Stated that he still struggles at times with feeling low and suicidality. Highlighted to George that this seems to have been part of his thinking for a long time- given large number of adverse life events, very understandably so. No significant history of active suicide attempts. More significant history of passive harm via not or sporadically engaging with medication treatments.

George stated that he would be willing to discuss this again with GP. Highlighted need for diabetic management as part of management of feet. George in agreement. Highlighted to George that one of his main fears- building relationships with others, he has done really well with OT, encouraging that he can reach out to others in the right circumstances. George in agreement.

This was also as a result of complex feelings around funeral. Weekly appointments with podiatry ongoing. Still not talking all medication as prescribed- advised to disperse or hand back anything extra to reduce risk of OD impulsivity. Spoke mainly about the dynamics about this, acknowledges that quite lonely but resistant to doing anything about this, plans to spend Christmas alone. Agreed that OT would provide some info to use over Christmas. Agreed florish house in the new year and d/c following this.

Spoke about how sometimes this can give an individual a sense of control over life circumstances that they are not otherwise in control of. Spoke about fear he experiences having to get emergency surgery- Agreed this was very much the experience of a person who wanted to live. Encouraged George to take care, follow protective advice for foot. Spoke about the body as a whole being a system and currently under extra pressure. Spoke about needing to take care of self both physically and mentally. George has always relied very much on his own physical strength and capability despite having 'everything wrong with him' discussed this can't be the case currently- needs to accept the help and support of family. [REDACTED] OT and George discussed how he at times becomes frustrated, but tends to express all emotions, fear, sadness etc as anger. Snapping at family over little things resulting in tense household not productive, encouraged to use services such as breathing space and acknowledge that his feelings are about the discomfort of being vulnerable more than the 'little things'. OT to order equipment for home: bath board, rail, perching stool, kitchen trolley, discussed these can be temporary however may help currently. Living with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] currently for the foreseeable however slowly moving into new flat. Awaiting some furniture delivery. Agreed would like Jim to attend court with him on the 8th of May, 10am. A warrant has been put out for other party and if does not go ahead then will likely reach the 2 year expiration date. This is still causing significant stress and worry. Agreed after this will be discharged from Jim as needs to focus on physical health more, not currently able to drive, go out and about etc. Plan, speak with Jim.

Spoke about using the logic side of brain / like Mr Spock from star trek/ to tell self and keep reinforcing that he is safe. Physical health wise George reports that he attended for MRI on neck, however found this process very difficult and felt very unwell, describes panic attack type symptoms. Daughter was with him and this helped. Stated that he is still not taking medication and in truth is not taking any medication at all. Agrees that he feels physically 'crap'. OT and George spoke for some time about habbding i nextra stockpile. George agreed would come tomorrow with stockpile to flo street, did not wish to give to pharmacist due to shame over waste and self neglect. Stated that continues to attend for treatment of wound on foot, this still requires dressing however the 'infection in his bone' has cleared resulting in slight reduction of pain and slightly better mobility. OT feels its a positive that George is re-engaging in some medical care but very concerns about medication stockpile. Stated that he is also worried about a lump on his left shoulder, had pharmacist look at it who advised him to see GP however struggling to get appointments. George reporting having to eat just one meal a day and also save food for the next day as much as possible. Struggling mainly due to money re this.
