I have explained to him that while it is difficult to be absolutely certain of any diagnosis within neurology, I am convinced that he has a diagnosis of epilepsy. As such, ongoing seizures raise the risk of injury during the period of impaired consciousness. Additionally I explained that major convulsions raise the risk of sudden unexpected death in epilepsy (SUDEP). This is a small but real risk of dying from a convulsion; anti-epileptic medication serves to attempt to reduce this risk. I have clarified this point and he has absolutely understood that I believe he has epilepsy and that untreated he would be at increased risk of adverse events. Despite understanding my position he refuses to take anti-epileptic medication, remaining convinced that his condition is not epilepsy.

I explained that he would need to stand down from driving for 12 months after the most recent event, necessitating him to be free from these events before he could return to driving. I explained that he must be truthful with the DVLA but should he be free of events for 12 months the DVLA would allow him to return to driving. Given the frequent nature of his events over the last five years, I think it improbable that he will be free of events without anti-epileptic medication.

He was frustrated with my opinion but did well to remain polite and reasonable during our conversation. It is clear however, that he does not accept the diagnosis and will not undertake anticonvulsant therapy as I have outlined. Additionally he will not undertake the investigations I have requested because of this fundamental difference in our opinions.

With this in mind I have discharged him from the Neurology Clinic as there is nothing further that I can do. I would be very happy to review him in the future should he be willing to reconsider his viewpoint.

I saw this 40 year old gentleman at the acute neurology clinic at Hurstwood Park Neurological Centre at your request, with his girlfriend present. They describe 5 years of what are likely to be complex partial seizures with a flurry of major convulsions in October.

As you had identified, for the last 5 years there have been intermittent episodes that sound like they are complex partial seizures, initially infrequent but over the last 2 ½ years more frequent, occurring on a nearly daily basis. He describes a feeling of panic coming over him with tightness in his chest and difficulty breathing and had previously described to her the visual representation of a circle, as if a computer screen was loading. He would then become unaware of his surroundings and she clearly describes a clucking noise of the mouth, like an oral automatism, during which time he would be unable to interact for up to 30 seconds before then slowly regaining awareness. During this time he would have forgotten the details of his work and then over a period of an hour would return back to normal although would appear tired. Overall this sounds relatively convincing for a complex partial seizure. These occurred daily and for reasons that are unclear he did not seek medical attention for this, predominantly because it was thought these were panic attacks.

On one night in October there were 4 consecutive major convulsions. She saw the end of the first with major jerking of all limbs which resolved. She subsequently another lip smacking episode which then evolved into another major convulsion beginning with a tonic phase followed by clonic contraction. Since then he had been of minor seizures until

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this last week when 3 minor seizures occurred over a space of 7 days. He is taking no medication for this.

His past medical history is notable for illicit drug use in the past and alcohol excess. He has had a ruptured biceps tendon but denies any other significant medical history of note. His development was normal and he denies previous childhood epilepsy, febrile convulsions, significant head injury, meningitis or encephalitis.

He takes no regular medications. He lives at home with his girlfriend and continues to work in construction. He smokes 2 or 3 cigarettes per day as well as marijuana and had previously consumed excess alcohol. His driving licence has been withheld for non-medical reasons.

The neurological examination demonstrates normal cranial nerves with normal optic discs. The limb examination was unremarkable and the reflexes were 1+ throughout with plantars down going bilaterally. The gait was normal.

I have explained to him and his girlfriend that the description of the minor events would be typical for complex partial seizures and the major convulsion sounds very much like a generalised tonic clonic convulsion. I have explained to them that he has a diagnosis of epilepsy and would point them towards the website <http://www.epilepsy.org.uk> for some further information about this diagnosis.

I have explained that we should undertake an MRI scan of the brain and an EEG to investigate things further but even if those tests were to be normal the diagnosis of epilepsy has been made on clinical grounds.

I have given them the usual safety advice in the event of further seizures and would advise him to inform the DVLA of this event. They would require him to stand down from driving for a period of 12 months free of seizures. I have warned him about the risk of morbidity and mortality associated with seizures.

