12.08.03 T/C to Strathcarron (Christa)	Crista reported that William very shocked and scared by the incident. Wanted to see myself or Gail yesterday, but was unable to do so. He is desperate to see his father. Gordon Frew (Childrens Rights officer) has been contacted and an interview will be set up. I advised that I would attempt again to inform Mr Tarbett and arrange for him to meet with William. I expressed my concern that the unit would need to handle the situation very carefully if William tells his father the names of those involved in the incident as it is possible he may decide to take the law into his own hands.
12.08.03 T/C to Mr Tarbett	No answer - left message. Mr Tarbett contacted me later. I gave Mr Tarbett and outline of the incident and stressed that William was quite shocked and wanting to see him. Mr Tarbett agreed that I should set up a contact. He did not ask about William's health or any details of the incident, but quickly changed the subject to inform my why he had missed the previous two contacts, to try and check out with me the whereabouts of William's younger siblings and to complain again about Linda Robertson's debts to him.
12.08.03 T/C Strathcarron (Gail Drummond)	Confirmed with Gail that contact will be arranged for 12 noon Thursday 14th August. Letter sent to Mr Tarbett and Linda Robertson

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12.08.03 Email to Childrens Rights Officer, Gordon Frew	Re assault on William
13.08.03 Information from Gail Aboim, SSW	Gordon Frew has interviewed William, and will be writing a response about the situation at Strathcarron. Police investigation ongoing but noone charged yet.
14.08.03 Contact with Mr Tarbett	Supervised by myself. We ate lunch in burger king. William wanted to tell his father about the assault but Mr Tarbett seemed uninterested. Concern that Mr Tarbett might threaten inappropriate or even illegal action did not materialise. After lunch I asked whether they would like some time in Camperdown park on their own, which was accepted. Spent half an hour on their own and seemed to be deep in conversation much of the time. On return William commented on the lack of supervision, saying it was 'brilliant'.
19.08.03	William started school at Monifieth today
20.08.03 T/C to Strathcarron	Re school. William handling it well. Has to get up early to catch public transport and doesn't return until gone 4.30pm. At present being accompanied until used to it. Strathcarron has been in touch with guidance teacher, <u>Margaret Ford</u> , who will confirm that William is arriving at school.
21.08.03 Copy letters to police	Copy letters sent by Meriel Clark to police re prosecution progress in respect of assault on William.

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25.08.03 Discussion with Maureen Petrie, SWA	Maureen confirmed that contact between William and Mr Tarbett, with reduced supervision, went well. William enjoying school, and told his father this. Mr Tarbett is suggesting a joint contact with [REDACTED] and also suggesting that he picks William up from school for contact. Maureen has advised that there can be no changes until discussed with the social worker. IvA will discuss with Gail in Supervision, to be on agenda when case is transferred in September.
25.08.03 Email from Strathcarron	From Graham. Advised that William had a good weekend - spent with the [REDACTED] family on Saturday. William has told Graham that [REDACTED] has stated that he will not be welcome in their home if there is any further involvement with the police.
27.08.03 Supervision	See notes. Ingrid leaving post. Case transfer discussed. LAC Review to be requested as no date set at last one in April. Particular issues are:- a) permanent placement - deadlock. IvA to send another memo to Margaret Moyes b) contact arrangements with father and siblings - time to review and reduce supervision levels?
01.09.03 T/C from Strathcarron	From Linda. Advised that all OK with William last week and over weekend. Email sent advising of my departure and plans for case transfer and closure with William. Copy to Maureen.
04.09.03 T/C from Strathcarron	Christa. Requesting that I come down immediately for a meeting of all the social workers because of the 'situation' at Strathcarron. It took me some time to ascertain events which have occurred yesterday and today, involving all the residents at Strathcarron, who have truanted from school and been involved in persistent aggression and violence towards the staff. The police were involved overnight. I asked to speak to Gail Drummond as I felt that the strategy of a meeting during the heat of the moment to be held at Strathcarron would only inflame the situation and achieve nothing. I was unable to speak to Gail. Eventually I contacted Gail Aboim who spoke at length to Gail Drummond, explaining why I

