**Network Meeting - 26th April at Colonsay Resource Centre re Andrew Murray**

General discussion took place re Andrew's behaviour over past few days. He had stolen a works van on Tuesday and now has an estimated 65 charges pending. Andrew was then taken away for two days to a Unit in Creiff by residential staff. This had been pre-arranged to give Nacha a break from Andrew's difficult behaviour.

Discussion then centred around a number of current issues.

- 1) Andrew's membership of Car Project. Some concerns expressed re group make up as Andrew is friendly with a number of group members and had stolen the work van with one group member. Agreed that Andrew should attend Group and that he should be informed that this is not his choice as it is a requirement of his Supervision Order.
- 2) Agreed that Jake Munro and Dave Craig are identified as the two residential workers who will deal with Andrew. A programme of times were agreed for the next month (copies of rota to be circulated by Alan Keep).
- 3) Roles and tasks were identified for each set of workers and mainstay carer. The roles and task for Nacha, Rosie and Isla (NCH) are as agreed on 1st April. (see attached).
- 4) Role for residential staff is to:-
  - i) Make referral to the 'Give & Take' Project for Andrew and discuss with him.
  - ii) Discuss careers options with Andrew
  - iii) Jake and Dave to discuss offending behaviour. NCH pack to be used and Jake will discuss pack with Catriona.
  - iv) Residential Staff will help Andrew with exam revision.

Andrew Murray joined meeting and was informed of above.

Meeting to discuss present situation regarding Andrew Murray, currently placed with Nacha in a Mainstay placement. A secure accommodation place had been found for Andrew on Friday, 19th April, at Rossie School. However, Service Manager, John Gilruth and W Frew, Head of Child Care, had decided that Andrew had not met the criteria for admission to secure accommodation on that date.

Andrew had been looked after over the weekend by residential staff and his Mainstay Carer. He had absconded on a number of occasions and had threatened Nacha with a glass bottle (unbroken). In the absence of John Gilruth, Line Manager for the case, Rhod Napier decided that this did not sufficiently change the circumstances of the case and he felt that this did not change the decision that Andrew did not meet the criteria for a secure accommodation place. Nacha was asked to decide whether he felt he could continue to care for Andrew and it was agreed that the package of support from residential staff should be continued and increased to provide support to the mainstay placement.

A further meeting continued with A Pennycook, R Adams, Nacha and Alan Keep and a programme of support was agreed including two overnights for the coming week.

A further Network/Planning meeting was called for Friday, 26th April.

Roles and Tasks Meeting re Andrew Murray - 1st April 1996

Identified Areas of Concern

3 APR 1996

- Stealing cars.
- Andrew's manipulation through behaviour to get what he wants and also at times using this as a way of trying to punish people, e.g. threatening to run away and steal cars / going to Nacha's friends house when he doesn't get what he wants.
- The need for Andrew to understand what he has control over / does not have control over.
- The need for Andrew to have more self-control.
- The need for Andrew to understand the choices / consequences of his behaviour - linked to accepting responsibility for his actions.
- Feelings about mum and why Andrew cannot live with her at present.
- Andrew's low self-esteem - needs to feel good about things other than driving cars.

Roles and Tasks

Agreed overall aim of Programme of Work is to maintain Andrew in the community as an alternative to Residential Care / Secure Accommodation.

Nacha - Cases

- Re manipulation - agreed Andrew should not be using Nacha's friends when he doesn't get what he wants.
- Continue to point out choices and consequences of actions to Andrew.
- Continue to work on building up Andrew's self-esteem.
- Encourage Andrew to stick to agreed access arrangements.

Isla - Youth Worker

- Meet with Andrew individually every week and also consider for another boys group.

To work with Andrew on the following issues;

- Manipulation through behaviour.
- What Andrew has / does not have control over.
- Self-control.
- Choices / consequences of behaviour / accepting responsibility for actions.

- Feelings re mum / also some focus on actual access e.g. when is access good / not good - how does Andrew affect this.
- Self-esteem.

Rosie - Social Worker

- Visit Andrew fortnightly.
- Continue to support placement and address current issues Andrew raises re this.
- Possible joint work with mum linking into work with Andrew re feelings about mum.
- Liaise with Mainstay Support Worker.

Andrew also to attend Muirton car Project as per Condition of Supervision Order.

Agreed fortnightly Network Meetings including Andrew would be helpful at present.

Andrew has been in the care of this department since June 95, in contract fostering. He has recently been absconding and stealing motor vehicles. He now meets the requirements for secure accommodation.

4. The focus of work to be undertaken whilst in secure.

There have been a number of areas identified as needing to be addressed with Andrew. These include self-esteem self control, feelings re relationship with mother, how Andrew manipulates through his behaviour.

5. Information regarding the young person's educational history. Has the child been statemented under Sec. 5 of the 1981 Education Act? If so give details with current school and contact person.

Andrew's school attendance has been poor recently. He was only in school on a reduced timetable. As his standard grade exams begin in May (if he decides to sit them) it was agreed that he did not need to attend ~~and~~ could remain at home rather than ~~was~~ wandering the streets during the day.

6. If the child has spent time in a secure unit within the last 28 days please give details.

7. If there has been any plans regarding placements in secure units in the past, what were the circumstances?

There were concerns raised following the second incident of Andrew stealing a car, that secure accommodation may become necessary. A plan of work was then agreed (see enclosed Roles and Tasks Map dated 1st Apr 96)

8. A copy of the Care Plan for the young person, details of family history, previous placement reports, recent review reports, latest planning meeting and placement reports with recommendations, absconding and offending history.

Elm Unit is a small, five bedded, mixed unit based on a firm philosophy of working within therapeutic principles. We will NOT offer a place on a holding basis and usually require at least 28 days to engage the young people in the work required. There is a school on site and expect young people to attend. Remand placements will only be considered where there are clear areas of work to be undertaken. If we consider a case to require long term work we will usually not offer a place.

## INTRODUCTION

This final assessment meeting was held in conjunction with a Level 3 meeting (see separate form YS1).

This minute should be read in conjunction with the detailed ICA report which clearly sets out the issues which were addressed as well as the process of the assessment.

The assessment commenced on 10 February 1995. Mrs Dingwall and Mr Park have jointly undertaken the ICA; Mrs Dingwall working individually with Andrew and Mr Park with Andrew's family.

## DISCUSSION

Mrs Dingwall stated that the main issue arising throughout the assessment was Andrew's low self-esteem. However during the residential Andrew showed his potential and how happy he can be. Taking into account Andrew's low self esteem, Mrs Dingwall looked at the 3 main areas with Andrew.

There are serious concerns for Andrew's situation in the house when Joey has been drinking and how Andrew copes with this. Andrew's relationship with Joey is quite poor and he has stated in the past that he doesn't want to call Joey 'dad', and it was acknowledged that Joey doesn't see himself as Andrew's father. Andrew wants to be at home and be happy there with his mother. He has protective feelings towards his mother and doesn't like when he sees his mother being verbally abused.

Within the community, Andrew finds it difficult to keep close friends. Mrs Dingwall felt that in helping Andrew feel better about himself this may enable him to establish and keep friends.

Andrew has expressed his wish to return to normal schooling, in class with his friends but he knows he is a long way from this and has to do a lot of work. Mrs Dignwall felt that Andrew's low self esteem makes him feel he cannot cope at school, therefore he becomes disruptive. Andrew has stated that when the home situation is difficult he finds it hard to behave and concentrate.

Mrs Dingwall added that she has concerns for Andrew's physical safety and emotional needs. When Joey is drinking the situation at home can become very aggressive and potentially violent for Andrew and his sisters.

Mr Park stated that alternative resources have been looked at and there is a possibility of shared care, with Andrew spending time in a Mainstay placement. This has been discussed with the Mainstay team and there has been a suggestion of a potential carer being identified for Andrew. It was noted that Joey drinks on Mondays, Tuesdays and occasionally Wednesdays, the rest of the time Andrew feels safe because Joey is not drinking. Andrew stated that he did not know how he felt about Mainstay. Mr Dingwall explained the process of the scheme.

Clearly there are issues in terms of how Andrew operates within the community. Mrs Dingwall stated that Andrew has acquaintances rather than friends and has few close relationships with his peers but he is quite friendly with someone at school. Mrs Dingwall was surprised to see how different Andrew acted when he was talking to them and he was trying to act 'the big man'. Mrs Dingwall felt that by acting in this way, this gets him into trouble and he becomes out of his depth.

There was an incident at the Health Centre where Andrew had smoked a joint however he was not charged with any offence. Mrs Dingwall was surprised at this because Andrew has very strong views about taking drugs and alcohol. Mrs Dingwall reported that Andrew has not run away since February, however Andrew informed the meeting that he ran away on Sunday for about half an hour.

Mrs Dingwall has a trusting relationship with Andrew and individual work with him will continue in relation to his low self esteem and home circumstances. There may also be a possibility of Andrew attending an NCH group in future.

Mr Craig advised the meeting that he has been taking Andrew out for walks, swimming etc. Andrew always appears happy when on these outings and takes part in any activities. Mrs Dingwall noted that Andrew really enjoys positive attention and she has had no behaviour difficulties with him. Mr Craig also stated that he has had no behaviour problems with Andrew. Andrew takes part in discussion and has a sense of humour.

### **School**

Mr Dingwall noted that at the Level 3 on 23 March, professionals were concerned that Andrew may not be able to fit back into school. A short term programme was set up in school which was supported by Mrs Dingwall and Mr Craig. Mr Allison stated that this situation was not ideal however positive things happened although there were times when Andrew could not be accounted for. Mr Allison felt that Andrew has to make the decision to buy into school and go into the support base at the onset. Mr Dunlop stated that Andrew will probably have to drop French now as he has missed so much which reduces him to 7 Standard Grades. Andrew has also missed out on his practical subjects.

In the past Andrew has said he didn't want to be at Blairgowrie High. However Mrs Dingwall felt that because Andrew was feeling so down, he did not want to be anywhere. Through ongoing work, Andrew has now expressed his wish to attend Blairgowrie High School. Andrew stated that he doesn't like school in general.

Mr Dingwall noted that the plan is for Andrew to return to the school, initially returning to the support base, which will build in support from NCH. Then after a few days, Andrew will gradually move into mainstream classes, with the support of the base. Hopefully this process will take around 4 weeks to have Andrew back full time in mainstream classes. Mr Dingwall advised that a further meeting in terms of practical support will be held in a few days. Mr Kaye offered his support to Andrew if he wishes to discuss anything with him.

It was agreed that Andrew would return to school tomorrow (19.4.95). Mrs Dingwall agreed to take him there and meet with Mr Dunlop prior to Andrew going into the support base.

### **FUTURE SOCIAL WORK INVOLVEMENT**

It was noted that Ms Courtney is to be taking over the case from Mr Park in the next couple of weeks. Over the past few weeks, Ms Courtney has been co-working with Mr Park and will become involved gradually.

### **CONCLUSION**

Mr Dingwall noted that the ICA has highlighted the problems in relation to Joey's alcohol abuse, his relationship with Andrew and his aggressive behaviour.

Therefore it was felt that at times, Andrew is at risk

(Mondays, Tuesdays and occasionally Wednesdays) when Joey is drinking. The possibility of shared care with Mainstay Carers is to be pursued. As regards school, Andrew will return tomorrow initially attending the support base with a view to gradual re-integration to mainstream classes. Mrs Dingwall will continue to work individually with Andrew on his self esteem and home circumstances. Mr Craig's input is also still available.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS AND AGREED TASKS

Mainstay placement to be pursued with a view to Andrew having shared care, Mondays, Tuesdays and occasionally Wednesdays.

(SWD/Andrew/Mother/Mainstay Carers)

Andrew to return to school tomorrow, initially to the support base, with a view to returning to full time mainstream classes.

(Blairgowrie High/Andrew)

Mrs Dingwall is to take Andrew to school tomorrow and meet with Mr Dunlop prior to Andrew joining the support base

(NCH/Blairgowrie High)

NCH are to support Andrew whilst he attends the support base within the school

(NCH/Mrs Dingwall/Andrew)

Mrs Dingwall to continue working with Andrew on an individual basis, with the possibility of Andrew attending a group in the future

Events leading to Reception into Care

05.06.95 - Early in the evening Andrew contacted O.O.H.S. to say his parents were drunk and that his step-father had put him out of the house. P.C. Brailsford from Coupar Angus was contacted by O.O.H.S. and he visited the house. Mr Waddell was drunk and asleep. Mrs Murray was sober. Andrew agreed to stay at home.

23.40 pm O.O.H.S. had a further phone call from [redacted] to say Andrew was in their house and he was saying that Mr Waddell had assaulted him. The Police were in attendance at this time. Andrew remained at [redacted] overnight.

Mr Waddell had woken up and became aware that Andrew had been in contact with both O.O.H.S. and the Police. He became violent and assaulted both Mrs Murray and Andrew.

Andrew was punched in the face and his glasses were broken by Mr Waddell. [redacted]

Mr Waddell was arrested and taken to the Police Station where he remained overnight. [redacted]

Andrew remained for part of the day with Mrs Duffy and spent the latter half of the day with David Craig, Resource Worker.

Given the extent of the assault on Andrew, a management decision was taken to seek a Place of Safety Warrant. This was obtained from Sheriff Wheatly at Perth Sheriff Court on 6th June 1995 at approximately 2.15 pm by A. Courtney, Social Worker, and Stephen Mackay, Senior Social Worker.

Andrew is due to be medically examined on 7th June 1995. Report will be furnished at the Hearing.

Andrew and his family have been involved with the Social Work Department for some time. Allegations of physical abuse by Mr Waddell towards Andrew in February of this year resulted in a Child Protection Investigation and Andrew being subject to Section 40 (7) of the Social Work (Scotland) Act. Andrew was also in P.R.I. in February, having been found by the Police in Perth, under the influence of some type of substance which was later identified as Ventolin.

Recent Concerns

Aileen Courtney assumed case responsibility from A. Park in May 1995. Due to concerns for Andrew's safety expressed by Social Work Department and N.C.H. worker, Marion Dingwall, it was agreed with A. Park, Social Worker, that a Mainstay Placement would be pursued for Andrew. This was agreed with management and a "shared care" arrangement was to be planned. This would mean that Andrew would be with an identified Mainstay Carer during what was considered vulnerable times for him, i.e. when Joey Waddell was drinking and he would be at home at other times. This was to be a voluntary agreement under Section 15 Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968.

However, on Monday, 15th May, Andrew was received into care under Section 15 for a respite placement for four days. At this juncture Mrs Murray was saying that she didn't want Andrew in the house any more and said that she had hit him. Andrew did not support or deny this.

Andrew returned home on Friday 19th May. The situation at home had calmed down. Mr Waddell was, according to Mrs Murray, going to ignore Andrew and have little or nothing to do with him. Plans for Andrew's reception into Mainstay proceeded and a possible family identified.

Over the past two weeks since Andrew returned home, the situation has deteriorated. Mrs Murray has expressed to A. Courtney that she didn't want Andrew in the house anymore.

