**Background:**

The family became known to the Society in October, 1977 when it was alleged that the mother was neglecting the children and providing poor home conditions. The complaint was investigated by Inspector Chalmers, R.S.S.P.C.C. who found no evidence to substantiate the complaint.

On 29th August, 1980 Father contacted Society seeking advice regarding the home circumstances. During a discussion he stated he was short tempered, a strict disciplinarian and that he was anti-authority. He revealed that his own parents were well known to the R.S.S.P.C.C. in Fife. They were prosecuted for alleged illtreatment by the Society.

On 3rd November, 1980 [REDACTED] the [REDACTED] and the [REDACTED] were not to his satisfaction. The father was severely warned against using such forceful methods of punishment and advised that his expectations were wrong.

On 10th March, 1981 Case Conference at Ninewells Hospital recommended Medical examination of two youngest children and Referral to Reporter.

On 11th March, 1981 Home visit, mother was advised of the Case Conference and the recommendation to have Marjory and Diane medically examined, she raised no objection. Marjory and Diane were then conveyed to Police Headquarters where they were examined by Dr Marshall, Police Surgeon who found no cause for concern.

## Conclusion

During the period of involvement by the Society concern has been constantly expressed in relation to the father's attitude towards the two older children, Gavin in particular. The father is fairly well known as a violent man who takes some pride in that fact and it is felt that he uses discipline within the home as a potential outlet for his moods. It has been observed that at the very least, his attitude towards the children causes fear and possibly mental injury.

It is my considered opinion that the father is a potential danger to the children and in view of this they should be placed in a situation where he cannot have access.

(Further information on the hearing is set out in the leaflet entitled "To tell you about the Children's Hearing" a copy of which accompanies this notification).

When the children's hearing are discussing your case, they will want to find out your views and you may, if you wish, bring with you to the hearing someone to help you in discussing your difficulties and what might be done. The personal expenses of this representative (but not any fees) may be refunded if they are not less than fifteen pence (15p).

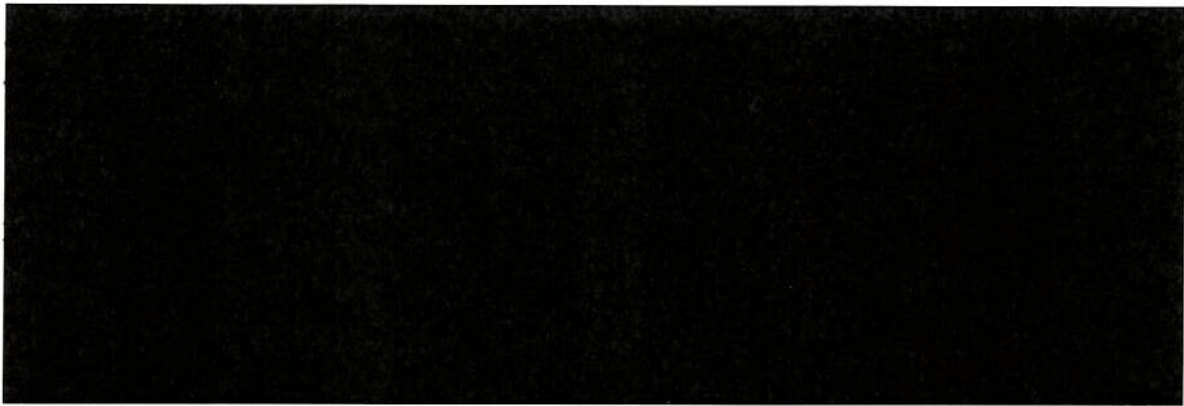

is being referred to a Children's Hearing for Tayside on the grounds of the following conditions:  
that she is a member of the same household as a child in respect of whom an offence mentioned in respect of whom an offence mentioned in paragraph (d) of Schedule 1 to the Criminal Procedure (Scotland) Act, 1975 has been committed, viz. an offence involving bodily injury to a child under the age of seventeen years. and may, therefore, be in need of compulsory measures of care in terms of Section 32 (subsection (2)(d)) of the Social Work (Scotland) Act, 1968.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

1. Marjory was born on 10th May, 1977, and until 14th March, 1981 she lived with her mother Marjory Helen Morrison or Wallace known as Ferguson and her stepfather Douglas Edward Keep alias Finlayson alias Ferguson at 1 Dronley Avenue, Dundee. Mrs. Ferguson has one other child of her marriage to Mr. Wallace, namely Gavin born on 14th December, 1975, and there is one child of her union with Mr. Ferguson, namely Diane born on 17th September, 1979.

