Billy has lived in residential care for approximately 4 years, and has recently moved from Strathcarron YPU to the care of his dad. It has been very difficult to develop a Pathways Plan with Billy due to his reluctance to become involved with the service and non engagement. Billy did one part of his pathways plan and refused to do any more.

Lifestyle

It is difficult to comment on Billy's lifestyle as he is often full of bravado. Billy does have a circle of friends he socialises with, that have cars and he appears to enjoy there company.

Billy has stated that he drinks a lot at the weekend; however he often changes his story to say he does not drink a lot of alcohol at all. It is difficult to know what is true with Billy as he stays with his dad at the weekend, so no-one is aware of his drinking habits.

Billy is aware of his own safety, however often chooses to put himself at risk within the community. This is with regards to fighting and arguments within the community and the town centre. Billy appears to think that this type of behaviour is acceptable and has been challenged on this, to no effect.

Billy has no positive leisure interests or hobbies. The writer and staff from Strathcarron unit have tried to involve him in hobbies but he is not interested.

Action: The writer will try and encourage Billy to think about the consequences of his actions, with regards to anti social behaviour in the community.

Family and Friends

As Billy is now staying with dad, he has constant contact with his family members. Before moving into his dad's, Billy had daily contact with his dad and had frequent contact with his siblings. Billy appears to have a good relationship with his dad and is close with his siblings. However, Billy would like to follow in his brother's footsteps. Billy's brother has been in and out of jail, and Billy often boasts about this. This has been constantly challenged with Billy.

Billy has a circle of friends of his own age that he socialises with. The writer is unable to comment on the suitability of Billy's friends as he often speaks with a great deal of bravado and it is difficult to tell what the truth is.

Action: To try and challenge Billy's behaviour.
To support Billy's move to dad's.

Health and Wellbeing

Billy has been diagnosed with dyspraxia but in general this does not affect his day to day life. Billy does not take any medication for this condition. As far as the writer is aware, Billy does not have any other on-going health concerns or issues.

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It is difficult to comment on a healthy lifestyle with regards to Billy as contact with him is sporadic. However, Billy always appears in good health.

Action: No action required

Learning and Work

Billy has mentioned various different types of jobs he would like to become involved with and was referred to a key worker at Careers Scotland, which helped him explore all the opportunities available to him. Billy was first put forward for Claverhouse training, but Billy did not enjoy this experience. Billy was then put forward for Hendry Boot, a training programme designed to give young people experience in the workforce. Billy was put on work placement, but left soon after stating he did not enjoy this. Billy's key worker explored the prospect of Billy attending a personal development programme and had the Princes trust in mind. I tried to encourage Billy to attend the interview for this, and believed this would be a good way of developing Billy's confidence etc. however, Billy did not want to do this. Billy also explored job opportunities with Ceri, but nothing came of this either. Billy's key worker has tried various ways to get Billy into employment or training, but he has not taken any of these opportunities on board. Ceri has also tried to contact Billy through phone and letter and as far as I am aware there has been little contact.

Action: For Billy to keep in contact with his key worker at Careers
To encourage and motivate Billy into employment

Where I Live

Billy is now staying with his father in the Hilltown area of Dundee. Billy has always stressed he would like to go to his dad's, but unfortunately at this time Billy's dad did not have enough room for him. However, after a brief stay at Street Level, supported accommodation, Billy moved in with his dad. Billy has always had a good relationship with his dad and whilst staying at Strathcarron Young Person's Unit, stayed with him three nights out of seven. Billy appears very happy at home with his family and has no plans to move on. It has been explained to Billy that he is expected to pay board money and help his dad with chores etc.

Action: To support Billy's move to Dad's

Finance

Throughcare and Aftercare have financial responsibility for Billy. Billy receives a weekly allowance which he collects weekly. Billy has a bank account but he has stressed that his brother is using this. Have advised Billy that TC/AC can pay this money into his account rather than come up to the office every week.

Action: For Billy to give details of his bank account, to pay his weekly allowance into
