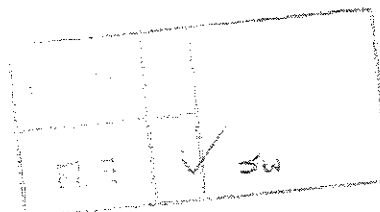

Dear Dr Blatchford

Re: Richard Dean, 14 Huntly Grove, Peterborough

Unfortunately Richard did not attend his last appointment with myself and Fran Mulraney from the C.D.T. This was to discuss how Richard could get his drug use into some kind of order sufficient for a Dexamphetamine prescription to help him. He readily admits that he is a long way from being in a position to make a Dexamphetamine prescription work for him effectively, given his continued chaotic use of other substances, particularly Dihydrocodeine and Temazepam.

As he did not attend I am unsure how to proceed. I will of course write another appointment letter for him. I believe that he and Sandy are having a number of relationship problems and also that Richard has, or had, been working night shift.

I do believe strongly now that Richard must begin to control his Benzodiazepine and opiate use if he is to progress. The only way I can see is for a reduction of his Dihydrocodeine to take place, probably over two months. Of course it would be much better if Richard would agree to this. However, even if he does not I cannot see how we are helping him by continuing to prescribe at present levels.

I will be happy to discuss this with you at any time.

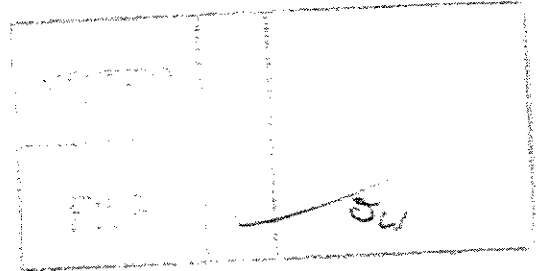

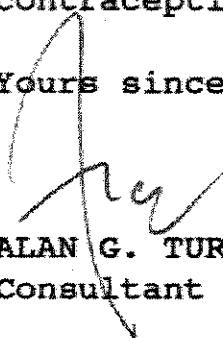

Thank you for referring this chap whom I eventually saw with his partner Alexandra Green at the Community Drug Team on 13th September 1995.

You are no doubt familiar with the history. Briefly, drugs use since late teens, predominantly amphetamine, including some involvement in dealing to support his own habit. He moved from Irvine approximately three years ago with his partner and two youngest children.

Since they have been here, Richard's amphetamine use has changed from oral to I.V. and there has been the almost inevitable increase in both frequency and amount used. This seems to have been particularly marked over the past 18 months - in response, Richard says, to a variety of stresses, part of which is the arrival in Peterborough of his parents. It seems that Richard's father is, in his own words, "schizophrenic", and his behaviour is sometimes aggressive and difficult, particularly towards Alexandra. This causes conflict within the relationship which is undoubtedly already fractious due to Richard's amphetamine use. He is also upset about his pigeons being burned in a recent fire.

I spoke to Richard and Alexandra together for some time. There is no doubt that Richard's amphetamine use is seen as problematic by both of them for several reasons. Firstly, it costs approximately £100 per week, which is obtained by shoplifting for the most part. Secondly, Richard is effectively out of the house for long periods and when he is at home he is inevitably suffering from a "come down". Thirdly, he expressed a wish to stop injecting but has found this extremely difficult. He is using reasonably large amounts of amphetamine, up to ½oz per week.

Complicating factors are his use of DF 118's which he seems to have been using for several years, initially prescribed for pain in his hands, but quickly seen by Richard as a pleasurable and handy drug. In conjunction, he takes Temazepam, predominantly to sleep after his amphetamine use. The Dihydrocodeine is taken irregularly in the sense that he does not always make them last the week. Interestingly, however, his main concern is not over this but over his amphetamine use which he sees as the major issue, even claiming that he could do without the DF 118's if his amphetamine use is curtailed or stabilised.

Further complicating the picture is the fact that his partner also uses amphetamine, although this is oral and usually about twice a week. I discuss this further in a separate letter.