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04.09.03 (cont)	would not come down to Strathcarron at this point. After a couple of hours of trying by phone and email I managed to speak with Gail Drummond. I advised that, at any point where it seemed William could be separated from the other residents, and might be amenable to listenening, I would come down and speak with him. William was charged with vandalism and breach of the peace. The staff seemed pretty desperate and unclear how to handle the situation. I kept in touch with Gail by email, but no request came to go to Strathcarron. Email to Alan Baird, Graeme Oliver, Gordon Frew expressing my strong concern about the ongoing poor management of the children at Strathcarron, the need for staff support and, primarily, the long-term negative impact of all this on William's future chances. 04.09.03 T/C from Margaret Ford, Guidance Teacher, Monifieth HS Tel 435566	Advising that William not at school today or yesterday. Informed her of the situation. Ms Ford thinks William is doing extremely well at school but 'off the record' he is jeopardising his place if he plays truant, as the School would like to 'get rid of him'. Advised Gail Drummond of my conversation.
05.09.03 Email from Graham Oliver	See Email
08.09.03 T/C from Gordon Frew	Requesting invitation to LAC Review if William agrees.

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09.09.03	Short transfer meeting with June Hopkins
09.09.03 Session with William	Took William out for tea in town. Initially William wanted to talk a bout the events of last week. Disclaimed any responsibility for broken windows etc. However, he did understand that if he was mixing with this group during such incidents, he must bear some responsibility. We talked through all the usual consequences, including the possibility that he might be excluded from Monifieth. This shocked him, as he much enjoys it, and it is where all his friends are. I also told William that I was leaving and who his new social worker would be - he had lots of questions about June. He did not seem particularly upset by the news, but did start reminiscing about times with Philip McGill and myself. I said that I would be taking him and Maureen out for a proper goodbye tea on October 2nd. William was his usual bantering, funny, easy to be with person, until we returned to Strathcarron, where there was an immediate change of persona, definitely cocky and aggressive.
11.09.03 Tel disc with Gail Drummond, Strathcarron	To check how William has responded to new of my departure. No problems. Gail also informed that Benefits agency have been in touch about backdated benefit and where to pay it. Donna telephoned [REDACTED] to see if William had a bank account. [REDACTED] referred this to his wife but then asked where he could complain to about William's presence in Auchterhouse and his behaviour. Donna sought to find out whether William's behaviour has been causing problems, but apparently not. [REDACTED] is concerned about contact between his sons and foster child and William and the <i>possibility</i> of something happening. Donna apparently dealt with this very firmly. I asked for a record of the conversation as I felt it should be brought to Margaret Moyes' notice. Email record subsequently received. Also noted that Strathcarron has been in touch with June Hopkins who will deal with the DLA issue.

01.10.03 Introductory visit to William	Maureen Petrie introduced me to William - he was very polite and presented as quite interested in the new worker. Brief discussion re contacts, hobbies etc.
02.10.03 Telephone call from Jennifer at Strathcarron Young People's Unit	Mr Tarbett has been on the phone accusing staff of not feeding Billy properly.
06.10.03 - 07.10.03	Social Worker on annual leave.
07.10.03 Email from Strathcarron	Billy has been phoning his dad a lot on a mobile phone Mr Tarbett gave him in September.
17.10.03 Email from Brenda Kidd, Resource Worker for the [REDACTED]	Billy has been telling people in Auchterhouse that his mother has died.
20.10.03 Telephone call from Graham Webster, Strathcarron	Billy was involved in an argument with [REDACTED] father at the weekend. This developed further into a fight between Billy and [REDACTED] on Saturday but this has now helped to clear the air.
27.10.03 Telephone call from Mr TARBETT	William has told his father that he was slashed by a local youth and chased by the police. Mr Tarbett also wanted to confirm the time of the LAC Review on 29.10.03.

