This is a supported accommodation project run by Blue Triangle (YMCA) for young people who were looked after by the local authority. They aim to provide the young people with structured opportunities to improve their independent living, life and employment skills. Mr Thomson would be offered support to move on to his own tenancy when appropriate.

Mr Thomson's stepfather, who had again provided him with support in September this year, moved back to London in October. It seems Mr Thomson found this change in his family circumstances unsettling and wished to help his stepfather move. He failed to attend appointments with the writer in October due to these reasons.

Unfortunately, Mr Thomson's maternal grandmother died suddenly on 29 October this year. However, he reacted in a creditable and mature manner, providing his mother with emotional and practical support while keeping his own needs, (for example, for settled and secure accommodation), in mind.

Mr Thomson is due to attend a Children's Panel in December to review his supervision requirement.

He should also be in a better position, thanks to a specific budgeting programme, to pay compensation. It should be noted again that, despite his unsatisfactory circumstances, Mr Thomson has only been charged in relation to one incident since being placed on Probation on 26 February this year. This does represent a significant change in his pattern of offending, which would not have been achieved without a growing sense of responsibility, and conscious effort on his part. In this sense, the writer believes Mr Thomson has responded relatively well to the adult behaviour demanded of him on Probation.

Introduction

Mr Thomson is known to the writer via supervision of his current Probation Order. This was imposed by Kilmarnock Sheriff Court on 26 February 2001 and immediately transferred to Dumbarton Sheriff Court. Reference has been made to Unit Records.

Mr Thomson also continues to be subject to a supervision requirement, made by the Children's Panel, and has an allocated social worker, Ms Marion Corcoran, of the Children and Families Team, Milngavie. Ms Corcoran works with this Authority on a part time basis. Given Mr Thomson's needs and lifestyle, it was felt expedient to allocate supervision of the Probation Order to the Criminal Justice Unit and thus provide Mr Thomson with access to a named worker throughout the week. The writer liaises regularly with Ms Corcoran and also with [REDACTED] of Includem. It is understood Ms Clark is submitting a separate report.

Behaviour

Mr Thomson has, to the writer's knowledge and belief, been charged with one offence since being placed on Probation. This related to an alleged RTA incident committed in May this year. Given Mr Thomson's previous frequent pattern of offending behaviour the writer would consider a solitary new charge as evidence of considerable effort and commitment on Mr Thomson's part to change or control his behaviour.

Compliance with Other Conditions of Probation

Mr Thomson was placed on Probation for stealing a car, with an additional requirement to pay £ 250-00 compensation to the victim. According to the Sheriff Clerk at Dumbarton, Mr Thomson has only paid £10-00 towards this Compensation. He is now to be cited to a Means Enquiry Court. Proven failure to pay Compensation as ordered will clearly constitute a breach of the Probation Order.

Mr Thomson has generally complied with the writer's instruction in terms of keeping appointments with her, although one failure to attend without reasonable excuse has led to a formal written warning.

Change of Circumstances

Mr Thomson's circumstances remain largely as they have been in the past year. That is, he remains in need of secure accommodation and formal training or employment.

Mr Thomson was residing in Bed and Breakfast accommodation in the West Highland Gate Travel Inn in Milngavie when placed on Probation. He was placed in the Lion Hotel, Bishopbriggs in May this year after being asked to leave West Highland Gate due to unacceptable behaviour on his part. Unfortunately, Mr Thomson was subsequently asked to leave the Lion Hotel for similar reasons in August this year. He stayed with his stepfather temporarily before going to visit his natural father in France for a fortnight. Mr Thomson was then placed at the Parkview Hotel, his current address.

Various referrals to supported accommodation projects have been pursued by Ms Corcoran but, for a number of different reasons, Mr Thomson has not, as yet, secured a place in any project. Mr Thomson has a potential offer of a place with YMCA Cumbernauld's supported tenancy project. He also has a formal interview on Wednesday this week with Dorothy McCall House in Glasgow, run by Blue Triangle.

Progress

Mr Thomson was placed on Probation with his criminogenic needs identified as homelessness; constructive activity; drug and alcohol misuse; peer influence and other long-term relationship difficulties. The writer did express concerns that Mr Thomson lacked the maturity to take full responsibility for his actions and would therefore be unable to benefit from a Probation programme.

His accommodation difficulties have been addressed as related above. He was referred to Includem, who provide intensive, focussed support to young people who are offending, from April this year, and [REDACTED] has attempted to assist Mr Thomson to explore his other difficulties in a highly structured way.

Mr Thomson was also offered a time-limited substance use education package by Mr [REDACTED] of East Dunbartonshire Addiction Service between February and April this year. Unfortunately it would not seem that this has, to date, been of much benefit to Mr Thomson. The problematic incidents which have occurred since April this year have been linked to excessive alcohol use on Mr Thomson's part. He does not, however, seem to believe his pattern of alcohol use is problematic.

Conclusions

Mr Thomson's circumstances have been largely unchanged since he was placed on Probation and his progress otherwise, for example in relation to controlling his alcohol use, has been limited.

His compliance with the conditions of his Order has been acceptable in general. However, he has not made payments to the Compensation Order and will be cited to a Means Court.

