand. However, he anticipates this will be resolved in the near future but he also states that he will be expected to pay rent at the sum of £40 per week so it is highly unlikely that Mr Murray will be in any kind of settled financial position for the foreseeable future.

## PHYSICAL/MENTAL HEALTH

In January last year Mr Murray was diagnosed as having a stomach ulcer which was exacerbated by abscesses. However, he advises me that whilst he was in and out of hospital last year as a consequence of this his ulcer has caused him little trouble this year. However, I understand that Mr Murray also suffers from asthma and he informs me that this has been troubling him to quite a large degree this year. With regards to his mental health, Mr Murray states that he does not suffer from problems of a psychological or psychiatric nature.

## ALCOHOL/DRUG USE

Mr Murray advises me that whilst he has on occasion drunk to excess in the past he rarely, if ever drinks nowadays. He considers this to be largely as a result of his ulcer as he finds that drinking alcohol can significantly exacerbate his stomach problems. Whilst he has in the past admitted to infrequent use of Cannabis, Mr Murray further states that he has stopped using Cannabis as well as he cannot afford it and cannot be bothered with it anymore.

## OFFENDING HISTORY

As the Court will be aware, Mr Murray has a significant list of previous convictions recorded against him. In the main these have been for offences in contravention of the Road Traffic Act 1988. Disposals for these offences have previously been by way of Fines, Disqualifications, Admonishments, Community Service, Probation and one period of Juvenile Detention. Most recently, Mr Murray was made subject to a two year Probation Order with a condition to undertake 90 hours unpaid work with a five year driving ban. This was made at Glasgow and Strathkelvin Sheriff Court on 28 March 2000. The main focus of this Probation Order has been to address practical problems such as housing and budgeting skills, and to try to find appropriate courses for Mr Murray to attend which would perhaps enable him to address his offending behaviour through a variety of methods. Unfortunately the issues of inadequate housing has impacted upon other areas of work to the point where it has not been possible to work as effectively with Mr Murray as had been first anticipated. Therefore, whilst Mr Murray is technically in Breach of his Probation Order by the commission of a further offence, it is hoped that in view of the significant issues still requiring to be addressed the Court will consider the possibility of a further Probation Order, possibly with a condition of Community Service.

## CURRENT OFFENCES

When questioned about his reasons for failing to attend for Community Service as directed by his supervising officer, Mr Murray advised me that he had been down in Manchester with his mother, [REDACTED] and that whilst he was aware of his obligations with regards to completing his Community Service he was not concerned at that time of the consequences because of his concern for his mother. However, subsequent to that interview with Mr Murray I received background information from Glasgow relating to the grounds of Breach. From reading this report, there seems to be an incompatibility of Mr Murray's account. Unfortunately I have been unable to discuss this with Mr Murray.

In describing the circumstances around his motoring offences Mr Murray advises me that he had received a telephone call from his uncle who lives in Glasgow inviting him to go through to Glasgow to visit. Mr Murray says he borrowed £10 from his girlfriend's mother and bought himself a train ticket. He was met by his uncle at Glasgow railway station and I am told they caught a bus to his uncle's house. Mr Murray states that one of his reasons for going through to Glasgow was that his aunt had given birth that morning and that he wanted to go to the hospital to see his new cousin. His uncle packed some clothes for his aunt and the new baby and had intended to drive himself and Mr Murray to the hospital. Mr Murray asserts that his uncle was half drunk from the night before and was drinking beer prior to setting off. Mr Murray says that because of this he offered to drive, knowing full well that he is a banned driver and was aware of the consequences for him should he be caught yet again behind the wheel of a car. However, he decided to take the risk and had driven some way towards the hospital when he was stopped by traffic police because of a cracked windscreen. Police became aware of his status as a banned driver when they carried out a computer check. He was arrested at that point.

## DISPOSALS

Due to the serious and analogous nature of Mr Murray's offending, I have only given consideration to Probation and Community Service Orders in this report as other community based disposals would be inappropriate as they would not reflect the serious view the Court will take today.

**Probation:** Whilst the Court may question the efficacy of Mr Murray's current Probation Order in view of his further offending I would suggest that to date much of the work carried out with Mr Murray has of necessity concentrated on practical issues such as housing and finance. This has therefore meant that there has so far been limited opportunity to address issues of offending. There is obviously a significant amount of work still needing to be done with Mr Murray if there is to be a realistic chance of his avoiding re-offending in the future.

