There was some physical contact when the children approached Mr. Tarbett but he did not move from his seat or make efforts to engage with the children, this was left up to them

Encouraged [REDACTED] to tell Dad about his weekend at [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], Mr. Tarbett saying he had not been told of move, reminded him of his office visit when he refused to discuss this.

Good access, children's behaviour good and Mr. Tarbett giving the children a cuddle when they approached him.

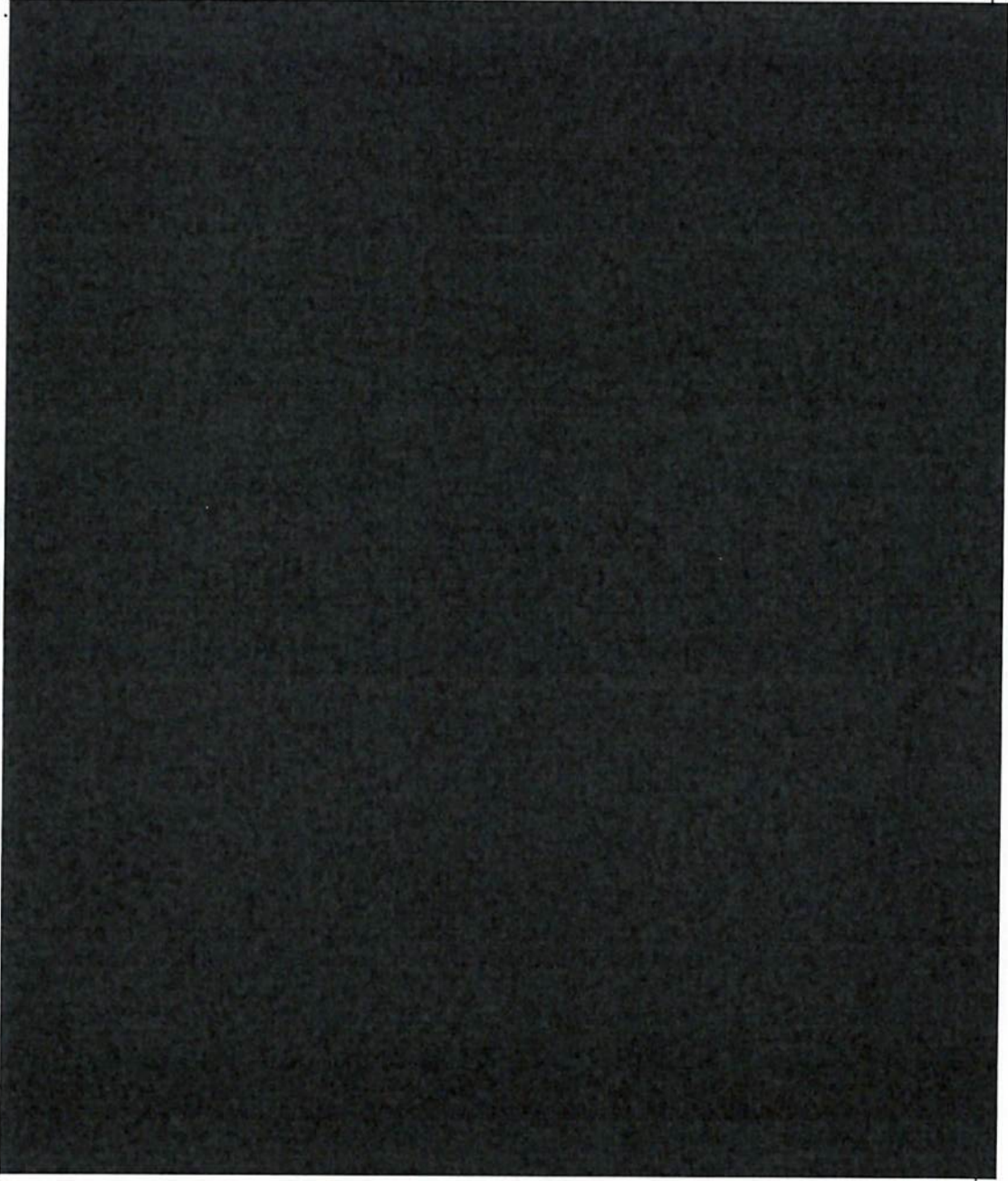

WILLIAM

██████████ and ██████████ - car journey

Went to pick boys up today at foster home after school. William showing keenness to come to Polepark while ██████████ more complaining. Wanting to know why William coming today when it should just be ██████████ and him. Saying he hates William and wants time away from him. After telling him it was a fun day for the 3 of them, decided this was a good time to talk to him about the children's group at Polepark which workers feel he should be given the opportunity to join. ██████████ (foster mum) and myself both talked to him about joining the group which starts next Wednesday - played on the fact it would be 'just for big boys'. I said Martin (worker in group) would tell him more when we got to Polepark. This had the effect of getting ██████████ to come more agreeably. However, in car still going on about how much he now hates William - said everyone in house (foster home) hates him too. When I asked why he thinks this, ██████████ said that William does things which annoy all in the house - some things he does are 'dirty' and some are 'bad'. Said he wished William did not live there - then it would be good. While this tirade going on, William said nothing. In Polepark, ██████████ did talk to Martin and agreed he might like to start the group next week.

On journey home ██████████ wanting to know if I would be telling ██████████ and ██████████ about his behaviour today - saying, 'I've been good, Sandra are you going to tell them that?' Also saying, 'its William who has been bad today' (doing dirty things). Said I did not think anyone had been bad today and all I would be saying to ██████████ would be what he had wanted us to feed back (bedtimes - and what goes on between the boys). When we got to foster home did feedback to ██████████ that ██████████ wants William stopped from spitting (gobbing) on him when they are in the bedroom on their own. ██████████ reassured ██████████ they will stop it if they are told.

██████████ also talking about Dad in car coming home - saying Dad has always liked them. Used to hit sometimes but only if they were bad and deserved it. Did not want to discuss it - called me 'nosy' for wanting to.

