Andrew McCracken - Diary of significant events between initial session of review and continuation session.

1. General

- June 1st - Barricaded himself in a room with two other boys; stole food and threw it around the room; broke two windows. Absconded and returned by police at 1.35
- June 2nd - Prior to leaving for school, broke a window and threw rubbish at other window
- June 3rd. - Absconded with two other boys, abused alcohol while outwith the Home. All the boys returned at 3.50 a.m..
- June 4th - Staff received two telephone calls from Andrew's brother, James, during school hours, intimating that Andrew was in his mother's house and causing severe problems, apparently assaulting members of his family, threatening to damage property and demanding money.
- June 5th - Chisel found under Andrew's pillow. In the evening, Andrew and one other boy absconded; they were returned by the police at 1.00 a.m..
- June 7th - Andrew and three other children running around outside the Home, throwing stones at windows and breaking one window on the rear fire exit door; also broke all windows on a portacabin at the rear of the school next to the Home charges may be brought by the police as a result of this.
- June 10th - Andrew jumped out of his bedroom window, contributed to raiding the food supplies through one of the windows broken previously and absconded with one other boy; they were found in the vicinity of the Home and brought back by the police at 2.00 a.m..
- June 11th - Andrew again jumped out of his bedroom window and absconded. He returned at 1.30 p.m. on June 13th. and told staff that he had stayed with his mother.
- June 17th - A bone in Andrew's foot was cracked when he was assaulted by four boys outside Columba High School at lunchtime.
- June 22nd - Andrew and two other boys running around outside the Home and refusing to come in until midnight.

2. School Attendance

It has been confirmed that Andrew truanted on the following days - May 27th., May 28th., June 2nd., June 3rd., June 4th., June 5th., June 8th., June 12th., June 23rd.. Given that Andrew did not attend school on medical grounds from June 18th to 22nd, he is confirmed as truanting on 9 days out of a possible 16, on at least one other day not reaching school until 11.30 a.m..

I must be honest and say that I cannot see any progress at all. Indeed one might say that the situation is regressing (e.g. Police now wish to see Andrew about vandalism to a nearby school).

The writer believes that Andrew is in need of residential schooling. However, he would still need a Childrens Home place for week-end leave. The lack of stability within the family exacerbates the situation. He could visit his mother whilst on week-end leave. However, what happens happens when his grandmother returns home?

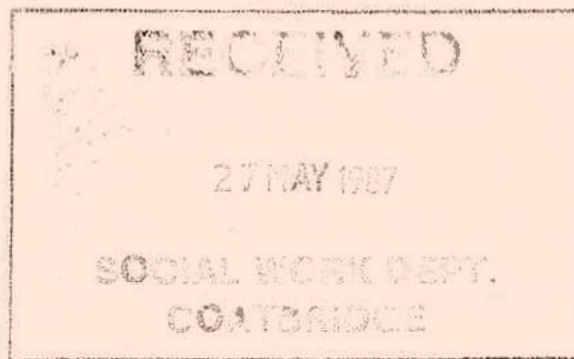

Andrew refuses to attend school. Meetings have been held with teacher but Andrew's attitude destroys all plans.

He wants to stay in his granny's all day.

5. Date/s and nature of Social Worker's contact with family since reception into care/last review:

Interviews with Mrs. McCracken at home and at Rosehall High. She has absolutely no control over Andrew. Due to her own personality and coping capacity, she is unable to influence Andrew at all.

6. Areas of Concern:

(a) Family Mother has no control over Andrew.

(b) Particular reference to child in care (including progress since reception into care/last review.)

Andrew has shown no commitment to school. He has truanted regularly and also absconded from Mitchell Street on two occasions.

He is missing at the moment having run away 24.3.67.

7. Other agencies involved:

Rosehall High - willing to work with Andrew but he will not allow them to do so.

Child guidance - asked for their attendance at Review to ascertain their assessment of Andrew's educational needs.