This would allow for an assessment period of the home situation and the risks to Andrew in this situation.

**Events since last Hearing - 09.06.95**

Since the Hearing on 09.06.95 when the Place of Safety Warrant was renewed for 21 days Andrew has remained with approved carers [redacted] at Glenalmond. To date Andrew has settled well and he has responded well to the way life is run in the [redacted] household. He is in the process of developing a relationship with [redacted] in particular with [redacted] with whom he enjoys activities such as swimming and golf.

Andrew has been transported to school everyday at Blairgowrie. However although he is in the school premises most of the time it is clear that he is not attending all his classes. He maintains he doesn't like being in school.

It would be my opinion that Andrew has, due to other events in his life, developed a different sense of priorities for himself. However, I feel that as life settles for Andrew work can be done with him on the importance of his education therefore possibly breaking this cycle of avoidance and non-attendance.

**Child Protection Case Conference**

A Child Protection Conference was held at Colonsay Resource Centre on Monday 19th June. Andrew's name was not placed on the At Risk Register. It was felt at that time that as Andrew had been removed from the house and has at present no contact with Mr Waddell, placing his name on the register would not ensure his safety to a greater degree than other measures already in force.

**Future Plans**

Future plans are that Andrew remains with [redacted] He has indicated that he is happy to do so and [redacted] feel Andrew is doing well with them.

Andrew's education for next term is under discussion at present. If he is to remain at Glenalmond for some time an alternative school will need to be looked at for various reasons, one of which is distance.

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**Update Report - Andrew Muray, DOB 19.09.80**c/o  Glenalmond

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Over the summer holidays it will be important that both Andrew and Mr and Mrs Anderson have support. With this in mind David Craig SCO and Marion Dingwall NCH will also be involved. Andrew will also spend a week at Teen Ranch.

**Access**

To date access visits have been twice weekly Monday and Friday after school. However, during the summer holidays this can be more flexible. Andrew has met with his mum on Monday and with his mum and sisters on Fridays. These visits have gone well. Access is outwith 5 Kings Road and is supervised at present.

**Conclusion and Recommendations**

Since his reception into Care Andrew has settled well. There are a number of issues which need to be addressed over the coming months.

1. Assessment of Andrew's position within the household at Kings Road.
2. Assessment of the viability or not of Andrew's rehabilitation there considering Mr Waddell's presence in the home and potential risks.
3. Andrew's own views on the above.
4. Assessment of Andrew's relationship with his mother and the promotion of their relationship in a positive way.
5. Andrew's relationship with his sisters.
6. Considering the above points and their outcome, long term plans for Andrew will need to be made.
7. Education - provision of education for Andrew which takes account of his needs and what has been lacking due to his absences from class.

It is with the above points in mind that I would respectfully recommend that Andrew be made subject to a 44(1)(a) Named Place Supervision Order with the following Conditions.

1. No contact at present with Mr Waddell.
2.  to be Andrew's carers at present - however with some discretion by the Social Work Department in relation to a possible move in care for holidays.

**Current Situation**

Andrew was placed on a Section 44 (1) (a), naming [redacted] as his carers since the Hearing on 28th June 1995. The placement has not been without its difficulties but these have been manageable. It was agreed at an In-care Review on 15th November 1995 that Andrew would remain in the care of [redacted] on a longer term basis, as it had become increasingly unlikely that he would be able to return home. At this time it was agreed that regular respite should be arranged every 4/6 weeks. Unfortunately there were no mainstay carers available to offer this respite and although arrangements were made for Andrew to attend Teen Ranch in Inchtute, this is not scheduled to take place until 23rd - 25th February 1996.

On Monday, 29th January, Andrew visited the author and stated that he did not wish to return to [redacted] as he was not happy there. He stated that he had fallen out with [redacted] on Friday evening and again this morning. He said that there had been a number of problems for sometime with his relationship with [redacted] but he had felt unable to say so before. He quoted a number of incidents when he felt [redacted] was being unreasonable although he was able to acknowledge that he was equally as responsible for some of the difficulties that have occurred in his relationship with [redacted]. It was agreed at this time that we would meet with [redacted] and their Mainstay worker to attempt to resolve some of these issues. Andrew was informed that it would not be possible to move him that day but if he wished, he could give us 28 days notice of his wish to terminate, as agreed in the placement contract. Following discussion [redacted] said that they would like Andrew to stay and were willing to attempt to resolve any differences but should Andrew decide that he did not wish to continue the placement, they would continue to care for him until an alternative placement had been identified.

It was agreed at this time that attempts would be made to offer respite for the forthcoming weekend.

Andrew visited the author again twice during that week complaining about what was happening in the placement. He was again informed that he could not be moved until another placement had been found. Andrew gave his assurances at this time that he would work with [redacted] over the next few weeks.

Andrew went for his respite with Mr P O'Mairthini on Friday, 2nd February and returned to [redacted] on Sunday, 4th February. However, due to the weather conditions he was not able to get back to Glenalmond from school and returned to Mr O'Mairthini's care on Thursday, 8th February 1996.

Following this period of respite, Andrew asked if he could have a full time placement with Mr O'Mairthini. It was agreed that this would be discussed but that he needed to return to the care of [redacted] at present. On Thursday evening following a disagreement with

[redacted] Andrew went to Perth to see Mr O'Mairthini and stated that he was not going to return home. He was, however, returned to [redacted]'s care by the Police. Arrangements were then made for him to have a further period of respite care with Mr O'Mairthini from the 9th - 11th February, 1996. Prior to Andrew leaving for his respite on Friday, he would appear to have provoked an argument with [redacted] and due to this, it was agreed that Andrew should remain in Mr O'Mairthini's care until Tuesday, 13th February, in order to ascertain whether there would need to be some changes to the original plan.

[redacted] have now said that given Andrew's behaviour and his clear objective to move from the placement, they do not feel they can continue to care for him. Andrew has, therefore, been transferred to Mr O'Mairthini's care with effect from today under Section 44 (6).

It is anticipated that Andrew will be placed with Mr O'Mairthini on a full time basis but this has yet to be explored more fully and agreed by all concerned. A meeting to discuss this has been arranged between Mr O'Mairthini, his Mainstay worker, the author and the social worker of the other young person currently residing with Mr O'Mairthini for Tuesday, 13th February 1996 at 3.00 pm.

### Conclusion

It had been anticipated in November 1995 that Andrew would remain with [redacted] on a longterm basis, given the unlikelihood that he would be able to return home. At this time it was acknowledged that periods of respite would be beneficial. Unfortunately this has not been possible and the first arranged date for respite is 23rd-25th February 1996.

On 29th January Andrew informed the author that he no longer wished to continue his placement with [redacted] as he was unhappy there. It was agreed at this time that he would give 28 days notice to terminate the placement but would continue to be cared for by [redacted] until this time had elapsed and in the interim periods of respite for the weekends would be arranged. It had been hoped at this time that the placement could still be salvaged. However, it became obvious by Thursday, 8th February that this was no longer the case. Although the plan remained that Andrew would still be cared for by [redacted] until the 28 days had expired.

Andrew expressed a wish to reside with Mr O'Mairthini on a longterm basis and this possibility is currently being discussed. Due to Andrew's behaviour, [redacted] have now said that they cannot continue to care for Andrew and he has now been moved to the care of Mr O'Mairthini under Section 44 (6).

Social Work/NCH Involvement

The author has scheduled meetings with Andrew on a fortnightly basis during school lunch hours. In addition to this, there has also been quite a bit of ad hoc contact when Andrew has come to the Social Work Office to discuss issues which he feels cannot wait until our next scheduled meeting. We have also recently attended Movement in Care and In-care Review meetings, in addition to a contract meeting.

Andrew has recently begun contact again with Isla McDonald from NCH. This has been primarily to address issues regarding Andrew's feelings about [redacted] and the breakdown of his placement with them. It was hoped that doing this work would prevent Andrew discussing these feelings at length with Mr O'Mairthini. It appears that Andrew has been doing both, which has created some friction between himself and Nacha.

Andrew recently informed the author that he visited [redacted] while at Glenalmond on his work placement last week and that this visit was successful.

Andrew's Current Placement

Andrew states he is happy in his placement with Mr O'Mairthini and wishes to remain in his care. His behaviour, however, does not always portray this wish. He is clearly testing out the boundaries Mr O'Mairthini is placing on him. An example of this was Andrew taking Mr O'Mairthini's car and driving it around Perth in the small hours of Monday morning (18th March 1996) before returning it to the same spot in the drive. Andrew was accompanied by the other young person staying with Mr O'Mairthini and a family friend. All three had sneaked out of the house after having all gone to bed. This only came to Mr O'Mairthini's attention when the Police informed him that they had seen his unsecured car a few miles from his home. They have agreed that they will not charge Andrew on this occasion but would leave Mr O'Mairthini to impose sanctions on Andrew. [redacted]

School

The voluntary driver Andrew had received to take him back and forward to school was stopped in early January. This was in order to give Andrew more responsibility for himself and his school attendance. He initially travelled to school by bus two mornings a week and was collected two mornings a week (due to his timetable) and got the bus back to Perth four days a week. His placement at Glenalmond College has continued and he is transported back and forward there by a voluntary driver. This plan originally worked very well and Andrew was taking responsibility to get himself to and from school at the times expected.

This situation has recently changed and his attendance at school has been poor. On the days that he is taken to school, he goes in and then leaves. This would appear to coincide with the issuing recently of report cards. Andrew received very poor grades and despite the narrative stating Andrew could achieve higher grades if he applied himself, he was unable to see this in any positive light.

It had been hoped that it may be possible to arrange an extended period of work experience for Andrew. However, Glenalmond are not in a position to offer anything other than one day per week.

Mr O'Mairthini is attempting to encourage Andrew to attend school regularly but despite it seeming that Andrew is attending, it has on occasions later come to our attention that Andrew has not, in fact, been in school.

Access with Family

Andrew was having regular access with his mother every Wednesday afternoon at the Social Work Office in Blairgowrie. This changed when his mother left her partner, Mr Waddell [redacted] [redacted] Since this time Andrew has been having more frequent contact with his mother and it has recently reached a stage where he is spending time there without Mr O'Mairthini's or his mother's prior knowledge. In order to resolve this situation, it was proposed that the author would meet with them to look at a clear plan for access. This plan was not agreed, however, as Andrew was refusing to cooperate, stating that he no longer wanted any further access with his mother or sisters.

In the author's opinion Andrew was taking this attitude as he was upset at his mother stating at a Departmental In-care Review two days before that she did not think it would be possible for Andrew to return to her care as soon as she obtained alternative accommodation.

The author would support Mrs Murray's view that an immediate return to her care is not an option at present. Andrew was made aware that the department's position on this is that he was outwith his mother's control prior to his reception into care and, given his recent behaviour, there is nothing to suggest that this situation has changed.

[redacted] [redacted] It is still hoped that Andrew will change his mind about regular access to his mother and that once she has her own tenancy that overnight access could be an option. However, this will not be within the next few weeks. Andrew struggles with this, as he always wants everything to happen now and thinks he can force people to see his point of view or do things at his pace which is what I suspect he hopes to gain by refusing to see his mother at the moment.

Andrew had recently recently re-established his contact with his Uncle Chris in Glasgow. This had led to a number of disagreements between Andrew and [redacted] as he was insisting he should be allowed to visit every weekend. This would appear to have occurred on two occasions, remaining overnight on Saturday, 27th February, following his initial visit with his mother on Wednesday, 17th January. This only came to the attention of the author during a meeting with the carers and Andrew on 29th January. When Andrew moved to Nacha's, it was made clear that he would not be allowed to visit his Uncle unless on a planned basis and that this could not be on an overnight basis. With the agreement of his mother, arrangements were made for Andrew to visit his Uncle Chris on Saturday, 2nd March, with the clear understanding that he should return on the evening of the 2nd March. Andrew did not return, as agreed, and was eventually collected by Nacha late on Sunday, 3rd March. Andrew maintains he had good reason for this change in plan, citing his mother's difficulties with her partner on the evening of Saturday, 2nd March. His mother maintains that she attempted to discourage Andrew from becoming involved.

On Tuesday, 5th March, following a telephone call from his Uncle Chris, Andrew eventually confided in Nacha that on Saturday evening a 32 year old female guest of his Uncle Chris had sexual intercourse with him against his will. His Uncle Chris has contacted the Police in Strathclyde who interviewed this woman and requested Perth Police to take a statement from Andrew. Andrew was interviewed by the author and Pauline McDougall from C.A.F.S.E.S. on Thursday, 7th March. Andrew's statement will be sent to Strathclyde Police for them to ascertain whether or not a crime has been committed. From the description of events given by Andrew, it would appear that although he was actively encouraged by this woman, this act did not take place against his will. These events have clearly brought the suitability of him having access to his Uncle Chris's home into question and he has now been informed that any access to his Uncle Chris can only take place if his Uncle Chris visits him in Perth and does not have sole responsibility for Andrew during the visit.

Future Plans

It is proposed that Andrew will be referred to the Muirton Youth Car Project to help him deal with his fascination with cars. It is anticipated that the meeting to begin the first stage of this course will take place after the Easter holidays.

Andrew plans on leaving school as soon as possible which is after his exam leave in May this year.

Andrew has very unrealistic thoughts regarding this and thinks he will find work no problem, and has by his own description been pestering the staff at Glenalmond in an attempt to force them to take him on. Due to this, he is not engaging in discussion with the School Careers Officer.

Conclusion and Recommendation

The author has met with Andrew on a number of occasions since his move to Mr O'Mairthini's. Andrew has also recently resumed his contact with Isla McDonald from NCH, primarily to address some of Andrew's feelings about the breakdown of his placement with [redacted]

Andrew states he is happy in his placement with Mr O'Mairthini and wishes to remain in his care. He is clearly testing out the boundaries being placed on him. However, I have no doubt that Mr O'Mairthini has adequate experience and skills to address this behaviour.

In January Andrew began making his own way to school two days a week. Initially he responded well to this responsibility, however, since his report card was issued his school attendance has been poor. Attempts were made to increase his time at this work placement at Glenalmond. However, this has not been possible.

Andrew has had regular contact with his mother but this has recently got out of hand. In an attempt to resolve this situation it was proposed that an access plan be made. However, at this time Andrew was refusing to become involved because he said he no longer wanted further access with his mother and sisters.

Mrs Murray has recently stated that she did not think it would be possible for Andrew to return to her care. This department would support this view in the light of Andrew's behaviour. It is still hoped that Andrew will change his mind about access and that once she has her own tenancy, overnight access could be an option. However, this will not be within the next few weeks.

Andrew has recently re-established his relationship with his Uncle Chris in Glasgow. Events during this contact have brought the suitability of Andrew visiting his Uncle Chris into question. This has led to the decision that any future access with his Uncle Chris can only take place in Perth and with another responsible adult person.

Due to the recent incident with Mr O'Mairthini's care, it is proposed that Andrew be referred to the Muirton Youth Car Project to help him deal with his fascination about cars.

Andrew plans to leave school as soon as possible. He has unrealistic thoughts regarding finding work and has been pestering staff at Glenalmond in an attempt to force them to take him on.