**Community Service:** Although Mr Murray is in Breach of the Community Service Order made on 9 June 1999, he is completing hours of unpaid work as a condition of a Probation Order imposed at Glasgow Sheriff Court on 28 March 2000. To date he has completed 40 hours of that Order, leaving 50 hours remaining. In view of this, should the Court wish to consider Community Service as an option, it would be possible to revoke the existing Order and replace it with a further Order of 190 hours Community Service. Should this be the case, I have assessed Mr Murray as continuing to be a suitable candidate and a vacancy is currently available. Any Order would of course be supervised and administered according to National Standards.

**Custodial Sentence:** Mr Murray is aware that he may well be facing the possibility of a custodial sentence today. However, whilst this would have a punitive effect on Mr Murray it would do nothing to address the significant problems he is experiencing in relation to accommodation and finances and will not encourage him to look at the underlying influences which continue to encourage him in his continuing offending. Whilst he must continue to be at medium to high risk of re-offending, a further period in custody will do nothing to reduce the risk for the future. However, Mr Murray does accept that should the Court choose to impose a custodial sentence today he has nobody to blame but himself.

## CONCLUSION

He is an immature young man who has been repeatedly through the system and at this point looks as if he will continue to do so. The easy option would perhaps be to put him in prison for a short period of time yet this is unlikely to stop him offending. I would respectfully suggest that working with Mr Murray to help him resolve practical problems such as housing will hopefully provide a more secure base for him within the community thereby helping him to identify with his neighbourhood rather than attempting to isolate him from it. This would also provide the opportunity to undertake focused work with Mr Murray to challenge him on his motivation for continuing to commit motor vehicle related offences and hopefully to enable him to understand why he is continually motivated to offend. In view of the above I would urge the Court to consider revoking the Community Service Order which is now in Breach and substituting a Probation Order with a condition of unpaid work in its place.

This report is based on ongoing contact with Mr Murray in respect of a current Community Service Order which is being transferred back from the Glasgow since his return to the area in early February this year. That 200 hour Community Service Order was imposed at Perth Sheriff Summary Court on 9 June 1999 for two analogous offences. Mr Murray later moved to the Glasgow area and this Order was transferred there. He also had his licence endorsed and was disqualified for three years on one charge and admonished on the second charge licence endorsed. An up to date Scottish Criminal Records Office check was available and perused as were previous case records. Mr Murray has co-operated and kept up to date with regard to transfer of his Order which I am in the process of formally asking Glasgow to return to our area pending request for an extension simultaneously.

### **PERSONAL/FAMILY HISTORY**

Mr Murray was born in Glasgow growing up in Easterhouse area. He never knew his father. He has two younger step-sisters who are the children of a long-standing relationship between a Mr Joseph Waddell and his mother. The family moved numerous times in Glasgow and as a result of difficulties in the community, they were rehoused in Perth in 1990. The family then moved to Coupar Angus shortly afterwards and again moved on to Stanley in north Perthshire. In October 1997 they then moved to St Andrews in Fife. In

January 1998 the family returned to the Muirton area of Perth where they remained until moving to Manchester area in April 1998.

Andrew Murray's mother then separated from Mr Waddell. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] In June 1995 her ex-partner was charged with physically assaulting Andrew Murray and his mother. As a result of this assault and continuing family difficulties Mr Murray was placed in Local Authority Care at the age of fourteen years. In the first eight months Mr Murray resided with his foster carers but due to his difficult behaviour he was then placed in a residential unit run by local Social Work Services.

He then appeared at Children's Panel Hearing and was discharged from Local Authority Care on 6 February 1997. Friction between Mr Murray and his mother led Mr Murray to immediately leave Perth and move to Glasgow to reside with relatives.

On 19 March 1997 Mr Murray appeared at Perth Sheriff Court in relation to a number of Road Traffic offences when he was imprisoned for three months and made the subject of a Probation Order totalling two years. Following his release on 2 May 1997 and again due to difficulties with his residency, this time in Glasgow, plus continued friction with his mother, Mr Murray agreed to be placed in supported accommodation. That placement, however, broke down in July 1997 and following a period spent with relatives in Glasgow Mr Murray then returned to the family home.

Mr Murray commenced an agricultural course at Elmwood College in Cupar, Fife in October 1997. He lived in privately rented accommodation there. Primarily due to his non-attendance Mr Murray's place on that course was withdrawn and in March 1998 he returned again to the family home. Continuing difficulties in his relationship with his mother meant he moved residence again and within a short period he was residing in Greyfriars Hostel Homeless Unit where he remained until he moved to Anchor House, Crieff Road in Perth, an independent unit for the homeless with substance misuse problems. He then left there to live locally in Perth, Letham area with a friend.

