Thank you for seeing this girl whom I saw at Deleval Road recently. Her problem is primary nocturnal enuresis and these days she is wet about 90% of nights. I have not yet checked her urine. There have been lots of family problems in the past which may have interfered with Amanda acquiring bladder control. There appears to have been a long history of marital violence and finally mother had to flee Scotland to get away from her husband as separation alone had not been sufficient. Amanda has witnessed [REDACTED] within the last two years and the family came to Newcastle in October of last year. Apparently since then everything has gone well in the family and there has been a marked improvement between the two occasions on which I have seen this family. Amanda has an older brother, [REDACTED] who has recently been an in-patient at the General with a convulsion following a head injury. He has a tendency towards wheezing.