The requirement to reside is subject to the discretion of the Director of Social Work to grant leave from time to time to enable him to engage in approved activities.

Subject to the discretion of the Director of Social Work and the agreement of the child/parent/guardian, the child may have respite care with other carers approved by the Social Work Department in terms of the Boarding Out and Fostering of Children Regulations (Scotland) Regulations 1985.

### Current Situation

Since the Hearing on 27th March 1996 Andrew's behaviour has been somewhat erratic and has been a cause for concern.

He has been going out without his carers permission and failing to return at his normal coming in times. On one occasion when Andrew was due to be cared for by residential staff, due to his carer being on holiday, he was missing from Saturday 6th April until midnight on Tuesday 9th April. During this time Andrew broke into the NCH Project stole the keys for their vehicles and subsequently stole two of their vehicles. During this time he drove approximately 375 miles and was charged with a total of 34 offences.

As a result of this behaviour Andrew was taken away by resource staff, who supervised him at all times, from Wednesday 11th April until Monday 15th April. During this time the author began making enquiries about the availability of a bed in secure accommodation. At this time there were no secure beds available in Scotland, however, Rossie did accept a referral regarding Andrew and placed him on their waiting list.

On Andrew's return arrangements were made for residential resource staff to be available to care for Andrew for an agreed period each week. These times covered periods when Mr O'Mairthini had other commitments and also gave him some respite. Andrew was informed that his movements would be restricted as he could not be trusted to be out on his own. During this week things were a little more settled although Andrew did abscond twice on 17th April. On one occasion he went to visit his previous carers and on the other he went to visit family friends now living in Perth. On the second occasion he had to be returned to Mr O'Mairthini's care with the assistance of the Police.

Mr O'Mairthini reported that when Andrew was in his care he was constantly threatening to run away and steal other cars, he was pacing the floor and was at times being abusive. As a result of this difficult behaviour it was agreed that residential staff should provide Mr O'Mairthini with increased periods of respite particularly over the weekend of 19th - 22nd April 1996.

On Friday 19th April Mr Roberts from Rossie contacted the author with the offer of a bed for Andrew from Monday 22nd April. At this time there was a management decision made that Andrew's behaviour did not, at present, meet the criteria of secure accommodation. Rossie agreed to retain the bed until Monday 22nd April if possible.

During the weekend Andrew's behaviour continued to be difficult and he absconded on three occasions, on the second occasion he remained out overnight. On three occasions police assistance was required to return Andrew to where he should be.

At a meeting on Monday 22nd April management indicated that this behaviour did not change the decision made on Friday in relation to secure accommodation. Rossie therefore took Andrew's name off their waiting list.

Following this meeting arrangements were made for Andrew to spend two days away with residential staff to give Mr O'Mairthini some much needed respite. Between this meeting and his time away Andrew absconded on two occasions and on one of these occasions stole a works van. He then went away for two and a half days, during which time there were no problems with his behaviour at all. Andrew also attended the first meeting of the Muirton car project on Thursday 25th April.

At a meeting on Friday 26th April a care plan for Andrew for the following four weeks was arranged. This would include input from residential resource staff, NCH, the author and Mr O'Mairthini. It is hoped that this plan will help Andrew look at various aspects of his behaviour and identify ways of modifying this where necessary.

During the weekend of 26th - 28th April Andrew remained solely in the care of Mr O'Mairthini as it was felt that his response on the previous two and a half days should be acknowledged and he should be given a little more trust. Andrew responded well to this and although persistently a little late his behaviour was not a problem.

When the author met with Andrew on Tuesday 30th April he was being very positive about his placement with Mr O'Mairthini and making all the right noises about what he needed to do, to turn things around before a Review Hearing, but also about what he needed to do to have his supervision order terminated to coincide with his sixteenth birthday.

However despite his apparent progress and positive attitude on Tuesday he absconded twice on Wednesday 1st May 1996. He did return of his own accord mid-afternoon and again at 3.15am. Mr O'Mairthini reported that he was very argumentative on his return complaining about the programme of work he is expected to do over the next few weeks and about the expectation that he will sit his standard grades.

Andrew informed Mr O'Mairthini that he had returned home as he was fed up looking for a car to steal, although he did say that there had twice been the opportunity to do so earlier in the evening but he had resisted.

Andrew has had very little contact with his mother over the last few weeks.

The author will be meeting with her this afternoon to discuss re-establishing their access.

As Andrew's behaviour is currently so erratic and unpredictable I am not at this time able to make a recommendation. I will however complete an update report with an overall conclusion and recommendation prior to the Hearing.

Andrew's behaviour has continued to be somewhat erratic. He absconded on 2nd May and was out overnight before being returned to his carer on 3rd May at 1.30 pm. He should then have spent the weekend with residential staff as his carer was due to be away for the weekend. He absconded from there and returned to his carer in the early hours of Saturday, 4th May, where it was agreed he could stay until the next day. He left on 5th May before his carer was up, having stolen a large amount of cash. Andrew was seen boarding a bus to Glasgow but repeated Police attempts to locate him were unsuccessful. On Tuesday, 7th May, Andrew returned to Perth driving his Uncle Chris's car, with Uncle Chris as a passenger. This resulted in a police car chase through Perth and for approximately 16 miles along the A9 before being blocked just outside Auchterarder.

Following this Andrew had a good week where he co-operated well with the work being done with him by Isla McDonald, NCH, residential staff and his carer. However, on the morning of Tuesday, 14th May, Andrew absconded before his carer was up, again stealing money. Andrew was apprehended on the evening of Wednesday, 15th May, where he had been involved, with a number of other young people, in a breach of the peace.

Following Andrew's return, it was agreed that there was not only a need to intensify the package of work being done with Andrew but also a need to isolate him in order to reduce the likelihood of him absconding. Since this time Andrew has worked with residential staff and Isla McDonald on a regular basis in an isolated farm cottage 2 miles from Alyth. It has been agreed that initially there was need to spend some time with Andrew carrying out an assessment of his perception of his current situation and what he thinks has led to the recent changes in his behaviour. It is proposed that from this information an intensive package of work will be carried out with Andrew in an attempt to help him change his recent behaviour. Andrew has at the time of writing agreed to work on both the assessment and the proposed package. (For further details of this, see the report completed by Isla McDonald).

As a result of Andrew's recent behaviour, his carer has reluctantly indicated that he will not be in a position to care for Andrew after 15th June 1996. However, in a discussion with Andrew on Friday, 17th May, he did agree to give some thought to reconsidering his position depending on Andrew's behaviour over the next few weeks.

Andrew has continued to attend the Muirton Car Project on a regular basis. I understand that they will be completing a report for the Hearing to outline the progress Andrew is making.

**Update Hearing Report - Andrew Murray, dob 10.09.80, 14 Ash Grove, Perth****Conclusion and Recommendation**

Since the Hearing on 27th March, Andrew's behaviour has been erratic and unpredictable. He has absconded on a number of occasions and has been involved in a number of offences concerning driving cars. It has been pointed out to Andrew that he is placing himself and others at risk by this behaviour. On some occasions he can acknowledge this and accept responsibility for his actions and at other times, he cannot. Following the incidents in early April consideration was given to this Department placing Andrew in secure accommodation. However, when a place did become available, later in the month, the decision was taken that he did not, at that time, meet the criteria for secure accommodation. It was agreed, however, that there was a continued need for Andrew to be involved in a joint package of care between residential staff and Andrew's carer. This has, on some occasions, been successful and Andrew has not only co-operated but has also become actively involved in the work being done by residential staff and Isla McDonald from NCH.

At a meeting on Friday, 17th May, it was agreed that a much more intensive package of work was needed and that Andrew also needed to be as isolated as possible. Since this time Andrew has worked with residential staff and Isla McDonald on an intensive assessment which it is proposed will inform an intensive package of work in an attempt to help Andrew change his recent behaviour. Andrew has agreed to work on both the assessment and the proposed package. Although it must be acknowledged that Andrew's co-operation in the past has been as erratic as his behaviour, it would seem that he is currently committed to becoming involved in this proposed package of work.

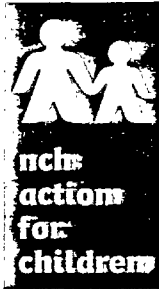
Andrew's current Mainstay placement is scheduled to terminate on 15 June 1996 although his carer may reconsider this position depending on Andrew's behaviour over the next few weeks.

Given Andrew's current agreement to work with residential staff and Isla McDonald on the proposed package, I recommend that the Hearing be continued for a period of four weeks to give him the opportunity to do so and to ascertain the position regarding Andrew's Mainstay placement.

### Reasons for Referral

Andrew was originally referred to the Project in February 1995 following a breakdown in family relationships, in particular Andrew's relationship with his mother's partner at that time, Joseph Waddell. This was coupled with increasing difficulties at school and in the community.

Andrew was again referred to the Project in February 1996 and April 1996. On the first occasion the reason for referral was to offer Andrew support to resolve some of the issues in relation to the breakdown of his mainstay placement. On the second occasion, the reason for referral was due to Andrew's recent behaviour.

### Programme of Work

#### February 1995 - June 1995

At the time of the initial referral, Andrew's home situation was very unsettled and family relationships were extremely difficult. A joint Intensive Community Assessment was undertaken to ascertain Andrew's future needs. Alongside recommendations to support Andrew at school and in the community, the main outcome of this assessment was that if Andrew could not feel 'safe' at home with Joseph Waddell, a 'shared care' package through mainstay would provide security for Andrew at identified times when he felt most vulnerable and scared. Unfortunately Andrew was received into care before this could be established following a serious assault on him by Joseph Waddell.

#### June 1995 - January 1996

The main focus of work during this period was to raise Andrew's self esteem and begin addressing some of the difficulties in relation to school and peer group relationships.

Over the summer period this included Andrew being involved in a residential survival week to raise his self esteem. This was then followed by involvement in the boys group to work on issues around peer group relationships and support the situation at school. Andrew found the peer group setting at that time difficult to manage and had to be withdrawn after attempting to establish his role in an inappropriate and aggressive manner.

The focus through individual work at that time was to assist Andrew to make links between his actions and the subsequent consequences in order for him to begin taking more responsibility for his behaviour.

Andrew Murray - D.O.B. 19.9.80

June 1995 - January 1996 cont

Latterly individual work also focused on issues around Andrew's reception into care as this increasingly caused Andrew a great deal of confusion and anger.

The conclusion from this work was that Andrew wished to remain with [redacted] (mainstay carers) and things became more settled. At that time it was agreed no further involvement with the project was necessary.

February 1996 - April 1996

Andrew was re-referred to the Project following the breakdown of his mainstay placement with the [redacted]. A short term programme of work was agreed which aimed to help Andrew resolve some of the feelings he had in relation to the breakdown of his placement so that he could move on. I met with Andrew on three occasions to do this work before the start of a difficult period at the end of March/beginning of April when Andrew was involved in serious offending behaviour including the theft of Project vehicles on two separate occasions.

[redacted]

[redacted] Andrew indicated to me himself on 25 March prior to stealing a Project vehicle the first time that he was upset and angry about not being able to live with his mother and felt like 'doing something' to get back at her. Andrew further stated he felt like 'running away' or 'stealing a car'.

April 1996 May 1996

At the beginning of April a new programme of work was agreed to address the current areas of concern. I then met with Andrew on three further occasions when the focus was on building up Andrew's self-esteem as a basis of a beginning to work on the other issues. Andrew was always willing to meet with me and be involved in this work, however things became disjointed when Andrew began absconding regularly. It was therefore agreed at a Network Meeting on 17 April 1996 that Andrew should be taken away and an intensive package of work put in place.

### Current Package of Work

The focus of the current package of work is to update the previous assessment and build a clearer picture around the current view that the main issues are related to Andrew's separation and loss of his mother.

So far Andrew and I have been involved in looking at his perceptions of his earlier life history and experiences. This has been developed through the use of a life map and an echo map which also begins to focus on future options. While Andrew's recollection of events is not too disrupted, he clearly does not have a coherent story about his life and has raised some very important questions about this. This work has also highlighted some misconceptions Andrew has about his mother and why he was received into care.

Andrew has identified four occasions when he describes very 'hurtful' feelings and which he continues to think about. Two of these occasions relate to the separation and loss of his mother, once when he was very young and again when he was received into care. The other two occasions are the breakdown of his mainstay placements.

The need for Andrew to have a coherent story about his life is directly linked to his ability to build and maintain relationships with carers. I believe Andrew's perceptions relating to the separation from his mother on two occasions has caused an inability to trust people and that Andrew currently believes that any care and love will be followed by loss. This follows the pattern of self-defeating behaviour which forces the breakdown of placements even though it is not necessarily what Andrew wants.

As well as continuing this work around assessment, the programme of work this week will continue to focus on Andrew's self-esteem and reinforce that he is a person of worth.

### Proposed Future Plan

Although the package of work in place is ongoing, a clear plan for future work is already beginning to emerge. Andrew has agreed to work with me on the 'hurtful' feelings he has described and this will form the basis of addressing the issues of separation and loss. This will be linked to building "Andrew's story" of his life, expanding his knowledge and correcting some of the misconceptions he has.

A crucial factor in the above work is the role of Andrew's mother, however as yet this has not been clearly established.

Proposed Future Plan cont

Andrew clearly wants to return to live with his mother, however at this stage further work is required on the possible future options.

In relation to Andrew's offending, he has stated a lot of mixed feelings through the assessment work. Andrew did show remorse about the consequences of 'stealing the Project vehicles and offered to repay the costs of the damage, however it is my opinion that the work already outlined requires to be done before any work on offending can be successful.