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27.10.03 Telephone call to Liz at Strathcarron	William and the other boys at the unit have all given slight different versions of trouble with local youths. William does have 2 small nicks on his face and said he was trapped in Gowriehill School for a time. Liz feels that William has been much more confrontational lately and is being negatively affected by life at the Young People's Unit. Staff will try to clarify details in time for the LAC Review on 29th.
27.10.03 Telephone call to Mr Tarbett	Fed back above information and assured him that William did not require medical attention.
29.10.03 LAC Review	See minute.
10.11.03 Telephone call to Strathcarron Young People's Unit	Spoke to Donna re bank account for William. Agreed to send DLA form and birth certificate to them for purpose of opening bank account.
20.11.03 Meeting at Strathcarron	Meeting attended by Mr Tarbett, Graham Webster, Maureen Petrie, June Hopkins and Billy. See minute.
24.11.03 Telephone call to Mrs Ford, Monifieth High School	Left message confirming that I was aware of William receiving supports in class.
25.11.03 Email from Margaret Moyes	Email from manager in response to requests from myself and Bill Chalmers, Review Officer, to consider a family placement for Billy. Margaret Moyes assured that Billy continues to be considered for family placement.
28.11.03 Email from Strathcarron	Billy stayed at the [REDACTED] Auchterhouse, last night as today is school in-service day. Billy doing well inside and out of the Young People's Unit at present.

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01.12.03 Telephone call from DLA	DLA section querying method of paying back money to William.
01.12.03 Telephone call to Strathcarron	Telephone line busy.
01.12.03 Telephone call to Brenda Rouse, DLA	Telephone line consistently busy.
02.12.03 Email from Strathcarron	Billy was at doctor's last night because of sore throat and was prescribed medication. Off school today but plans to return tomorrow.
03.12.03 Telephone call from Strathcarron	William has been unwell with a sore throat. He missed ice-skating because of this.
09.12.03 Telephone call to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] previous carer	Asked [REDACTED] re William's health book. [REDACTED] said they never had this as William came to them before these were routinely issued. They have recently avoided Billy because of this disruptive behaviour.
10.12.03 Telephone call to Strathcarron	Fed back information from [REDACTED] re health book being missing. Arranged to visit Billy on Tuesday at 5:00pm.
16.13.03 Visit to Billy	Took Billy over to Sidlaw Thistle training at Braeview. Billy spoke in the care about wanting a family. He was surprised at another Strathcarron young person who ran away from his new family, as he knew this would jeopardise this boy's placement.

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19.12.03 Email to Margaret Moyes	Informed Margaret that Billy's behaviour has deteriorated recently and Choice are to become involved because of the number of recent offences. Notified her that Billy is still motivated re family placement. Response from Margaret Moyes was that Graham Oliver has refused permission for external referrals (to be reviewed in 3 months) so we need to continue to consider our own fostering resources.
29.12.03 Email from Strathcarron	Concerns raised that Billy has visited the home of [REDACTED] with John [REDACTED]. Staff concerned that [REDACTED] is not a safe associate for the young people at Strathcarron.
12.01.04 Telephone call from Graham at Strathcarron	Billy was the only young person in Strathcarron on Christmas Day but coped well with this. Billy has been having unlimited contact with his dad and has had a lot of cash and sweets/kebabs. Alongside this however he still speaks about having a family and has commented to staff that the only way to get one is to smash up the Young People's Unit.
	Billy also sees the more difficult youngsters getting trips with Choice Project and has said this is unfair. This may stop him being motivated to keep out of trouble. Graham Webster feels that he is generally becoming more aggressive towards staff.
13.01.04 Meeting with Margaret Moyes	Discussed my concerns re: 1 William being alone in Young People's Unit on Christmas Day 2 Family finding as William is still motivated 3 Increasing aggression so time is important for Billy 4 Contact - unlimited contact with dad but Margaret feels we should maintain formal contacts.
20.01.04 Telephone call to Strathcarron	Asked if contact could take place there with use of the snooker table. This is not something encouraged by the unit because of potential difficulties with birth families.
22.01.04 Telephone call to Elaine, Finance Department, Tayside House	Discussed Billy's bank account again and the only means of opening this is in joint names with myself - something which I do feel is appropriate.
22.01.04 Emailed Margaret Moyes	Requested further advice re bank account and voiced by reluctance to have my name jointly due to difficult birth family.