Mr Murray was supervised on a two year Probation Order imposed at Perth Sheriff Summary Court in March 1997. This Order expired in March 1999 when Mr R Duncan, his Probation Supervisor, last had contact with him. He had at that time failed to follow up his last supervision session where a deferred sentence and Supplementary Report was being provided to the local Court for 31 March 1999. He therefore did appear at Court and sentence was further deferred, he was convicted of a further offence dating from January. Records indicate that Mr Murray was supervised by Manchester Probation Services where his mother and siblings continued to reside, Mr Murray moving there again in August 1998. He then returned to Perth the following October 1999 and had itinerant lifestyle living with friends and while not in Glasgow living with other relatives.

After living in Glasgow more recently he has returned to this area having lived with either relatives, friends or family acquaintances. It was then that he became involved in these offences which date from last September.

## **PRESENT CIRCUMSTANCES**

Currently Mr Murray is residing with his girlfriend at his given address, this relationship appears to be steady currently.

## FINANCES

Mr Murray is in receipt of £61.40 per fortnight benefit. He would normally be due a further £20 per fortnight benefit but is repaying Social Fund Loans to the Benefits Agency and this will take him a period of two years to repay these. He stayed at a recent friend's care of address locally where he was paying £50 rent and board which he regarded as excessive as the food provision was minimal. This left him with only £5.20 per week in his pocket and he also has outstanding fines to address. This position should now have improved given that he resides with his current girlfriend and he has free rent plus board. I am continuing to encourage him to address fine repayments which remain outstanding. Mr Murray is unsure of what he still has to pay and I am currently updating this information from the Courts.

## THE OFFENCE

Mr Murray does not deny his culpability, indeed he states he would not waste anyone's time with regard to the fact that he took the opportunity to drive what was regarded as an "old banger" for what can only be described as a joyride. He accepts that his behaviour was foolish and dangerous, especially if he had caused any significant damage or harm to others or property. I have stressed to him the importance of not continuing Road Traffic offending behaviour. Mr Murray responds by acknowledging his foolish behaviour describing it as "stupid" and allowing himself to be led on to some extent by others. He states he has now left Glasgow partly for this reason but also partly due to difficulties with accommodation and concerns about the character of the family acquaintance with whom he was residing.

I believe Mr Murray saw signs that he may become more embroiled in either criminal activity or possibly witness such and for this reason he returned to Perth. However his lifestyle continues to be itinerant unless he can attempt to settle anywhere for a reasonable period. This yet remains to be seen. He is fully aware of the disposals available to the Court and states he will comply with any appropriate sentence the Court imposes.

## HEALTH/SUBSTANCE MISUSE

In late January last year Mr Murray while visiting relatives was taken into Glasgow Royal Infirmary where it was subsequently transpired that he had an ulcer and as a consequence is suffering from stomach and bowel problems. That was apparently exacerbated by abscesses. He was eventually discharged from hospital in early March and returned to Perth at that time. Mr Murray has also been hospitalised recently for a repair to a metal plate on the right side of his face where he required some adjustment and currently he is suffering from bruising and has only just had stitches removed. During this past two weeks he has been suspended temporarily from undertaking Community Service.

Records show that Mr Murray has admitted to drinking to excess in the past and that he only consumes alcohol usually at the weekend. There have been times when alcohol appears to have been a factor in his offending behaviour but it is not always prominent. Mr Murray denies taking any other substances with the exception of irregular use of Cannabis. Finally, he has been subject to other hospitalisation usually in connection with being assaulted by others for various reasons which has obviously subjected him to some experience of being a victim himself.

## SUMMARY/RISK ASSESSMENT

Mr Murray's offending behaviour and record speaks for itself. It appears now to be increasing, however, there have been intermittent periods of absence from further criminal activity and Mr Murray did manage to co-operate for a large part of a two year Probation Order even though his continued itinerant lifestyle made this more difficult. He is a young, sometimes, irrational and certainly, at times, immature young man who is hopefully slowing down his activity in criminal behaviour and is slowly maturing to realise the importance of not committing such offences as libelled, especially if the consequences could be much more severe than he has ever experienced thus far.