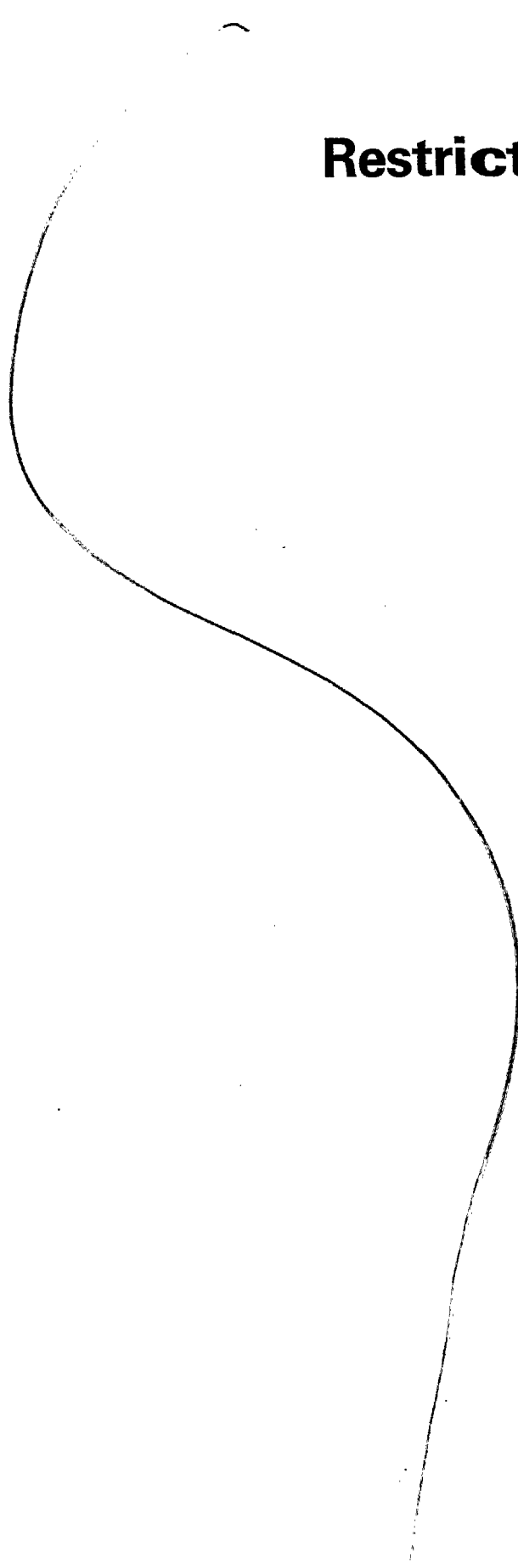
Conclusions and Recommendations

Although the last two months have been very unsettled for Andrew, things have moved on over the last week. Andrew has been committed to being involved in the current programme of work and a clear plan for future work is beginning to emerge. I therefore recommend that the Hearing is continued in order to allow the opportunity for this work to be followed through and a clearer assessment can be made on the impact this will have on Andrew's recent difficulties.




## Contact sheet summary :

- 18/4 - Jake had Andrew from 2pm. At 8pm Nacha came to return him home. Andrew refused to go + had to be "helped" into car by Nacha + Jake.
- 19/4 - 10am to 2pm. Out to Dundee for run in car with Omar. No problems.
- 20/4 - 10.30am - 2pm. Andrew with David Craig at Nachas house. When it was time to come to Almondbank, in order for staff to changeover, Andrew made it very clear he did not wish to go there. Did go but on arrival at Almondbank stayed a few minutes and then absconded. Reported at 3.10pm, (after staff made a brief search of surrounding area) to police and O.C.H's. At 3.22pm Andrew phoned Almondbank from Nachas + due to resistance again to be at Almondbank, as timetabled, police and staff had to use some force to return him. 6pm - Andrew resistant to return to Nachas so had to be "put" into a taxi. 7.45pm Nacha rang to say Andrew had run off.
- 21/4 - 5pm Police returned Andrew to Almondbank and was returned to Nachas at 6.45pm.
- 7.30pm Andrew absconded from Nacha.
- 9.50pm Andrew hanging around Almondbank in company of
- 11.30 Andrew came to Almondbank + requested we

phone Naeha for a lift. This was done. Staff made it clear to Andrew he was to remain in kitchen till Naeha arrived. Andrew wanting to get out, threatening to hit staff with empty rum bottle. This came to nothing.

11.45pm Staff made call to police for assistance to return Andrew to Naeha, as he was refusing to get into Naeha's car.

## Behaviour

Andrew has often been unco-operative with staff wishes resulting in on 2 occasions him being physically escorted back to Naeha and twice absconding from our care on the same day and absconding from Naeha. Twice he was returned to our care, once being after an overnight away (believed to have stayed with ). He was challenged on his behaviour on return and there was apparent signs of remorse.

Andrew fights against adults having control over him and wishes to do what pleases him. - He emphasised on a few occasions the fact he has rights and staff discussed with him the responsibilities which accompany these rights. Andrew said on a couple of occasions he wishes to be in secure accommodation.

Andrew did not speak about his offences + staff felt he perhaps was not aware that staff have basic knowledge of these. He was threatening on occasion but staff felt, although concerning for the future, the threats were unlikely to be carried through.

## BACKGROUND

Carolina House Trust, at short notice, was asked to consider options to support Andy and offer services which might help to avoid a secure accommodation order being made at a Hearing on 28 May 1996.

Andy has a complex home background, including a dysfunctional family home and a failure in one mainstay placement. Over the past six months, he has become regularly involved in the theft of motor vehicles. The Hearing on 28 May will consider some 150+ offences in relation to his activities, which include attempts to escape the police and a high speed chase on the Perthshire motorway network. Andy is placed on a 44(1)A named place supervision requirement with a single mainstay carer, who has a good relationship with him, but is needing help urgently to sustain the placement.

The Social Work Department and Perth Rural Youth project have been offering support which could still be available as part of a comprehensive and co-ordinated plan.

## ASSESSMENT AND BASIS OF RECOMMENDATIONS

The Trust has attended one meeting with the manager, senior and social worker who are case accountable. From this initial meeting, a full day of assessment visits were then conducted by [redacted] who spent time with the senior, social worker and Andy. During the early evening she also visited "Nacha" the mainstay carer. On Sunday 12 May, [redacted] spent a full ten hour day with Andy at Moulzie (the Trust's cottage) and walking in the Glen Clova area. Information from these sessions is used to frame this proposal.

## The options

On the attached chart, a number of key areas for work are identified for action. Set against these are our proposals to begin direct intervention.

Work with Andy, regarding the motor vehicle offences, has been started in a groupwork programme run by SWD staff. During our discussions with Andy, he explained that he was "sick of people talking about the offences" and indicated that he was not keen to become involved in further work in this area. In view of the short period of time prior to the Hearing, and his reluctance, it seems unwise to propose further specific work in this area from outset. We may discover his willingness to consider this later. Perhaps during the discussion of other topics in the programme, which has been devised to begin work on some of the deeper issues underlying the offence behaviour.



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

## PERTH & KINROSS RURAL YOUTH PROJECT

### OFFENDING PROGRAMMES

For young people who are involved in habitual or serious offending we have found it more useful to work with them on an individual rather than a group work basis.

This avoids them influencing their peer group or being competitive about the amount or type of crimes they have committed.

An example of an offending programme we would run would be as follows:-

#### Session 1

SYSTEM'S LADDER - Where They Are.  
Individual Contract of Work.  
Self Assessment Sheet.

#### Session 2

TELLING THE STORY: Where, when, who with, why/gain, (what happened before during and after).

- Select a typical offence or go through one offence at a time. If necessary follow on for one more week doing this. Also quite useful to check where parents were/family situation at the time etc.
- Record the information in written and cartoon format.

#### Session 3

##### CHALLENGING THE MODUS OPERANDI!

How could it have been different?  
How could you avoid it next time?  
Who can help?

What do you need to do?  
Is there a pattern? etc

- Record and test out various answers by role reversal exercises.
- Use of 'stop' points from cartoons or recordings  
ie: Where could they have changed the course of action  
What would have happened if?

#### Session 4 & 5 ATTITUDES

##### A. SERIOUSNESS OF OFFENCES

- List various crimes in order of seriousness
- Examine values of young person ie: Do personal victims count more than institutional ie: Theft from parent  
Taking a vehicle  
Burglary etc.

## Session 4 & 5 cont

### A. SERIOUSNESS OF OFFENCES CONT

- Do violence or property head the list?  
Follow by discussion of individual ratings and worker's perceptions.

### B. COUNTING THE COST

System's ladder can be used here again.

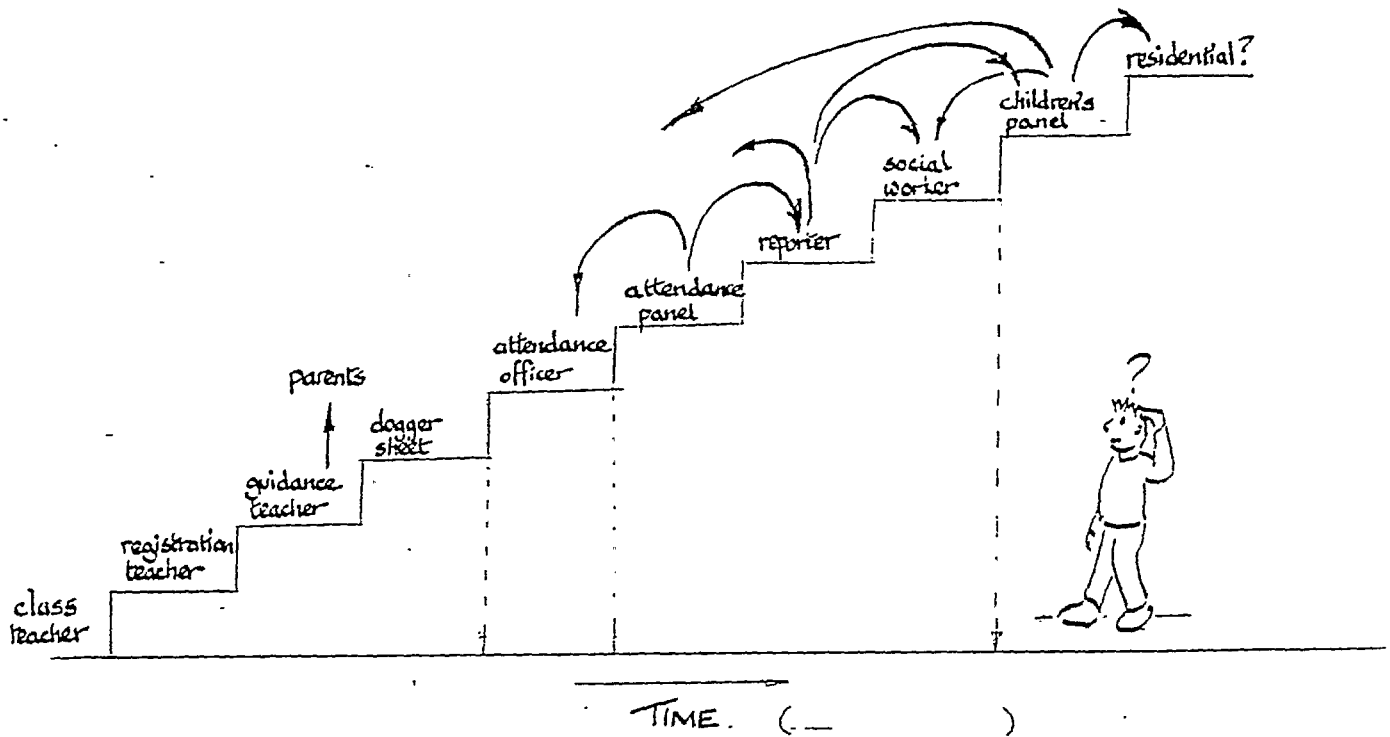

We find it can be useful to structure the meetings and make them quite formal/no treats basis, particularly if young person is trying to avoid tackling the issues and not accepting much responsibility.

## The System



A basic understanding of school and welfare systems is essential to allow the young person to make informed decisions. Seen as one of the most dry or boring but also most important and informative aspects of a group programme, we try to use the sketchy knowledge of members to build up a diagram to show where they are now in the system and what could happen, making the escape routes clear. Faced with the dangers of over-simplification or showing too much of the complexity, we have tried step-diagrams based on an idea from West Yonderton and flow charts - the latest development being to involve the group in cutting together the 'jigsaw' by matching up cards.

*"We filled in steps and I sat worried because it could happen to me if I keep dogging it."*

*"I have never dogged it but thought of it and what I learned today put me right off dogging it."*

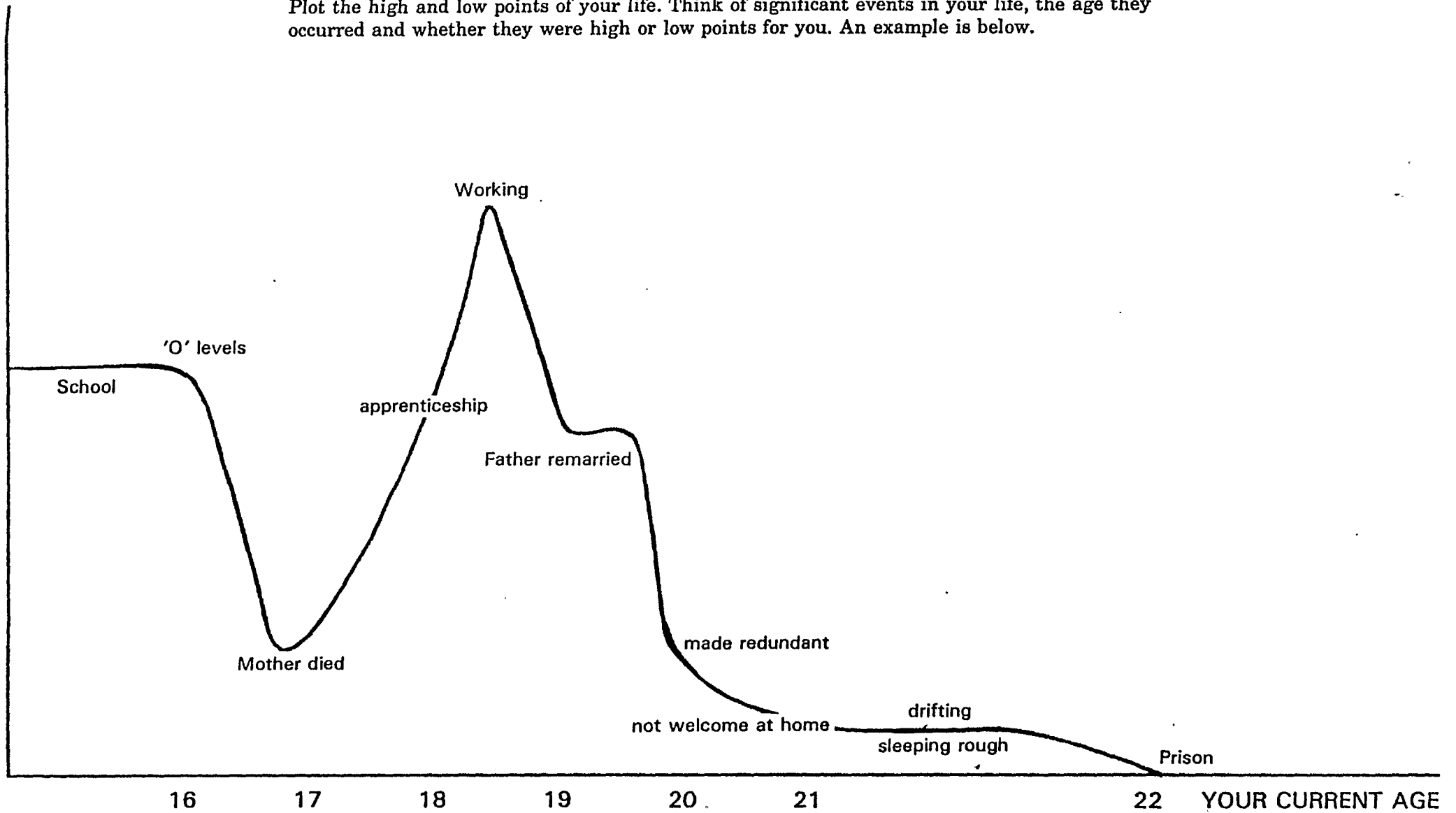

### NOTES FOR PARENTS ABOUT THE SCHEME

The Scheme has been set up since 1979 to find adult friends for young people, aged about 5 to 18, who could benefit from someone taking an interest in them. This could take many forms; helping with a hobby, playing or accompanying on sports, or simply taking them out and spending some time with them.

