**Event:** Office Visit By Howard Campbell For Advice.

Has had contact with Graeme Wilson, Housing Manager, Horizon who is querying when rent will be paid. Advised him to contact DSS in first instance. Howard then stated £200 in benefits due to Joyce and this would likely cover it. Then went onto query what financial assistance would be available for the couple if they took the children. Reminded him that no clear policy as yet regarding relative fostering allowances but limited moneys could be available in longer term. Howard indicating money would be an issue for the couple as his wife is self-employed with no guaranteed income. Gained impression Howard wavering regarding the children. He admitted it is a major decision and will totally change their lifestyle.

He also acknowledged the tension during the family meeting but attributed this to the fact the family had not had a discussion beforehand.

Queried if he should contact Social Work in Renfrew to see what assistance would be on offer. Advised this might complicate situation and to allow Morag Bulloch to become involved as from 16 September, 1996 in first instance. Howard in agreement.

Arrangements in place for children next week.

13/09/96 - Telephone call from Ann Tomasso, aunt.

Concerned that situation is reaching crisis point with Horizon placing pressure regarding rent and regaining tenancy. Also that decisions about the children are being delayed. Reminded her of the agreed timescale of our involvement from the family meeting and this had been accepted. After further discussion Ann indicated that she feels Howard and Mary were not really committed to the children and were only doing this through guilt. They do not realise the task they are undertaking or the impact this will have on their lifestyle.

The family have just discovered that Joyce made a Will in which Ann Tomasso is the executor. She is due to meet with the solicitor in Denny on 16 September, 1996 to find out what is in it. A draft Will made in 1991 made a neighbour of Joyce's in Denny the children's guardian but there has been no ongoing contact with this neighbour in recent years.

Ann agreed to contact myself or Morag Bulloch after seeing the solicitor.

Continued to emphasise to her that the children are a family responsibility while Social Work can advise, assist and enable.

After general introductions Howard and Mary stated they had decided to take the children. The couple live in a three bedroom house at [REDACTED] Both work full-time and requested information about possible supports available. However, couple then stated that they wished to move the children on a gradual, planned basis and are thinking of putting them into Foster Care in Falkirk with weekends in Lochwinnoch, possibly until Christmas. It was clear through further discussion that this is not a unanimous decision by family present, with Mrs Tomasso in particular challenging some of the couple's statements.

...ile the couple are keen to keep some stability for the children i.e. school, friends etc. they had failed to realise the implications for children of coming into care. After further discussion they accepted this would not be in the children's interests. Family are able to continue a rota to keep the children in their home for a further three weeks but beyond that would require home help support morning and evening on week days.

Kevin and Zoe have not yet been advised of couple's plans but both have expressed fears of being received into care.

Family are concerned about Kevin, describing him as "traumatised". Apparently G.P. had refused a home visit to Kevin when his mother died. Advised family to contact Dr Norton's clinic to establish if she is still involved or whether he needs to be re-referred via G.P.

Very obvious that neither Howard nor Mary have given in-depth thought to their plan nor discussed it at any length with the rest of the family. Indicated that the children's views are important in this situation and Morag Bulloch, Social Worker, can become re-involved as from 16/09/96. She could also be available for advice and guidance particularly for Howard and Mary.

...r Campbell was keen for me to contact Housing to see how long the tenancy can be kept. Advised him to do this himself, explaining the present situation with the children but if there were problems to advise myself or Morag Bulloch.

Before ending, reminded the family that this Service has no statutory involvement/Orders with the children and at this stage can only advise the adults involved.

Mrs. Campbell has now informed the Social Work Department that if she is taken ill or needs hospital care her current neighbour Mrs. Findlay has agreed that she will take the children. Mrs. Findlay has confirmed this with the Social work Department.

Mrs. Campbell's friend Mrs. Blair has also confirmed that she is willing to give support to Mrs. Findlay with the care of the children.

There have been difficulties on previous occasions when Mrs. Campbell has been unwell and has asked that either her sister in Glasgow or her neighbour Mrs. Findlay have the care of the children. When they were unable to, due to their own commitments, Mrs. Campbell did not want to consider foster care although she herself was physically unfit to look after the children. Additionally, she has stated that she felt extremely vulnerable and at risk on at least one occasion when the children went to her sister's and she was left alone as there was nobody to press the alarm system for her.