This has been made very clear to him. He is obviously aware that he faces custodial sentence, particularly because of his continued driving whilst disqualified. However, he admits his culpability and acknowledges his behaviour as totally unacceptable and he himself describes it as stupid.

Given the number of actuarial and clinical factors or indicators with regard to Mr Murray, his behaviour and offending or re-offending pattern, he remains at a medium risk of re-offending unless he exerts adequate self-control and responds appropriately and more maturely to the triggers which precipitate his offending behaviour.

## ● COMMUNITY BASED DISPOSALS

**Probation and Suitability:** Mr Murray has recently completed Probation Supervision. There appears to have been some degree of positive impact and general compliance at least to reduce his frequency of offending. I have assessed him as suitable, a supervisor would be made available and the action plan would be to continue to address the issues of: (a) itinerant lifestyle, (b) accommodation, (c) financial management, (d) specifically address driving offences, (e) general supervision of an offender in the community. A moderate to maximum Order would be required to address and sustain the above issues. However, the Court may wish to consider whether Mr Murray would continue to choose his itinerant lifestyle, thus reducing the effect any longer period of supervision.

**Community Service Suitability:** Reports from Glasgow indicate Mr Murray worked **44 hours** but was close to being Breached for non-compliance. He has worked one further day locally. **50 Hours** total worked. **90 Hours** are currently available to the Court as Mr Murray has an outstanding balance of one hundred and fifty hours yet to complete. I have assessed him as continuing to be a suitable candidate and a vacancy is currently available. Any Order would of course be supervised and administered according to National Standards. Mr Murray has been advised that any lack of compliance would entail a return to Court and subsequent consequences which he is aware of. Transfer is to be confirmed and an extension sought if he remains. *free*

Due to Mr Murray's continued offending and the analogous nature of these offences I have not assessed Mr Murray for any other community based disposals as these would appear inappropriate currently. Mr Murray accepts that he faces probable incarceration.

## INCARCERATION

I would urge the Court to consider that Mr Murray has more than many to lose from a further period of incarceration. He has experienced such once before and alongside the periods of isolation he has experienced since the break-up of his family when he was received into Care at fourteen years of age, I would not recommend that this young man undergoes further

isolation and institutionalisation. However, he is aware and accepts that should this occur he himself is responsible. In addition to losing his liberty any self and family respect, he would not have to face up to maintaining himself in the community. Incarceration might seem an easier and quick solution plus option for "time out". Imprisonment, notwithstanding the effects of further association(s) with a wider group of criminal personalities may also reinforce the degree of institutionalisation with regard to his lifestyle.

## CONCLUSION

Given the details and circumstances in this case this immature, young man has made some recent efforts to at least reduce his offending behaviour plus coping with an itinerant lifestyle and indeed lack of roots or family support. Whilst it remains to be seen how quickly he may mature, or not, I would urge the Court to consider a community based disposal and respectfully recommend that Community Service be imposed as a direct alternative to any custodial sentence deemed appropriate by the Court. Unpaid work could also be considered as a condition of Probation as an appropriate high tariff disposal for this young offender.

Should the Court consider that the only appropriate sentence is one of imprisonment then I would respectfully urge the Court to consider limiting the period of incarceration to reduce the negative effects of such.



### BASIS OF REPORT

The writer was due to interview Mr Murray in relation to the current Report on 24 March 1999 but he failed to appear for his appointment. This Report is therefore largely based on Departmental Records. The writer's last interview with Mr Murray was on 09 March 1999. Mr Murray's two year probation Order, imposed at Perth Sheriff Court, expired on 18 March 1999.

### CIRCUMSTANCES SINCE LAST REPORT

Shortly after Mr Murray's last appearance in court he moved out of Anchor House to live with a friend in the Letham area. Following a period spent living with relatives in Glasgow, Mr Murray, in August 1998, moved to Manchester where his mother and siblings now reside. During this period, Mr Murray was supervised by Manchester Probation Services. Mr Murray returned to Perth the following October and, since this time, and while not in Glasgow, he has lived with different friends. The writer however, is unaware of Mr Murray's current whereabouts.

In late January of this year, Mr Murray, while visiting relatives, was taken into Glasgow Royal Infirmary. It subsequently transpired that Mr Murray had an ulcer and, as a consequence, was suffering from stomach and bowel problems. This situation was apparently exacerbated by abscesses. He was eventually discharged from hospital earlier this month and returned to Perth.

As far as the writer is aware, Mr Murray has been convicted of no further offences during the period of deferment. In addition, he continues to be in receipt of State Benefits.