The youngsters usually come to the notice of the scheme through people who know them, such as Social workers, Teachers or others, but *never* without the consent of the youngster and his/her parents. The youngsters who take part in the Scheme do so by choice.

In order to find a suitable volunteer, the Scheme's Organiser is told, in confidence, just enough about the youngster to make a 'match' possible. Then the 'right' volunteer is looked for.

There may not be a suitable volunteer available immediately, and it can take some time to find someone but, when one has been found, arrangements are made for youngster and volunteer to meet each other. After that first meeting, it is up to the volunteer to make further arrangements with the youngster that suit them both and that are acceptable with home, but usually it will be about once a fortnight for an evening or an afternoon.

The people who volunteer are people who enjoy being with youngsters. Any person over 18 may apply to become a volunteer, but those who are accepted have been carefully selected. They are people who can be trusted, have common sense, and a sense of responsibility. Their role as a befriender is as a friend to the youngster only.

Volunteers are not expected to buy treats for the youngsters from their own pockets. If bus fares, entrance fees etc. have to be paid, they may be claimed back from the Scheme by the volunteer. Equipment needed for some activities can be borrowed from the Scheme as required.

### HISTORY OF THE SCHEME

Perth Volunteer Befriending Scheme first started in 1979/80 with a committee of representatives from Perth Boy's Club, Education, IT etc, and a small number of volunteers.

It continued on these lines until 1983, when funding from Social Work Services Group was obtained for a pilot scheme of 3 years duration. A full time Organiser was appointed to publicise the scheme and recruit volunteers and, over the next year or two, the number of volunteers grew until we had in excess of 30, plus a steady flow of referrals from various agencies in the community as a whole.

Before the Spring of 1986, when funding from SWSG would cease, an alternative source of adequate funds was sought, but unfortunately to no avail. Without the financial backing so necessary to run the Scheme, the Organiser had to be released from post. With that, the support of the volunteers fell away and, from April 1986 until December 1987 (when the Scheme re-started) the volunteers gradually drifted away as matches ended without being replaced with other youngsters. In addition, no new volunteers were recruited as the future of the Scheme was so uncertain.

The Scheme was re-started in December 1987 with a part time Organiser initially, and we continually tried to build up the number of volunteers in order to satisfy the apparent need of our services for, in spite of not being fully operational, a list of some 40+ youngsters had accrued during the 18 months, which suggests that the referring agencies see us as a useful resource. We are, of course, always seeking adequate long-term funding, as this is deemed essential in order to offer continuity of our Befriending to all of these youngsters in need.

From May 1989 the Scheme took on a new part time Organiser, but also an assistant to mainly concentrate on those fundraising initiatives so necessary to attain short-term goals and keep the Scheme viable.

To better reflect its work across the District of Perth and Kinross, the Scheme became known as The Volunteer Befriending Scheme.

From 1992, when the Assistant Organiser went overseas, the Scheme's part time Organiser became full time once again, and so the work continues.....

Although the number of active volunteers fluctuates as individual circumstances change, and new applicants are sought and gained all the time, the Scheme remains a useful and effective resource for the benefit of local youngsters, thanks to the work of our volunteers.

He told me that the Social Work Department were trying to arrange other carers and I advised him to be mature enough to wait for this to happen. He could give no reason for his unhappiness other than 'they wouldn't give him any pocket money tonight. Andrew saying he might as well run away. Advised him that he is required to live at [redacted] at present and he should remain there. Also reminded him that severe weather was forecast for tonight. Advised him of Andrew's contact earlier this evening and that he would need to be returned one way or another to the [redacted]

Advised him that I would phone back once I had looked at the case papers. On phoning him back, I asked to speak to Andrew who still refused to consider a return to the [redacted] Mr O'Mairthini could not be prevailed upon to assist in Andrew's return to his placement and stated that he would take him to his own house when he finished at 22.00. I advised him that I could appreciate Andrew had placed him in a somewhat invidious position but nevertheless, Andrew should not be allowed to manipulate and dictate what was happening as this would result in further problems once officially placed with him.

I phoned [redacted] to advise her of this development. she was angry not only at Andrew's actions but also at Mr O'Mairthini's involvement. After some discussion, [redacted] agreed to report Andrew missing to the police. Consideration was given to getting a worker from one of the Y.P. Units to try to get Andrew back to the [redacted] but due to situation in the units, no workers were free to assist.

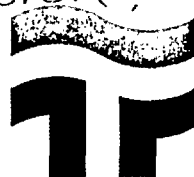

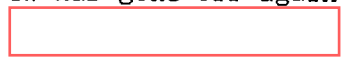

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As you are aware after a great deal of hard work, a secure accommodation place was found for Andrew Murray on Friday, 19th April 1996. This place was obtained at your instruction. However, on Friday, 19th April, a decision was made by yourself and the Head of Child Care that Andrew did not meet the criteria for secure accommodation.

Since Friday Andrew has absconded on a daily basis, despite being supervised continually, both by his Mainstay Carer and Residential Staff. Police have been called on a number of occasions, either to return Andrew when missing or to aid residential staff. Andrew has threatened his carer and a staff member with a bottle and has also threatened to harm himself.

He has also stated that when he has absconded, he has been actively looking for cars to steal. Luckily he has been unsuccessful until Monday evening when he stole a works van in the company of another boy. He was apprehended by Police in the early hours of Tuesday in Perth and charged with a number of road traffic offences which brings his total offences to around 65 in the past couple of months. This is despite no charges being made in one of the incidents when he stole his carer's car.

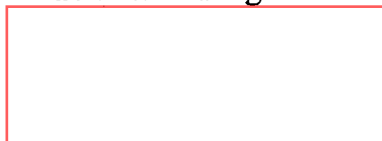

Andrew has been missing since Friday and David phoned Naghar O'Mairthini to see if Andrew had been found. Andrew had not been located but his mother had phoned Naghar to say Andrew had been in Perth with his uncle, Chris Murray, from Glasgow. He had been threatening to "do in" his mother's house and Naghar's house and car. Andrew and his uncle were in a red Ford Fiesta which Andrew was driving as his uncle was incapable through drinks and or/drugs.

As it seemed that Andrew probably could not return to his mainstay placement c/o O'Mairthini, Perth Management was consulted. OOHS previous referral indicated that secure accommodation was being considered and Mr Frew had been involved.

Spoke to Bill Frew but the case is now being dealt with by Mr John Gilruth who was consulted. It was agreed that a residential vacancy in Perth be utilised if necessary.

23.50 OOHS who was in Perth Police station dealing with another case phoned to say Andrew had just been brought in by police. He is to be charged.

Naghar O'Mairthini was advised. He agreed it was probably best for Andrew to go to Carlundy. However he asked if he could visit at the police station to talk to him and this was agreed to. Perth Police station was very busy and there was to be a considerable delay in Andrew being charged. David Craig was advised of this and agreed to be on standby at home to be called when required. Perth Police were not considering holding Andrew in custody.

Police had been told that Andrew was coming up to Ashgrove in Perth in a red Fiesta. Andrew was driving. He had his uncle Christopher who was drunk, in the car with him.

The police first spotted him along the Crieff road in Perth. Andrew was driving the car. They put the lights and siren on to make Andrew stop but he took off with the police panda car following him. He went through a number of red lights in Perth and started heading out along the A9 towards Glasgow.

The police panda car was assisted by 2 traffic cars and a police unit from Auchterarder ie. there were 4 police cars in pursuit of Andrew.

He was driving in a reckless and dangerous manner and twice crossed the central reservation and drove towards oncoming traffic. He hit a police car which was trying to box him in. He went through Auchterarder with police cars in pursuit and headed back towards Perth. He was eventually stopped near the Dunning turn off. His uncle Christopher Murray from Glasgow was present in the car and was drunk.

He was to be charged with various offences, including dangerous driving and driving without a license or insurance.

Andrew was going to be charged in front of Mr O'Mairthini who was going to assess whether he could return home with him.

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- (a) the order shall remain in force beyond the twelve month period;
- (b) the offender's obligation under paragraph (1) above will continue, and;
- (c) the local authority officer appointed under the order shall take whatever action is appropriate to bring the circumstances to the attention of the Court.

### **BASIS OF REPORT**

This report is based on one office interview with Mr Murray and reference to Departmental Records. The writer also previously supervised Mr Murray's two year Probation Order, imposed at Perth Sheriff Court and, which expired on 18 March 1999.

### **ACCOMMODATION**

The home is a three-bedroom, terraced house rented from Perth Housing Association.

### **FINANCE**

At present, Mr Murray is in receipt of State Benefits totalling £80.70 per fortnight. Regular fortnightly financial outlays are £20 for accommodation and £10 towards the payment of a fine.

## PERSONAL HISTORY

Born in Glasgow, Mr Murray grew up in the Easterhouse area and never knew his father. He has two younger step-sisters who are the children of a long-standing relationship between his mother and a Joseph Waddell. The family moved many times in Glasgow and, as a result of difficulties in the community, they were re-housed in Perth in 1990. Shortly after, they moved to Coupar Angus, then to Stanley and in October 1997, to St Andrews in Fife. However, the following January the family returned to the Muirton area of Perth where they remained until moving to Manchester in June 1998, where they currently reside.

[REDACTED] In June 1995 Mr Waddell was charged with physically assaulting Mr Murray and his mother. As a result of this assault, and continuing family difficulties, Mr Murray was placed in Local Authority Care. For the first eight months Mr Murray resided with foster carers but, due to his difficult behaviour he was then placed in a residential unit run by the Social Work Department.

● Following an appearance at the Children's Panel, Mr Murray was discharged from Local Authority care on 6 February 1997. Due to friction between him and his mother, Mr Murray immediately left Perth to go to Glasgow to live with relatives.

On 19 March 1997 Mr Murray appeared at Perth Sheriff Court in relation to a number of Road Traffic Offences when he was imprisoned for three months and made the subject of a Probation Order totalling two years. Shortly after his release, on 2 May 1997 and, due to difficulties with his residency in Glasgow and continuing friction with his mother, Mr Murray agreed to be placed in supported accommodation. However, this placement broke down in July 1997 and, following a period spent with relatives in Glasgow, Mr Murray returned to the family home.

● In October 1997 Mr Murray commenced an Agricultural course at Elmwood College in Cupar, Fife where he lived in privately rented accommodation. Due primarily to his non-attendance, Mr Murray's place on the course was withdrawn and, in March 1998 he returned to the family home. However, difficulties with Mr Murray's relationship with his mother continued and, shortly after, he moved into Greyfriars Hostel for the Homeless where he remained until moving into Anchor House a few weeks later.

In early July 1998, Mr Murray moved out of Anchor House to live with a friend in the Letham area. Following a period spent living with relatives in Glasgow, Mr Murray, in August 1998, moved to Manchester to live with his mother.

During this period, Mr Murray was supervised by Manchester Probation Services. Mr Murray returned to Perth the following October and, since this time, and while not in Glasgow, he has lived with different friends. He moved into his current accommodation, where his girlfriend lives, approximately one month ago.

## EDUCATION/EMPLOYMENT

Mr Murray attended Rogerfield Primary School in Glasgow where his poor attendance was noted. On coming to Perth Mr Murray attended Perth Grammar School where again his poor attendance and disruptive behaviour were prevalent. As a result of these difficulties, Mr Murray attended Blairgowrie High School for a period in 1995. While admitting that he 'didn't like' school, Mr Murray was of the opinion that family difficulties contributed to his poor

attendance and negative attitude towards his schooling. Since leaving school, and apart from a two week period spent as a Kitchen Porter and a few days casual employment, Mr Murray has remained unemployed. However, in interview Mr Murray informed me that he has recently registered with 'People Finders', an agency which specialises in finding employment for people. At the time of writing, Mr Murray is due to work two days at Scone Races.

## **HEALTH**

Mr Murray suffers from asthma and eczema. In addition, while visiting relatives in January of this year, Mr Murray was taken into Glasgow Royal Infirmary. It subsequently transpired that Mr Murray had an ulcer and, as a consequence, experienced stomach and bowel problems which was exacerbated by abscesses. Since his discharge from hospital in early March of this year and following his return to Perth, Mr Murray has continued to experience stomach problems. He is due to return to hospital in the near future 'for tests'.

## **ALCOHOL/DRUGS**

According to Mr Murray, he consumes alcohol only 'once in a blue moon' and he did not regard his use as problematic.

With regard to drugs, and while admitting to using cannabis in the past, Mr Murray maintained that he does not do so now. He further stated that neither alcohol or drugs were factors in the current offences.

## **OFFENDING BEHAVIOUR**

Virtually all of Mr Murray's previous offences have all involved motor vehicles. While admitting to having a liking for cars, Mr Murray was of the opinion that the main factors in relation to his previous offending behaviour were his frustration with being in Local Authority Care and his continuing family difficulties. He stated that he was 'depressed and bored' and 'wanted to do something stupid'. While not disagreeing with Mr Murray, the writer is of the opinion that his disrupted upbringing and immaturity were, and remain, pertinent factors.

## **OUTSTANDING OFFENCES**

Mr Murray would appear to have one matter outstanding.

## **THE OFFENCE**

Mr Murray admitted to the current offences. He stated that he bought the car for £30 'because I wanted to be happy.....I wanted something to be mine for a change'. Ultimately, and while not totally appreciative of the potential danger of his actions, Mr Murray admitted they amounted to 'stupidity'.

## **COMMUNITY BASED DISPOSALS**

**Deferred Sentence:** This course of action would put the onus on Mr Murray to prove to the Court that he has the motivation and commitment to avoid further offences. In addition, this option could also act as a deterrent and a further report could be provided at the end of the period of deferment.

**Financial Penalty:** Mr Murray was of the opinion that he is in a position to pay a financial penalty at the rate of £5 per fortnight.

**Probation Supervision:** Mr Murray has been assessed as a suitable candidate for Probation Supervision. The focus of work would revolve around his offending behaviour, immaturity, employment/education and social isolation.


**Community Service:** Mr Murray has been assessed as a suitable candidate for Community Service which will be carried out according to National Standards.

## CONCLUSION

While experiencing what can only be described as a disrupted upbringing, Mr Murray managed to avoid becoming involved in offences until some three years ago. With regard to these offences, Mr Murray maintained that they occurred as a result of his frustration with being in Local Authority Care and continuing family difficulties. While not disagreeing with Mr Murray, the writer would suggest that immaturity and a degree of social isolation were, and remain pertinent factors.

With regard to the current offences, immaturity would again appear to be a factor, Mr Murray's main reason for his actions being that it made him 'happy'. In addition, Mr Murray did not appear to fully appreciate the potential dangers of his actions.

