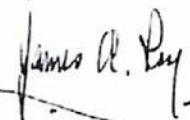
Dear Miss Crawford

I enclose a copy of a Minute of complaint issued by a Children's Hearing on 9th August, in the case of Philip Reilly and would be grateful for your comments. I would make the following points:

- (1) I realise this unfortunate situation can probably be explained in part by the summer holidays; it is therefore, I trust, likely to be non-recurrent.
- (2) Nevertheless, the failure to brief Mr Vaughan in the absence of Mr Innes and Miss Hume meant that Mr Vaughan was unable to furnish any relevant ^{information} or recommendations to the Hearing. This was compounded by the absence of any representatives from Ellen Street.
- (3) The Hearing members were further concerned because - according to the Chairman - no Social Work contact had been made with Philip during his stay in Ellen Street, although it is understood that he has been involved in two further incidents during this period.
- (4) Because of (2) above, the Hearing by a majority felt compelled to continue the Hearing for 14 days. Among other results, this appears to imply that no suitable educational provision has been made for the boy at the start of a new school year, although absenteeism appears to have ^{been} a major presenting problem.

I trust that at the resumed Hearing, a definite placement suitable for his needs will be offered for Philip.

Points regarding minute of Complaint

- 1) Yes. Summer holidays were responsible in the main for lack of proper sw representation.
- 2) The sole reason for calling the Panel was to ratify the emergency move from Burnside to Ellen St. The reasons for this were fully outlined ~~at~~ in the report for the initial hearing. At no time was it suggested that Ellen St. was being proposed as a long-term placement. That is why Mr. Vaughan was not briefed more fully on long-term plans. ^{blame for} The absence of representative from Ellen St. cannot be laid at our door.
- 3) Not true. Philip was away camping for most of his first two weeks in Ellen St. ~~at~~ Although sw was on holiday when incidents occurred after his return, a sw did visit Ellen St. ~~at~~
- 4) No firm arrangements could be made for Philip's schooling until the Panel had decided where Philip was to be resident - Morgan Acad would not accept him on their roll until he was officially resident at Ellen St.

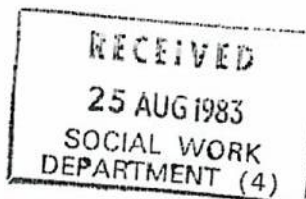
