I regret to inform you that I interviewed Claire on Friday 2 June regarding a serious matter.

A member of Culloden Academy staff reported harassment by three pupils throughout the recent second year Outdoor trip. Claire was reported as using verbal abuse, sexual harassment and racist comments directed at the teacher. Claire has admitted to this bullying of a member of staff.

I am extremely concerned that Claire has acted in such a disrespectful way and persisted with the jibes even warned to stop by the teacher and Glenmore Lodge staff.

Our staff give a considerable amount of their own free time to allow such a trip to take place; it is most disappointing that such generosity has been so grossly abused. These trips are usually a valuable and pleasant experience for both staff and pupils alike. Claire's thoughtless remarks have caused distress and unhappiness for many of the people involved in this trip.

Claire and the two other second year pupils have been admonished by me and a serious incident demerit recorded. In addition I have asked that each pupil writes three letters of apology one for each of the following Mrs Allan, Glenmore staff and the remainder of their second year group. I would appreciate your counter signing the letters. I must also tell you that Claire will not be permitted to participate in any other school trips.






Basis of Report

This report has been compiled following ongoing Social Work Support to Claire MacRae and her family. Additional information has been gained from Culloden Academy.

Background Information.

Ms MacKintosh has a long history of drug misuse and there has always been concern about the effect that this has on the home environment and on the level of care offered to the girls. Ms MacKintosh began misusing drugs several years before Nicola was born. She states that this was primarily amphetamines and that it was approximately eight years ago that she began to use heroin. Ms MacKintosh had begun on a methadone programme several times over the past eight years but had always returned to using heroin. In April 1998, after five months of regular contact with a support worker from Osprey House, her GP was again willing to prescribe methadone. Ms MacKintosh again began a methadone programme, however on 1st May, she was arrested and found to be in possession of a large quantity of heroin. She was charged with possession of a controlled substance with intent to supply.

Nicola and her sister Claire were subsequently accommodated by the Local Authority. This followed their mother's imprisonment on the drugs charge. The period in Local Authority accommodation was a very difficult and unsettling time for Nicola and Claire, particularly as Ms MacKintosh was held on remand for five-and-a-half months prior to her trial. Understandably Claire and Nicola were anxious that their mother could receive a length sentence. Nicola and Claire were very happy to return home in January 1999 and felt that they had been waiting a long time for their mother to be released from prison.

During her incarceration, Ms MacKintosh was forced through a strict methadone reduction programme. Her methadone dose was reduced most weeks and this led to fairly severe withdrawal symptoms. During her time in prison, Ms MacKintosh attended drugs classes where she was able to discuss some of the issues relating to drug abuse.

Ms MacKintosh has continued to be drug free and works toward setting clear boundaries for Claire. Late 1998, Claire's name was removed from the Child Protection Register due to the improved home situation.

Current Circumstances

Claire has settled back into the home situation very well, accepting boundaries from her mother. According to files, Claire began Culloden Academy in August 1998. Her behaviour in school was very good and she received several merits. She made many friends in school and progressed well until October 1999 when she changed school to Millburn Academy re the effect of her sister Nicola's behaviour. Claire continued at Millburn Academy until January 2000 and returned to Culloden Academy where she continues to progress.

It would appear Claire is progressing well with no demerits and is a popular girl with many friends. Claire attends Army Cadets and recently spent two weeks in Edinburgh at the beginning of the summer school holidays and continues to show commitment toward her interest.

Ms MacKintosh continues to work to remain drug free and provide a settled home situation for her daughters. She Nicola and is managing her own business successfully. Claire's father, Gordon MacKae, lived with the family temporarily until the beginning of July 2000 when he moved to accommodation in the centre of Inverness. Ms MacKintosh stated she is happy and focussed without his contact.

Recommendation

Recommendation is for removal of supervision in support of Claire and Ms MacKintosh continuing to manage their lives successfully. Claire and Ms MacKintosh have shown clear commitment to progress successfully.



Grounds of Referral

That Claire has failed to attend school regularly without reasonable excuse.

Claire accepts these grounds.