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22.01.04 Meeting to discuss contact	Meeting at Strathcarron between workers, Billy and dad - see minute. Billy and Mr Tarbett determined that they will see each other as often as they like.
23.01.04 Email from Graham Webster	Billy very angry and aggressive after meeting with dad and workers. He eventually calmed down when given his own space.
23.01.04 Telephone call to Julie Philp, Social Worker for John Anderson	Discussed [REDACTED] who has had visits from [REDACTED] and Billy. He is believed to be "grooming" children. [REDACTED] had loaned Billy a coat and had given [REDACTED] a mobile phone. Julie and Michelle Knight, Senior Social Worker, will be visiting [REDACTED] on 03.02.04 to ask him to "back off".
27.01.04 Email from Strathcarron	Billy had been at the [REDACTED] overnight last weekend but plans to return this weekend appear to have fallen through. Billy's attitude has been confrontational and he has continued to see his dad frequently.
28.01.04 Telephone call from Alan Hope, Choice Project	Alan does not plan to do any further work with Billy but will keep his case open for now.
29.01.04 Email from Margaret Moyes	[REDACTED] is considering Billy's paperwork and is considering offering him a permanent foster placement.
02.02.04 Telephone call from Graham Webster, Strathcarron	Billy has been very aggressive towards staff and using foul language. He has been uncooperative in the unit and threatening staff that Mr Tarbett is going to "come and batter them". He is still seeing his dad often.
04.02.04 Email from Strathcarron	Billy verbally aggressive to staff most of last night - swearing and at supertime throwing food at them. He stated that female staff could do nothing to move/control him. He refused to go for his shower and was deliberately confronting staff for approximately one further hour. Better attitude before going off to school this morning.

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06.02.04. Telephone call from Paul, Strathcarron	Paul asking re family finding progress. Billy got detention at school on Monday for fighting with another boy but he was provoked when the other boy had said, "go fuck your mother". He had a better night last night.
07.02.04 Email from Strathcarron	Billy excluded from school - Friday 6th until Tuesday 9:00pm because of an assault on another pupil. Again teachers said he was provoked. Resolution meeting to take place on the 9th at 9:00am.
09.02.04 Telephone call from Strathcarron	Michael Tarbett came to collect Billy as he and Mr Tarbett were off to Perth Prison to visit their brother. Billy was not there as he had spent an overnight at the [REDACTED]
10.02.04 Email from Strathcarron	Billy's school resolution meeting went well. Billy brought Evening Telegraph into the unit tonight and was boasting that his brother, [REDACTED], got a 6-month prison sentence.
19.02.04 Introductory meeting between Billy and [REDACTED] [REDACTED], Carer	Meeting attended by Billy, [REDACTED] Laura Gordon (Resource Worker), Graham Webster (key worker) and myself. This was fairly relaxed and it was agreed that Billy would visit [REDACTED] house later today or through the week.
19.12.04 Email from Graham Webster	Billy had mixed feelings after the meeting but did visit [REDACTED] this evening and met the other young person who lives with her. Other visits to be arranged with Strathcarron.
20.02.04 Telephone call to Doug Carrie, Reporter	Requested Review Hearing for Billy - report required by 1 March 2004.
20.02.04 Telephone call to Graham Webster	Billy in good form after his visit to [REDACTED]

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23.02.04 Telephone call from Graham Webster	Billy now saying he does not want to live at [REDACTED] and leave his friends at Strathcarron. He saw his dad everyday last week and has also seen [REDACTED] at Fairbairn Young People's Unit. Very mixed feelings for Billy but he is to be encouraged to go to [REDACTED] for tea later.
23.02.04 Email from Graham Webster	Billy went to [REDACTED] and had a good visit. They talked a lot and had a laugh together. Next visit planned for Saturday.
25.02.04 Telephone call from Strathcarron	Mr Tarbett dropped Billy off last night and he was wearing a brand new Burberry duffle coat. Confirmed that I would take Billy to [REDACTED] for tea this evening.
25.02.04 Telephone call to Strathcarron to confirm that Billy will go to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] house tonight	Billy wanting to go to [REDACTED] - in a very angry mood and not wanting to see her. Left it for tonight. Arranged to collect Billy from school on Friday to discuss future with him and key worker, Graham Webster.
25.02.04 Telephone call to [REDACTED] [REDACTED]	Informed [REDACTED] of the above. [REDACTED] very annoyed and stating that she will not be "messed about" by Billy.
26.02.04 Emails to and from Laura Gordon, [REDACTED] Resource Worker	Recognition of Billy's ambivalence about going to [REDACTED]. Agreed to monitor and support Billy and [REDACTED] through this. Also noted my concern at [REDACTED] lack of patience/understanding of Billy's ambivalent feelings about having a family placement.
27.02.04 Telephone call to Laura Gordon	Discussed Billy's current reluctance to go to [REDACTED]
27.02.04 Went to Monifieth High to collect Billy	No sign of Billy at the school.

