DESCRIPTION

1. Significant Events or Changes in People and Circumstances :

Andrew moved from Grammar School, Perth to Blairgowrie H.S. two weeks in December 1994 initially on a trial basis. Successful start but evidence now of Andrew avoiding school.

Liaison with Grammar School/Community Policing in Coupar Angus and Home resulted in concerns being addressed with the Reporter to Children's Panel by both School and Social Work Dept. Children's Hearing date for 7.2.95.

2. Summary of Work Done :

Supported Andrew through his change in school location - now B.H.S. Support Andrew who is continuing to get into incidences involving the police.

Liaising with school and local police who have been helpful.

3. Client's Definition of Main Problem :

Do not like school.

Do not like Coupar Angus, nothing to do.

Difficulties in home relationships with mother and Joseph Waddell

(REVIEW CONTINUED)

ANALYSIS

4. Social Worker's Definition of Current Problem :

Andrew feeling isolated both at home and in school. At home his relationship with his mother is fragile at present. Andrew's relationship with Mr Waddell is extremely strained, Mr Waddell continually knocking Andrew verbally. Andrew appears to have no strong friendships, difficulties in peer relationships.

Hypotheses to Test :

6. Reason for Not Closing the Case :

Continuing behavioural difficulties within home and school setting.
Still strong need to ensure support for Andrew within family setting.

PLAN

6. Social Worker's Aims :

Monitor Andrew's position within the home.
Encourage attendance at B.H.S.
Assist with additional diversionary pursuits, outwith home and school placement.
Enhance an area of trust with Andrew.

8. Proposed Actions :

See Andrew at least fortnightly.
Liaise with Vanda and Joseph regularly.
Ensure that a multi disciplinary approach is adopted with this case.

7. Client's Aims :

To attend school regularly.
Try to better the relationships he has with family members.

Co-operate with Social Worker and school.

DESCRIPTION

1. Significant Events or Changes in People and Circumstances :

Hearing held on 7/2 with Andrew placed on a Safety Order. Social Work Dept decision for Andrew to remain at home. On 23/2 P.S.O. renewed with alternative placement found (1st) Aunt's, Blairgowrie then to James Street.
On 16/2 I.C.A. planned intervention involving Social Work and NCH.
23/2 Disclosure of alleged physical abuse named perpetrator Vanda Murray and on further investigation also naming Joseph Waddell.
On 26/2 Andrew admitted to PRI following his absconding from James Street. Consult Phsyciatrist PRI written to Dr M Field re Andrew.
1/3 Andrew discharged from PRI and clearly stating his wish to go home.

2. Summary of Work Done :

Child Protection Investigation carried out on Andrew 24/3/95 - see Appendix B1. Intensive Community Assessment plan meeting on 16/2/95 - see Marion Dingwall (NCH) report following Residential on 30 - 31 March.

Andrew continued to be supported at home and in school. Relationships so fragile within the home that on occasion Andrew requiring Place of Safety.

Mainstay papers now taken out with Andrew on 25/4/95.

3. Client's Definition of Main Problem :

Andrew expressing his fear at times when Joseph Waddell returns home from the Pub influenced by alcohol.

Andrew feels that if Joseph Waddell was not living in his house experiences both at home and at school would improve.

ANALYSIS

4. Social Worker's Definition of Current Problem :

Mother has obvious loyalty to her daughters, whose father is Joseph Waddell. This loyalty continues to create a wedge in her relationship with Andrew who feels isolated. His extensive absence from school leaving him gravely short of academic support thus further advancing the already low esteem he holds for himself.

Hypotheses to Test :

Shared Care via Mainstay Placing.

6. Reason for Not Closing the Case :

Continuing Support needed to assist in bettering the relationship Andrew has with his mother.

6. Social Worker's Aims :

To aid in any way the relationship between Andrew and his mother Vanda. Encourage Andrew to attend school.
Assist in any future Mainstay Placing.
Co-operate closely with NCH Worker and Blairgowrie High School and Residential Outreach Worker.

8. Proposed Actions :

Liaise with Resource Team over future Mainstay placing.
Close contact with Andrew and Vanda Murray.
Liaise with School and NCH.
Support Andrew at future Hearings, Case Conferences, etc.
A Park, Social Worker to officially transfer case to Aileen Courtney.

1. Significant Changes in People or Circumstances:

Spccific evidence Andrew being subject to physical abuse by Mr Joseph Waddell, violent behaviour. This violence associated with Mr Waddell's drinking habit.

Andrew Murray presently on a "Place of Safety Warrant" and in a Mainstay Placement.

2. Summary of Aims Achieved and Actions Since Last Review:

Support been given to Andrew through school, NCH and Social Work - intensive work with Andrew.

Andrew clearly stating his dislike for school in general, however every effort is being made to encourage him to give commitment to B.H.S. As a consequence of major difficulty in home relationships, alternative accommodation has been found for Andrew on several occasions.

Following recent evidence of physical abuse, a place of safety needed to be found for Andrew which will be reviewed within 21 days period.

3. Aims not Achieved:

Achieving a safe manageable home setting for Andrew to feel comfortable and a member.

As a major influence in Mr Waddell's abusive outburst is a consequence of his drinking, his acceptance of this and his commitment to seek assistance still to be assured.


Andrew still demonstrating a reluctance to buy into the assistance on offer within his school setting.

Due to an additional Social Worker joining the Blairgowrie Social Work Team, it was felt both practicable and acceptable to transfer case.

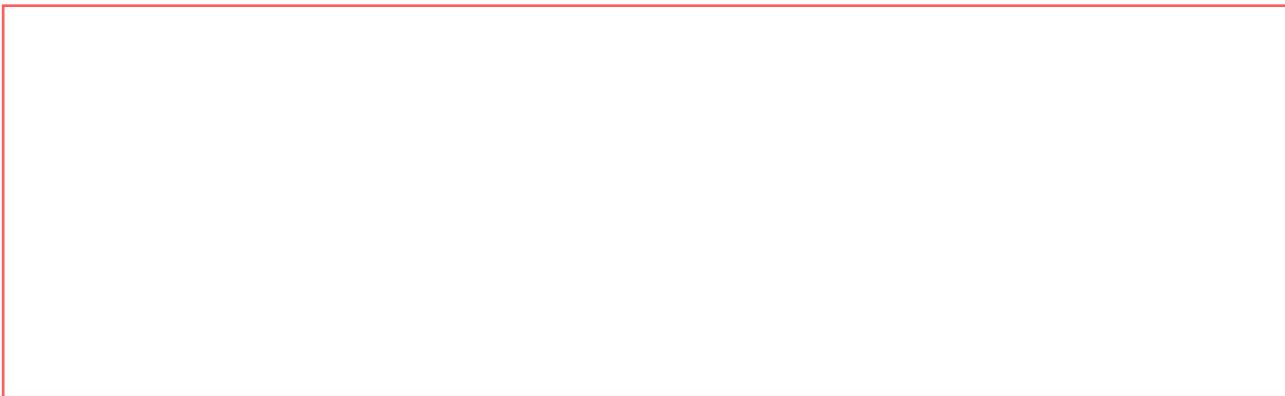

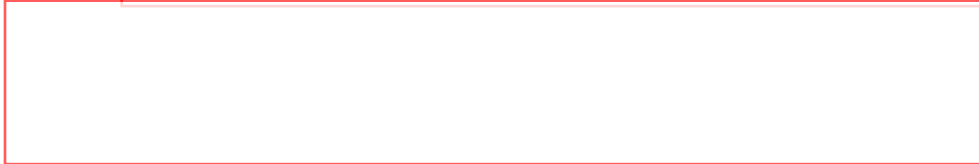

Today he disclosed to the NCH worker that last night mother hit him once on the back and twice on the head, however having made this statement, he ran away and he is still missing. The police have been informed of Andrew's allegations and he has been reported missing. The SW has discussed last night's events with Andrew's mother who gave a different version of events. A CP investigation will proceed once Andrew has been found.

23.30 - Phone call from PC Brown (9024), Coupar Angus sub station. Andrew was at the above police station having been picked up at 31B Ainslie Gardens, Perth. He was refusing to go home in case he got hit.

00.45 - attended at Coupar Angus sub station.

Andrew became insistent that he would not return home and complained that his stepfather, Joe, had hit him and punched him 2 weeks ago. His social worker knows about the incident and it did not result in any bruising/injuries.

