I collected William from his carers, William was looking well, he was chatty and presented as settled and happy, said they had all had a great Christmas.

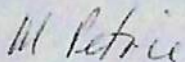

While walking there William said to his dad it was his birthday next week, Mr Tarbett looked surprised, he suggested we go and get him something. I told Mr Tarbett William had said to me he would like a play station or money towards buying one for his birthday. Mr Tarbett said he would give him money.

The visit went well, they walked around the zoo together, making conversation, looking at the animals.

When we got back to the car park Mr Tarbett gave William £70 he said he will give him more money for his holiday the next time he sees him. I told Mr Tarbett he won't see William until after his holiday. Mr Tarbett gave William his mobile phone number, told him to phone him if he needs more money for his play station and his holiday.

Mr Tarbett showed William the stitches /staples that had been taken out of his wound, giving William some of them to take home with him.

Mr Tarbett saw one of his son's cars in the car park, he wanted to go and look for him saying to William he would give him money for his birthday, we looked around the immediate area but did not see him.

I gave Mr Tarbett £1.80 for expenses for today's visit and an amended list of contact dates.

William happily said goodbye to his dad.

William was chatty on return journey, especially about the money his dad had given him, he said he had more money in the house so he would have enough money to buy a play station. William again spoke about looking forward to going on holiday.

CONTACT.

Collected William from placement. He told me that dad is going to court to "get him back" and that a man (curator) is coming out to see William to talk to him about this. Explained in very basic terms, about court action, this will not side re William returning to dad's care, this would have to be considered by Children's Hearing. William asking if mum is going to be at court, I said to William mum not involved in this action, she already has "rights". I asked William if he was worried about this, he said "no", encouraged him to talk to carers if anything he is unsure of. This prompted William to ask some questions about his past.

Due to a mix-up over meeting place, we had a wait before seeing mum (approx 15/20 mins). William restless, looking out for [REDACTED], asking for reassurance that I had made arrangements.

Spent time in McDonalds having a meal. William initiated little conversation with mum, at times more interested in what was going on around him. Linda's attention was necessarily focused on [REDACTED] - feeding him, talking about recent blood tests to identify source of [REDACTED] downs syndrome. 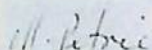

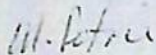