**CONCLUSION**

Presuming the above information is correct, the writer would suggest to the court that they consider admonishing Mr Murray on this occasion. This recommendation is based on the fact that Mr Murray has already been the subject of Probation Supervision for the last two years, his itinerant lifestyle and age.

This report is based on one office interview with Mr Murray and reference to Departmental Records. The Writer also supervises Mr Murray's current Probation Order.

**FINANCE**

At present, Mr Murray is in receipt of State Benefit totalling £60.60 per fortnight. Regular fortnightly financial outgoings are £40 towards accommodation and £5 toward the payment of a fine.

## PERSONAL HISTORY

Born in Glasgow, Mr Murray grew up in the Easterhouse area and never knew his father. He has two younger step-sisters who are the children of a long-standing relationship between his mother and a Joseph Waddell. The family moved many times in Glasgow and, as a result of difficulties in the community, they were re-housed in Perth in 1990. Shortly after, they moved to Coupar Angus, then to Stanley and in October 1997, to St Andrews in Fife. However, the following January the family returned to the Muirton area of Perth where they remained until moving to Manchester some two weeks ago.

Mrs Murray, who has now separated from Mr Waddell [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] In June 1995 Mr Waddell was charged with physically assaulting Mr Murray and his mother. As a result of this assault, and continuing family difficulties, Mr Murray was placed in Local Authority Care. For the first eight months Mr Murray resided with foster carers but, due to his difficult behaviour he was then placed in a residential unit run by the Social Work Department.

Following an appearance at the Children's Panel, Mr Murray was discharged from Local Authority care on 6 February 1997. Due to friction between him and his mother, Mr Murray immediately left Perth to go to Glasgow to live with relatives.

On 19 March 1997 Mr Murray appeared at Perth Sheriff Court in relation to a number of Road Traffic Offences when he was imprisoned for three months and made the subject of a Probation Order totalling two years. Shortly after his release, on 2 May 1997 and, due to difficulties with his residency in Glasgow and continuing friction with his mother, Mr Murray agreed to be placed in supported accommodation. However, this placement broke down in July 1997 and, following a period spent with relatives in Glasgow, Mr Murray returned to the family home.

In October 1997 Mr Murray commenced an Agricultural course at Elmwood College in Cupar, Fife where he lived in privately rented accommodation. Due primarily to his non-attendance, Mr Murray's place on the course was withdrawn and, in March 1998 he returned to the family home. However, difficulties with Mr Murray's relationship with his mother continued and, shortly after, he moved into Greyfriars Hostel for the Homeless where he remained until moving into Anchor House approximately six weeks ago.

## EDUCATION/EMPLOYMENT

Mr Murray attended Rogerfield Primary School in Glasgow where his poor attendance was noted. On coming to Perth Mr Murray attended Perth Grammar School where again his poor attendance and disruptive behaviour were prevalent. As a result of these difficulties, Mr Murray attended Blairgowrie High School for a period in 1995. While admitting that he 'didn't like' school, Mr Murray was of the opinion that family difficulties contributed to his poor attendance and negative attitude towards his schooling. Since leaving school, and apart from a two week period spent as a Kitchen Porter and a few days casual employment, Mr Murray has remained unemployed.

## HEALTH

Apart from suffering from asthma and eczema, Mr Murray was of the opinion that he keeps in good physical and mental health.

## ALCOHOL/DRUGS

According to Mr Murray, he consumes alcohol only at weekends although recently he has admitted to drinking to excess. He further stated that alcohol was a factor in the current offence.

Apart from the irregular use of cannabis, Mr Murray denies taking drugs.

## OFFENDING BEHAVIOUR

Mr Murray's previous offences have all involved motor vehicles. While admitting to having a liking for cars, Mr Murray was of the opinion that the main factors in relation to his previous offending behaviour were his frustration with being in Local Authority Care and his continuing family difficulties. He stated that he was 'depressed and bored' and 'wanted to do something stupid'. While not disagreeing with Mr Murray, the writer is of the opinion that his disrupted upbringing and immaturity were, and remain, pertinent factors.

## OUTSTANDING OFFENCES

Mr Murray would appear to have no matters outstanding against him.

## THE OFFENCE

Mr Murray admits to the offence and, to being drunk at the time it was carried out. He states that on the day of the offence occurred, he was visiting his mother and living at Greyfriars Hostel. When he was due to leave, a friend offered him the baseball bat and Mr Murray decided 'stupidly' to take it, just 'in case any of the Muirton mob attacked me'. Mr Murray, who apparently did not attempt to conceal the bat, was apprehended on his way to the hostel.