He also said that yesterday his mother slapped him on the head and back; he said that he did not have any injuries/bruising and did not need any medical attention. We pointed out to Andrew that having spoken to the NCH worker today, he should not have run away as this had prevented his SW investigating the allegation and helping him. We explained to him, that given the time of night and the fact that he was not injured, that he should come with us to see his mother to allow us to assess whether he was at risk this evening by returning home, bearing also in mind that A Park is pursuing the matter tomorrow.

Andrew eventually agreed to go home and became more relaxed when we arrived at the house. Mrs Murray presented as calm and co-operative and assured us that Andrew would not be hit by anyone. Advised her that Mr Park would make contact with the family tomorrow.

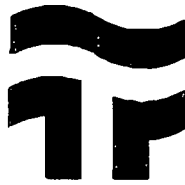

If everything goes well and it is planned for your child to stay with the Carers there is an agreement meeting where our child, the Carers and the social workers agree how long the placement will be for, and how the Carers will try to help your child. If possible, we would like you to take part in the agreement meeting to see what you can do to make the placement work.

Will I Keep in Touch with My Child?

We hope you will keep regular contact with your child and we expect Carers to encourage your child to keep in touch with you. Sometimes it can be very difficult seeing your child living in another family.

The plan for visits home or to Carers should be talked out with your child, the Carers and your social worker so that everyone knows where they stand. Visits can take place at your own home or at the Carers' home or elsewhere. It is usually best for everyone if visits to Carers are arranged beforehand - the Carers might, for instance, be planning to go out.

Phone calls and cards are other ways to let your child know you are thinking about and interested in him.

You will be invited to regular reviews on your teenager. We hope you will come to those reviews and help your child by discussing how he or she is getting on and what the next plans are for him or her.

Information for Parents

What is Mainstay?

It is a Scheme starting in 1985 to find homes for teenagers who are in care or are coming into care. Mainstay Carers are ordinary families who want to help teenagers by having them to live with their family for a while. This is to help them get ready for moving on to independence or to go home.

The Scheme is for young people between the ages of 11 and 16 who would like to live with a family but do not want a "new mum and dad". Carers aren't new "parents" but simply adults who can help teenagers with the things they may be finding difficult.

Why Mainstay?

Whatever the difficulties have been in your family, this time you and your child cannot live together. Because of this the Social Work Department or the Children's Hearing has to make the best plan it can for where your teenager is going to live.

For many teenagers living in a Children's Home or in a List D School does not prepare them for being an adult:

- they are not seeing and learning from being in a family;
- in a Children's Home it isn't easy to give them the individual attention they need to get over their difficulties;
- other kids can make them think they are "bad" because they are in a Home (so they may act that way).

For many teenagers, then, living with Carers is the next best thing to living with their own family.

What Kind of Families?

The families are all different. Some are old and some are young. Some have grown up children, some have young children, and some have no children at all.

All foster parents get allowances to cover the cost of looking after a child. In addition Mainstay Carers are paid a weekly wage for the teenagers in the Scheme. This is because it has always been difficult to find families willing to take teenagers, especially those with problems at school or in the home. By paying we can make sure we have Carers available to help teenagers, but we also ensure that none do it "just for the money". They are all interested in teenagers and want to work with them.

Does it Matter What I Think?

What you feel about a placement could make a big difference to your child -

- If your child thinks you are against the placement he or she can feel torn, confused and unhappy.
- If your child thinks you are in favour of the placement, even though it is hard for you, he or she may settle down better and may be able to sort out his or her problems.

Sometimes children come into care and go to Carers against the wishes of the parent. If you are against your child going to Carers, but everyone else (your child, the Children's Hearing, social workers) is in favour of it, the Social Work Department or Hearing would have to decide what seemed to be in the best interests of the child at the time.

Before your child moves in with Carers he or she will have some visits, called introductions, to see if everyone can get on. During this time, we hope you will be willing to meet the Carers.

- You may not have so many outings or trips organised for you.
- You would go to the local school.
- There will be one or two adults who will be around all the time.
- You would be living in a family home.
- You would have to try to get on all right with the whole family.
- You and the family would agree to work on certain problems.
- You stay with the family for an agreed length of time.

What Happens if the Placement Goes Wrong?

Sometimes placements will not work out. Perhaps the right Carers for you weren't suggested (it is hard to know if they will be right for you until you have lived with them full time). Or maybe you found it too difficult being in a new situation, keeping to family rules and so on.

If a placement hasn't worked but you still want to stay with Carers, we will try to place you with another family. As we are only just starting the scheme with a few families, we might not have another family straight away. But if not, you would be the first young person we would look at for any families that become free.

Information for Young People

What is Mainstay?

It is a Scheme starting in 1985 to find families for teenagers who are in care or are coming into care. Mainstay Carers are ordinary families who want to help teenagers by having them to live with their family for a while. This is to help you get ready for moving on to independence or to go home.

The families are all different. Some are old and some are young. Some have grown up children, some have young children, and some have no children at all.

They are all interested in teenagers like you, and want to work with them and are paid a wage for doing this.

Who is the Scheme for?

If you are aged 11 to 16 and would like to live with a family but do not want a "new mum and dad" Mainstay could be for you.

You may have some problems - at home, at school, getting along with others - but part of the Family Carers' job is to help you with things you find difficult. This means, if you wish, you could be considered.

How do I get on the Scheme?

If you are interested in going to a family, you and your social worker, and the person looking after you at the moment, fill in a form, describing you and suggesting how going to Carers might help you. You should know what other people have written on the form about you.

Then a family will be suggested for you. You and the family will be asked if you like the sound of each other. If you do, arrangements are made for you to meet. You can see them as much as you like before you and they decide if you could live together.

If you get a family and decide you don't want to live with them, we suggest another family. It is important to remember that you don't have to feel committed until you have met a family that you feel that will suit you.

If you and the family want to go ahead, everyone involved agrees how long the placement will be for, what the Carers will try to help you with, and what everyone agrees to do to try to make it work.

Usually you will stay with Carers for between six months and two years. If anyone wishes a placement to end before this, they should if possible give a month's notice - this means the Carer, social worker and the teenager. Plans can then be made for new arrangements.

What about my own Family?

Carers aren't "new mums and dads" - you will probably call them by their first names and they won't stop you from seeing your mum and dad, brothers or sisters. They won't push you to see them either.

When you stay with Carers you can either go and visit your family or your family can come and see you at the Carers' house, whichever is best.

Sometimes it can be hard for your own mum and dad if they know you are going to Carers. It is part of the Carers' job and your social worker's job to help your own family to see that Carers aren't taking their place.

What Difference will Mainstay Make to Me?

If you are already living in a Children's Home or List 'D' School, these are some differences you may notice:

Andrew began to give us cause for concern on his return after the summer holidays. He claimed that he had run away from home on several occasions, and presented as much less happy than usual. His attitude towards school began to deteriorate. He resented being part of the Special Needs Group and wanted to be treated "as normal". However, when left alone in class, he would not work unsupervised. He began to truant, often in the company of another boy, and on several occasions the police had to be called because they were outside the school causing a disturbance. Only on rare occasions did the nice side of Andrew show through.

A level 3 meeting was called which suggested a trial period at Blairgowrie High School. The next day, we received a phone call saying that Andrew really wanted to go to the Grammar School and would we have him back. However, on his return, his behaviour was impossible and he was suspended and told to go to Blairgowrie. Andrew has done this and claims to be settling in well to a mainstream timetable. We wish him well.

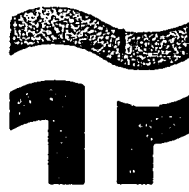

Report - Andrew J. Murray

Andrew started off well enough at the High School, however, there is already a pattern of behaviour developing which would give rise to concern. Andrew is a pleasant enough individual and when he addresses staff he seems logical as well as charming. He does however send out smoke screens to confuse issues and waste time.

Attendance

Andrew's attendance is poor. There are already several days where Andrew's absence is unaccounted for. He has not brought in any notes to explain absence nor has the school been contacted to record an illness etc. Andrew has regularly come in late and deliberately avoided registration. He wanders around the school at this time and whilst he may not go looking for trouble invariably this behaviour will lead him into trouble. When challenged he mis-informs the staff with stories such as "Going to matron" or "I'm looking for Mr. Allison to get a copy of my timetable!" Further his non-attendance at registration confuses his attendance record. It is difficult for a registration teacher to monitor attendance if the teacher never sees the individual. Andrew avoids being challenged about attendance by avoiding registration.