3. Mr. Ferguson was then charged by the Police with a common law offence of assault to ~~injury~~ injury, or alternatively a contravention of Section 12 of the Children and Young Persons (Scotland) Act, 1937, in respect of this incident. On 4th June, 1981 Mr. Ferguson pleaded guilty in Dundee Sheriff Court to the common law offence, and was sentenced to four months imprisonment.

Natural Father: George Wallace (24) resides c/o 92 Dunbar Crescent, Dundee. - he is unemployed.

Prior to the events of 9.3.81 Mr. and Mrs. Ferguson and the three children stayed at 1 Dronley Avenue, a three-bedroomed local authority house in an area of high deprivation. Mrs. Ferguson, who is pregnant, is currently living there with Diane.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Marjorie Morrison (Ferguson) and George Wallace were married on 22.9.75 when she was pregnant with Gavin. They were allocated a house in Fintry but moved house a few months later. The couple separated on 17.3.1977 a few weeks before Marjorie's birth. Mrs. Wallace (Ferguson) moved house again with the two children and remained there until July 1978. Meanwhile, within a few weeks of leaving his wife Mr. Wallace met another girl with whom he lived for three years. They have a three year old son [redacted] but this relationship ended and she is now married to someone else. Mr. Wallace sees [redacted] fairly regularly.

Mrs. Wallace (Ferguson) moved into Dundee Battered Women's Hostel in July 1978 after she and the children had been assaulted by a man with whom she was associating. Six weeks later she and the children moved to Dunfermline Battered Women's Hostel where she stayed for three weeks. She then lived with a brother in Dunfermline for three months until she was allocated a house in Dunn Crescent, Dunfermline. Shortly after moving to Dunfermline Mrs. Wallace (Ferguson) met Mr. Ferguson and he moved into her house. In June 1979 Mr. Ferguson, Mrs. Wallace (Ferguson) and the children came to Dundee on holiday and decided to stay. They moved into Dronley Avenue in September 1979.

Until Mrs. Wallace (Ferguson) moved to Dunfermline Mr. Wallace had regular contact with his children. In the summer of 1978 he moved with his cohabitee and their child to Nottingham and they were there for eighteen months. They returned to Dundee together but subsequently separated. Mr. Wallace left Dundee again in the summer of 1980 when he got a job in Shetland. He returned in January of this year and moved in with his parents and has been unemployed since that time.

Mr. and Mrs. Wallace (Ferguson) were divorced on 26.6.80 and Mr. and Mrs. Ferguson were married on 21.2.81. Diane, their daughter was born in September 79 and Mrs. Ferguson is due to have another child later this year.

FAMILY SITUATION:

Mrs. Ferguson first referred herself to Social Work Department in May 1977 when she was separated from her husband and had financial difficulties. We had contact with her for a short period but it was after her return from Dunfermline with Mr. Ferguson that we began to have more specific concerns about the children.

In February 1980 a case conference was held at Ninewells Hospital because the Health Visitor was concerned about Gavin and Marjorie. It was decided that their names should be placed on the Early Warning Register as they were thought to be "At Risk". A recommendation of the conference was that Gavin and Marjorie should be considered for Day Nursery and with the parents' consent they were subsequently admitted to Lochee Day Nursery.

In June 1980 [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] and concern was expressed about the rigid discipline imposed by Mr. Ferguson on his two young step-children. Concern was such that referral to the Children's Panel was considered appropriate and this was to be done by the hospital medical staff.

However this recommendation was not carried out because it was felt on later consideration of the case that in these particular circumstances the referral was not an appropriate one for a doctor to make.