I have given him a prescription for Carbamazepine CR 200mg at night in the first instance for 2 weeks, increasing after that to 200mg twice a day. I have given him a total of 4 weeks' supply and would be grateful if you might then prescribe him 200mg in the morning, 400mg at night and after a fortnight increase that further to 400mg twice a day. The intention would be to prevent these minor seizures from recurring.

I will invite our Epilepsy Nurse Specialist to be involved in his care also, but have made plans to see him back in 4 months' time.

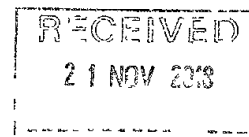

Left distal biceps repair 3 weeks ago

Patrick's developed some seizures around 5 days post-op. He had four seizures. On reflection, he's actually been having these sort of episodes in the last year. He has now seen his GP and is getting a referral. He is worried that he may have damaged the biceps repair, because of the jerking movements so early after surgery. Looking at his arm there is a little swelling around the incision site which is clean, healthy and dry with no evidence of infection. He has got no neurological issues. The biceps feels intact in the cubital fossa on a Hook test. There is a little swelling approximately towards the muscle belly, but overall the tendon bulk shape and strength is good, therefore I am thankful that the repair appears intact despite his seizures.

I have reminded him that he shouldn't be doing any lifting for 3 months and of the importance of getting his seizures looked into, which is underway.

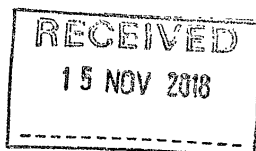

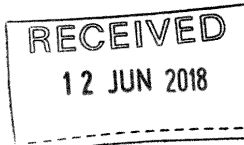

I reviewed this pleasant gentleman who is complaining of a lump around his abdomen. He has been having this for many years but recently it has been giving him more discomfort. He also noticed a smaller lump just above the main lump. He is otherwise fit and well with no major medical or surgical problems.

On examination this is a supraumbilical hernia and about an inch above that he also has a small fatty hernia. This is also accompanied with a divarication of his recti. I think the way forward is to have this hernia fixed with open repair and most likely with a mesh. I will try and fix both the fatty hernia as well as the supraumbilical hernia at the same time. I have explained the pros and cons of surgery and he is keen to go ahead. This will happen at the Princess Royal Hospital as a day case.