Matron

It has also been noted that Andrew regularly visits the school matron. Andrew it would appear does not keep good health. The symptoms do vary and the matron has a genuine concern for Andrew. In most instances though it does appear that Andrew is using matron as an excuse to take an extended break at timetable changeovers or to avoid class altogether. For all Andrew's visits to matron it should be noted he still has not brought in his medication. We have discussed the subject with Andrew on a number of occasions but he appears unwilling to come to some arrangement.

Discipline

Andrew has demonstrated the habit of walking out of school when challenged on an issue of discipline. Once with the Rector when being disciplined for truancy he walked out of school. On another occasion when being disciplined by a teacher for not being prepared for class he walked out of school. Clearly there are several issues that one could choose to address here. Interestingly enough on both these occasions he was not being disciplined individually: he was the only pupil who reacted in this manner, the others accepting the discipline. In Andrew's favour is that he went straight to Mr. Park, his Social Worker, to discuss the incidents and returned to school "repentant". He is going to have to learn to face up to his own responsibilities however.

In my first interaction with Andrew it was made clear he wanted to be treated like all pupils in his yeargroup. He did not want special attention, he did not want to be seen as different from any other pupil. Andrew has however attracted special attention to himself. His registration teacher, matron, assistant rectors and numerous other members of staff have identified who he is and regard him already as an individual who needs to be closely monitored.

To monitor his attendance at school I have arranged for Andrew to carry an attendance card. I have also asked the matron to record Andrew's visits and in particular brief visits where Andrew makes speedy recoveries. I would consider Andrew an individual who would benefit from some type of supervision order which would in some way attempt to address the issue of attendance and lateness, hopefully giving the school a clear line of communication to support Andrew.



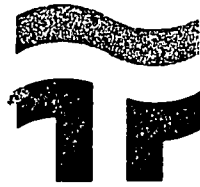

At the Extensive Community Assessment Andrew raised a number of issues. The social work department, N.C.H. and Andrew seem able to resolve the outstanding concerns. She had been speaking to Andrew Murray over the school lunch break when he informed of allegations against his mother, Vanda Murray - see 2 Referral. A Park not available himself at the time of telephone call. Message informed that Marion Dingwall would be making her way to Blairgowrie Social Work Office with request to telephone her there.

By 2.00 p.m. Marion was at Blairgowrie Social Work Office. A Park, social worker telephoned Blairgowrie Social Work Office and spoke with Stephen Mackay, Senior Social Worker and was brought up to date with Andrew's allegation about his mother.

22 February 2.22 p.m.

Stephen Mackay FAXED A Park to Pitlochry Office the reported account of allegations M Dingwall received from Andrew Murray when she met with him through the lunch break - see Detail back of Appendix B1.

A. Park arranged to make a home visit at approximately 3.30 p.m. to speak with Mrs Murray before going on to Blairgowrie High School to interview Andrew Murray about his allegations.

A Park telephoned Blairgowrie High School before leaving Pitlochry Social Work Office and spoke with Andrew's guidance teacher, Ross Allison, and requested that Andrew be detained at the school until A Park's approximate arrival at 4.00 p.m. When A Park arrived at Blairgowrie High School after speaking with Mrs Murray, Andrew was nowhere to be seen and he had not waited in school as requested by Marion Dingwall.

22nd February 4.30 p.m.

A Park went to Blairgowrie Social Work Office to update S Mackay
 and inform that Andrew's whereabouts was unknown.

By 5.00 p.m. Stephen Mackay had informed Sgt. H Gunn of Andrew's Murray's case and A Park had taken appropriate measures to inform Out of Hours Service and Coupar Angus police station of Andrew's disappearance, see FAX 23/02/95 time 08.32 to 08.34.

From the above FAX it can be seen that Andrew Murray was eventually located in Perth and brought back to Coupar Angus Police Station. Out of Hours Service was contacted and eventually persuaded Andrew to return to his home at 5 Kings Road in the early hours of 23.02.95.

A Children's Hearing was pre-set for 23.02.95 at 6.45 p.m. following Andrew being subject to Section 40(7).

a.m. 23 February 1995

A Park arranged to interview Andrew at his home regarding the allegations he passed to Marion Dingwall NCH. There was now additional allegations Andrew had disclosed to Out of Hours Service regarding his step-father Joseph Waddell, who Andrew maintained hit and punched him approximately two weeks previously - see Out of Hours Service FAX 23 February 1995 page 02. A Park planned to speak to Andrew at his home before driving Andrew, his mother and Joseph Waddell to the Children's Hearing at 6.45 p.m.

A Park contacted P.C. Brown, Coupar Angus regarding the allegations being made by Andrew and Andrew's return to 5 Kings Road.

23 February 1995 - 4.30 p.m.

A Park contacted Sgt. H Gunn to update him regarding situation, with a view to continuing joint investigation with Community Involvement on 24 February 1995 a.m.

23 February 1995 - 5.30 p.m.

A Park visited 5 Kings Road to give Andrew the opportunity to inform him of the allegations he was making concerning both his mother and Mr Waddell. Andrew clearly stated that he did not wish to speak of the allegations and that he was waiting to speak to the Children's Hearing. Andrew also stated before leaving Coupar Angus that he would refuse to return to his home at 5 Kings Road, as he no longer wished to be any part of that home.

A Park drove Andrew, his mother and Mr Waddell to the Children's Hearing in Perth. On the way Andrew had asked if he could have the opportunity to speak to the Panel on his own. Both his mother and Mr Waddell had indicated their acceptance to his request.

At the initial stage of the Hearing, A Park was asked if there was any unvoiced concerns regarding Andrew's safety which had not been addressed at the Hearing of 7 February 1995. A Park informed the panel of Andrew's disclosure of allegations to Marion Dingwall NCH with reference to his mother and additional concerns of allegations referring to his step father Mr J Waddell. At this venture the Reporter voiced her concerns regarding information given to her by Andrew prior to the Hearing. The Panel asked Mr Waddell and Mrs Murray if they were prepared to leave the Hearing in order that Andrew could feel more comfortable when stating to both the Panel and A Park, social worker, the allegations he was making against his mother and Mr Waddell - see Detail Report on 24/02/95 at Blairgowrie Social Work Office 12.30 p.m. where joint interview with Andrew Murray took place involving Cathy Gunn, Community Policing and Alastair Park, social worker.

Outcome of the Children's Hearing - decision reached by Panel members that Andrew remain on a 'Place of Safety' Order extended for a further 21 day period.

Andrew agreed to stay overnight 23 February 1995 at his aunt's (not blood related), Mrs Patricia Henvey, Rosebank Cottage, Balmoral Road, Rattray when alternative accommodation was found at James Street, Perth on 24 February 1995.

A.M. 24.02.95

A Park had made arrangements for a joint interview to take place at Blairgowrie H.S. involving himself, Kathy Gunn, C.I. and Andrew Murray at 11.30 am.

At 11.30 am A Park and K Gunn visit Blairgowrie H.S. to find that Andrew Murray had absconded from the school premises. A general scout round Blairgowrie town proved unsuccessful and A Park and K Gunn returned to Blairgowrie Social Work office.

12.20 am Andrew Murray comes into Blairgowrie S.W. office requesting to see A Park. Joint interview with Kathy Gunn took place at 12.30 pm. See Detail Report at back of App. B1.

Following the interview with Andrew Murray at approximately 2 pm Kathy Gunn arranged to liaise with PC Len Brailsford, Coupar Angus and to interview Mrs A Cadell, 22 Causewayend in connection with the allegations being made by Andrew against his mother.



From the evening 24.02.95 Andrew was to be placed at James Street Adolescent Unit over the weekend. His position was to be reviewed on the Monday 27.02.95 with a view to the earliest suitable return to his home setting.

Andrew absconded from the Unit on 26.02.95 at 7.15 pm. By 8.54 pm Andrew had been found by the police and taken to PRI as a result of the influence of some type of substance(s), see OOHS fax 27.02.95 time 8.31 am.

Date 28.02.95. Andrew is presently in Ward 11 PRI under observation. His mother is aware of his location and intending to visit.

This family have not been without chaotic circumstances, having obtained police escort out of their Easterhouse/Milton locations in Glasgow to housing in Old Muirton, Perth. [redacted]

Although Andrew's allegations regarding his mother were unsubstantiated, Mrs Murray has expressed her concern regarding her son's hostility in the home and the measures she may resort to in an attempt to regain control. [redacted]

Andrew is presently on a POS (40(7)) at home with his mother. Today he disclosed to the NCH worker that last night mother hit him once on the back and twice on the head, however having made this statement, he ran away and he is still missing. The police have been informed of Andrew's allegations and he has been reported missing. A CP investigation will proceed once Andrew has been found.