8. Needs of the child (estimated length of placement, type of placement, involvement of other agencies, estimated nature of parental contact etc.):

Andrew will not go to school. He refuses to live with anyone but his granny. A child cannot be allowed to live in this house due to the appalling home conditions. Andrew refuses to live with his mother. Significantly Andrew settled at Viewfield Assessment Centre and responded well to this set up. I would suggest that unfortunately Andrew at this stage needs a total break from his proximity to his granny. Mother would be encouraged to visit Andrew.

9. Plans for child in view of above comment (including short, medium and long objectives):

Two questions to be tackled is: Should we use another Children's Home and another school, or List 'G' school, or ultimately would the Panel decide List 'D'. Certainly since R.I.C. Mitchell Street have only been allowed to do a 'food and watering' job. Andrew decides everything else for himself.

10. Any further comments:

Andrew needs a longer break away from his grandmother who can no longer look after him. Mrs. McCracken cannot cope with Andrew who simply wants to live a totally independant lifestyle. It is difficult to envisage Andrew going back to live with his mother and attending school. We may well be talking about long-term care. He is now 'on the run'.

1. Physical development since admission/~~last review~~ (include details of recent accidents or illness):

Andrew is a healthy, active boy, of reasonable build for his age. He has received medication for a throat infection. This infection has not restricted him in any way within the Home, but he has repeatedly used it in conversation with his mother as a reason for non-attendance at school.

2. Emotional Development:

Andrew's ties to his grandmother are of an importance to him which overrides all else; in seeing her as often as possible he demonstrates a high degree of single-mindedness as well as an inability to see his actions and their possible consequences in anything but the very short term.

Aside from his relationship with his grandmother, he chooses to make no others on anything but a superficial basis and within the Home frequently seems to prefer his own company.

3. Behavioural Problems:

In general, Andrew presents no severe behavioural problems. He is clearly used to making decisions for himself and, when he does join in with any "fun and games" within the Home, does so as an individual, showing no tendency to follow or lead.

In attempting to maximise his contact with his grandmother, however, Andrew presents a different picture. He has frequently and successfully attempted to manipulate his mother into confrontation with the Home in an attempt to provide leeway for himself to truant and spend the time with his grandmother; he also lies without compunction in an attempt to "cover" time spent in this way when he should have been elsewhere.

To date, Andrew has absconded twice, once in the company of several other residents, apparently "for a lark". His second absconsion was by himself on 24.5.87, an absconsion from which he has not returned at the time of writing.

4. Contact with parents and other relatives:

As indicated over, Andrew has a strong bond with his grandmother, whom he visits daily, with or without permission to do so.

Also as indicated over, he manipulates his mother in an attempt to "cover" for these visits and therefore also sees her on a very regular basis.

5. Contact with siblings:

Andrew has contact with his siblings, all three of whom have visited the Home, but, given the impossibility of Andrew's whereabouts between 9 and 4 being accurately established on most days, we cannot say with any certainty how much contact has taken place outwith the Home.

6. Contact with other agencies and comments or reports:

Educational observations: School, like ourselves, experience no significant behavioural problem from Andrew when he is there, and have indicated that they are willing to continue to work with him.
To date, out of a total of 22 school days since Andrew's transfer to this Home, Andrew has truanted on 13, returned to the Home claiming have been sick on one, arrived noticeably late on 2, was taken to school on one, his first day and has attended by himself for 5 full

9. Relationships:

- (a) Within home: As indicated earlier,, pleasant if superficial with staff and children at most times as long as the core subject of his relationship with his grandmother is not at issue.
- (b) Outwith home: Outside of family, no relationships of note

10. Any special areas of concern requiring action:

Andrew's continued attempts to block any "interference" in his relationship with his grandmother, and his concurrent truancy and non-negotiated absences from the home in order to maximise his contact with her could lead Andrew into serious and, in some ways, undeserved consequences if the current pattern does not undergo some change.

11. Short, medium and long term objectives for child:

An acceptable pattern must be established in the short term before the medium and long term future for Andrew can be approached with any clarity.

Clearly, a continued relationship with his grandmother must be part of that pattern, but with both Andrew's obligations in terms of school attendance and his needs as a developing adolescent adequately met.