With regard to disposal therefore, and taking into account the above, Mr Murray's background and youth, and the fact that he responded well to previous supervision, the writer would suggest to the Court that, on this occasion they consider making Mr Murray the subject of a Probation Order. If the Court does not agree with the above assessment, and are of the opinion that more vigorous measures are necessary then it could also make Mr Murray the subject of a Community Service Order.



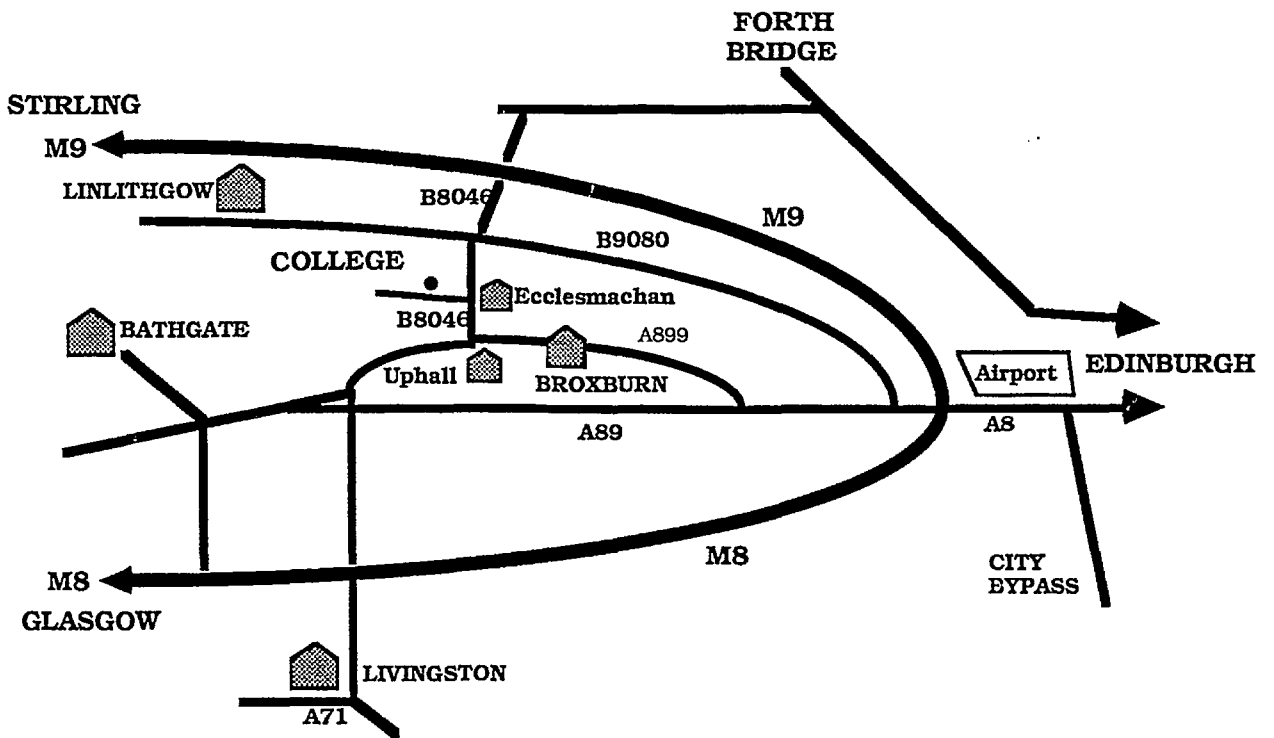

### ACCOMMODATION

Due to increased pressures on the College hostel facilities it will, on occasions, be necessary for some students to be placed in local bed and breakfast accommodation. Nacha outlined his view that Andrew should follow a re-introduction programme as this was lacking when Andrew was initially placed. Andrew was in agreement with this. Nacha requested that the following programme be followed by Andrew successfully before he could return to Nacha's care on a full time basis - 6 short visits, 2 overnights and 1 long weekend.

- 1 Visits arranged for Andrew on Saturday 8 June 1996 and Saturday 15 June 1996 from 2.00 pm - 5.00 pm at Nacha's.
- 2 Andrew to continue his work with Isla at NCH.
- 3 Andrew not to make telephone contact with Nacha until after Nacha's return from holiday.
- 4 Andy to follow through on the standard house rules as follows:-
  - (a) One chore to be carried out daily.
  - (b) Nacha cooks and Andy and  clear up after meals.
  - (c) Keep room reasonably tidy and clean. Laundry to be put in basket, not on floor.
  - (d) Curfew is set at 10.30 pm on work nights and bed at 11.00 pm (no arguments!). Weekend curfew at 11.00 pm and bed by 1.00 am.
- 5 Nacha and  will not enter into discussion on matters such as Glasgow, family access or whether Andrew should be placed in secure accommodation.
- 6 Andrew and  to respect each other's privacy. Andrew to make every effort not to deliberately wind  up.

1. Update - Isla updated meeting on work with Andrew. Following the Children's Hearing on 29th May, Andrew felt that he no longer needed to do the Life Story work because he wanted to return to the Hearing and be taken off Supervision. This issue was resolved and Andrew is clear that the Hearing was Continued to allow an opportunity for this work to be undertaken. Since that point, Andrew has met regularly with Isla, however he has been reluctant to do the work. Part of the reason for this is Andrew feeling tired after work. Andrew stated that he feels Isla pressurises him into doing the work. Isla said that meetings are always arranged in advance and the expectations were clearly agreed in Andrew's contract. At that point in the meeting, Andrew stated that he was no longer prepared to do the work and his attitude made it difficult to continue the meeting. After a 5 minute break, Andrew gave a clear commitment to working with Isla for 1 hour twice a week.

Isla also raised the issue of Andrew not allowing her to share responsibility for contacting people in relation to his Life Story work but not following through on agreements to do this himself. Andrew agreed to share responsibility for this.

2. Offender Services - Rosie checked our Andrew's understanding of the court system and possible outcomes of the recent charges. Although Rosie acknowledging the positives, i.e. Andrew's job and no further offending, Rosie suggested it may be helpful for Andrew to discuss this with someone from Offender Services. Andrew said he was unsure about this at present. Agreed Anne Marie would follow up and arrange a meeting if Andrew feels it would be helpful.

3. Access -

Mum : Sunday 16th at lunch-time - Vanda to phone and arrange.  
Tuesday 18th - Residential staff to collect Vanda in Perth at 6.05 p.m.

Nacha : Saturday 15th - 2 - 5 p.m. as previously agreed.  
Nacha to contact staff when he returns after 2nd July.

Isla : Monday 17th at 7.30 p.m.  
Wednesday 19th at 5 p.m. after work.

4. Future Plans - A clear agreement has been reached between Nacha and Andrew re expectations of his placement there. Andrew now working towards a return to Nacha. Rosie explained to Andrew that initially the Recommendation at the Hearing will be to change his Order to 44 (1) (b) for Woodside and then take it back to another Hearing to change Order when he returns to live with Nacha.

5. Activities - Andrew asked about doing activities. Agreed this could be considered again after the Hearing if things continue to go well. Andrew already involved in unit group night.

6. Bed-time - Andrew raised the issue of bed-time as he is unhappy that it is half an hour earlier than the other Young Person in the unit. It was explained to Andrew the reason for this was due to the other Young Person being older. Everyone agreed the current arrangement is fair.

7. Repayments - Isla updated meeting on her arrangement with Andrew to repay £2.50 per week towards the cost of damage caused to Project vehicles. Agreed Anne Marie would keep £2.50 off Andrew's pocket money every week.

8. Savings - Anne Marie checked if it would be possible to keep money from Andrew's wages for his savings. Agreed Andrew can be encouraged to do this but does not have to. Discussed the issue of Board - agreed Residential staff should discuss this further and decide an appropriate contribution, e.g. Andrew paying for his packed lunches.

9. Work - Andrew very enthusiastic about his new job, however was encouraged not to work on his days off as he will need some time for himself. Agreed Anne Marie would be the contact person for Andrew's work.

**Current Situation**

At a Network meeting held on 31st May 1996 it was agreed that Andrew should reside in Woodside Crescent, residential establishment, with the proviso that should there be concerns regarding his behaviour and the staff's ability to retain him then he would be taken away to another remote location, at short notice. However, to date this has not proved necessary.

A clear plan of how Andrew's time was to be spent was arranged including work with Isla McDonald, access with his mother and access with Mr O'Mairthini. It was agreed at this time that contracts should be drawn up in relation to Andrew's access with his mother and Mr O'Mairthini.

For more details of the work carried out with Isla McDonald, please see her report.

Following a careers interview Andrew began working at an Ostrich Farm just outside Methven on Monday, 10th June 1996. He has been very positive about this job and it would appear to have given him some incentive to modify his recent behaviour.

**Andrew's Behaviour**

Andrew has absconded on two occasions since the last Hearing. The first was on Sunday, 2nd June, following a visit to Mr O'Mairthini's, before the contract had been agreed, when Andrew's behaviour was very difficult and Mr O'Mairthini explained to him that there needed to be further discussion before he could make a decision regarding Andrew's return to his care. On this occasion Andrew was picked up by the Police in the early hours of 3rd June. He did not incur any charges at this time.

On the second occasion Andrew absconded on Friday, 7th June, and returned of his own accord on Sunday, 9th June. On his return Andrew stated that he had gone to his Uncle Chris's because there were a number of items of his clothing missing when they had been returned earlier that week. (Andrew had left the majority of clothes at his Uncle Chris's when apprehended in Glasgow on 15th May 1996).

Overall Andrew's behaviour has improved considerably. Although there have been times when he has been somewhat abusive to both staff and with Isla McDonald when he has not been happy with their expectations of him, when he has been challenged regarding this, he has eventually agreed to co-operate.

Following a network meeting on Wednesday, 12th June, it was agreed that Andrew would be allowed some free time in the evenings and no longer required to be supervised by staff when outwith the unit.

**Future Plans**

The current plan is for Andrew to reside in Woodside Crescent and begin package of re-introduction to the care of Mr O'Mairthini. It was agreed by both Andrew and Mr O'Mairthini that the introductions should successfully take place before Andrew could return to Mr O'Mairthini's care on a full time basis. It is proposed that this would include six short visits, two overnights and one long weekend. Two visits were arranged before Mr O'Mairthini went on holiday although only one took place due to Andrew absconding on 7th June. These visits will resume after Mr O'Mairthini's return on Tuesday, 2nd July, 1996. A clear contract of expectations of Andrew during these visits and following his return to Mr O'Mairthini's care have also been agreed.

Andrew is to continue to have regular access with his mother, with an agreement from Mrs Murray that should Andrew's access continue to go well, she would be happy to have him for pre-arranged overnight access. An exact date for this has not yet been arranged and when this does take place will be dependent on the success of current access visits. However, it is hoped that a clear plan of agreed dates can be arranged within the next few weeks.

**Conclusion and Recommendation**

Andrew has resided at Woodside Crescent since 31st May 1996. Although there was provision available to take Andrew away, this has not been necessary.

A clear plan for his time was arranged including his contact with Isla McDonald, Mrs Murray and Mr O'Mairthini.


Andrew began working at an Ostrich Farm outside Methven on 10th June, this would appear to have been a very positive experience for him.

Andrew has absconded twice since the last Hearing. He has not to the author's knowledge been charged with any offences at this time and on the second occasion returned of his own accord.

Overall Andrew's behaviour has improved considerably. He has still on occasions been somewhat abusive with workers but when challenged, has agreed to co-operate.

The current plan for Andrew is that he continues to reside in Woodside while a package of re-introductions to Mr O'Mairthini's care takes place. He will also continue to have regular access with Mrs Murray with the view to overnight access when appropriate.

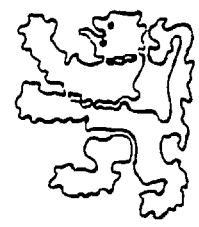
I, therefore, recommend that Andrew be placed on a Section 44(1) (b) at 36 Woodside Crescent, Perth.

### Reasons for Referral

Andrew was originally referred to the Project in February 1995 following a breakdown in family relationships, in particular Andrew's relationship with his mother's partner at that time, Joseph Waddell. This was coupled with increasing difficulties at school and in the community.

Andrew was again referred to the Project in February 1996 and April 1996. On the first occasion the reason for referral was to offer Andrew support to resolve some of the issues in relation to the breakdown of his Mainstay Placement. On the second occasion, the reason for referral was in relation to Andrew's recent difficulties and offending behaviour.

### Programme of Work from April - May 1996

(For previous programmes of work see Hearing Report dated 23 May 1996).

At the beginning of April a new programme of work was agreed to address the current areas of concern. Initially this work was disjointed due to Andrew absconding, however things moved on significantly prior to the last Children's Hearing when it was decided that Andrew should be taken away and an intensive package of work put in place.

The outcome of the package of work was a clearer assessment of Andrew's perceptions about his earlier life history and experiences. This highlighted the need for Andrew to have a coherent story about his life and also the need to address issues of separation and loss relating to his mother and also the breakdown of his two Mainstay Placements. This helped make sense of the self-defeating behaviour which has forced the breakdown of Andrew's Mainstay Placements, i.e. Andrew's perceptions relating to the separation from his mother on two occasions has caused an inability to trust people and Andrew's subsequent belief that any care and love by adults will be followed by loss.

This work was coupled with ongoing work to raise Andrew's self-esteem and feeling of self-worth.

### Programme of Work - June 1996

As Agreed at the last Children's Hearing, the focus of work with Andrew has been addressing the issues of separation and loss and building a coherent story about his life. This has been alongside ongoing work on Andrew's self-esteem.

Initially the plan was to meet with Andrew three times a week, however this has been reduced to twice a week due to Andrew successfully finding full-time employment. Working full-time has been a significant achievement for Andrew and has greatly improved his feelings of self-worth, however it has also made him feel somewhat reluctant at times to do the work agreed with myself despite meeting with me on most occasions.

Andrew Murray - D.O.B 19.9.80

Andrew has completed the work on his feelings in relation to the separation and loss and this will be linked into the life story work where appropriate. Although Andrew's life story is beginning to come together, a lot of time has been required for gathering information, photographs etc. Andrew's mother, Vanda Murray has been very helpful with this.

### Conclusions and Recommendations

Although the planned work with Andrew is not completed as yet, Andrew has had a fairly settled period since the last Hearing and has not committed any further offences. Andrew is very enthusiastic about his new job and this has been a very positive progression for him.

A clear agreement has now been reached with Nacha O'Mairthini and Andrew about the expectations of Andrew's placement there and a planned return is now possible. Andrew's access with his mother has also been positive and there is now more possibility of Andrew having overnight visits in the future.

I therefore recommend that Andrew's Supervision Order is changed to a 44 (1) (b) and that Andrew resides at Woodside Children's Unit where plans will proceed for him to return to live with Nacha O'Mairthini. This will also allow a further opportunity for the agreed work on Andrew's life story to be completed. This is important for Andrew moving on as it will help challenge some of Andrew's perceptions about his past life and address the issues of separation and loss which will enable Andrew to increase his trust in adults.

The Residential Resource team began the most recent period of work with Andrew at the end of April 1996. We were asked to give extra support to Andrew and his Mainstay Carer.