23.30 - Phone call from PC Brown (9024), Coupar Angus sub station. Andrew was at the above police station having been picked up at 31B Ainslie Gardens, Perth. He was refusing to go home in case he got hit.

00.45 - J Fullarton and L McLauchlan attended at Coupar Angus sub station.

Andrew became insistent that he would not return home and complained that his stepfather, Joe, had hit him and punched him 2 weeks ago. His social worker knows about the incident and it did not result in any bruising/injuries.

He also said that yesterday his mother slapped him on the head and back; he said that he did not have any injuries/bruising and did not need any medical attention. We pointed out to Andrew that having spoken to the NCH worker today, he should not have run away as this had prevented his SW investigating the allegation and helping him. We explained to him, that given the time of night and the fact that he was not injured, that he should come with us to see his mother to allow us to assess whether he was at risk this evening by returning home, bearing also in mind that A Park is pursuing the matter tomorrow.

Andrew eventually agreed to go home and became more relaxed when we arrived at the house. Mrs Murray presented as calm and co-operative and assured us that Andrew would not be hit by anyone. Advised her that Mr Park would make contact with the family tomorrow.

I am sorry that I am unable to attend the case conference on Friday 3rd March, and I send my apologies.

I have known Andrew for about 18 months, since he moved to Coupar Angus, and I know him and his family fairly well. I know that he has had quite a few problems, and has been seen by Alistair Park on numerous occasions. I also know that he has had many problems with schooling, and of course has moved from Perth to Blairgowrie. I know that recently he has made allegations of minor abuse against his mother and stepfather.

[REDACTED] Andrew's behaviour at times is certainly very poor and difficult, and he certainly has many problems. [REDACTED] He has, of course, run away from home on several occasions, and has been under supervision orders in the past. He, himself, has actually told me that he would rather be in care. [REDACTED]

Andrew has suffered from eczema and asthma since childhood, but these are not major problems at present. I gather he took a recent overdose, and was in Perth Royal Infirmary [REDACTED]

In summary [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] I am really not sure what would be the best course of action for him. However, he has obviously caused quite a lot of bother to both his family and various agencies. He is only 14, and obviously should still be attending school, if only even to learn some socially acceptable behaviour patterns. I would be interested to know the outcome of the case conference, and to receive a copy of the meeting.

(v) **Summary of discussion etc. (to be read in conjunction with all previous sections)**

Purpose of Meeting

Mr Napier welcomed members to the conference and reported on the present situation. He explained that Andrew had appeared at a Children's Hearing on 23 February 1995 and made allegations that he had been the victim of an assault at home.

The Children's Hearing decided that Andrew should remain on a Place of Safety order for a further 21 days. Following the Hearing Andrew went to stay with an "aunt" in Rattray overnight, and was found accommodation in James Street Adolescent Unit, Perth, the following day. He absconded from there and was picked up by the police and taken to PRI as a result of the influence of some type of substance.

On his discharge from hospital Andrew went home at his own request and that of his mother.

PC Gunn reported that Mr Waddell has no previous convictions involving children and said that she thought Andrew was embellishing the allegations.

Mrs Dingwall said that on the night of the Hearing Andrew made allegations that in the past he had seen his stepdad assault his mum with a broken bottle. She said that Andrew can present as a very unhappy boy.

Mr Napier said that there may well be a background of similar behaviour in the past within the family. Mr Park said he had spoken with Mr Waddell who had indeed admitted to him that he had hit Andrew in the past.

Mr Mackay said that over the past 6 months a lot of help has been offered to Andrew, but that he had failed to take this up. Mr Mackay also said that the family handled this present incident by telling Andrew's two sisters that he was away on holiday thus giving them the impression that he was being rewarded for his bad behaviour.

Mr Allison reported that Andrew has not been attending school, making all kinds of excuses. He is there in the morning, meets with Mrs Dingwall at lunchtime and is there to get the bus home in the evening, but does not attend classes. He has lunch tickets but never takes lunch.

At this point Andrew, Mrs Murray and Mr Waddell joined the meeting. Mr Napier made introductions and took apologies.

He explained that the conference was being held as the result of recent allegations made by Andrew at a Children's Hearing that he was the victim of an assault within the home. A Place of Safety Order was made and Andrew spent some time away from home while the allegations were being investigated.

Mr Napier said that the meeting would be looking at the findings of the investigation and would be hearing from the professionals and the family regarding the present situation. Following this two decisions would be made - 1) Whether or not there are sufficient grounds to warrant placing Andrew's name on the Child Protection Register, and 2) whether the matter will be referred to the Children's hearing.

2.1

Investigation

PC Gunn reported that she and Mr Park had spoken to Andrew on Friday 24 February when he made the allegations - one involving his mum which took place at Causewayend in Coupar Angus and two involving Mr Waddell at their home in Kings Road, Coupar Angus. These were investigated with Mrs Murray and Mr Waddell and although there was some substance to the allegations, there was insufficient evidence to prefer charges. Mrs Murray and Mr Waddell were given advice about the type of chastisement used against Andrew.

Mr Mackay said that he had accompanied Mr Park to meet with the parents to discuss their views about Andrew returning home and also to see Andrew in hospital. The parents wanted Andrew to return home and Andrew wished to go home. The family are still happy with this arrangement.

Andrew said that since he has returned home he has not been frightened as his parents have explained that they will not punish him in the same way again.

NCH

Mrs Dingwall reported that Andrew had made the allegations against his mother during a lunch time discussion and said that he intended running away. Mrs Dingwall persuaded him to stay in school and said that she would inform Mr Park of the allegations.

Mrs Dingwall is concerned that Andrew is due back at the Children's Panel in two weeks' time and that they are not nearly through the community assessment. Andrew has difficulty in working with one person and if he does not get what he wants he will move on to another person. Mrs Dingwall wishes to have Andrew's co-operation and explained to him that "in care" was not the appropriate place for him, and that he should be at home. They are presently giving Andrew individual support through the Rural Youth Project and this will continue.

School

Mr Allison stated that when Andrew was in school he did not attend Guidance or go to any teacher, but would go to the Social Work Department.

In future the system will be for a member of staff from the Social Work Department to bring Andrew to school and hand him over. Andrew has not been attending classes so far, but there is a support base for him when he returns to school. In the base he will carry out the same work as the other pupils, and within a week he should be attending classes occasionally. This will be increased with the intention of his returning full time to his class in around 4 - 6 weeks' time.

Andrew said he moved to Blairgowrie High School two weeks before Christmas and attended every day until the Christmas break. Since the holidays he has only gone for about a week. Mr Mackay said that since being put on a Place of Safety Order he has been taken to school each day but has not been attending classes, and Andrew said that he did not like attending Guidance as the other pupils call him a baby.

Mr Napier explained to Andrew that he is putting himself at risk by wandering around and that the school were now offering him a good system which would ensure his safety by being seen on a daily basis.

PC Gunn left the meeting at this point.

Health

Mrs Menzies said that Mrs Murray is a very caring mum, but there are a lot of difficulties with Andrew's behaviour at present.

Mrs Janssens said that when she worked in Coupar Angus, Mrs Murray came into the Health Centre on a number of occasions looking for help and in particular on an occasion when Andrew had run away. Andrew too attended to see the Practice Nurse about his Asthma and ventilator. Mrs Murray said that she found the Health Centre very good and very helpful.

Mr Napier read from a report supplied by Dr Greig which stated that apart from asthma and eczema, Andrew had no major health problems and that his problems came mainly from his behaviour and the family situation.

Home Situation

The family moved from Glasgow to Muirton in Perth but following disagreements with neighbours, were moved to Coupar Angus, where things have been better. When they initially moved to Perth all three children were on Supervision Orders. Andrew is now the only member of the family on supervision.

Overdose Incident

Mr Park reported that Mrs Murray had talked to him about Andrew's overdose of ventilin and said she is really worried about the way Andrew is putting himself at risk. Andrew has not had any lasting effect from the overdose, but at the time he was extremely ill. He did not say how he obtained the tablets.

Mr Napier asked Andrew why he took the substance and he said he did it because he did not care about anybody including himself.

School

There have been three attempts at setting up a Record of Needs, but this has never happened.

Andrew said he has friends at school but said he did not want to go about with the boys in Coupar Angus as they were always asking him to give them things.

Mr Mackay said that there is a lot of help available to Andrew but he has not taken this up, and he needs to know how to use the services offered.

Mrs Dingwall thinks that Andrew has a very low self-esteem and that NCH could help him with this and building up his confidence.

