Andrew last appeared at a Hearing on 30.7.86 when he was instructed to attend school and live with his mother at 196 Whifflet Street, Coatbridge. Since birth he has resided with his grandmother who is now 84 years old and living in appalling home conditions. The old lady cannot look after herself, far less Andrew, but refuses to go into Eventide accommodation.

Since the Panel, Andrew has seldom called to see the writer, continued to live with his grandmother and hardly ever attended school.

ANDREW:

Andrew has extreme difficulties in relating to adults apart from his grandmother whom he cannot bear to part from. One wonders how he will cope when the old lady eventually dies. The writer is concerned that his personality and emotional development have already been damaged. If confronted by the seriousness of his situation he can only laugh but not in an arrogant manner. He presents as a sad young boy who is living in a world of his own. Whilst he cares for his grandmother and refuses to live with his mother, he also benefits financially from this arrangement since his grandmother gives him £10-£15 weekly pocket money. He undoubtedly is in a very vulnerable position.

ASSESSMENT:

Given the disturbing problems which exist, the writer is clearly saying that Andrew initially requires a three week residential assessment period. Mrs McCracken and Andrew are now reluctantly resigned to this possibility.

The writer would also ask for reports from the Department of Child and Family Psychiatry and Child Guidance. The case obviously requires a corporate approach since large question marks surround Andrew's future.

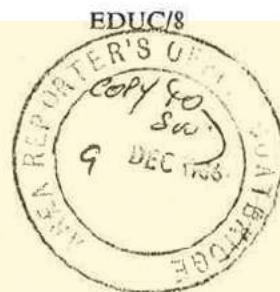

We must wonder if the disposition of Andrew's recent Children's Panel is being adhered to. On 27th October this school wrote to Mrs McCracken regarding the poor attendance of her sons, Andrew and James. In the last seven weeks Andrew has attended this school for a total of one and a half days. Mrs McCracken has assured us by telephone that she is sending Andrew to school. Andrew can be seen in Coatbridge Main Street where he appears to be enjoying good health. We have had telephone calls at this school asking us why the McCracken boys do not attend school! We feel that Andrew has no intention of attending school and that his mother, although she tries on occasion, cannot make him. (Signature).....

Mrs Mc Cracken then pleaded with Andy to go to School to-morrow. Andy kept refusing and she then threatened him and she would come up herself and take him. Andy is a very stubborn boy and nothing will move him if he makes up his mind on thing.
4 th Aug.	Andy went to School, was delighted when I phoned [redacted] and he said Andy was there. Andy [redacted] all ran away they returned 12-40 pm asking had we called the Police. They are playing silly games not hiding around the grounds and coming in after the Police are called.
5 th Aug.	Andy was at School for the first three periods only. Again Andy makes out it's because of the bullying. Andy well able to handle himself.

[redacted] Andy were interviewed downstairs Andy admitted having sex with [redacted] confirmed this. Both boys were spoken to by [redacted] Friday night was spent at Grandmother's disused house after receiving sleeping bag from Uncle John. Saturday seems to have been spent in Mrs. McCracken's (While she was at the Railway Club [redacted] and Andy had sex in brother James bed. they had jammed the Bedroom door so no one could get in. They spent the rest of the evening in Mrs. McCracken left. and being fed there as well. Mrs. McCracken has been warned of encouraging Andy and other kids from the Home [redacted] was given a medical by Police Surgeon which she agreed to have. Andy is charged with with unlawful sex offence (Intercourse with [redacted]). Andy was taken from Police Station to Refuge over night. About 10 pm Andy appeared outside the Home on a bike, as I went out the front door he fled round the corner. Later after twelve midnight he was sighted again. Refuge was phoned, he later arrived back there for the night.
22nd.	[redacted] Sat. here to discuss Andy. Just after 7 pm Mrs. McCracken appeared for Andy clothes and announced Andy was at the corner [redacted] ran off after her and were seen getting into a Taxi at the Baths. Police and Standby contacted [redacted] picked up by Police at Mrs. [redacted]

The following terms are agreed by all signatories below:

1. Mitchell Street Children's Home will provide a place of residence for Andrew, within which he will have the same rights as all other residents.
2. Mitchell Street Children's Home will supply Andrew with the cost of fares to make home visits on Tuesday and Sunday of each week.
3. Staff in Mitchell Street Children's Home will offer such assistance as they are able to Andrew in coping with problems which may arise in his life during his stay in the Home.
4. [REDACTED] will maintain regular contact with Andrew, his mother and any other members of his family deemed necessary and offer his assistance in dealing with such problems as may arise.
5. Andrew will obey the rules of Mitchell Street Children's Home, as directed to do by the Children's Panel.
6. Andrew will attend school.
7. Andrew will make home visits on Tuesday and Sunday of each week, at times agreed with the Children's Home staff on duty on each occasion and may make home visits on other days with the agreement of the Children's Home staff on duty at the time he wishes to do so.
8. Mrs. McCracken will visit Andrew in Mitchell Street Children's Home on Wednesday evening and Saturday afternoon of each week.
9. Mrs. McCracken will not at any time harbour Andrew in her home when he is absent without permission from either the Children's Home or school.
