Dear Michelle Sherratt,

Thank you for your email making a Subject Access Request (SAR) on behalf of your client David Craig.

I am sorry to tell you that we cannot help David Craig with his query because we at Children's Hearings Scotland do not deal with these records.

Let me explain why: Children's Hearings Scotland (CHS) was established in 2013 and is responsible for the recruitment, training and support of Panel Members who sit on the Children's Panel in Scotland.

This means that we do not hold the records of children or young people who have been involved in the system or attended hearings, and do not hold any information on your client.

**To help you further:** There are 2 organisations I suggest you might want to get in touch with. These may be able to assist you further or provide further information:

- **The Scottish Children's Reporter Administration (SCRA):** Children's Reporters decide whether a hearing is needed for a child or young person and SCRA is the organisation responsible for managing hearings reports. You can find [advice and guidance on the SCRA webpage on making a request for information](#).
  - You can also make Subject Access Request (SAR) for your client's information from the local authority/council area he was in at the time. You should be able to find the correct webpage if you do an internet search with: [Council] Subject Access Request. When people contact us, we are aware that the process of accessing records about themselves can cause difficult feelings, especially if they suffered abuse during their time in the care system.
