Good morning,

Thank you for your email of 31/10/2025 in which you requested information from SPS relating to your client David Jackson's time in custody. Your request was processed as a Subject Access Request (SAR) in accordance with Section 45 of the Data Protection Act 2018 (DPA).

Upon receipt of your request, SPS conducted the relevant searches of our records, and I can confirm we hold no longer hold any records for Mr Jackson. Our electronic prisoner records system only holds data from 1995 onwards and paper prisoner records created prior to this have been destroyed in accordance with our Prisoner Records Retention and Destruction Policy.

In relation to your request for historic records, some historic records over the years been transferred to the National Records of Scotland (NRS), therefore we asked NRS to carry out a search of SPS records they hold on your behalf for the dates provided. NRS have concluded their searches and identified the following record within the date range provided which included Mr Jackson's personal data: **HH21/70/158** - Barlinnie Index Card (See attached).

NRS have advised us that files marked 'Open' will not include any personal information but relate to the running of institution and requesters are welcome to review any of these 'Open' records held in the Historical Search Room at General Register House. NRS have previously advised us that a separate SAR can be submitted directly to them as they can carry out a wider search of non-SPS records created by Scottish Government which relate to institutions that looked after young offenders. Court and Legal colleagues may also be able to identify any court records, which might include personal information. If you wish to do so, you can submit a request to dataprotection@nrscotland.gov.uk.

You may also wish to submit a SAR to the Scottish Government (SG) as the Directorate for Children and Families hold some redacted copies of Scottish Education Department files relating to institutions for looked after children/young offenders. A request to SG can be submitted via:

If you are dissatisfied with our response you should in the first instance, contact the SPS Data Protection Officer explaining the reason(s) for the dissatisfaction:

You also have the right to apply to a court where you believe there has been an infringement of your client's rights under the data protection legislation in contravention of that legislation.