Support was offered three days a week with weekend work.

One of the aims of the support was to relieve some of the stress Andrew & Nacha were experiencing at the time due to Andrew's behaviour.

Linking in with the NCH Rural Project the resource workers also attempted to encourage Andrew to prepare for his forthcoming standard grade exams and look at aspects of this behaviour.

After continued running away and alleged involvement in road traffic offences, the Residential Resource team were asked to take Andrew away from Perth, one to geographically prevent Andrew from continued offending behaviour, and two with NCH support, look more intensively at the problematic areas in his life. Andrew responded reasonably well to being away from Perth with one-to-one staffing. His behaviour was acceptable and he made no attempt to run away. It was difficult to motivate him in regard to issue based work.

At Andrew's last panel on 29th May, the Panel members were advised that the close support for Andrew would continue but would be based in a residential unit in Perth.

#### **Woodside Residential Unit - from 29 March**

##### **Work Experience**

Andrew started work at Bellour Farm, just outside Methven, on the 10th June. Andrew is currently working on an ostrich farm and appears to be enjoying the work he is involved in. There have been no adverse reports with regard to this placement, which appears to be going successfully at this point in time.

##### **Health**

Andrew suffers from eczema and asthma but is currently on medication for both complaints. Andrew manages to control both these complaints of his own accord and is generally responsible in this area.

On Saturday 15th June, Andrew admitted himself to Perth Royal Infirmary, complaining of headaches, a sore throat and feeling giddy. Initial thoughts from hospital staff were that they suspected meningitis, and it was felt appropriate to give Andrew a lumbar puncture. This initial exploratory examination proved that this was not the case, and there were no further concerns. Andrew was discharged after being kept in overnight for observation and no further difficulties were expressed in this area.

##### **Family**

Andrew has had several access visits from his mother while at Woodside these visits appear to be going well and although these visits have been supervised by staff, the relationship between Andrew and his mother has been pleasant, positive and relaxed. It is hoped by both that this contact will increase, but at the moment there are no plans for this.

### Mainstay Carer

Andrew has had two visits to Nacha while at Woodside which have both appeared to be positive, unfortunately Nacha is on holiday at present, although there are plans to resume this contact on his return. It is hoped that the amount of contact will increase and that there will be plans to include a steady build up including overnights. The overall aim for Andrew is to return to Nacha's on a permanent basis before the end of July.

### Absconsions

Andrew has absconded from Woodside unit on 2 separate occasions.

Sunday 2nd June, Andrew was picked up in Auchterarder by the police after failing to return. There is no evidence of Andrew having committed any offences.

Andrew absconded again on Friday 17th June and travelled to Glasgow. It is known that Andrew spent some time in the company of his uncle Christopher. Again there is no evidence of Andrew committing any offences. Andrew returned by himself on Sunday 9th June.

### Alleged Offences

On 12th June, Andrew made his own way to visit a friends house. Subsequently, staff were notified by the occupant that a purse and credit cards were missing. Andrew was confronted regarding this alleged incident but denied any knowledge of the purse although admitted that he had in fact visited. There has been no further action with regard to this incident.

### Concerns

Andrew is currently continuing contact with previous mainstay carers, this is felt to be inappropriate. This has been taken on by Woodside staff and Andrew has been informed that this is not advisable.

### Conclusion

Andrew has managed to fit into the routine of Woodside and his work placement in a positive manner. Andrews contact with his mother has also been positive and there appears to be an overall stability within his life at the present moment. Andrew is managing to sustain a healthy and positive relationship with staff at the present time although on occasion Andrew has attempted to puch the boundaries. It is still seen to be the case that Andrew is working toward a return to his mainstay placement with Mr O'Mairthini towards the end of July.

The Local Authority is also obliged to make use of facilities and services available for children who remain in the care of their own parents for children in the Local Authority's care.
  
2. Under Regulation 20, the care authority has to ensure, so far as is consistent with Section 20 of the 1968 Act, that the child will be brought up in accordance with his religious persuasion. 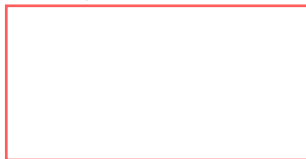

Due to Andrew being off work at present time he is to be encouraged each day to find employment of some kind even if only as a temporary measure till a new placement comes up on the skillseekers programme (may take a while to happen.) Staff may assist Andrew in carrying this out by taking him to Job centre etc. If Andrew is to be out of unit during day due to staff having other work to do outside unit then he may be offered £1-50 lunch money Any other times he may ret. to unit for lunch It may be decided that Andrew will start on Independent Living as from week commencing. 1st OCT. 96. This is to be confirmed with Steve Waugh on Mon.30th Sept.

**ACCESS**

Andrew to have no access to Stanley to visit mum at any time for the foreseeable future. If Vanda phones Woodside to say Andrew is there then he is to be reported to the Police as an absconder and returned to Woodside as soon as possible. Woodside staff to have no other contact with Vanda and not get involved in any issues she may have, If Vanda needs assistance she has to contact George/O.O.H. Access will be arranged to take place at Colonsay and an Independent Resource Worker will be working with Andrew and mum during these visits.

O/N There will be no further overnights at present for Andrew due to recent events.

**TV.**

Andrews bed time during week is 11pm At weekends it may be later if agreed by staff.  
Andrew may have t.v. during week if his behaviour is acceptable within the Unit. If Andrew has difficulty getting up in the morning due to watching late t.v. it may be removed from room.

**ROOM.**

Andrew to clean his room on Saturdays (may be done Fri. if he is about and pocket money given after it has been checked) this includes changing bed and doing washing. Andrew to make sure it is kept tidy the rest of the days. Once Andrews room is done he may get his pocket money, £2.50. is to be put by off Andrews money for N.C.H. each week which Andrew has agreed to.

**TIME OUT**

Andrew is to return to unit 10.30pm at latest during week. Negotiable with staff at weekends.

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### ACCESS

Andrew may visit mum at his request and pay his own fares. If staff are available to take Andrew out to Mums outwith set access could they make a point of checking with mum it is o.k. when they arrive and that the visit suits her. If all o.k. then Andrew may be given bus fare for returning to Woodside. If staff cannot transport Andrew on set visits then bus fare may be given to Andrew and he is to be informed bus tickets to be handed in on ret. If no bus tickets are returned then Andrew will repay fare off his pocket money for that week and not be given further fares for rest of week but offered lift if transport available.

### O/N

Andrew at the moment is allowed two set nights for staying at mums These nights at present are as follows

**THURSDAY/SATURDAY.** Andrew may be given bus fare on these nights, if staff not available to drop him off. Tickets to be returned. Andrew may be given food/money for tea at mums on his set nights there, may also take pot noodle or likes for his supper.

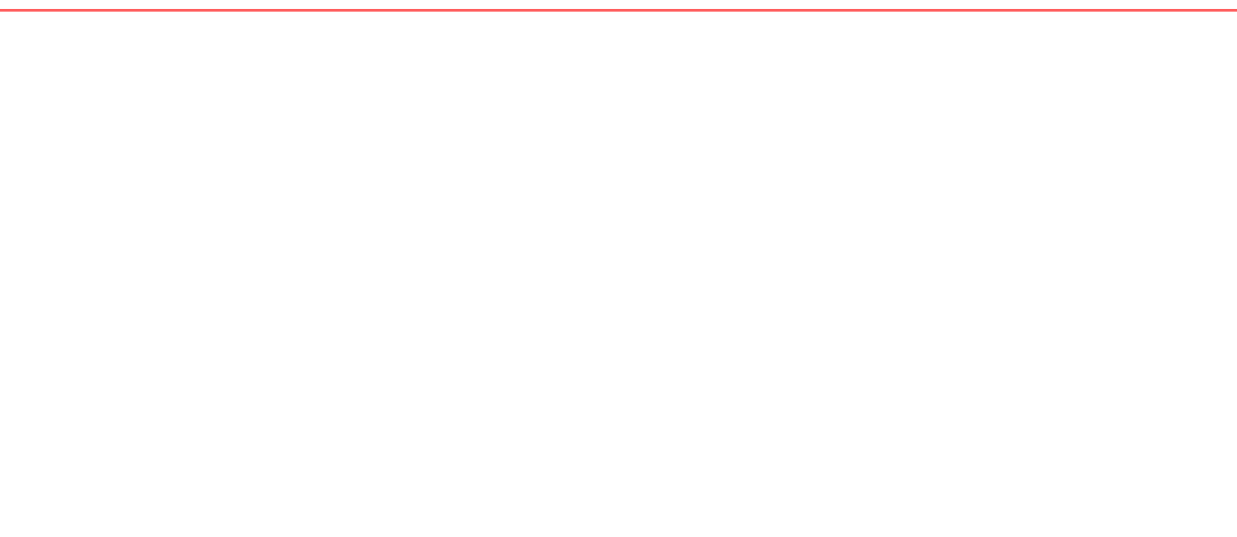

## RELATIONSHIP WITH MUM

According to Andrew mum is back with Joey and he has been present in the house when Andrew has visited. Andrew very disappointed in mum. Rosie to check out with mum where Joey is. If he is in Stanley access visits will not be able to take place there. Andrew should not be going there until this is checked and there is absolute certainty that Joey will not be there. Visits at Woodside going well though Andrew drawing on staff a lot when mum there. They have not gone as well as initial visit. Jim has drawn up contract re what they do/don't talk about. Discussed who'd undertake this work. Rosie felt that Woodside staff are best placed to support Andrew in his relationship with mum. If there are any issues that need to be raised with mum agreed that Rosie will do this.

**Re-introductions**

Andrew said he had seven overnights with Nacha since re-introductions began, most recent being from Friday of last week to Tuesday this week. He feels this has been pretty good. He acknowledged that one night didn't go well, as he came in at 12.10 when he should have been in at 11.30. There was also one morning when he "couldn't" get up in the morning and ended up being late for work. He said he wasn't too sure to start with whether or nor he wanted to return to Nacha's but now he wants to come back and doesn't think there needs to be any more time for introductions.

Nacha agreed with what Andrew had to say. He feels things went very well. There have been arguments and disagreements but nothing major and they managed to deal with them.

He said Andrew was coming in for meals when he's supposed to. He is also getting on well with [redacted]. At their request Andrew and [redacted] are sharing a room. This is going very well.

Nacha also voiced the concerns and doubts he had when re-introductions began but said he was feeling much more positive now.

Andrew will give Nacha £7.50 Board Money, which is the same as he paid at Woodside. He will also give Nacha an extra £2.50 at the beginning of the week which Nacha will give him back during the week.

Andrew's work is part of the skill seekers scheme. He will be going back to Edinburgh College periodically throughout the two years. When there, he has to live in for the week. Arrangements will have to be made to have a condition allowing him to do this included in his Supervision Order.

**Meeting to review Andrew Murray's Re-introduction to Mr O'Mairthini's care and Movement in Care Meeting**

There will be a Child In-care Review for Andrew on 26th August. Rosie asked Andrew about his thoughts once he reaches sixteen, as this will not now be long. Andrew stating he now wants to continue to live with Nacha until he is ready to live on his own. Under which section he remains, will need to be explored further. Re offences, which will definitely be heard in the Courts, would it be better for Andrew to remain on Supervision until these have been dealt with? Agreed this needed to be discussed further.

**Woodside** - John stated that Andrew had not presented any real problem to staff since his stay with them. Last week he did go out after normal time, following a carry-on with another resident. Was later brought back by the Police. Had not been reported missing and was not involved in any offending.

He considers Andrew has been dealing well with problems in Woodside which have increased since another young person began living there.

Andrew is currently getting an extra £3 from Woodside towards his bus fare. Nacha said he would look at the feasibility of Andrew getting a bus pass which may reduce these costs.

Eddie Beck from Offenders was to make contact with Andrew re discussing possible outcome of offences. He should be making contact with Andrew soon.

**Access**

**Vanda** said Andrew was out at Stanley last Thursday. Only stayed a short time and then went to visit a girlfriend. Agreed that it was necessary to have a definite plan for access and not change this on a weekly basis.

Agreed that access should be as follows:-

Sunday - Afternoon in Stanley. Bus out and will be collected by Nacha - time will vary depending on Nacha's football schedule.

Wednesday - Evening. Mum to come into Perth, with Michelle and Kirsty to meet Andrew to do activity.

Arrangements to be made for money to be paid to Nacha for him to give to Vanda prior to access.

As Andrew "burst" Michelle's tyre during a recent visit, it was agreed that he would pay to have this fixed.

At the time of Andrew's last Hearing it was intimated that the plan should be for him to become involved in re-introductions to his previous Mainstay Carer as soon as he returned from vacation.

These re-introductions began the week beginning 1st July 1996. Initially Andrew had two mid week evening visits which proved quite difficult for him. However, he had his first overnight access on Saturday 13th and Sunday, 14th July, which were very successful. Following this Andrew had a number of pre-planned visits, both at weekends and mid-week for a two week period. This was reviewed on Thursday, 1st August, when both Andrew and Mr O'Mairthini agreed that things had gone well and they did not require a further period of re-introduction. Arrangements were, therefore, made for Andrew to return to Mr O'Mairthini's on Friday, 2nd August, for an extended period of leave, until such time as this arrangement can be ratified by a Children's Hearing.

**Conclusion and Recommendation**


Andrew's re-introduction to Mr O'Mairthini began at the beginning of July. Despite a slightly tense start these have been very successful and Andrew returned to Mr O'Mairthini on an extended period of leave with effect from Friday, 2nd August.

I, therefore, recommend that Andrew be placed on a Section 44 (1) (a) with the following conditions:-

He resides with Mr P O'Mairthini, 31 Allison Terrace, Newton Glade, Tulloch.

The requirement to reside is subject to the discretion of the Director of Social Work to grant leave from time to time to enable him to engage in approved activities, go on holiday with his carer and reside in college accommodation while on block placement at Edinburgh Agricultural College as part of his Skill Seekers Training.

Subject to the discretion of the Director of Social Work and the agreement of the child/parent/guardian, the child may have respite care with other carers approved by the Social Work Department in terms of the Boarding and Fostering of Children (Scotland) Regulations 1985.

#### Pen Picture

Andrew is a tall slim young man with short dark hair and glasses.

#### Social Work Involvement

In late March Andrew's behaviour became somewhat erratic and a cause for concern. This began with Andrew going out without his carer's permission and failing to return at his normal coming in times. However, this escalated in early April when he began absconding and offending. The offending in the main involved him stealing and driving cars and, on one occasion, was involved in a high speed car chase. He also broke into premises in order to obtain keys to these cars and stole from his carer.

Following the initial incidents of stealing and driving a car, the possibility of Andrew going to secure accommodation was explored. Although a place eventually became available, by that time Andrew's behaviour had improved somewhat and it was decided that although Andrew's behaviour was still inappropriate, it didn't quite warrant this department making the decision that secure accommodation was necessary. However, a Review Children's Hearing was requested and following the car chase, a secure bed was held for Andrew in case the Hearing decided he required it.

