

Victoria Sutherland - Complete Chronology of Care

Consolidated from all three supplied record sets. The chronology records confirmed placements, legal status, reviews, leave, absconding, health and education events during care, and later evidence that corroborates the care history.

Key findings and limitations

- The records provide direct evidence of foster care, St Mary's Kenmure secure accommodation and a C.A.P.S. placement under statutory supervision.
- Review venues at Drummie Road and Drummond House are not treated as placement addresses unless another record establishes residence there.
- No precise final discharge date from C.A.P.S. is supplied. The later account of an own tenancy at age 16 is retrospective corroboration rather than a contemporaneous discharge form.
- Where a document records a planned event, notice, uncertain date or retrospective recollection, the chronology labels it accordingly.