SESSION TOGETHER - MAIN POINTS

- 1 ██████████ and William arrived at Polepark first today (before ██████████). Helped make the snack before going to the big playroom. Martin joined us and said a bit to ██████████ about the new group which he can join this week if he wants to. ██████████ quite interested - asking what they might be doing each week in the group.

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2 [REDACTED] and William played separately at the start. [REDACTED] made a sledge of bricks (with Martin's help) while William went to the home corner. Once [REDACTED] had built his sledge, William would have liked to go in it but [REDACTED] would have none of it. Started again about 'hating him' and not wanting William near him (follow on from what he was saying in the car). Also saying Dad had not given them their Xmas presents yet. Thinks he still has to wrap them.

3 Joined by [REDACTED] and Fiona [REDACTED] looking pleased to be there, telling everyone that she had a new dress on today - and that she is beautiful.

4 Martin left and children settled down to play. [REDACTED] tried to draw [REDACTED] into his dispute against William, telling her "didn't she hate William". [REDACTED] checked out with him first, "do you?" M - "yes, everybody hates William". [REDACTED] looked over at Fiona who said nothing then [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] "no". [REDACTED] told Fiona he does not like William because he hits him with his pillow at bedtime.

5 William in home corner with Fiona whilst [REDACTED] bad mouthing him. William appeared passive about what [REDACTED] was saying and did not reply or try to defend himself. However, he did hammer and saw giving louder and louder bangs as [REDACTED] taunted him. William then left the home corner and went over to the long mirror where he "kissed and shagged" himself against it. The intention also was to bring out his penis and when told not to he refrained from doing so.

Workers feel that such behaviour could stem from a degree of stress and be in response to [REDACTED] unfriendly behaviour towards him. William implied that he does "the shagging" to [REDACTED] in their bedroom.

6 [REDACTED] counted up to 5 by using his middle finger ("one"), the "V" sign ("two and three"), repeated the "V" sign ("four and five"). Wanted [REDACTED] to watch him doing it again as she had not seen the first time. Fiona advised she ignore him which she did, he did not pursue it. Michael appeared to be doing this to show off, seek attention and let others see (as it were) "[REDACTED] in" - "William out".
