CLOSING SUMMARY It is my opinion that Christopher making false claims of robbery meant Police had to carry out an unnecessary investigation and completely changed initial thoughts of him being a vulnerable adult. In effect Christopher is making himself financially unstable through his addiction to illicit substances. Given there is no role for social work I am recommending there is no further action from Adult Concern Initial Response Team.

Text: VA referral received from Police Scotland Date of incident 15/7/20 Consent: Yes Around 1800 hours on 15/07/2020, Christopher Young contacted Police to report that he had been robbed by an unnamed male. A short time later, Police Officers attended and obtained a signed statement from Christopher. At this time, they seized the clothing identified to them as those he was wearing on the date of the robbery. Christopher's statement was very inconstant and when pushed to disclose a locus, was unable to confirm. Christopher was later re-interviewed by CID officers and his statement remained

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inconsistent. Further enquiry carried out showed Christopher not to be within the vicinity of the alleged locus and that clothing seized by Police was not clothing he was wearing during the alleged robbery. CID re-attended and spoke with Christopher at which time he confirmed he made a false report. This was due to him having financial issue and a drug habit he can't support. Christopher was given suitable advice with regards to making these allegations in the future. 24 hour projection of actions: * Christopher made himself out to be a vulnerable person.

Text: At 14:30 on 07/10/2019 Christopher Young attended at the Job Centre and intimated to staff that he wished to kill himself and that he had taken a quantity of Sertraline anti-depressant pills. Staff within thereafter contacted an ambulance. As Christopher has previously shown signs of violence towards ambulance staff, police were contacted. Police attended and found Christopher to be under the influence of what he stated was Gabapentin and Heroin. He was assessed by paramedics and agreed to attend Ayr Hospital where he stated that he did not intend to harm himself in any way. Christopher was compliant throughout his visit to A & E. HV by ASP workers [REDACTED], no answer at door as expected due to doors and windows having been boarded up. Homeless team contacted, Mr Young has been staying at Viewfield Gate pending the offer of a new house. [REDACTED] (sessional worker) at Viewfield Gate, informed me that he did not have a lot of contact with Mr Young therefore he could not tell me if there had been any changes in his (Mr Young's) mood Since the incident in the Job Centre when he had stated he wanted to 'kill himself'. When Mr Young answered my call, he sounded relaxed and was friendly enough, he told me that he was in a better frame of mind since the Job Centre incident, the only recent issue that had made him feel quite low was the death of his (ex?) girlfriend [REDACTED] who was buried on Friday 6th Dec. However, Mr Young did say to me that he was working with at least 3 services who were helping him greatly, the services are Peer Worker at Viewfield Gate [REDACTED], [REDACTED] at Addaction, and [REDACTED] who works at Addiction services. Mr Young went on to say that he hopes that this time he is ready to turn his life around and is looking forward to being allocated a new home. Given that Mr Young is in a safe environment and has support from 3 agencies, all who are linked with either Social Work or the NHS and who would know the appropriate people to contact in case Mr Young's mood dips again, it would be the recommendation of the Duty ASP Social Worker [REDACTED] that this case can be closed off as a VA with NFA necessary.