According to Mr Murray, he regrets the offence which, he maintains, would not have occurred had he not been drinking. He also stated that he would not have used the bat.

## COMMUNITY BASED DISPOSALS

**Admonishment:** Taking into account Mr Murray's age and background, and the fact that he is currently subject to a Probation Order, the Court could consider admonishment as a suitable disposal.

**Monetary Penalty:** It is the Writer's opinion that Mr Murray would have difficulty in paying a monetary penalty, mainly due to his present financial situation and his immaturity. However, if the Court is considering this course of action, then I would suggest the imposition of the minimum fortnightly payment.

**Deferred Sentence:** This course of action would put the onus on Mr Murray and give him the opportunity to prove to the Court that he has the motivation and commitment to avoid further offences. It could also act as a deterrent.

**Probation Supervision:** While Mr Murray has been assessed as a suitable candidate for Probation Supervision, given the fact that he is currently subject to such an Order, this course of action would appear to be unnecessary.

**Community Service:** Mr Murray has been assessed as a suitable candidate for Community Service which will be carried out according to National Standards.

## CONCLUSION

While experiencing what can only be described as a disrupted upbringing, Mr Murray managed to avoid becoming involved in offences until early 1996. With regard to these previous offences, the last occurring approximately twenty months ago, Mr Murray maintained that they occurred as a result of his frustration with being in Local Authority care and continuing family difficulties.

Despite a degree of isolation and continuing accommodation difficulties, Mr Murray again managed to avoid coming into conflict with the law until the current offence occurred in March of this year. In relation to this offence alcohol, along with immaturity would appear to be relevant factors.

With regard to disposal and taking into account the above information, especially Mr Murray's background, age, and the fact that he is currently subject to a Probation Order, the writer would suggest that on this occasion the Court considers deferring sentence for a period for good behaviour. During this period, Mr Murray has agreed to address his alcohol misuse and a referral to an outside agency for counselling is likely. If the Court is of the opinion that stronger measures are required, then I would suggest the imposition of a further Probation Order, with a condition to undertake alcohol counselling.

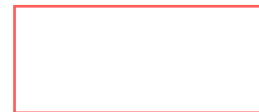

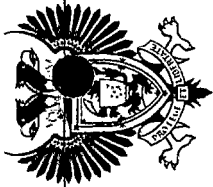



### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Mr Murray was ordered to undertake 200 hours Community Service when he appeared at Perth Sheriff Court on 09.06.99; he had been convicted of an offence contravening Section 103(1)(B) of the Road Traffic Act 1988. The case was eventually transferred to Glasgow North district on 30.06.99 and interview was arranged for 05.07.99 when the conditions and penalties of the Order were explained in full.

An agency placement was arranged at the Fernan Street Hostel in Shettleston, Glasgow, a project catering for special needs adults and Mr Murray was instructed to attend each Monday and Thursday from 10.00 am - 3.00 pm. Attendance at first was consistent with acceptable supervisors reports and by 12.08.99 a total of 44 hours had been completed, although a Formal Warning had been issued for a failure to attend for interview on 09.08.99.

Due to a problem with accommodation arrangements which had necessitated Mr Murray living temporarily with relatives in overcrowded conditions it was agreed that the Order would be suspended for 2 weeks; contact was made with the Housing department, the D.S.S. and 'Who Cares Scotland' in an attempt to have this issue resolved.

Mr Murray was expected to return to placement on 26.08.99 but failed to do so and it was the following week before contact was made with the office, with Mr Murray explaining that he was residing short-term with a friend in the Tollcross area of Glasgow. As he had failed to return to Fernan Street as instructed the placement there was withdrawn and he was allocated an alternative place with the Painting and Decorating team, to re-start on 14.09.99.

He failed to attend however and when a further absence was recorded on 21.09.99 a Final Warning was issued and the possible consequences of further non-compliance was clearly explained. A meeting was arranged for 08.10.99 to discuss the situation and although Mr Murray failed to attend he 'phoned later that day to say that he had been detained in hospital and would not be released until the following day. This was accepted, although he was instructed to make contact with the office on 18.10.99. He failed to do so and further absences from placement were recorded on 26.10.99 and 02.11.99. Since then there has been no contact from Mr Murray and the decision has been taken to institute Breach proceedings in view of continued non-compliance with the conditions of the Order.
