I saw Lee with his Mother at school on 17 June 1998 for his Primary 1 medical examination. Mrs Reid had expressed concern over Lee's poor eating, constipation and soiling. On examination his height of 109 cm was on the 9th centile and weight of 19.5 kg was on the 50th centile for his age. The only abnormalities on physical examination were a variable left convergent squint and the fact that his abdomen was distended and hard. I tested his vision and found it to be 6/6 bilaterally.

I understand that Lee's chronic constipation has been previously investigated by the surgeons, and that he had rectal biopsies which showed no evidence of Hirschsprung's disease. After his period of bowel training in 1996, he was given laxatives and this was successful for a short time. However Mum says that he remains a poor eater, and he has recently told his Grandmother that if he doesn't eat he won't need to move his bowels. He is no longer receiving laxatives. Mrs Reid told me that she and Lee were recently seen at Child and Family Psychiatry, but I have no note of this. Apparently she is awaiting a further appointment.

Lee's soiling remains a huge problem for the family. He only moves his bowels once every 3 weeks, into his under clothes, refusing to use the toilet. His bowel motions are hard and contain blood. He soils his pants almost daily, and this can be a problem at school. Mrs Reid cannot see a solution to this long standing problem, which now has a big psychological component for Lee. I wondered whether you would consider referring him to Dr Bisset's medical out patient clinic, if you considered it appropriate. Mrs Reid will consult you in the school Summer holidays about this, and about possible re-referral to the Eye Clinic for his squint. She knows that his vision is satisfactory, but is still concerned. I have not arranged to see Lee at school.

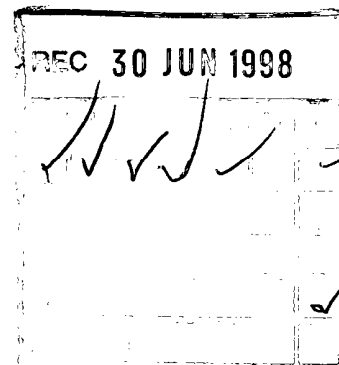

Diagnosis: Small Laceration to Left Forehead after Head Injury

Lee sustained a head injury on the 14th June 1998. This resulted in a small laceration to the left side of his forehead but no sequelae from the head injury.

The wound was initially cleaned and steristripped and he was allowed home.

On the 19th June 1998 he returned with some oozing through the steristrips and so the wound was re-cleaned and re-steristripped.

We asked him to return on the 23rd June 1998 for review but he did not attend and we, therefore, assume that the small laceration has now healed up.

We will, of course, be happy to see him again if required.
