Thank you for asking me to see this 31-year-old man who complains of intermittent pains in his wrists and hands which began about 18 months ago when he was working as a driller. He tells me that he initially had difficulty straightening his fingers and that he was given Cortisone injections, presumably into the flexor tendon sheaths. He saw a hand specialist in Scotland before moving to this area. His symptoms have improved steadily with time but he is still taking eight tablets a day of Dihydrocodeine.

I can find no abnormality in his hands or wrists at this stage but it sounds as though he may have had traumatic flexor tenosynovitis of his fingers caused by working with a pneumatic drill. No further treatment is indicated for this, and the priority should be to wean him off Dihydrocodeine.

I have not arranged to see him again.

He did tell me that he had not received this appointment as unfortunately it went to his old address. He tells me that he has been offered a new appointment on 8 March, only he gives me the impression that this is with Dr Daudjee, at Edith Cavell Hospital. I would be grateful if you could confirm who his new appointment is with.

We have agreed to prescribe him Dihydrocodeine until he has his appointment at the CDT or Edith Cavell. He has undertaken not to seek supplies elsewhere at this time.

I would be grateful if you could confirm these arrangements with me or advise otherwise.

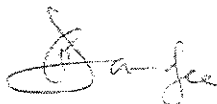

I would be grateful if you would see this 31 year old gentleman with some urgency. He has been having pains in his hands and he says that he has been unemployed for the last 15 months. The pain was due to the fact that he used to work as a Driller and the vibration caused numbness and his hands sometimes tend to turn blue in colour like a Raynaud's attack.

His previous Doctors have been given him Dihydrocodeine for the pain. I refused to give him a repeat prescription and told him that he must be seen at a drug addiction clinic and try and get himself weaned off the drug. In the meantime I have referred him to Dr Sheehan, Consultant Rheumatologist to advice regarding his pains in his hands. He is presently on Froben 50 mg tds and Co-Proxamol 1/2 tds for pain control with Movelat Gel to be applied locally.

I would be thankful if you would see this young 31 year old married man, who has been working 15 months ago as a Driller and he says the vibration, due to the driller, has caused pain and tingling in his hands. He says that sometimes his hands turn blue in colour and had to give up his job due to the pain. Query Raynaud's phenomenon.

His previous Doctors have been given him Dihydrocodeine and I told him that it is a controlled drug and I have referred him to the Drug Addiction Clinic, Dr Dardjee, at the Edith Cavell Hospital. In the meantime for his pain and discomfort of his hands I have given him a non steroid anti-inflammatory cream to be applied locally and Froben 50 mg tds and Co Proxamol 1 to 2 tds for pain control.

I would be thankful if you would see this young man and advice regarding his pain in his hands. He says previously he has had cortisone injections to his tendon sheaths with little or no lasting relief. Thanking you.

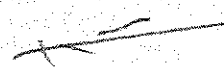

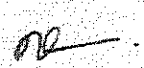

A - Heroin Dependency

Dear Dr Panday

Richard was assessed last week and has now been seen in clinic. He attended and was suitable for our project, due to his class A drug use and his criminal activity. He is currently using Heroin, 5 to 6 bags daily, these are between 0.15 and 0.2 gram bags each. It is costing him between £50 and £60 a day. Currently he is injecting into his right hand groin and has no problem with this site. He is unable to access any other injection sites. He is attending Bridgegate for appropriate needle exchange.

He has been using for 3 to 4 years, on and off, and the last period time of abuse has been since he has been out of prison for the last 2 months. He started using Heroin, as I said, about 3 to 4 years ago through an ex partner using. He is also using Cannabis on a regular basis, but does not feel that he has a problem with this. Previously he used Amphetamines for 7 to 8 years, prior to his Heroin use and has occasionally used Crack. Since using Heroin, he has not used either.

He has received no outpatient treatment but has had a prison detox on the Britlofex and Zoplicone. The longest period of time he has had without Heroin is 14 months and this was due to a prison sentence. The longest he has had without being in prison is 5 weeks.

He states that he used due to boredom and having no support and constant housing. This will obviously be areas that we will be able to assist with and look into, occupying him and his housing status. He states that he has had his Hepatitis B vaccine completed and has been screened for Hepatitis C and HIV, which was clear. He does not have any long-term illnesses or any medication.

He does state, however, that he is allergic to penicillin.

He says that he suffers from Depression, which displayed itself as poor diet, hygiene, low self-esteem and no motivation. He has been prescribed Amitriptyline which he has not been taking. We have discussed about his possible review of treatment and he has not made any self harm attempts or attempted suicide, although occasionally he says he feels like it, but has no plans to do so. He says his concentration is poor and presently his mood is low, feels worthless. He states his memory is ok. His behaviour and speech were appropriate for the situation. He appeared quiet at first, but opened up a little bit towards the end of the interview. He was clean-shaven and his clothes were clean and smart.

He was born in Scotland and he moved around as a child. He has 3 sisters and 3 brothers, all of which he has no contact with. His parents separated after 47 years of marriage. His mum died last year and his dad currently lives in Bradford, and he is aware of his drug use and they have no contact. He has 3 daughters, a 22 year old who he has no contact with living in Scotland and another 2 that he sees regularly that live in Peterborough. He had finished his education but received no formal qualifications but would like to do some building work and we will be looking into this aspect for him.

Richard has already been seen in clinic and will be on a Methadone prescription initially to able stabilisation and then we will review this treatment. The other aspects we will be looking at are obviously his housing situation and work. We will also encourage his contact continues with his children. We will also be reviewing his mood and monitoring any changes. We will contact you regularly to update you on Richards's progress.

As you know, this man started on a Dexedrine treatment programme for his Amphetamine addiction on Friday the 27th September, 1996. The next week he failed to pick up his Dexedrine from the Pharmacy and we have concluded from this that he does not need this prescription on a daily basis as he is obviously able to manage without. As such we will be stopping the prescription and the last day that he will be prescribed for is Friday the 11th October, 1996.

With regard to any further treatment, I would suggest to you that should he come seeking drugs from yourself that you resist his requests. I have written to Mr Dean explaining our position and suggesting that he should contact myself to organise some counselling for his drug problems as there is obviously no need to prescribe to him. Of course, if he presents requesting such services we will keep you informed of any developments.

This chap turned up for assessment at the Medical Community Drug Team Clinic this evening, the 24th September, 1996.

He claims that he's been using about 1500mgs a week of Amphetamine by injection and denies any other substance use, including alcohol. I gather from Peter Ford that his life is not terribly stable at the moment and this may militate against his being able to fulfil his aim of stopping injecting completely. Nonetheless we have taken him at face value and will supply him with a prescription for 30mgs of Dexamphetamine a day over five days every week.

I will see him again in the Clinic in three weeks time, and Peter will keep a fairly close eye on him with regular urine tests, etc.

Just to confirm that it seems as if Richard has decided to stay away from the Community Drug Team.

It sounds very much as if he and Alexandra are having ongoing relationship difficulties as it were. I believe he is reluctant to be reduced much further in his Dihydrocodeine use. I would suggest continued pressure on him to reduce is valid. If he insists on remaining on opiates long-term then I would have thought that Methadone Mixture would be much more appropriate. This would probably best be started through the C.D.T. with a view to handing back if things stabilised. I hope this is helpful.