As stated previously, Mrs. Campbell is currently supported by the Home Help Service who attend four hours per day six days per week. Mrs. Campbell has stated that she finds the lack of control over the children's lives one of the most difficult aspects of her physical disability. Some of this she will be able to regain when she is in more suitable accommodation.

Zoe is an extremely lively young girl who is very outgoing. She makes friends both amongst her own age group and adults. She is a very inquisitive child who constantly asks questions. Zoe can be enuretic at night at home but when in foster care has not had any difficulties. Zoe appears to cope well with different situations, quickly relating to the different carers both within her home and on the occasion she has had to go to other people. Due to her outgoing personality Kevin often gets left in the background. Zoe is keen on music and dancing. She also likes playing with dolls and cuddly toys.

Attitude to Social Work Involvement

Mrs. Campbell has stated that she does not want contact with the Social Work Department following her move. She has always found it difficult to accept the alternative care offered. On the other hand she feels let down with provision for the children during the summer holidays. For the first four weeks the children had gone to the playscheme and when contact was made with Mrs. Campbell she had indicated that she was making her own arrangements through her family.

Assessment

This is a complex family situation where there are a number of different agencies involved in supporting both Mrs. Campbell and the children and as such some confusion can arise as to what Mrs. Campbell is saying to different agencies at different times. However, there are concerns that she is not always able to make decisions in the children's best interests due to her own difficulties in accepting her situation. As such, she has unrealistic expectations of what can and cannot be provided by different services. At times, Mrs. Campbell can be very contradictory, on the one hand saying that she wants control of the care of the children and then saying that this is too much for her.

The children themselves do have a number of needs, particularly in terms of their mother's illness and necessity for hospitalisation. Unfortunately, whilst she is unable to accept this need, it is unlikely that they also will be able to accept the situation as it arises.

Mrs. Campbell herself does evoke a large amount of sympathy due to her very real physical and emotional needs. However, it must be stressed that the children's needs must come first and should not be set aside because of this. Additionally, the children themselves were exposed on this particular occasion to unnecessary suffering.

I would therefore recommend that the children be made subject of a 44(1)(a) so that the following work can continue.

- 1) To co-ordinate and assess the package of support to Mrs. Campbell in terms of Home Help input, day care if appropriate, respite foster care if appropriate in the future.
- 2) To assess what needs the children have in the future in terms of alternative care if Mrs. Campbell has further spells where she is unable to care for them for short periods.
- 3) Continued contact with the other agencies involved, e.g. Dr. Norton, Child Psychiatrist, re: the needs Zoe and Kevin have in terms of their level of anxiety about their future.
4. Work with Mrs. Campbell to look at the children's needs

Campbell but she decided that she no longer wanted this service preferring to care for the children herself. Respite foster care has been offered but declined by Mrs. Campbell.

On the 18.06.92 the children were received into care under Section 15 of the Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968 as Mrs. Campbell was admitted to hospital and there was no-one available amongst the extended family who could provide care at that time. Mrs. Campbell was very reluctant to agree to this although there were no other alternatives and there were concerns that she was unable to put the children's needs first. At that stage she had wanted to discharge herself from hospital although she was medically unwell and would not have been physically able to cope with the children. The children viewed their period in care almost as a holiday and showed no outward signs of distress. They wanted to remain in contact with the foster family after they were discharged from care two days later when Mrs. Campbell was fit to resume their care.

Circumstances leading to the Place of Safety.

At 3.50 p.m. on Friday, 14th August, 1992 Mrs. Campbell's home help Mrs. Irwin received a telephone call from Mrs. Campbell who appeared to be very distressed and threatening to take her pills. The home help could hear Zoe banging on the door and asking to be let in as she had fallen. Mrs. Irwin advised Mrs. Campbell not to hang up but to go and let Zoe in. Mrs. Campbell did hang up. Mrs. Irwin went down to the house and found Zoe and Kevin outside with both doors to the house locked and bolted and a neighbour, who has a front door key was unable to get in. With the neighbour's help a window was forced open and Kevin climbed in. Mrs. Campbell was lying on the kitchen floor unconscious. Mrs. Irwin called M.E.C.S. and Mrs. Campbell's G.P. and M.E.C.S. arrived shortly afterwards with the G.P. arranging for Mrs. Campbell to be admitted to hospital. The Social Work Department were notified to make alternative arrangements for the children.