Summary

Mr Napier said that it was clear that there have been some issues at home when Andrew had been slapped and punished, and there is a degree of risk associated with them.

Andrew had demonstrated in a variety of ways that he had placed himself at risk in terms of running away, being absent from school and taking tablets, all of which is very alarming.

From the information being brought forward by other agencies there are concerns about Andrew's education.

2.3

The family's GP has concerns, but there are good supports available in Coupar Angus through the Health Centre, which the family make use of.

NCH have had regular contact with Andrew and this will continue.

The family's views are that since coming to Coupar Angus things have improved.

Child Protection Register

Mr Napier explained the function of the Child Protection Register to the family.

Mr Park said that he will be working with the family and supporting them in the Child Protection Register as people are aware of the concerns.

Mr Allison said that Andrew is putting himself at risk, but that Andrew himself is controlling the situation. Mr Allison felt unable to make a decision regarding registration.

Mrs Menzies said she was worried that Andrew might do the same again and would prefer to see his name on the Child Protection Register.

Mrs Janssens said that the family wished to comply with the services available and from that point of view she did not think that Andrew's name should be placed on the Child Protection Register. Also he is receiving help from the NCH Rural Youth Project, which will be ongoing.

Mr Mackay said that Andrew had in the past felt fears at home. The family's difficulties are usually in the evenings and at weekends and as the SWD would be looking at additional supports to try to assist Andrew to understand that help is available, he did not think Andrew's name should be placed on the Register.

The decision of the meeting was that Andrew's name will not be placed on the Child Protection Register.

Tasks

Social Work staff to remain in regular contact with the family and Andrew, and that Andrew should be seen on a weekly basis.

As part of an overall protection plan, Andrew should return to school as soon as possible and the school, as a means of helping him to secure his safety, is offering a support base. The Social Work Department will offer transport in the initial phase.

There is good support existing from health-care staff which will continue, and this is a local resource available to the family.

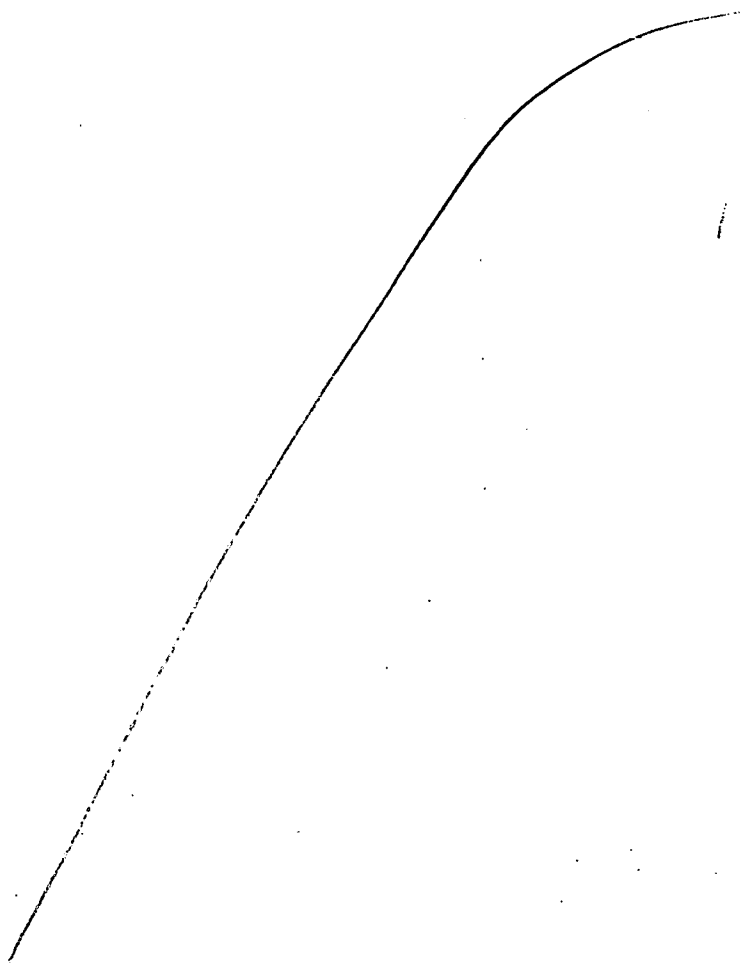
The NCH Rural Youth Project will be offering continued support through Mrs Dingwall.

Mrs Murray and Mr Waddell have given assurances that they will not use excessive physical force.

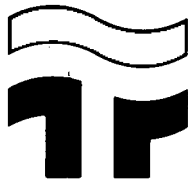

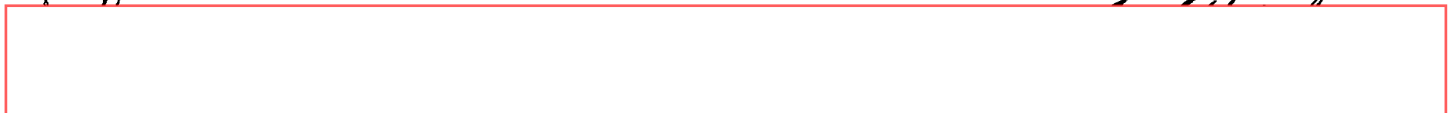

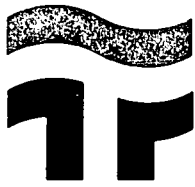

Andrew's difficulties were related to the meeting by his parents, by Mr. Park, and by Mrs. Dingwall.

Andrew and his parents apparently did not get on and Andrew was antagonistic to them. One evening things had deteriorated to such an extent, after allegations about incidents in the town (COOPAN ANGUS) that Andrew had spent the night in the JAMES STREET RESIDENTIAL UNIT in Perth.

It had been decided that some kind of contract regarding behaviour and attitude would be drawn up and signed by Andrew to get a fresh start made within the family home. Mrs. Dingwall and Andrew had produced this contract. Andrew now repudiated it.

Mrs. Dingwall said Andrew had almost no self-esteem at all, and felt no-one cared about him. Adults needed to make Andrew cared for. His mother said she was doing all she could to show she cared for him. Worrying about his whereabouts was evidence of this.

Andrew's reaction to all attempts to solicit his views was to say he did not care, or, he did not want this or that. He wanted to be left alone to do as he wished.

When the meeting turned to Andrew's problems in the school Mr. Dunlop recounted Andrew's history since he arrived mid-December from Perth Grammar School.

Andrew had done well up to Christmas which he regarded as a trial period. Thereafter, the habits seen by staff at Port Grammar School had reappeared. He would walk out of classes and out of school, often to reappear an hour or so later. He would often refuse to do any work. When put in the Individual Support Base he had deliberately given a lot of verbal abuse to the Teacher-in-charge, and been put out. This would "normally" have led to an EXCLUSION but Mrs. Dingwall had persuaded the school to hold back mention and keep Andrew in a place by himself until the meeting.

"In a full and frank exchange of views"; the case was put strongly by Mrs. Dingwall, Mr. Pat and Mr. Dingwall for Andrew to be kept in school meantime until there was a chance to consider a part-time timetable coupled with work-experience or some other activity. The Doctor, Mr. Allison and Dr. de Almeida explained the ~~case~~ inevitable effect of such an arrangement on academic progress: a choice would have to be made between Andrew's scholastic progress ~~and~~ with a full set of Standard Grades, and his social and behavioural progress in a part-time setting.

Conclusions: Andrew would remain in school meantime. He would be assessed by an Educational Psychologist. Later he might move to a three day week, with input on school days from Mrs. Dingwall and Mr. Craig. During Easter holidays, Andrew would get a few days at TEEN RANCH, Ballinacorney House, Inchtive. Part of his experience would be with horses with the possible intention of making that kind of thing his work experience.

Blairgowrie High also phoned to say Andrew's behaviour in the base had been very negative this morning and he had been verbally abusive to a teacher and very disruptive. The Rector was considering exclusion.

28.3.95 - Met Andrew at school. Andrew working on school work. Little discussion about home. Discussed practical issues re. Teen Ranch and residential.

30.30.95 - Residential.

- Session 2. Why are we here?
What do we want to achieve?
Rules to enable us to do this.

4) Andrew doesn't feel comfortable with Joey's generally aggressive behaviour to others when under the influence of alcohol. He states Joey talks of "guys getting wide" with him and of his threats (Joey's) to other men (incident at swimming pool).

5) Andrew has concerns about his Mum's relationship with Joey - "They mouth off at each other".