Claire appeared to be progressing well at Culloden Academy up until the beginning of 2001. It would appear that Claire's father Gordon MacRae was imprisoned for a drug related offence early 2001 and is presently in Glenogle Prison. Claire appeared to have a good relationship with her father and misses him. Her mother appeared to form a new relationship with a Mr [redacted] whom Claire does not like or get on with, which she feels changed the relationship with her mother. Her sister Nicola MacKintosh continues to live with her mother and Claire during periods when she is not in Prison.

Claire has been spending much time out of the family home with friends and Nicola and has drifted aimlessly at present.

Incident of 13.04.01

Claire accepts she did not return home on the evening of 13 April 2001 against her mother's advice and chose to stay at a friend's house whom she did not name. It would appear that approximately three weeks prior, there were concerns that Claire was detained along with others by the Police on suspicion of breach of the peace/vandalism, at a house in Woodlands Court.

Claire does not accept this account of breach of the peace/vandalism and states she had gone to school that day, however she sneaked off early and got the bus to town. She stated that she saw some friends, [redacted] walking into town so she got off the bus at Inshes to join them. She stated the Police stopped them around the Main Bridge, Ness Bridge and they were taken to Burnett Road. She stated she was not involved and released.

On the day of 13 April 2001 she had been grounded by her mother for telling lies about not attending school. Claire stated she sneaked out to be with her friend [redacted] around 7 p.m. and went to town. She stated as the evening went on she went to [redacted] house in [redacted] with [redacted] and [redacted] and telephoned her mother saying she was in Hilton. She stated she watched T.V. at [redacted] house, stayed overnight and returned home the following day around lunchtime.

Claire continued at Millburn Academy until January 2000 and returned to Culloden Academy where she continued to progress until early 2001 refusing to attend. It would appear that Claire continued satisfactorily at Culloden Academy gaining merits and was a popular girl. She showed great commitment to the Army Cadets and spent two weeks at the beginning of the summer 2000 in Edinburgh which she appeared to enjoy.

Current Circumstances

Claire's father Gordon MacRae is presently serving sentence at Glenogle Prison for a drug related offence early 2001. Claire's sister Nicola was also in Porterfield and was released around 6 June 01.

On 15 April 2001 Claire's mother Tracey MacKintosh was remanded at Porterfield Prison for a drug related offence and as of 22 May 2001 was remanded for a further 110 days. Tracey hoped for bail, however as of 29 May 2001 this has been denied. On Thursday 7 June 2001 Tracey was moved to Aberdeen prison reducing the opportunity for Claire to visit her mum.

Claire is presently being looked after by her uncle Neil MacKintosh and his partner Trish at [REDACTED] however it would appear they are unable to offer long term placement and alternative accommodation is being sought by Social Work Services.

Contact continues with Culloden Academy and Education, to look at alternatives to exclusion. Social Work Services are currently seeking a placement, where Claire has access to visit her mother, sister and father at Glenogle.

Highland Council Housing Services are presently in the process of evicting Ms MacKintosh from her home at 162 Smithton Park, Inverness.

Conclusion and Recommendation

It would appear that Claire is presently trying to make sense of her present situation with overall effect on her ability to concentrate or attend school. However Social Work Services maintain almost daily contact with Claire, her aunt and uncle, to offer support and continue to encourage Claire to see her mum and sister as required.

Recommendation to the Authority Reporter is for consideration of compulsory measures in support of Claire's present welfare and immediate needs.

Care Plan

1. To discuss options with Education in support of Claire returning to school.
2. Social Work Services to continue to support Claire as required.
3. Social Work Services to encourage Claire to visit her mother, and father who are both in Prison.
4. Social Work Services to continue to offer Claire's present carers, Neil and Trish MacKintosh support in the care of Claire.

Mr MacRae, Claire's father, is no longer living in the home and Claire does not wish to pursue contact at this time. With regard to school, Claire has returned to Culloden Academy and is doing well. She currently has no demerits.

There were a couple of incidents in April/May time, which were addressed at the time with Claire. It was noted that there has been nothing since.

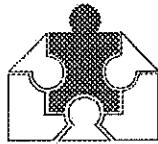
It was felt that there has been a sustained period of stability for Claire, and that there appear no ongoing conditions to necessitate compulsory measures of supervision. Voluntary Social Work support would be available to Claire if needed.