It was decided that the children were in need of a Place of Safety because Mrs. Campbell had been in sole charge of the children and failed to ensure that they were adequately looked after. They had been out on the street with no way back into the house. Mrs. Campbell had apparently made a serious attempt at suicide.

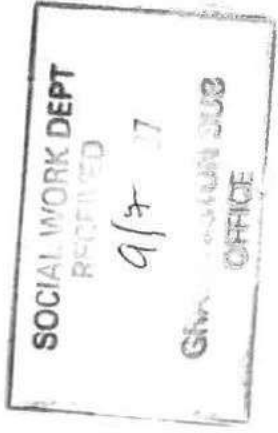

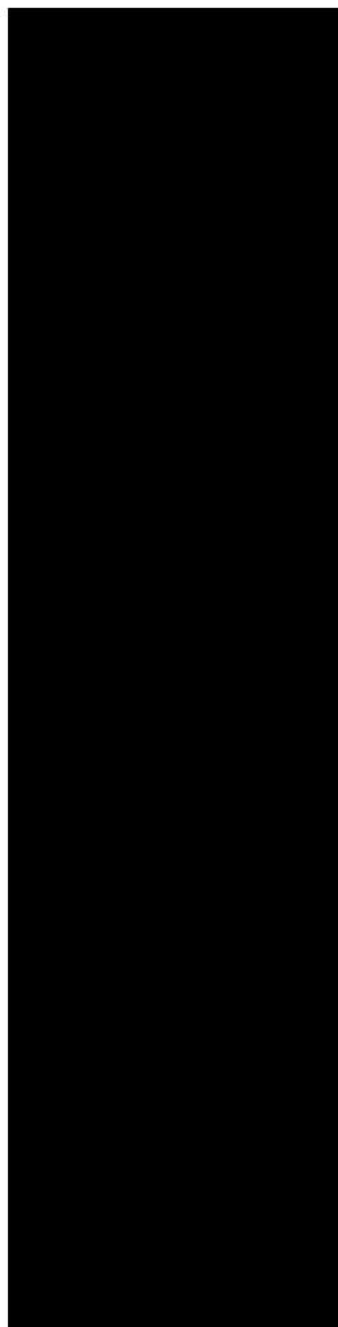

Further to your memo dated 29/08/97 regarding the correspondence from the above, Morag Bulloch, Social Worker, has been in telephone contact with Ms. Tomasso and we have also taken advice from Annabel Fowles, Solicitor, Legal Division.

Information from Ms. Tomasso on 18/09/97 indicates her position may have changed slightly from her written request for Zoe to be received into care in Falkirk.

It may well be that her own children will not be leaving the home after her marriage to her present partner and this will be of assistance in day-to-day care. Ms. Tomasso is highlighting holiday periods as the difficulty and the financial strain of funding childminding. As indicated in her letter her mother has assisted recently but this has caused difficulties and tensions.

In respect of other family support, only Howard Campbell, a brother, may be able to help at weekends.

Ms. Tomasso had originally thought Zoe would be better being "in care" in Falkirk but now seems to have changed her mind about this since another brother, Brian Campbell, who took Zoe's brother to live with him in Falkirk, expressed his anger at this idea. On 29/08/97 Ms. Tomasso was stating it would be better for Zoe to remain in Glasgow if she has to come into care.

However, Ms. Tomasso now feels the main issues are financial and child care during school holidays.

At present she is in receipt of Child Benefit and Guardians Allowance of £19.00 per week.

Ms/

Ms. Tomasso has indicated Zoe is happy and settled but still writes to friends in Falkirk.

It is of note that Ms. Tomasso has not approached her own Social Work Services claiming this would be difficult as she is an employee.

I have discussed the situation with Annabel Fowles, Solicitor, and clarified that Section 22 Children (Scotland) Act, 1995 would apply to children and families in our area and a child's "physical presence" in an Authority is the essential factor. In view of this, the fact that Zoe has been settled in Glasgow for a year and there was no understanding that this was a temporary arrangement would place the onus on Ms. Tomasso's own Local Authority to respond.

Falkirk Council could, if so desired, respond with financial assistance in terms of Section 50, Children's Act, 1975 which places no geographical criteria for eligibility.