As a result of this a further case conference was held in July and following discussion of the current family situation it was felt that a referral should not be made to the Reporter. It was felt that efforts should be made to help Mr. Ferguson increase his awareness of the needs of children. Mr. Ferguson responded favourably to a suggestion that he spend some time at Lochee Day Nursery and from August to December of last year he spent one day each week at the nursery. He was also heavily involved in a Community Project in the Beechwood area organising and participating in holidays for youngsters from the area. In fact his involvement was so great that I understand at times this caused friction between himself and his wife.

In August of last year Mr. Ferguson referred himself to the R.S.S.P.C.C. on the basis that he felt he needed help in modifying his over-strict attitude and short-tempered behaviour. He has never attempted to hide the fact that he has been in prison on a number of occasions and has a 'violent' background. An officer from the R.S.S.P.C.C. visited regularly until the incident which resulted in [REDACTED] My first contact with the family was at the crisis point when [REDACTED] and Mr. Ferguson was on remand in Perth Prison.

The following week I was surprised to learn that Marjorie was with her father at his parents' home in Linlathen. Marjorie has been in her father's care since that time although Mrs. Ferguson insists that she thought he had only taken her for a weekend visit. I think it is likely that she simply agreed to Marjorie going into her father's care. Marjorie responded well to her father's easy manner and a good rapport was quickly established. With the support of his parents this seemed to provide a temporary solution pending the outcome of a Hearing. However Mr. Wallace moved approximately six weeks ago to live with a friend who is also a single parent and he now hopes to be allocated a house in his own right.

Gavin and Marjorie are very close and I was able to arrange to take Marjorie on visits to the children's home. Mr. and Mrs. Ferguson and Diane visited the children with me on a number of occasions. Initially these visits were rather strained as the Fergusons felt they were under scrutiny but in time they were able to relax and Mr. Ferguson felt able to play with all three children.

Since March Mr. Wallace has had some contact with Gavin but certainly he has not been able to build up the kind of relationship he has with Marjorie.

ASSESSMENT OF SITUATION TO DATE:

Mr. Ferguson: As already indicated Mr. Ferguson has a violent background. He was taken into care when aged about twelve years and has been through children's home, list 'D' School, borstal and for a number of years of his adult life has been in prison. I understand that as a youngster he was badly treated by a step-father who was a rigid disciplinarian. Overall his childhood years were not particularly happy and he later drifted into a marriage which ended in divorce. His first wife has the care of their two children.

Mrs. Ferguson: Mrs. Ferguson married Mr. Wallace on her sixteenth birthday when she was already pregnant. As already noted the marriage did not work out possibly due to the immaturity of this young couple and both drifted into other relationships. She is still very young and expecting her fourth child.

Mr. Wallace: He says he had a happy childhood with caring parents and they certainly come across as a couple interested in the welfare of their family. Since the break-up of the marriage he has spent much of the last few years away from the Dundee area and consequently contact with his children has been limited.

I understand that when the Fergusons married, Mr. Wallace agreed to allow them to function as a family unit and that he would not interfere in the upbringing of the children provided they were well cared for. He now feels that he would like to set up home for his children but given that he has only had Marjorie for a short time and has had little contact with Gavin, I have reservations about his ability to manage and accommodate himself to the needs of growing children. He has made contact with a solicitor regarding custody of the children. Mr. and Mrs. Ferguson have maintained throughout their contact with me that they want the children back. Mr. Ferguson was very hostile towards me and made it clear that he would only tolerate me until this case was over. However he has co-operated with my decision regarding visits to the children and allowed visits to the home and in the office. With time his suspicion of social workers has eased and I understand from previous records that his overall rigidity in attitudes has mellowed and he is becoming increasingly amenable to suggestions regarding the emotional and physical needs of children. He is very aware of the need for change and it is to his credit that he spent time in the nursery involving himself with young children.

Re: Ferguson Family

Prior to the incident [REDACTED], there were specific events which led to a build up of tension. Unfortunately, there are no guarantees that another build-up of frustration would enable him to find another outlet for aggression. I feel he is very fond of the children and he says he would be willing to undergo any type of training to help him respond better to them. A major factor in his attitude is concern that Gavin, Marjorie and Diane should not become delinquent and end up like himself. Unfortunately there are no specialised intensive facilities to help Mr. Ferguson examine and change some of his behaviour.

