Purpose

To meet to-gether and share information about William's behaviour and changes he has encountered and their effects.

1. Sexualised behaviour

William has been displaying more sexualised behaviour at his new home with the [redacted] than he did at the [redacted]. William was telling Fiona at his session at Polepark that he was a "faggoid", thats what [redacted] and [redacted] call him (demonstrating with his fingers that he had a cigarette between them ; he is unaware of the real meaning). It has since been discovered they are calling him a faggot. All the children within the household and their friends have seen Williams behaviour. Mr.& Mrs. [redacted] are finding it difficult to deal with.

Within the Family Centre William is thrusting himself against [redacted] but stopped when told to by Marion.

2. Change of Home Placement

William is experiencing a hard time at home understanding the changes he has encountered with 3 moves in a short time. Hopefully this will settle now that he is back at Mr.&Mrs. [redacted]. William has not made a space for himself within the family, unlike [redacted] who fits in well. [redacted] is making it clear to William that he dislikes him because William could possibly spoil things for them within the new family. William asked Karen when he would be able to find a real family instead of having to move all the time.

3. Changes within Williams behaviour

Within the family centre William often appears to be his old self but some days he is apathetic. Within small group time William will not care what he plays with. He appears to be confused and doesn't know where he is going or with whom. When Margaret, SW assistant, came into collect William he asked " Where are you taking meaccess or Polepark.... where am I going ?" When Margaret replied " Home", he just said " Right".

William can be moody and disruptive, wetting on the toilet walls and round the toilet seat just to get a reaction.

He told staff that he had not to get his new trainers dirty or he would be in trouble.

cont./....

William has made no mention of [REDACTED] or his new carers since his return. only about the dogs and about getting them to bite others.

4. Use of sessions at Polepark

William was simulating^{sex} against a mirror within the playroom and was asked to stop. He plays with snakes and knives during his sessions at Polepark. He has used the anger brick a lot in his new sessions.

5. Way Forward

1. It has been suggested that William may move on to nursery school at Easter, possibly the nearest one to his intended primary school.
2. All other changes - new carers, new social worker - will have settled by then.
3. Query Williams "emotional" readiness for Primary 1 - perhaps a year a nursery school would benefit him.