Due to the difficulties Andrew was presenting, support was given to Mr O'Mairthini by residential staff. This primarily was in the form of caring for Andrew when Mr O'Mairthini had other commitments. However, as Andrew's behaviour became more demanding, periods of respite were also included.

**Case Reviews - Children in Care - Andrew Murray, dob 19.08.80**

In early May his carer, reluctantly, indicated that he would not be in a position to care for Andrew after 15th June 1996. However, in a discussion with Andrew on Friday, 17th May, he did agree to give some thought to reconsidering his position depending on Andrew's behaviour.

At a meeting on 17th May it was agreed that there was not only a need to intensify the package of work being done with Andrew but also a need to isolate him in order to reduce the likelihood of him absconding. Andrew went with residential staff to an isolated farm cottage 2 miles from Alyth where he began working with residential staff and Isla McDonald on an assessment of his perception of his current situation and what he thought had led to the recent deterioration in his behaviour. From information obtained an intensive package of work was designed to help Andrew change his behaviour. Andrew co-operated well with this package and because of his initial co-operation the Children's Hearing agreed to continue his initial Review Hearing for four weeks to allow time for this package of work to be carried out.

Following the continued Hearing, a network meeting on 31st May agreed that Andrew should reside in Woodside Crescent residential establishment, with the proviso that should there be concerns regarding his behaviour and the staff's ability to retain him, then he would be taken away to another remote location, at short notice. However, this did not prove necessary.

A clear plan of how Andrew's time was to be spent was arranged including work with Isla McDonald, access with his mother and Mr O'Mairthini. It was agreed at this time that contracts should be drawn up in relation to Andrew's access with his mother and Mr O'Mairthini.

At the subsequent Hearing Andrew was placed at Woodside Crescent with the clear understanding that re-introductions to Mr O'Mairthini's care would resume as soon as he returned from his summer holiday.

**Suitability of Placement**

Although at the time of the last Review Andrew stated clearly that he wanted to remain with Mr O'Mairthini, his deteriorating behaviour meant it was necessary for there to be a temporary break in this arrangement.

Re-introductions to Mr O'Mairthini's care began the week beginning 1st July 1996. Andrew had two mid week evening visits which proved quite difficult for him. However, he had his first overnight access on Saturday, 13th and Sunday, 14th July, which were very successful. Following this Andrew had a number of pre-planned visits, both at weekends and mid-week for a two week period. This was reviewed on Thursday, 1st August, when both Andrew and Mr O'Mairthini agreed that things had

gone well and they did not require a further period of re-introduction. Arrangements were, therefore, made for Andrew to return to Mr O'Mairthini's on Friday, 2nd August, for an extended period of leave, until such time as this arrangement can be ratified by a Children's Hearing.

**Andrew's Behaviour**

From late March to mid May, Andrew's behaviour was extremely erratic and unpredictable. During this time he accumulated a large number of charges against him, the majority of which the Procurator Fiscal has retained and will be heard before the Courts. A number of different approaches were used to attempt to engage Andrew, sometimes this would appear to be in some way successful and then for no apparent reason Andrew would abscond or offend again. From his move to the cottage in Alyth in mid May, Andrew's behaviour and co-operation improved considerably. Although there were times when he was somewhat abusive to both staff and Isla McDonald, when he was not happy with their expectation of him. When he was challenged regarding this, he eventually agreed to co-operate.

Due to this positive change in Andrew's behaviour it was agreed in mid June that Andrew would be allowed some free time in the evenings and no longer required to be supervised by staff when outwith the unit. In the main Andrew responded well to this increased trust.

Following a careers interview Andrew began working at an Ostrich Farm just outside Methven on Monday, 10th June 1996. He has been very positive about this job and it is my view that this has made a significant difference to Andrew's attitude and behaviour.

At the Review on 1st August Andrew stated that he now wished to continue to live with Mr O'Mairthini beyond his sixteenth birthday. This decision is a major move forward for Andrew who has always previously stated that he could cope on his own and as soon as he was sixteen, he would no longer wish any involvement or support from this department.

**Health**

On 14th June 1996 Andrew went to P.R.I. complaining of pains in his neck. There were concerns that Andrew had Meningitis. He was, therefore, given a lumbar puncture and retained overnight. Tests results were all clear and Andrew was discharged on the Sunday, 15th June 1996. There have been no further concerns regarding this.

**Case Reviews - Children in Care - Andrew Murray, dob 19.08.80****Access with Natural Family**

Attempts were made following the last Review to re-establish pre-planned access. However, initially Andrew refused to discuss access with his mother following her statement at the In-care Review that, given Andrew's behaviour and her own situation, she was not prepared to consider Andrew's return to her care. At Andrew's request a further meeting was arranged for 28th March when access times and days were arranged. When Andrew's behaviour deteriorated further in early April, his mother refused to see him. She did, however, maintain regular contact with his carer.

Following the Children's Hearing in late May access was again resumed. This initially took place at Woodside and then progressed to Andrew making visits to his mother's home in Stanley. At the commencement of this access, agreement was made between Andrew and his mother regarding topics which were not to be discussed i.e. Joey and Uncle Chris. The current situation is that Andrew should see his mother and sisters twice a week - once mid-week and once on a Sunday. This will now take place in Perth.

At the Hearing on 27th March 1996 there was a condition included in Andrew's Supervision Order that he has no contact with his Uncle Chris. Andrew did, however, have a number of contacts while he was absconding and it was in his Uncle Chris' car, with his Uncle Chris in the driver's seat that Andrew was involved in the high speed chase. The last known contact between Andrew and his Uncle Chris was 9th June 1996, when Andrew returned from Glasgow of his own accord.


**Future Plans**

That Andrew's return to Mr O'Mairthini's care be ratified by the Children's Hearing

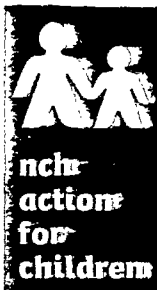

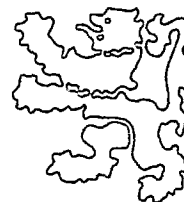

### Reasons for Referral

Andrew was originally referred to the Project in February 1995 following a breakdown in family relationships, in particular Andrew's relationship with his mother's partner at that time, Joseph Waddell. This was coupled with increasing difficulties at school and in the community.

Andrew was again referred to the Project in February 1996 and April 1996. On the first occasion the reason for referral was to offer Andrew support to resolve some of the issues in relation to the breakdown of his mainstay placement. On the second occasion, the reason for referral was in relation to Andrew's more recent difficulties and offending behaviour.

### Update Report

(For previous programmes of work see Hearing Reports dates 23 May 1996 and 19 June 1996).

Since the last Hearing, Andrew has had a very settled period and has continued to make good progress. Andrew and I have now completed the work in relation to the issues of separation and loss and developing a coherent story about his life and have one further meeting planned to pull this together. As well as helping Andrew remember and understand what has happened to him in the past and assisting with the formation of identity, this work has also helped Andrew to resolve the issues of separation and loss and move on. Andrew's perceptions of what happened on these occasions has changed considerably and he now acknowledges the way in which his own behaviour influenced the outcomes. Although this includes Andrew's view of why he was originally received into care, he still has some unresolved feelings towards his mother. It may be helpful to meet with Andrew and his mother to resolve this.

This work, alongside other factors such as Andrew finding and maintaining a full time job and the support he has received from other agencies has assisted a successful return to his mainstay placement with Nacha O'Mairthini. I believe Andrew is now more equipped to build a trusting relationship with Nacha and sustain a mainstay placement.

### Conclusions and Recommendations

Over the last two months, Andrew has continued to make use of the support available and has made considerable progress. He is also increasingly demonstrating he is able to take responsibility for his behaviour.

Andrew's return to live with Nacha has been well planned and Andrew himself is more prepared for and able to cope with a mainstay placement.

Conclusions and Recommendations cont

I believe this move will be positive for Andrew and Nacha will continue to offer him a high level of support.

I therefore recommend that Andrew's supervision order is changed to a 44 1(a) residing with Nacha O'Mairthini.

UPDATE.

Andrew has been in the care of Nacha Omarthini since 2nd August 1996. Andrew had been placed with Nacha on a planned basis following several Network and planning meetings and was re introduced to Nacha on this basis.

There are currently no problems with Andrews placement that have involved the use of residential staff .

Woodside.

Andrews stay at Woodside was seen in general terms to have been positive. Andrew managed to work in with the structure and expectations of the unit, and build positive relationships with the staff team. However, Andrew did have difficulty in maintaining positive relationships with other residents in the unit. This area of difficulty was never overcome by Andrew while in unit.

Andrew had worked consistently at reducing the nature and level of his previous offending. Andrew was encouraged and supported by staff group in his attempts to gain employment in which he was successful.

Work Experience.

Andrew has successfully gained a place on the skillseekers course which placed him in work on an Ostrich farm. Andrew enjoyed this work and was said by his supervisor to be a willing hardworking young man. Andrew himself stated that he enjoyed the work at the farm and had built a good relationship with his supervisor. Andrew has also gained a place at Oatridge agricultural college and was due to undertake a course beginning the 19th of August.

### Family contact.

Andrew had been initially keen to continue planned supervised access to his mother although latterly this did not take place as planned. Andrew did have positive meetings with his mother while placed in Woodside.

### Health.

Andrew continues to suffer from Eczema which was further irritated by his work experience placement. Andrew did seek out advice of the doctor and undertook a course of medication to control this complaint.

Andrew had occasion to spend overnight at P.R.I, on 15/6/96, owing to his complaints of headaches and stomach pains. There was concern expressed by the hospital that this may have been suspected meningitis and several tests were undertaken. The initial concern was not followed through as there were no signs of possible meningitis. Andrew was discharged from hospital the following morning and given the all clear health wise.

### Other agencies.

Andrew had continued to work alongside Isla McDonald of N.C.H rural project, until a decision was made to discontinue the work within Woodside due to moving Andrew on to Mr Omarthini. Isla had suggested that she wished to finish off a particular piece of work with Andrew although this was not clarified.

Andrew had been involved with Mr Brian Hutton ( resource worker ) in the Muirton car and mechanic project which he attended regularly only missing when it was felt that his behaviour within the group was having a negative effect on others at the project.

### Conclusion

Andrew came to be placed in Woodside Crescent after difficulties surrounding his offending behaviour within the community. It has been recognised that while in Woodside Andrew has made positive steps to rectify this offending pattern and has done so significantly. Andrew has had difficulties building positive relationships with other residents but managed to make and sustain positive relationships with the staff team.

Andrew was driven by his wish to return to the care of Mr Omarthini and made a positive effort to look at his current situation and what needed to change in order for this to happen. This concluded positively for both Andrew and Mr Omarthini resulting in a return to Mr Omarthini's care on an extended leave basis. This has continued on a positive basis and no reference has been received regarding any difficulty with his placement.

It appears that Andrew has begun to acknowledge his role in the community and his responsibility for himself and to others. Andrew has

many positive assets to his personality and has proven more often than not , that he can follow care plans , guidelines and expectations that are laid before him.

Meeting arranged at short notice to look at future options following the breakdown of Andrew's Mainstay Placement.

Andrew unhappy about being at Woodside and wanted to know what the options are. Rosie said main options were to remain at Woodside or Independent Living. Andrew making a clear statement that he is not ready for Independent Living. Rosie suggested supported lodgings is also an option - Andrew unsure - said would need to know more about it.

Andrew stated again he did not want to remain at Woodside and suggested Mainstay. Heather let Andrew know that there was no placement available and it would not be a future option for him. Andrew then suggesting that the only place would be mum's. It was suggested to Andrew that this would be unlikely to last given that things have not yet progressed to overnights.

A general discussion was raised about whether or not Andrew still required to be on supervision - Rosie explained briefly to Andrew what the differences would be. Discussed the possibility of Andrew staying at Woodside while he does the 12 week training for Independent Living. Carol said this may be possible even though it is not an ideal arrangement.

Andrew clearly unhappy about the breakdown of his placement and felt that he did not deserve any support. Andrew was told that while his behaviour had been unacceptable, there was still support for him and that Nacha had also made a commitment to future contact. Andrew said he would like to see an I.L. worker to find out more.

Andrew encouraged to use support to discuss any problems he has at work.

Tasks

- Rosie to arrange for Andrew to see an I.L. worker and also make a referral to I.L.
- Rosie to invite Andrew's mum to the next network meeting to discuss whether Andrew staying with her is an option.
- Andrew to think through options before the next meeting.

Next meeting 9 a.m. on 2 September 1996 at NCH providing Andrew has been able to speak to someone from I.L. before this.

This meeting had been scheduled as an In Care Review but, due to the change in Andrew's situation it was agreed that it should be a Movement in Care Meeting. A Review will be scheduled to take place shortly, by which time it is hoped that clearer plans can be made for Andrew's future.

A report was submitted by the social worker.

**Background to Movement in Care:**

When Ms Adams wrote her report, Andrew was going to move back into his Mainstay placement with Nacha and it had been agreed that he would be regarded as being on leave from Woodside until the Hearing. A Hearing is due to take place on 29 August 1996.

Andrew moved back with Nacha on 2 August 1996 and settled down immediately as if he had never left. He was very interested in his work placement, very helpful around the home, he had a new girlfriend and his visits to his mother were going well. Prior to Andrew moving back, a tight agreement on boundaries had been made and it was clearly stated that Andrew would not touch Nacha's car.

On Thursday evening, 22 August, Andrew visited his mother in Stanley, taking his girlfriend with him. The visit did not go well and Andrew was very uptight and 'hyper' when he returned and would not go to bed. He got up at 2am and decided to take Nacha's car to go and see his grandfather in Glasgow. Andrew first went to Stanley to see if his mother wanted to accompany him but she refused. He then went to Dunblane and drove around for a few hours before returning home.

On Friday morning when preparing to drive Andrew to work, Nacha noticed the mileage was up and there was more diesel in the car than when he last drove, and Andrew admitted to taking the car but said his mother had put him up to it. Nacha and Andrew then went to see Andrew's mother in Stanley who denied having suggested such a thing. On the way back home, Nacha and Andrew met Andrew's girlfriend who said Mrs Murray had said to Andrew "you should think about getting a car and going down to see grandad".

Before reaching the Police Station, Nacha advised Andrew that he had broken their agreement and the placement would have to end. Andrew was very disappointed at this. Andrew was charged by the Police on two counts.

On return to the house Nacha and he again discussed the situation. Ms Adams telephoned and arrangements were made for Andrew to go to Woodside at 1pm on Friday 23 August.

**NCH:**

Ms Macdonald advised that after the last Review and following high level offending, there had been an assessment and link was established between Andrew's relationship with his mother and his offending. She considered that Andrew is holding on to a lot of anger surrounding his reception into care and although his work with the Project has moved him on considerably, he is still hanging on to feelings about his mother. She feels that his behaviour on Thursday could be linked to his visit earlier that evening to his mother.

**Employment:**

Andrew is working on an Ostrich farm and this has been going very well although he will do anything to drive a vehicle on the farm. His employer says he is a bit cheeky, complains about doing things he doesn't want to do and doesn't like the smell. Andrew is on his last chance at work.