In conclusion, Ms. Tomasso's initial stance seems to have altered to focus on financial assistance in respect of Zoe and possible care when required e.g. hospital admission next year?

Legal advice indicates she has to approach her own Local Authority for Social Work Services and I would suggest she does this in the first instance. I would also argue that Ms. Tomasso may be in need of a service rather than pure financial assistance i.e. respite care etc. and this again focuses on her own Local Authority.

I hope this is of assistance in responding to Ms. Tomasso but if you wish to discuss further please contact me.

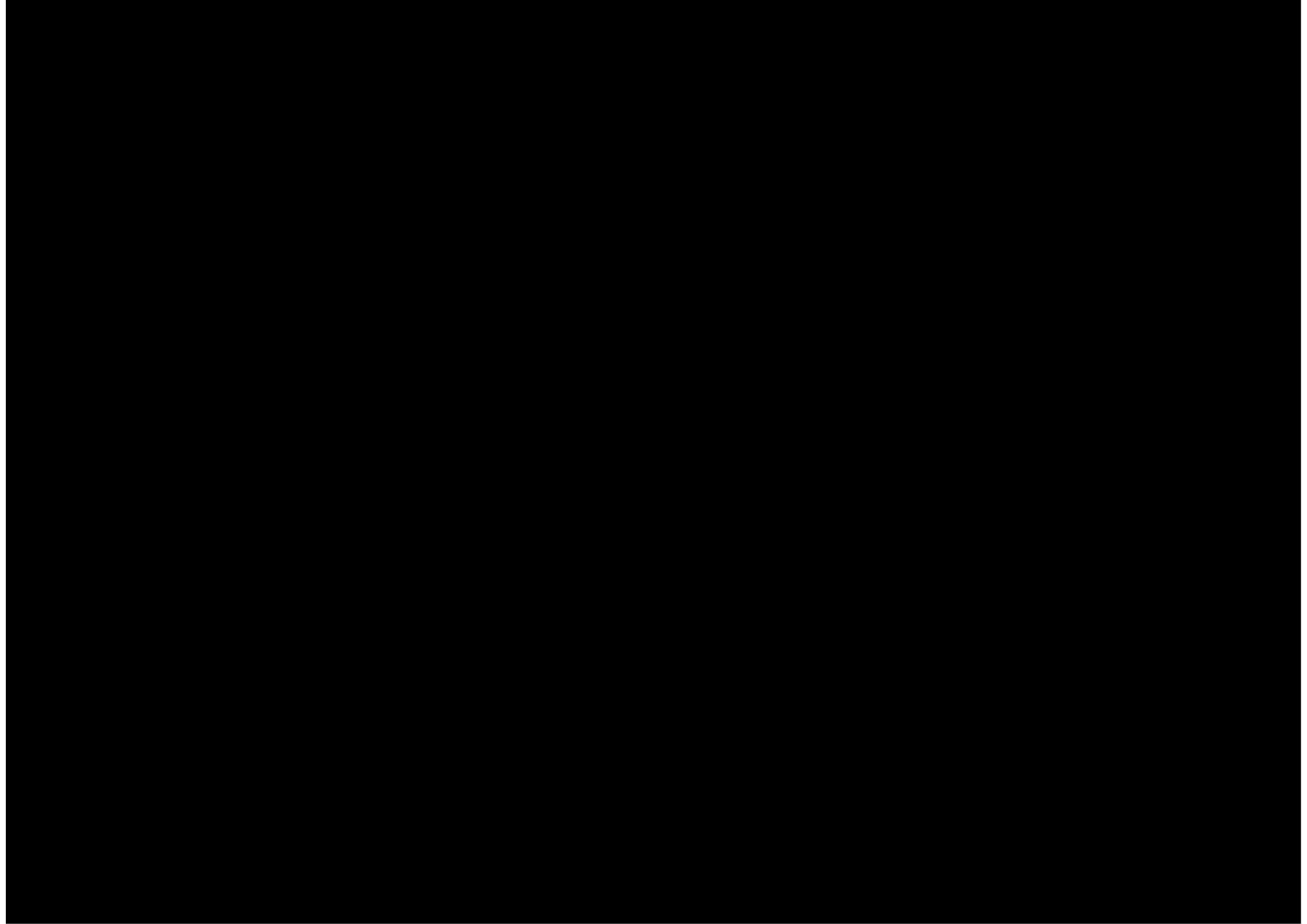

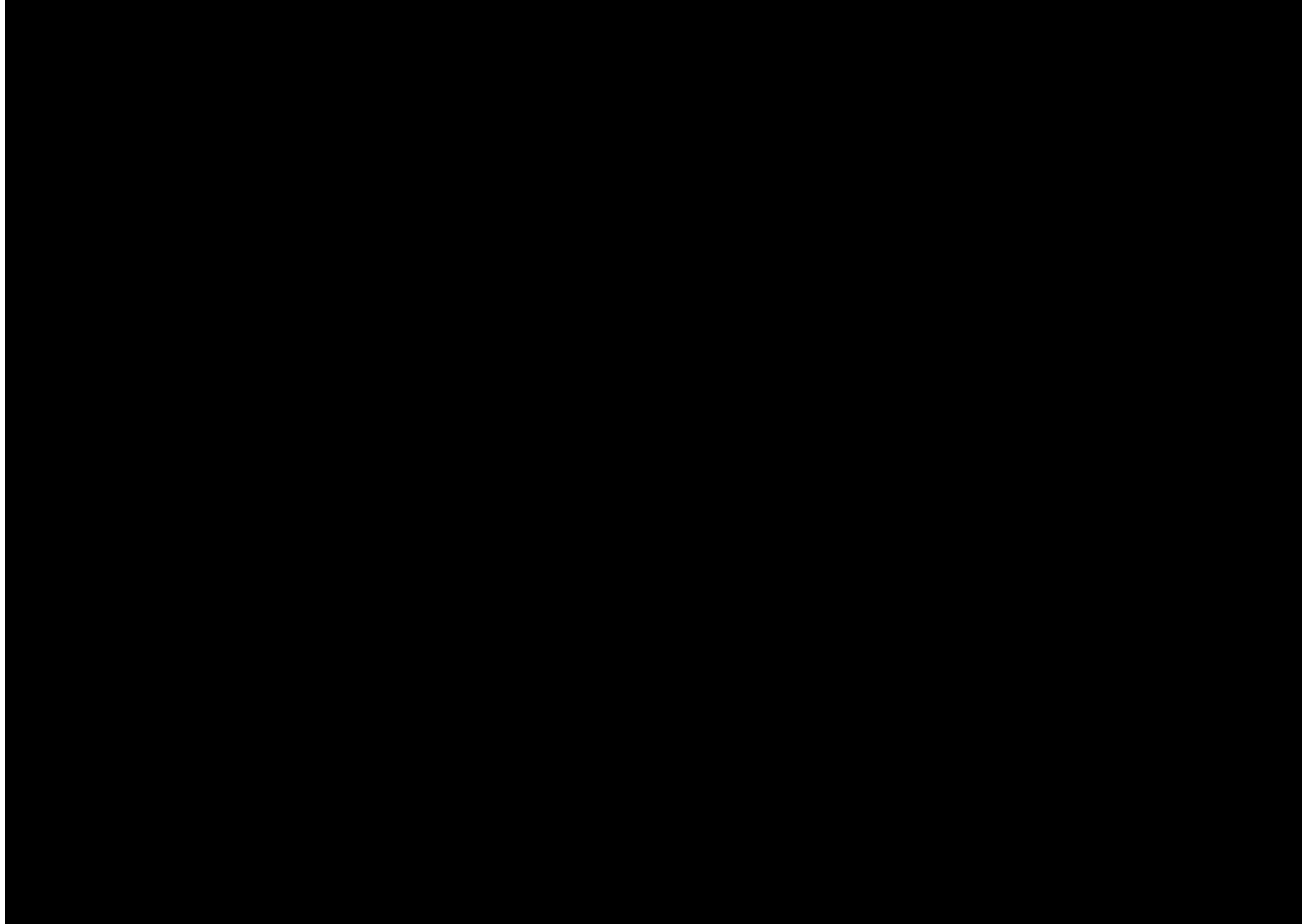

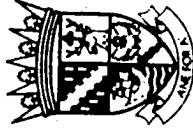

I understand you have recently contacted Morag Bulloch, Social Worker, requesting financial assistance in respect of day care over the holidays and school uniform for Zoe.