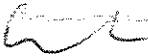
Richard was open and frank about his problem, although I am unsure as to his commitment to deal with his amphetamine use. He was not demanding a Dexamphetamine prescription, although he did raise the issue. I feel that this might be an option and will discuss the case with the Community Drug Team with a view to getting him seen by Dr. Kilgour. I would not expect this to be done by yourself. However, I would like to see some commitment on his behalf and have therefore offered him a series of appointments, as it is likely to be November before Dr. Kilgour can see him.

If he can gain some stability with his main drug of choice, then I think we could reduce and stop his Dihydrocodeine and Temazepam use.

I appreciate this is a somewhat tentative plan, but this is a very long-standing problem. Hopefully if Richard does maintain contact with ourselves the picture may well become clearer and I will contact you to discuss a formal plan of treatment.

I hope this is satisfactory.

He tells me that he has made attempts to be seen at the Community Drugs Team in the past, but I assume these have only been half hearted as he was usually deferred by a waiting list. He is also now injecting Amphetamines and feels that he would like to stop all of this, as he has found that this is disrupting his relationship with his common law wife. He is currently taking 65 tablets per week of Dihydrocodeine 30mg as well as Temazepam 10mg tablets 12 per week. 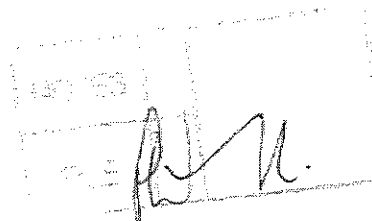

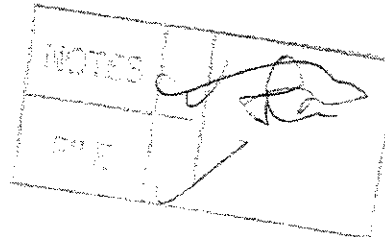

I have seen Richard on two occasions now for assessment. He attended the C.D.U. stating that he had seen you and that he was receiving a prescription of 100mg of D118 from you and that you had advised him to attend here for assessment. Following on from his appointment I am writing to inform you of the options that Richard has after discussion with me about his present and future drug use. He states that he does eventually want to be drug-free but is unsure how to reach this goal. I have therefore left him with three options to consider and he will return to let me know his decision next Monday 16th May '94. His options are, if you yourself are in agreement with these please:

1. to continue being prescribed at his present amount by yourself and to be put on to our waiting list (presently 3-4 months duration) and then to be reduced by us
2. to gradually reduce his prescription from you of D118's over a negotiated period of time and receive support from Bridgegate to help cope with the reduction and psychological/emotional issues that occur along the way
3. for his present script to be changed to Methadone and to be maintained on this by yourself whilst being on our waiting list.

I have explained that the latter will allow him to gradually reduce off as Methadone is longer acting than his present D118's. He does appear to be fairly motivated to change his present situation, but is very aware that he needs support to do this.

I hope the above information is of use to you, I will of course, contact you again following my next meeting with him and update you as to his decision. Please do not hesitate to contact me to discuss any queries that you may have regarding his treatment/care.

Following our telephone conversations on 24th and 25th March I would like to outline my understanding of Mr Deans case. He was originally referred to our service by Dr Manickasingham in November 1993 via Dr Daudjee, Consultant Psychiatrist at the Edith Cavell hospital, to whom the original referral was sent. At that time he presented requesting a supply of Dihydrocodeine for pains in his hands resulting from his ~~work~~ work as a driller. Dr Manickasingham refused to supply Dihydrocodeine and referred him to Dr Daudjee for treatment for drug addiction. Hence his referral to our service. Dr Manickasingham prescribed Froben 50mgs t.d.s., Coproxamol .5mgs t.d.e. for pain control.

Mr Dean was offered two appointments for assessment by myself both of which he failed to attend. On 23rd March 1994 he attended our Needle and Syringe Exchange wanting help for his use of Dihydrocodeine and he was given an assessment appointment for 25th March which he did not attend. Consequently I am unable to offer you any advice as to the management of this patient and to my knowledge he has no further appointments either with our team or with Dr Daudjee at the Edith Cavell Hospital. He is discharged from our care. I hope this information is of use.