At present, travelling to Coatbridge to school, he seems to find it impossible to resist the temptation to divert to his grandmother's home. We would therefore recommend that this temptation be removed by transfer to an Airdrie school and that Andrew's response to this be assessed at a review within the next 6 - 8 weeks and further planning done at that time

Andrew appeared at a Childrens Hearing on the 18th of April 88 where he denied most of the grounds of referral. Accordingly it was decided that the case should go to Proof at the Sheriff court.

Subsequently additional grounds have been received, the writer visited Andrew at Geilsland School on 20.4.88 where the additional grounds were presented to him.

Andrew admits to breaking into the Technical Services Offices between the 18th and 20th December but denies stealing so many items. He also accepts that he set fire to the two vans. However he denies having broken into the Technical Services Offices between the 24th and 26th December and also denies being involved in setting fire to these premises.

Andrews attitude towards these offences continues to leave much to be desired. He exhibits a total lack of remorse for his actions and is totally apathetic towards the damage which he had caused.

PROGRESS AT GEILSLAND

The writer has been working in conjunction with staff at Geilsland school and particularly in close association with [REDACTED] (Key worker). [REDACTED] can confirm that within the school staff have noticed a significant improvement in Andrews attitude and behaviour in the school. Indeed such is his progress that he has been made one of the senior boys of the school and it is hoped that this progress will continue. Andrew himself hopes to leave school in December 1988 and all parties are working towards this.

Whilst the writer would consider requesting that Andrew should continue to reside at Geilsland school, the writer is also conscious of a forthcoming Proof hearing and it may well be that it would be better for matters to be left unattended until such times as the Proof hearing has been decided upon.

Andy was extremely reluctant to retire to bed this evening, spoken to by [redacted]. Andrew allowed himself slightly reluctantly, to join a disturbance which resulted in four other boys and himself on the roof of the New Vic house unit after having run around the school grounds. During the course of the disturbance Andrew claimed to have taken 15 to 20 paracetamol tablets. He was sick later on and there seemed no other adverse effects later on. Because the disturbance was escalating the police were called and as soon as they appeared Andrew retired very swiftly to his bed.

Andrew was admitted to Geilsland on grounds of chronic truancy and offending. Admission to Mitchell Street Children's Home had not improved this situation.

Andrew initially settled in well at Geilsland and has never been a great management problem within the school. Indeed he is generally well-mannered and polite towards Social Work and care staff.

However, by November 1987, it was noted that Andrew was failing to return to Geilsland from leave and also absconding from the school. This problem no longer exists and Andrew now returns in time.

The most serious concern presently is the number of offences which Andrew has accumulated, particularly since November 1987. The writer interviewed Andrew about these matters in Geilsland. It was most disconcerting to discover that Andrew displayed a totally remorseless attitude towards these incidents and seemed to find the entire interview situation boring.

GROUND'S OF REFERRAL:

It is difficult to establish exactly which grounds of referral Andrew is accepting or denying. Furthermore, his mother complicates the entire situation by adamantly claiming that Andrew has never committed any of these.

These matters would perhaps be best dealt with by the Panel.

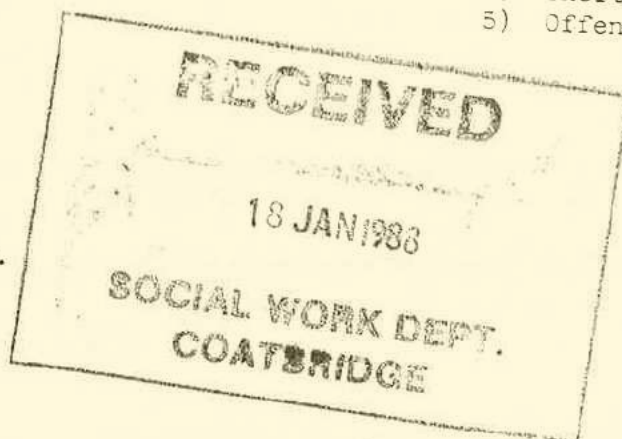