I have given the matter serious consideration and this Authority is unable to assist for two main reasons.


Firstly, Zoe was never in Local Authority care in this area. If she had been, there would have been a statutory obligation from this Authority towards her, but she does not meet this criteria.

Secondly, in terms of Section 22 Children (Scotland) Act 1995, Local Authorities have the discretionary power to provide assistance, in exceptional situations, by giving cash to individual children and families to safeguard and promote welfare and promote their upbringing by their families.

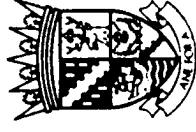

Thank you for your letter dated 7th July, 1997 and I note the points you raise.

I accept your point that Zoe was indeed in Local Authority care some years ago while another Area Office within Central Region was involved. I have now clarified this and established that Zoe was provided with two days respite care during the period 18th to 20th June, 1992 when her mother was ill and family members were unable to assist.

The second occasion was during the period 14th to 19th August, 1992 when Zoe was made subject to a Place of Safety Warrant and indeed placed with Foster Carers in Camelon. The Warrant was not renewed by a Hearing on the 19th August, 1992 and Zoe was returned home that day. However, legally Zoe was not in Local Authority care, as in terms of the Act at that time, children "on warrant" were deemed not to be "in care" until a Children's Hearing made a substantive decision to keep the child in residential or foster care. As indicated, in this instance, the Hearing returned Zoe home.

In essence, Zoe has been in voluntary care for two days, five years ago while under the auspices of another office and my view is still that she does not meet the criteria for financial assistance.

You mention that you should have been offered a "relocation" payment in respect of Zoe. This must be a policy adopted by Strathclyde and subsequently your local Social Work Service and is not one held by Central Region and now Falkirk Council.



If last year you had indicated a commitment to assume care of Zoe, but were prevented from doing so because of practical reasons and the only alternative had been Local Authority care, there could have been discussion as to assistance, but again this would have been at the Services' discretion as to what would have been realistic. Since there was no mention of this at the time and Zoe is no longer within this Local Authority, it is difficult to see how a retrospective claim can be made.

Finally, you mention there may be a need for foster care next year. Hopefully this will not be necessary, but clearly you would contact your own Local Authority, i.e. Glasgow.

Mrs. Campbell is a 39 year old, single parent who had a series of aneurisms, brain haemorrhages in early 1991, resulting in her requiring brain surgery. She has been left with a left-sided weakness which means she is now wheelchair bound. Mrs. Campbell has also been suffering from what appears to be epileptic fits and since 1991 there have been several hospital admissions due to her continuing failing health.

Mrs. Campbell has two children, Zoe and Kevin. Zoe is 8 years old and Kevin is 10 years. Both children are particularly demanding of their mother and constantly want her attention and participation in all areas of their lives. Mrs. Campbell finds great difficulty in this as her poor health has left her unable to see to her children's needs as she would wish as a mother. The family have the support and help of a Home Help three times per day as well as MECS, OT involvement and social work help. There is also regular contact between Mrs. Campbell and her own mother and other family friends.

Mrs. Campbell's greatest fear at present is her inability to take her children outside the house to either play or go shopping and now that the school holidays have started, she is unable to content or amuse them for any period of time.

Involvement by Mrs. Christine Landelles of the Scottish Epilepsy Association has meant that applications to various charities has also been taking place.

Children in Need have awarded a payment to Mrs. Campbell. The sum of money being £200.00 to help pay for someone in the way of child care over the summer holidays.

It/

It has been agreed that the money received be spent on allowing the children to attend a summer playscheme being run at the Beancross School in Grangemouth. The cost of this playscheme is £5.00 per day per child. The full cost of the playscheme for seven weeks is £280.00.

To allow these two children to benefit from social interaction and development, as well as possibly preventing the Social Work Services further expense in the future, I request for consideration that the amount of £80.00 be paid by this Department in order to allow the children to attend the playscheme.

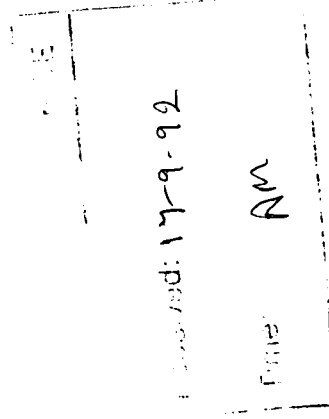

Further to my telephone discussions with Elaine McKeown re: the events of Friday 14th August 1992, these are the details of the events from when the Social Work Department were contacted by Mrs. Campbell's GP, Dr. Dyer.