Decision

Request an early Children's Hearing, to recommend the termination of Claire's Supervision Requirement.




It would appear Claire is progressing well at Culloden Academy with no demerits. She is a popular girl with several friends and attends Army Cadets. She recently spent two weeks in Edinburgh with the cadets at the beginning of her summer holidays and continues to show commitment toward her interest.

Ms MacKintosh continues to work to remain drug free and provide a settled home situation for her daughters. She continues to provide support for Nicola who is presently accommodated in Porterfield Prison on remand and is managing her own business successfully. Claire's father, Gordon McRae, lived with the family temporarily until the beginning of July 2000 when he moved to accommodation in the centre of Inverness. Ms MacKintosh stated she is happy and focussed without his contact.

Recommendation


Recommendation is for removal of supervision in support of Claire and Ms MacKintosh continuing to manage their lives successfully. Claire and Ms MacKintosh have shown clear commitment to progress successfully.

Basis of Report

This report has been compiled following an interview with Claire McRae/McIntosh. Additional information has been gained from Culloden Academy.

Background

On 1 May 1998 Ms MacKintosh was arrested and found to be in possession of a quantity of heroin. She was subsequently charged and held on remand in Porterfield Prison until her release on 15 December 1998. Nicola and Claire were accommodated by this service until their return to Ms MacKintosh in January 1999. Ms MacKintosh appears to continue to be drug free and works toward setting clear boundaries for Claire. Late 1998, Claire's name was removed from the Child Protection Register due to the improved home situation.

Current Circumstances

Claire has settled back into the home situation accepting boundaries from her mother. According to files, Claire began Culloden Academy in August 1998. Her behaviour in school was very good and she received several merits. She made many friends in school and progressed well until October 1999 when she changed school to Millburn Academy re effect of her sister Nicola's behaviour. Claire continued at Millburn Academy until January 2000 and returned to Culloden Academy. It would appear that on return to Culloden Academy Claire has on occasion challenged staff and has been involved in negative behaviour within and outwith school. However Claire appears to have accepted some responsibility for her behaviour and has made new friends in the community and attends Cadets on a weekly basis.

Claire continues to live at home with her mother Tracey McIntosh and also lives with her father Gordon MacRae who recently moved into the family home – Claire's sister Nicola is currently in residence at Corntonvale Prison which has had effect on the family, however Claire appears to be showing effort at present.

Grounds of Referral

That on 15.01.00 at Caulfield Road, Inverness she did assault [REDACTED] and did pull her hair and slap her face; being an offence of assault.

The Grounds are not accepted by Claire McRae/McIntosh.

Claire stated that on the evening of the alleged offence she and a friend [REDACTED] called for [REDACTED] around 9.30pm and asked her to come out. Claire stated that [REDACTED] said No as she had to go shopping with her mother. Claire stated that she and [REDACTED] spoke to [REDACTED] at her front door, however [REDACTED] asked to use the bathroom. Claire stated that on [REDACTED] return [REDACTED] said she thought she saw [REDACTED] also a friend in [REDACTED] kitchen. [REDACTED] apparently said [REDACTED] was at home as she was grounded. Claire stated that she was discussing [REDACTED] with [REDACTED] and was pointing her finger at her face when she accidentally poked her in the

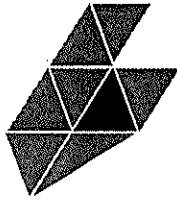
face. Claire said [REDACTED] father came out after her and [REDACTED] who were en route to the bus stop to return home. Claire stated that [REDACTED] mum came out and asked her husband to go back indoors. Claire stated she did not pull [REDACTED] hair or slap her face. Claire said she and [REDACTED] then went home around 10.00pm.

Conclusion and Recommendation

Claire stated she no longer keeps contact with [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] and appears to be making effort to make new friends. Claire has started a local Cadets group on a Wednesday making positive use of her free time. I would respectfully recommend to the Authority Reporter that Claire continue to receive advice, guidance and assistance under Section 70 of the Children (Scotland) Act 1995.

Care Plan

1. To continue liaising with Culloden Academy to monitor attendance and progress.
2. To continue to support Claire to address issues around negative behaviour.
3. To continue support from appropriate agencies on drug awareness and misuse.