- 3) Mrs Murray has informed me that the fears Andrew has expressed are in general accurate. She cited an aggressive outburst on Tuesday 4 April by Joey which resulted in police involvement after which she and the girls ended up in homeless accomodation overnight.

In conclusion of this sub-section I feel it is important to voice Andrew's worst fear which is that Joey will get drunk and kill someone. Again this is Andrew's perception and I cannot evidence this.

Community

Andrew continues to feel bored in Coupar Angus. His low self esteem perhaps gives him difficulties in establishing and retaining true friendships. Alastair Park and I witnessed an attempt by Andrew to attract the attention of some older boys passing his house. His approach was loud and exaggerated and outwith our experience of his usual demeanour. This is an area as yet unresolved. Perhaps as Andrew grows in self esteem and receives nurturing and guidance this will change. David Craig's role has eased this issue but I do not feel will resolve it long term as Andrew needs to develop social skills in relating to his peers. This is an area perhaps for ongoing work. Related to this was offending and running away. To my knowledge Andrew has been involved in or accused of two incidents re offending -

- 1) Damage to lights at the Health Centre - no charges.
- 2) Obtaining and smoking hash - no police involvement.

Andrew again to my knowledge has not run away since February 1995.

School

The last term has been fraught at school. Andrew stated during the residential that it is difficult to be good at school when things are so bad at home.

This coupled with his low self worth and learning difficulties due to absences must make concentration and ability to apply himself very difficult. Andrew responded well to my individual input in the school and whilst I accept this as probably not feasible in the long term is something to note and build upon.

Andrew has also stated he wishes to go back to school properly ie. be in normal classes and be seen to be like everyone else. This was acknowledged and put back to him that this can only happen if he behaves like everyone else. The difficulty here is creating a home environment which will afford him this chance to try this out.

However the more Andrew relaxed with me and developed a trust in our relationship the more I saw his potential. I can honestly say I have no difficulty with Andrew's behaviour when I am with him. He is eager to please and flourished through positive attention. During the residential this was very evident and I believe the message of acceptance allowed for him to look at his situation as a whole and voice the good and the bad bits about his life. Over the assessment period I have noted the following -

1) Andrew responds well to positive attention and in return becomes eager to please.

2) Andrew responded well to the positive male role model contact he had with Alastair through football, stone throwing competitions and board games. He has a healthy competitive streak, however states he does not share any activities like this with Mr Waddell.

3) Andrew has very firm male/female stereotype beliefs. He avoided washing up and tidying during the residential and made a clear statement that this was women's work - this is related in my belief to his identification of seeing being asked to help at home as a problem.

Andrew has many positive attributes and I feel that through stability in his life and increased nurturing these can perhaps help Andrew shake off the negative labels he has accepted as true.

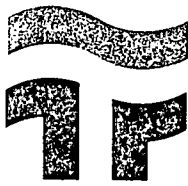

Report for ICA Meeting 18th April 1995.

Andrew Murray ; - DOB 19/09/80

I first met Andrew on the 20th March at which time he was refusing to return to the family home, and indeed he spent that evening in James Street residential unit. My role was identified as offering some support to Andrew outwith office hours to help maintain the home situation and offer some respite to both him and his family.

I have subsequently seen Andrew on five occasions and have been with him in school, social, and family settings. Andrew relates well to me and has been able to discuss issues quite readily.

The current situation at school is obviously quite boring to Andrew and not meeting his needs. The day that I visited him at school (on the afternoon of the 23rd March, following the Level 3 meeting) he was finding it difficult to concentrate and apply himself to completing any formal work. This was not helped by the distraction of having to move from the hall to the foyer as another class required the accommodation. Andrew seemed intent on just walking out as he felt that he was wasting his time. I spent most of my visit encouraging him to make the best of the imperfect situation in order to move forwards to one more suited to himself and the school's needs. I had the distinct impression that my presence was a convenient distraction for Andrew who "pushed the right buttons", about walking out, to avoid completing course work.


Socially I have found that Andrew enjoys the one to one attention that he has been afforded. Andrew expects to be taken out but has made no unreasonable demands for extraordinary activities. He has been happy to go swimming, for a short ramble, and a drive in the car. Andrew is good company possessing a sense of humour and enjoying conversation over a range of subjects. When with me he has always behaved in a socially acceptable manner, although his tales of his exploits with his peers would suggest that this is not always the case. Andrew talks of a group of friends with whom he spends his free-time and seems to derive the most pleasure from activities which are a little risqué. Whether or not this is indeed the case or bravado I have, as yet, been unable to ascertain. Andrew talks of relationships with the opposite sex which seem to reflect the usual adolescent pattern; being short-lived and relatively unimportant. Andrew feels that it is important to have a "woman on your arm" to be normal.

In the family setting there is an obvious bond between Andrew and his mother, with each caring for the other. This does not, however, always translate into a particularly good or stable relationship. Andrew openly ignores his mother's requests and advice and seems to feel that he should have complete autonomy in his own

life. This puts obvious strains on the home situation with Andrew feeling that his mother interferes and Vanda feeling ignored and unappreciated.

Andrew openly admits to being afraid of Joey, particularly when he has been drinking, fearing that he will be physically admonished for any misdemeanours (real or perceived). Andrew's feelings about Mr. Waddell are quite complicated; he blames Joey for the family's removal to Coupar Angus which is a place that he says he does not like. Andrew also feels responsible for some of the family disputes between Joey and Vanda, feeling that they arise when they adopt different ways of trying to deal with him. The above allied to his fear of being on the receiving end of Joey's aggression make it a difficult relationship. This is exacerbated by Joey being unable or unwilling to believe that Andrew has any cause for concern. Having seen, first hand, Mr. Waddell behave aggressively both to members of the public and Vanda whilst intoxicated I do feel that Andrew is justified in feeling concerned.

I have found Andrew to be quite insightful and able to discuss some of the above problems and even possible solutions in a quite mature manner. This gives me considerable hope for the future. At present, however, Andrew finds it difficult to carry through the suggested solutions when faced with real-life situations and quickly reverts to his "natural" behaviour. I feel that work should continue in trying to raise Andrew's self-esteem and in helping him to develop his own coping mechanisms which he can use when faced with future stressful situations. I also feel that there will be a continued need for respite both in a planned and emergency basis if the home situation is to be maintained.

INTRODUCTION

This final assessment meeting was held in conjunction with a Level 3 meeting (see separate form YS1).

This minute should be read in conjunction with the detailed ICA report which clearly sets out the issues which were addressed as well as the process of the assessment.

The assessment commenced on 10 February 1995. Mrs Dingwall and Mr Park have jointly undertaken the ICA; Mrs Dingwall working individually with Andrew and Mr Park with Andrew's family.

DISCUSSION

Mrs Dingwall stated that the main issue arising throughout the assessment was Andrew's low self esteem. However during the residential Andrew showed his potential and how happy he can be. Taking into account Andrew's low self esteem, Mrs Dingwall looked at the 3 main areas with Andrew.

There are serious concerns for Andrew's situation in the house when Joey has been drinking and how Andrew copes with this. Andrew's relationship with Joey is quite poor and he has stated in the past that he doesn't want to call Joey 'dad', and it was acknowledged that Joey doesn't see himself as Andrew's father. Andrew wants to be at home and be happy there with his mother. He has protective feelings towards his mother and doesn't like when he sees his mother being verbally abused.

Within the community, Andrew finds it difficult to keep close friends. Mrs Dingwall felt that in helping Andrew feel better about himself this may enable him to establish and keep friends.

Andrew has expressed his wish to return to normal schooling, in class with his friends but he knows he is a long way from this and has to do a lot of work. Mrs Dignwall felt that Andrew's low self esteem makes him feel he cannot cope at school, therefore he becomes disruptive. Andrew has stated that when the home situation is difficult he finds it hard to behave and concentrate.

Mrs Dingwall added that she has concerns for Andrew's physical safety and emotional needs. When Joey is drinking the situation at home can become very aggressive and potentially violent for Andrew and his sisters.

Mrs Murray agreed with Mrs Dingwall's comments.

Mr Park stated that Mrs Murray recognises the home situation becomes difficult when Joey is drinking and this was evidenced by an incident where she left the family home with the girls due to the potentially violent situation. There are general concerns for the family and the difficulties within the home. When there have been suggestions of violence, this has always been in relation to the drink element or when Joey has been under the influence of substances.

Over the past 3/4 weeks there have been 2/3 occasions which highlighted Mrs Murray managing more herself and being more 'up front' that Joey has something to do with the problems within the house, whereas in the past Andrew tended to be scapegoated for the problems.