4.45 p.m. Dr. Dyer contacted Pat Preece, duty social worker, to request alternative care for Zoe and Kevin as Mrs. Campbell had taken an substantial overdose and was comatosed. An ambulance had arrived to take Mrs. Campbell to hospital. Pat spoke to both the home help Mrs. Irwin and the Mobile Emergency Care Service (MECS) who were at the house. The home help indicated that the children were out playing and that she could stay and supervise them until the social workers got to the house but that she should not be there (it was not her working time).

Pat also spoke to the MECS warden who indicated she had to leave to be able to respond to next call. Attempts were made to contact Mrs. Tomasso, Mrs. Campbell's sister in Glasgow, at this stage by P. Preece, without success.

Senior Social Worker consulted with Reporter's Department (Dorothy Martin) who agreed that there were grounds for Place of Safety (grounds outlined on Place of Safety Warrant).

Pat and Fiona Shevill obtained Place of Safety Warrant and arrived at the house at approximately 5.30 p.m. The children were still out playing - Kevin was visible from the house and Mrs. Irwin, home help, was asked to call him and for him to get Zoe. Kevin arrived back at the house with Zoe and his friend Eric. (Later established to be Carol Blair's son.) Eric went home. (Social Workers advised Kevin to tell him to go.)

Pat Preece again tried to contact Mrs. Campbell's sister, Mrs Tomasso, in Glasgow but could not. Mrs. Irwin indicated that Joyce's father may want to take the children but she also indicated that due to his age and health he would not be able to cope.

It was explained to the children that they would need to go into foster care because their mother had had to go into hospital. (They are used to sudden hospital admissions for their mother and did not appear unduly upset by her admission.) Zoe was happy to go and pack some things but Kevin was initially a bit upset and asked if he could stay with his pal Eric but that Zoe could not go. Fiona Shevill explained to him that it was important to keep him and Zoe together.

At no time did Kevin indicate that Carol Blair was caring for him or Zoe. Neither Kevin nor Zoe had had any tea and complained of being hungry. Again, they did not indicate that they were expected at Carol Blair's for tea.

It was decided to proceed with foster care due to:-

1. Joyce being unable to give informed consent about who should care for Zoe and Kevin;
2. Lack of availability of suitable <sup>alternatives to</sup> foster parents; ?
3. The very real possibility Joyce could die.
4. Both children appeared happy with the prospect after Kevin's brief upset at not being able to go to his friend's.

Joyce had left nothing to indicate that she had made arrangements for the children to be cared for. Neither was the home help aware of any such arrangement. Additionally, given that Mrs. Blair was supposed to have care of the children she herself made no attempt at contacting the social work department to tell them that she had care of the children. If she had care of the children she in effect let two strangers take the children from her without question. Nor had the children had anything to eat. Neither are we aware that she reported them missing overnight.

On Monday 17th August I spoke to the home help who was at that time still certain that Joyce had had sole care of the children.

APPENDIX

The Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968 by Section 37(2) as amended, enacts:--

"A constable or any person authorised by any court or by any justice of the peace may take to a place of safety any child -

- (a) in respect of whom any of the offences mentioned in Schedule 1 to the Criminal Procedure (Scotland) Act 1975 has been or is believed to have been committed; or
- (b) who is a member of the same household as a child in respect of whom such an offence has been or is believed to have been committed; or
- (c) who is, or is likely to become, a member of the same household as a person who has committed or is believed to have committed such an offence; or
- (d) in respect of whom an offence under section 21(1) of the Children and Young Persons (Scotland) Act 1937 has been or is believed to have been committed; or
- (e) who is likely to be caused unnecessary suffering or serious impairment of health because there is, or is believed to be, in respect of the child a lack of parental care,

if any child so taken to a place of safety or any child who has taken refuge in a place of safety may be detained there until arrangements can be made for him to be looked after in a children's hearing under the following provisions of this Part of this Act; and, where a child is so detained, the constable or the person authorised as aforesaid or the occupier of the place of safety shall forthwith inform the reported of the case."