Mr Thomson has been charged with one offence since being placed on Probation. The writer is of the opinion that this is very positive, given the unsatisfactory state of Mr Thomson's circumstances and his previous involvement in offending behaviour.

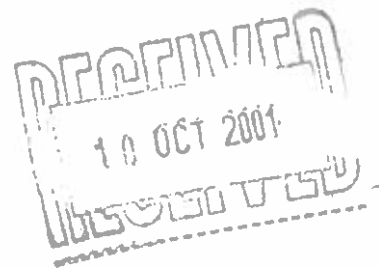
When the above named appeared at this court today, the Sheriff, having considered your supplementary social enquiry report, and having heard Mr Thomson's solicitor; further adjourned this case until 5th November 2001.

The purpose of this deferral was to enable the prosecutor to investigate a matter which would appear to be outstanding against Mr Thomson, and for a further supplementary social enquiry report from your department. Please ensure your report is in the hands of the sheriff clerk at least twenty four hours prior to the next calling on 5th November 2001.

I am directed to advise you that failure to pay a compensation order imposed as a condition of a probation order, is a breach of that order, and does not mean that the offender will be cited to a means enquiry court, as your report suggests. It would be for your department to commence breach proceedings in such an order.

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Mr Thomson also continues to be subject to a supervision requirement, made by the Children's Panel, and has an allocated social worker, Ms Marion Corcoran, of the Children and Families Team, Milngavie. Ms Corcoran works with this Authority on a part time basis. Given Mr Thomson's needs and lifestyle, it was felt expedient to allocate supervision of the Probation Order to the Criminal Justice Unit and thus provide Mr Thomson with access to a named worker throughout the week. The writer liaises regularly with Ms Corcoran and also with [REDACTED] of Includem. It is understood Ms Clark is submitting a separate report.

Behaviour

Mr Thomson has, to the writer's knowledge and belief, been charged with one offence since being placed on Probation. This related to an alleged RTA incident committed in May this year. Given Mr Thomson's previous frequent pattern of offending behaviour the writer would consider a solitary new charge as evidence of considerable effort and commitment on Mr Thomson's part to change or control his behaviour.

Compliance with Other Conditions of Probation

Mr Thomson was placed on Probation for stealing a car, with an additional requirement to pay £ 250-00 compensation to the victim. According to the Sheriff Clerk at Dumbarton, Mr Thomson has only paid £10-00 towards this Compensation. He is now to be cited to a Means Enquiry Court. Proven failure to pay Compensation as ordered will clearly constitute a breach of the Probation Order.

Mr Thomson has generally complied with the writer's instruction in terms of keeping appointments with her, although one failure to attend without reasonable excuse has led to a formal written warning.

Change of Circumstances

Mr Thomson's circumstances remain largely as they have been in the past year. That is, he remains in need of secure accommodation and formal training or employment.

Mr Thomson was residing in Bed and Breakfast accommodation in the West Highland Gate Travel Inn in Milngavie when placed on Probation. He was placed in the Lion Hotel, Bishopbriggs in May this year after being asked to leave West Highland Gate due to unacceptable behaviour on his part. Unfortunately, Mr Thomson was subsequently asked to leave the Lion Hotel for similar reasons in August this year. He stayed with his stepfather temporarily before going to visit his natural father in France for a fortnight. Mr Thomson was then placed at the Parkview Hotel, his current address.

Various referrals to supported accommodation projects have been pursued by Ms Corcoran but, for a number of different reasons, Mr Thomson has not, as yet, secured a place in any project. Mr Thomson has a potential offer of a place with YMCA Cumbernauld's supported tenancy project. He also has a formal interview on Wednesday this week with Dorothy McCall House in Glasgow, run by Blue Triangle.

Progress

Mr Thomson was placed on Probation with his criminogenic needs identified as homelessness; constructive activity; drug and alcohol misuse; peer influence and other long-term relationship difficulties. The writer did express concerns that Mr Thomson lacked the maturity to take full responsibility for his actions and would therefore be unable to benefit from a Probation programme.

His accommodation difficulties have been addressed as related above. He was referred to Includem, who provide intensive, focussed support to young people who are offending, from April this year, and Ms Clark has attempted to assist Mr Thomson to explore his other difficulties in a highly structured way.

Mr Thomson was also offered a time-limited substance use education package by Mr Stuart Harris of East Dunbartonshire Addiction Service between February and April this year. Unfortunately it would not seem that this has, to date, been of much benefit to Mr Thomson. The problematic incidents which have occurred since April this year have been linked to excessive alcohol use on Mr Thomson's part. He does not, however, seem to believe his pattern of alcohol use is problematic.

Conclusions

Mr Thomson's circumstances have been largely unchanged since he was placed on Probation and his progress otherwise, for example in relation to controlling his alcohol use, has been limited.

His compliance with the conditions of his Order has been acceptable in general. However, he has not made payments to the Compensation Order and will be cited to a Means Court.

Mr Thomson has been charged with one offence since being placed on Probation. The writer is of the opinion that this is very positive, given the unsatisfactory state of Mr Thomson's circumstances and his previous involvement in offending behaviour.