Mrs Murray stated that Joey has said he does not want anything to do with Social Workers and he is not interested. Mr Craig has witnessed Joey being aggressive but feels that Joey cannot see that there is a problem or is unwilling to admit this. Joey appears to think that Andrew should know he is safe however this is not the case. Mr Park felt that these issues need to be addressed with Joey. Joey is also a registered drug user and is being weaned off drugs. Mrs Murray stated that Joey is currently on 1ml of methodone per day but he also takes alcohol to help ease the pain and make him sleep. Occasionally, Joey misses his methodone then takes it the next day.

Mrs Dingwall advised that Mrs Murray feels she needs to be more confident about herself to enable her to make decisions. Mrs Dingwall felt that Mrs Murray and Joey's relationship was strong but Mrs Murray has said that once the girls are grown up she is leaving. Mrs Murray is now looking for help and support in building up her self confidence.

Mr Park stated that alternative resources have been looked at and there is a possibility of shared care, with Andrew spending time in a Mainstay placement. This has been discussed with the Mainstay team and there has been a suggestion of a potential carer being identified for Andrew. It was noted that Joey drinks on Mondays, Tuesdays and occasionally Wednesdays, the rest of the time Andrew feels safe because Joey is not drinking. Andrew stated that he did not know how he felt about Mainstay. Mr Dingwall explained the process of the scheme.

Clearly there are issues in terms of how Andrew operates within the community. Mrs Dingwall stated that Andrew has acquaintances rather than friends and has few close relationships with his peers but he is quite friendly with someone at school. Mrs Dingwall was surprised to see how different Andrew acted when he was talking to them and he was trying to act 'the big man'. Mrs Dingwall felt that by acting in this way, this gets him into trouble and he becomes out of his depth.

There was an incident at the Health Centre where Andrew had smoked a joint however he was not charged with any offence. Mrs Dingwall was surprised at this because Andrew has very strong views about taking drugs and alcohol. Mrs Dingwall reported that Andrew has not run away since February, however Andrew informed the meeting that he ran away on Sunday for about half an hour.

Mrs Dingwall has a trusting relationship with Andrew and individual work with him will continue in relation to his low self esteem and home circumstances. There may also be a possibility of Andrew attending an NCH group in future.

Mr Craig advised the meeting that he has been taking Andrew out for walks, swimming etc. Andrew always appears happy when on these outings and takes part in any activities. Mrs Dingwall noted that Andrew really enjoys positive attention and she has had no behaviour difficulties with him. Mr Craig also stated that he has had no behaviour problems with Andrew. Andrew takes part in discussion and has a sense of humour.

School

Mr Dingwall noted that at the Level 3 on 23 March, professionals were concerned that Andrew may not be able to fit back into school. A short term programme was set up in school which was supported by Mrs Dingwall and Mr Craig. Mr Allison stated that this situation was not ideal however positive things happened although there were times when Andrew could not be accounted for. Mr Allison felt that Andrew has to make the decision to buy into school and go into the support base at the onset. Mr Dunlop stated that Andrew will probably have to drop French now as he has missed so much which reduces him to 7 Standard Grades. Andrew has also missed out on his practical subjects.

In the past Andrew has said he didn't want to be at Blairgowrie High. However Mrs Dingwall felt that because Andrew was feeling so down, he did not want to be anywhere. Through ongoing work, Andrew has now expressed his wish to attend Blairgowrie High School. Andrew stated that he doesn't like school in general.

Mr Dingwall noted that the plan is for Andrew to return to the school, initially returning to the support base, which will build in support from NCH. Then after a few days, Andrew will gradually move into mainstream classes, with the support of the base. Hopefully this process will take around 4 weeks to have Andrew back full time in mainstream classes. Mr Dingwall advised that a further meeting in terms of practical support will be held in a few days. Mr Kaye offered his support to Andrew if he wishes to discuss anything with him.

It was agreed that Andrew would return to school tomorrow (19.4.95). Mrs Dingwall agreed to take him there and meet with Mr Dunlop prior to Andrew going into the support base.

FUTURE SOCIAL WORK INVOLVEMENT

It was noted that Ms Courtney is to be taking over the case from Mr Park in the next couple of weeks. Over the past few weeks, Ms Courtney has been co-working with Mr Park and will become involved gradually.

CONCLUSION

Mr Dingwall noted that the ICA has highlighted the problems in relation to Joey's alcohol abuse, his relationship with Andrew and his aggressive behaviour. Joey is not prepared to work with staff whether he accepts the problem or not. Therefore it was felt that at times, Andrew is at risk

(Mondays, Tuesdays and occasionally Wednesdays) when Joey is drinking. The possibility of shared care with Mainstay Carers is to be pursued. As regards school, Andrew will return tomorrow initially attending the support base with a view to gradual re-integration to mainstream classes. Mrs Dingwall will continue to work individually with Andrew on his self esteem and home circumstances. Mr Craig's input is also still available.

RECOMMENDATIONS AND AGREED TASKS

Mainstay placement to be pursued with a view to Andrew having shared care, Mondays, Tuesdays and occasionally Wednesdays.

(SWD/Andrew/Mother/Mainstay Carers)

Andrew to return to school tomorrow, initially to the support base, with a view to returning to full time mainstream classes.

(Blairgowrie High/Andrew)

Mrs Dingwall is to take Andrew to school tomorrow and meet with Mr Dunlop prior to Andrew joining the support base

(NCH/Blairgowrie High)

NCH are to support Andrew whilst he attends the support base within the school

Mr Park stated that alternative resources have been looked at and there is a possibility of shared care, with Andrew spending time in a Mainstay placement. This has been discussed with the Mainstay team and there has been a suggestion of a potential carer being identified for Andrew. It was noted that Joey drinks on Mondays, Tuesdays and occasionally Wednesdays, the rest of the time Andrew feels safe because Joey is not drinking. Andrew stated that he did not know how he felt about Mainstay. Mr Dingwall explained the process of the scheme.

Clearly there are issues in terms of how Andrew operates within the community. Mrs Dingwall stated that Andrew has acquaintances rather than friends and has few close relationships with his peers but he is quite friendly with someone at school. Mrs Dingwall was surprised to see how different Andrew acted when he

was talking to them and he was trying to act 'the big man'. Mrs Dingwall felt that by acting in this way, this gets him into trouble and he becomes out of his depth.

There was an incident at the Health Centre where Andrew had smoked a joint however he was not charged with any offence. Mrs Dingwall was surprised at this because Andrew has very strong views about taking drugs and alcohol. Mrs Dingwall reported that Andrew has not run away since February, however Andrew informed the meeting that he ran away on Sunday for about half an hour.

Mrs Dingwall has a trusting relationship with Andrew and individual work with him will continue in relation to his low self esteem and home circumstances. There may also be a possibility of Andrew attending an NCH group in future.

Mr Craig advised the meeting that he has been taking Andrew out for walks, swimming etc. Andrew always appears happy when on these outings and takes part in any activities. Mrs Dingwall noted that Andrew really enjoys positive attention and she has had no behaviour difficulties with him. Mr Craig also stated that he has had no behaviour problems with Andrew. Andrew takes part in discussion and has a sense of humour.

School

Mr Dingwall noted that at the Level 3 on 23 March, professionals were concerned that Andrew may not be able to fit back into school. A short term programme was set up in school which was supported by Mrs Dingwall and Mr Craig. Mr Allison stated that this situation was not ideal however positive things happened although there were times when Andrew could not be accounted for. Mr Allison felt that Andrew has to make the decision to buy into school and go into the support base at the onset. Mr Dunlop stated that Andrew will probably have to drop French now as he has missed so much which reduces him to 7 Standard Grades. Andrew has also missed out on his practical subjects.

In the past Andrew has said he didn't want to be at Blairgowrie High. However Mrs Dingwall felt that because Andrew was feeling so down, he did not want to be anywhere. Through ongoing work, Andrew has now expressed his wish to attend Blairgowrie High School. Andrew stated that he doesn't like school in general.

Mr Dingwall noted that the plan is for Andrew to return to the school, initially returning to the support base, which will build in support from NCH. Then after a few days, Andrew will gradually move into mainstream classes, with the support of the base. Hopefully this process will take around 4 weeks to have Andrew back full time in mainstream classes. Mr Dingwall advised that a further meeting in terms of practical support will be held in a few days. Mr Kaye offered his support to Andrew if he wishes to discuss anything with him.

It was agreed that Andrew would return to school tomorrow (19.4.95). Mrs Dingwall agreed to take him there and meet with Mr Dunlop prior to Andrew going into the support base.