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27.02.04 Telephone call to Strathcarron	Informed Unit staff that Billy had not been at school - suspect he is avoiding me.
01.03.04 Telephone call from Strathcarron	Billy very agitated and unwilling to discuss [REDACTED] Graham Webster had suggested going there for tea on Saturday but Billy left the Unit to go to Cupar with his dad (possibly to visit [REDACTED] his sister).
08.03.04 Telephone call to Paul at Strathcarron	Billy went missing at the weekend - went off with [REDACTED] from the Unit and appeared at Fairbairn Young People's Unit. There was an incident there but Billy managed to stay out of it - the other two were much more aggressive. Mr Tarbett had been informed, as had the police. Billy returned to Strathcarron at 12:15am and went up to bed and settled.
	Mr Tarbett came to the Unit after this and Billy heard him at the door but did not get up.
09.03.04 Telephone call from Strathcarron	Billy went to his dad's straight from school. When he came in at 7:15pm he was very arrogant.
10.03.04 Telephone call from Margaret Ford, Monifieth High	Billy's behaviour at school has been deteriorating daily - although much of this is bravado, Margaret is concerned that this will escalate. Arranged to pick up Billy from school next week.
15.03.04 Telephone call from Christa, Strathcarron	Billy has been nasty to staff. On Friday morning when there was no atmosphere or tension, he said to Donna, "Don't touch me - I could get you done for child molesting and you would lose your job". On Saturday morning he left the Unit at 9:00am and did not return until 4:30pm when he was in a foul mood. The Unit young people acquired alcohol and Billy ended up kicking his bedroom door and breaking the lock.
	He broke a window at the Unit on Sunday night. Christa said he is clearly having a lot of contact with dad and has seen a lot of [REDACTED] also.

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16.03.04 Email from Strathcarron	Billy returned from school with £5 cash and chocolate bars. He left the Unit after tea with [REDACTED] but did not return on time and was reported missing to police. The three came in at 10:30pm by themselves and were drunk (lager, cider and vodka shots). Billy off to school this morning, but untidy and un-showered.
23.03.04 Telephone call to Disability Living Allowance	Billy currently receives middle rate Disability Living Allowance - care component and low rate for mobility - £727 per annum. Notified them of me being the new Social Worker.
25.03.04 Telephone call from Strathcarron	Billy has had contact with his sister, [REDACTED] and saw brother, [REDACTED] at Fairbairn Young People's Unit.
25.03.04 Telephone call to Linda Taylor, Finance	Queried management of Billy's back payment of Disability Living Allowance - I should complete F4 and she will hold Billy's money in an account as "client cash".
26.03.04 Email from Alan Hope, Choice Project	Alan is writing to the Reporter to get Billy exited from the Fast Track scheme, as there have been no offences since November 2003.
29.03.04 Telephone call from Graham Webster	Updated on Billy - still seeing a lot of dad and mum also around. Graham was at Baxter Park and bumped into the Tarbetts and [REDACTED] family. Linda Robertson was threatening to "slap" [REDACTED] Billy visited the [REDACTED] at Auchterhouse last Friday and is usually much nicer after visits to [REDACTED] family.
31.03.04 Telephone call from Margaret Ford, Monifieth High	Billy truanted on Monday afternoon - he left school at lunchtime saying he had a dental appointment but clearly the Young People's Unit had no knowledge of this. Billy may have ended up in Montrose but Margaret Ford will follow this up.
31.03.04 Telephone call to Graham Webster	Graham said that Billy is up everyday for school and away at 7:45am. However, [REDACTED] is having a negative influence on him in the Unit. Left note of my leave dates.