On watching him with Diane it is evident that she is very fond of her father and his manner with her is firm but caring. Gavin and Marjorie are both delightful, attractive children. They are extremely close and always look very excited about seeing each other. I feel it is important that they should be brought together as soon as possible.

As already stated I do not think it would be appropriate for the children to be returned to Mr. and Mrs. Ferguson meantime. Equally I have reservations about Mr. Wallace's ability to manage and on one occasion he admitted that having Marjorie was quite a handful at times. Gavin is older and more boisterous and I am concerned that given Mr. Wallace's previously carefree lifestyle he could find the demands of getting to know his children and provide for their needs too great a task.

Shortly after I met Mr. Wallace he talked about a sixteen year old girlfriend and although he had only known her for a few weeks was thinking about the possibility of marriage and of her moving in with him and the children sometime in the future. I found this concerning particularly as Marjorie mentioned to Mr. and Mrs. Ferguson that she now had two mummies. This relationship has I understand, now ended.

Overall, I feel that the needs of Gavin and Marjorie could best be met by placement in a substitute family where caring is coupled with consistent handling. Given their adjustment to the recent changes in their lives, I think they would adapt well to a new situation.

Diane appears well cared for and provided regular contact is maintained by Health Visitor and Social Worker I feel she should be able to remain with her parents.

Case Summary - September 1981  
Mr Ferguson: Recently out of prison following a 4 months  
prison sentence. He is very anxious to have Gavin  
and Marjorie back with him and his wife and has  
moved from a position in Maitland where he was only  
just aggressively tolerant of social work intervention  
to attempting to cooperate fully with me. He admits  
freely that he needs help in looking at his  
rigidity re child rearing and is prepared for any  
amount of supervision etc. He has approached Mrs Fisher  
at F.B.W. re spending time there in a voluntary  
capacity working with the children. We are to look  
at this more closely when Mrs Fisher and myself  
are back from leave at the end of September.  
I find he is demonstrating concern and interest  
re all ~~the~~ three children.

Mrs Ferguson. She is due to have another baby  
next month and at the moment seems rather worn  
out. She goes along with her husband re the children  
but needs a great deal of guidance. While visiting  
Mr Ferguson in Perth Prison he volunteered the information  
that his wife was brought up in the Children's  
Shelter and Lyet Hill Hostel. He is aware that her  
standards re housekeeping etc. are not consistent  
and says he intends to work on this with her. She is  
not a particularly responsive person so it is difficult  
to gauge her feelings much of the time.  
Gavin is well settled in Florence Booth. He is

Margie appears to be reasonably well cared for by her father. He has recently moved into his own house and is trying to get it furnished. Whenever recent information suggests that Mr Wallace may be working and being her in the case of a relative body per week 8a-8p. Certainly this could explain why he has not been keeping appointments with me and with Florence Booth house.

Diane

Mr Wallace was initially very keen to take both his children. He appeared back on the scene when [redacted] and I was concerned about his enthusiasm - particularly as neither of the children knew him as their father. Mrs Ferguson was initially agreeable to him taking Margie but the situation developed and she has been with him since March.

## Future plans

I am currently working with Mr + Mrs Ferguson and Mr Wallace to assess where the children would be better placed. I have strong reservations about Mr Wallace and feel that he is not sufficiently interested in Gai for him to make a sustained effort. At the same time I feel that Gai and Margie should be reunited as soon as possible. Mr + Mrs Ferguson seem well motivated in their desire to have the children home. Obviously there are

cope in the future particularly with another baby  
due very soon. My plan for the future  
is to continue the contact between the children and  
their parents and to have a review of the hearing  
perhaps early in the New Year. It is I feel possible  
that M<sup>r</sup> Walker will initially be very difficult and

with the Ferguson's will be over a long period  
before reconciliation with the children can be  
contemplated. Meantime unless Bethan