Future Social Work Involvement

It was noted that Ms Courtney is to be taking over the case from Mr Park in the next couple of weeks. Over the past few weeks, Ms Courtney has been co-working with Mr Park and will become involved gradually.

Conclusions: Mr Dingwall noted that the ICA has highlighted the problems in relation to Joey's alcohol abuse, his relationship with Andrew and his aggressive behaviour. Joey is not prepared to work with staff whether he accepts the problem or not. Therefore it is felt that at times, Andrew is at risk (Mondays, Tuesdays and occasionally Wednesdays) when Joey is drinking. The possibility of shared care with Mainstay Carers is to be pursued. As regards school, Andrew will return tomorrow initially attending the support base with a view to gradual re-integration to mainstream classes. Mrs Dingwall will continue to work individually with Andrew on his self esteem and home circumstances. Mr Craig's input is also still available.

Mr Dingwall made introductions. He noted that today's meeting was a final ICA meeting and a Level 3 meeting. Due to difficulties raised during the ICA and at the Level 3 meeting on 23 March 1995 it was decided to combine both meetings.

The initial ICA meeting on 16.2.95 identified three main areas and attendant issues:

1 Home

Andrew feels there are "sometimes" problems at home and he doesn't like doing as he is told

Andrew's relationship with Joey

Andrew's running away

2 Community

Andrew is bored - he needs activities

Offending behaviour

Running away

Andrew gets the blame for things

3 School

School are unsure where Andrew is during the day as his attendance card is not signed

Andrew's attendance

Andrew alleged he was assaulted by a member of staff

Andrew rejecting additional support offered to help him catch up

Andrew didn't want to go to Blairgowrie High School

Mrs Dingwall and Mr Park have jointly undertaken the ICA; Mrs Dingwall working individually with Andrew and Mr Park with Andrew's family.

Mrs Dingwall stated that the main issue arising throughout the assessment was Andrew's low self esteem. However during the residential Andrew showed his potential and how happy he can be. Taking into account Andrew's low self esteem, Mrs Dingwall looked at the 3 main areas with Andrew.

- 1 There are serious concerns for Andrew's situation in the house when Joey has been drinking and how Andrew copes with this. Andrew's relationship with Joey is quite poor and he has stated in the past that he doesn't want to call Joey 'dad', and it was acknowledged that Joey doesn't see himself as Andrew's father. Andrew wants to be at home and be happy there with his mother. He has protective feelings towards his mother and doesn't like when he sees his mother being verbally abused.

2 Within the community, Andrew finds it difficult to keep close friends. Mrs Dingwall felt that in helping Andrew feel better about himself this may enable him to establish and keep friends.

3 Andrew has expressed his wish to return to normal schooling, in class with his friends but he knows he is a long way from this and has to do a lot of work. Mrs Dignwall felt that Andrew's low self esteem makes him feel he cannot cope at school, therefore he becomes disruptive. Andrew has stated that when the home situation is difficult he finds it hard to behave and concentrate.

Mrs Dingwall added that she has concerns for Andrew's physical safety and emotional needs. When Joey is drinking the situation at home can become very aggressive and potentially violent for Andrew and his sisters.

Mrs Murray agreed with Mrs Dingwall's comments.

Mr Park stated that Mrs Murray recognises the home situation becomes difficult when Joey is drinking and this was evidenced by an incident where she left the family home with the girls due to the potentially violent situation. There are general concerns for the family and the difficulties within the home. When there have been suggestions of violence, this has always been in relation to the drink element or when Joey has been under the influence of substances.

Over the past 3/4 weeks there have been 2/3 occasions which highlighted Mrs Murray managing more herself and being more 'up front' that Joey has something to do with the problems within the house, whereas in the past Andrew tended to be scapegoated for the problems.

Mrs Murray stated that Joey has said he does not want anything to do with Social Workers and he is not interested. Mr Craig has witnessed Joey being aggressive but feels that Joey cannot see that there is a problem or is unwilling to admit this. Joey appears to think that Andrew should know he is safe however this is not the case. Mr Park felt that these issues need to be addressed with Joey. Joey is also a registered drug user and is being weaned off drugs. Mrs Murray stated that Joey is currently on 1ml of methodone per day but he also takes alcohol to help ease the pain and make him sleep. Occasionally, Joey misses his methodone then takes it the next day.

Mrs Dingwall advised that Mrs Murray feels she needs to be more confident about herself to enable her to make decisions. Mrs Dingwall felt that Mrs Murray and Joey's relationship was strong but Mrs Murray has said that once the girls are grown up she is leaving. Mrs Murray is now looking for help and support in building up her self confidence.

BACKGROUND:

Mrs Courtney explained that over the last two months the possibility of a shared care arrangement was being investigated. However, Andrew came into care under Section 15 on 14 May as an emergency arrangement due to the situation at home being quite volatile. After four days he returned home but the discussion regarding shared care continued.

On Monday evening 5 June the situation at home deteriorated when Andrew was assaulted by Joey Waddell. Andrew left the house and went to friends at 16 Kings Road who informed OOHS. The police were already involved. Mrs Murray was also assaulted and taken to Blairgowrie Cottage Hospital where she received treatment for a wound to her leg. Mr Waddell has been charged with the assault of Andrew and Mrs Murray together with Breach of the Peace.

Andrew remained at 16 Kings Road overnight and the following day went to Mr and Mrs Anderson. Mrs Courtney obtained a Place of Safety Order from Sheriff Wheatley and at a Children's Hearing this morning the Order was continued for a further 21 days.

Andrew has now been with Mr and Mrs Anderson for four days and says he is happy there.

HEALTH:

Andrew was given a medical at Drumhar Health Centre on Wednesday when nothing untoward was discovered. However, his carer had to take him to PRI on Wednesday night suffering from chest pains. Andrew was given an Xray and a thorough check and Mrs Dingwall advised that there is the possibility of internal bruising as a result of the assault.

Andrew has asthma and is supposed to use a preventative inhaler. He has concerns about using this. Mrs Murray advised that Andrew experimented with hash a few weeks ago and suffered a panic attack and the doctor had to be called. Since then he has not used his inhaler. He is afraid that it might not be the right inhaler for him and may have a damaging effect. It was suggested that Andrew should have a chat with Mr Anderson's GP about this.

Mrs Anderson said that Andrew seemed to be a picky eater but Mrs Murray advised that this is not normally the case.

LEISURE:

Andrew had a game of golf with his carer but has been taking it easy since he went to PRI but hopes to have another game at the weekend.

Mrs Dingwall advised that Andrew is wanting to save his money to buy a bike but NCH have agreed to loan him a bike for a short time. It will need some work and Mr Anderson agreed to help Andrew with this.

CONTACT WITH FAMILY:

Andrew would like to see his mother and sisters but only if Mr Waddell is not present. As Mr Waddell is living in the family home it was agreed that access would take place elsewhere. It was agreed that access could be tied in with school times and will be supervised by Social Work or NCH staff. The details have still to be worked out but it seems likely it will be arranged on a twice weekly basis. This will be reviewed at the start of the school holidays.

SCHOOL:

Andrew will continue to attend Blairgowrie High School, at least until the school holidays. It had been hoped to have combined this meeting with a Level 3 meeting but unfortunately no representative could attend from the school. Mrs Courtney will be in touch with the school regarding a date for the Level 3 meeting to take place before the school holidays.

Andrew is being transported to and from school by members of Social Work Department and NCH staff.

AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

It was agreed that regular Network Meetings should be held to co-ordinate the roles and tasks. Mrs Dingwall will be maintaining her involvement with Andrew as will David Craig who has been involved with Andrew for the last two months.

CLOTHES & PERSONAL ITEMS:

Andrew has obtained his clothes, etc, from home but he does need some new clothes and these will be obtained for him. Mr Le Blanc is to arrange funding for this.

PLACEMENT AGREEMENT:

The Mainstay Placement Agreement is to be completed following this meeting.

TASKS & DECISIONS:

- 1 Andrew is to remain with Mr and Mrs Anderson meantime.
- 2 He is to continue to attend Blairgowrie High School until at least the end of this term.
- 3 Access is to be arranged on a twice weekly basis with his mother and sisters outwith the home and will be supervised by Social Work or NCH staff.
- 4 Andrew is to discuss the use of his inhaler with the GP.
- 5 Andrew is in need of clothes and Mr le Blanc is to obtain funding for this.
- 6 Regular Network Meetings are to continue.
- 7 A Level 3 Meeting is to be convened before the end of term.