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01.04.04 - 09.04.04	Social Worker on annual leave.
20.04.04 Telephone call from Margaret Ford, Monifieth High	Billy boasting at school about assaulting a member of staff at the Unit last night. Told her that there had been no word of this to myself, which would be unusual if something had happened.
27.04.04. Telephone call from Graham Webster	Billy has been let down a lot recently by Mr Tarbett and has said to Graham, "He wouldn't let [REDACTED] down". His bike has gone missing from dad's recently. Billy has become closer to staff again - he told them that [REDACTED] had been arrested for assaulting staff at Fairbairn Street Young People's Unit.
04.05.04 Telephone call from Linda at Strathcarron Young People's Unit	Billy has been out and about again with Mr Tarbett. His attitude at Strathcarron has been very positive - so much so that he has been given new football boots as a reward. He is off to Stirling today on a school trip.
08.05.04 Billy missing from Young People's Unit	See missing person report.
10.05.04 Telephone call from Strathcarron	Billy had been supposed to go to his dad's on 8 May but went missing with [REDACTED]. Linda from the Unit saw them down near the home of [REDACTED] in Crichton Street around 4:30pm. [REDACTED] admitted seeing them at 7:30pm but claimed this was, "only for 5 minutes". Mr Tarbett was annoyed with Billy - the Unit staff grounded him on Sunday night.
13.05.04 Telephone call to Voyce	Follow up of incident resulting in damage to Strathcarron by Billy and other youths.
13.05.04 Telephone call from Strathcarron	Billy missing from 9:45am - Mr Tarbett informed. Billy excluded from school yesterday as he and two others had pushed another child to the ground.

Event:

Collected Billy from Monifieth High as arranged with Guidance Teacher, Margaret Ford. Billy was cocky and disrespectful from the beginning and complaining about having to walk out to the street to my car etc etc.

In the car, Billy boasted about drinking and partying with [REDACTED] his brother. He also boasted that [REDACTED] had hit their mother because he saw her kissing her girlfriend. Billy was very disrespectful about his mother but when I asked if [REDACTED] actually hit her, he backed down and said, "well I didn't see that but he was shouting at because she squared up to him".

We were stuck in traffic on the Kingsway and I thought Billy might run off. I felt intimidated by his attitude in the close confines of the car.

Billy said he was going to live with his dad. I acknowledged that he is being pulled in different emotional directions and said that I felt he should remain in Strathcarron Young People's Unit while he sorts out family issues. Billy calmed down a bit at this and then said that he didn't want to live with his dad. I repeated that I felt the best place for Billy now is Strathcarron. I said that the Social Work Department was looking at Mr Tarbett's situation with a view to considering [REDACTED] future.

We arrived at Strathcarron and Billy had his knee at the gear stick while I went to reverse park. I made a joke about him needing to move his knee so that I didn't touch it and he put back beside the gear stick a second time. I felt uncomfortable in case he might make an allegation.

Again, after speaking to unit staff, I went up to Billy's room with a staff member to say, "bye". Billy was in he trousers but with no shirt and was slightly posing. Again, I felt uncomfortable about his slightly sexual posture. Staff confirmed that they are having to be very careful with Billy at present. Whilst much of this is bravado, there is a concern that he may make allegations against staff.

Event: Visit to Billy Tarbett

Visited Billy to discuss the prospect of family placement with Linda [REDACTED]. Billy was initially very petulant and insisted on finishing a game of pool with a new resident.

After five minutes, he sat down and said he did not want to go to [REDACTED] and did not want to live in Fintry. Reassured him that I wanted to hear the issues around this placement and was not going to force him to consider anything he is unhappy about.

The main issues are that she is a single carer and does not drive. I said that we had carefully considered the fact that [REDACTED] is on her own but decided that this had the benefit of no male carer competing with Billy's dad. Billy said he would rather wait and get a family "like the [REDACTED]" with a male and a female carer.

Billy spoke about [REDACTED] not driving and the fact that she said he would have problems getting to and from Auchterhouse. Billy's body language at this point was to cuddle into the back of the settee. I said, "if you had three wishes is that what you'd want"? to which Billy replied, "I don't need three wishes. I just need the one wish and that is what is going to happen".

He then jumped up and said defiantly "[REDACTED] visits all the time and he gets to party and boogie until midnight". I said I had concerns about how this would work out for him and [REDACTED] and he said, "it'll be great".

I asked him to think seriously about [REDACTED] offer of a home. I tried to reassure him that she is not looking to replace his parents but to support him with the future.

Told Billy that I would collect him from school on Friday and meantime he should consider [REDACTED] placement.

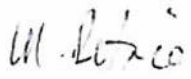