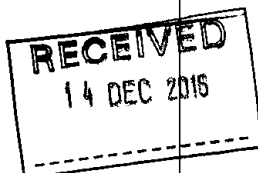

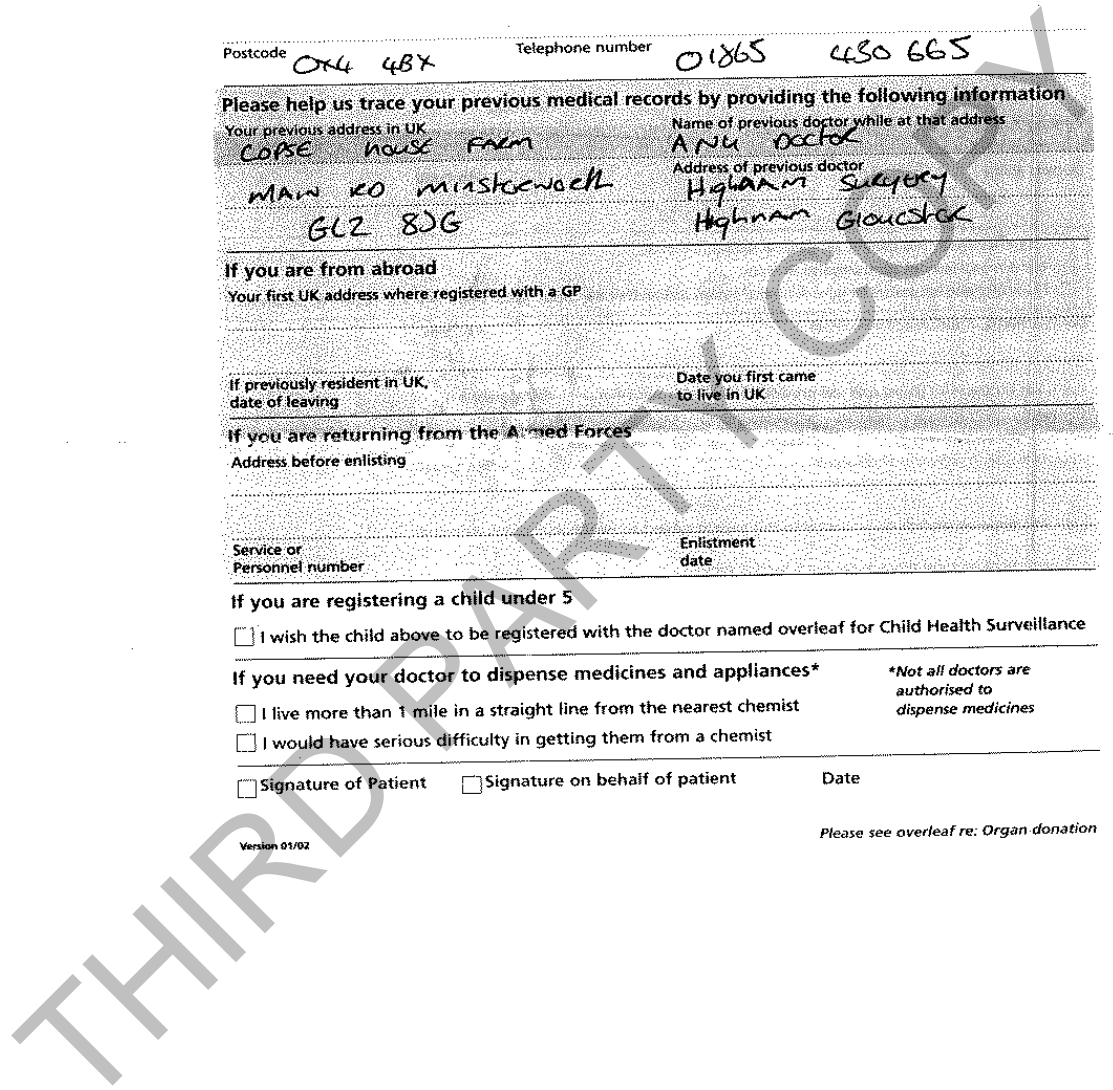

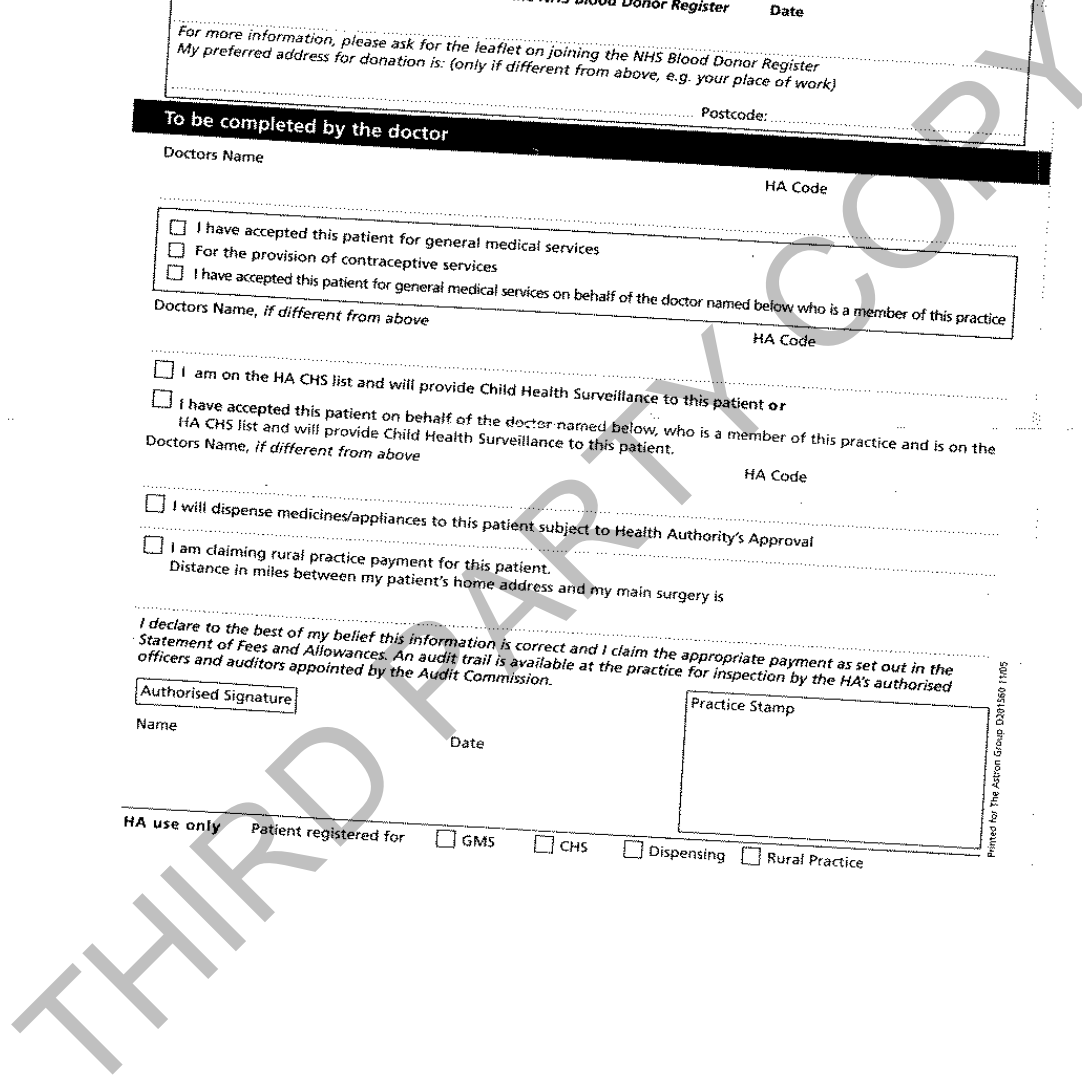

Your client above was seen by our services for an alcohol assessment. Mr Southern reports that he has been drinking up to 24 cans of stella 5.2% larger finance permitting. He drinks up to 140 units per week on average he has been drinking at these levels for the past 15 years. He reports shakiness, sweating, nausea and acute anxiety with panic attacks as form of withdrawl.

History of Substance Abuse

Mr Southern started drinking since the age of 12 years and has experimented with numerous other elicit drugs including ecstasy and cannabis. He says he reacts very badly to alcohol becomes violent and according to his own words dangerous over the years it has got him into a lot of difficulties where he has attacked others and has been injured himself.

Phrensic History

Mr Southern has recently left Lewes Prison in June 09 after serving 4 years for attempted murder and aggravated burgulry on 2 separate occasions. He says that he has been in similar type of trouble throughout his life. He attributes this to alcohol says that each time he had committed this type of crime he had axcessive levels of alcohol. In 2005 Mr Southern attempted to stab the boyfriend of his ex girlfriend and was sent to prison for 4 years, he left prison after serving 2 years but had to go in again for aggravated burglary.

Mr Southern lives alone in a short term hostel accommodation since leaving prison in june 09. Currently he is on parole from prison. He has no contact with his family consisting of step father, mother and 1 sister and a brother for the past 20 years. He says he has been in and out of care since the age of 4 years after the age of 9 years was in permanent local authority care. He says his mother and step father used to abuse him physically. He says he feels lonely and isolated most of the time.

Mental Health

Mr Southern does not report any difficulties with his mental health apart from the effect of excessive drinking whereby he says he loses control and has attacked many people in the past for no good reasons. He states that he becomes dangerous after drinking, wants to address his drinking immediately he is afraid of hurting some one else.

Following discussions with Mr Southern and the alcohol team it was decided that our 2 weeks of ambulatory detox programme would be the suitable treatment option for him. Following a successful medical assessment on 1st October 09 Mr Southern would be able to start the programme of treatment on 5th October 2009. We will keep you informed of any future developments.
