Dear Dr Naven

Mr Palmer has an ongoing problem with his left shoulder. He had a dislocation of the left shoulder probably about 15 years ago which he said was treated at the Royal Alexandra in Paisley. This was successful but about 10 years or so after his surgery he developed a discharge from his sinus of the Axilla. This has been an ongoing problem and he is also complaining of significant pain and reduced movement in his left shoulder post op. He has forward flexion to only about 40°, external rotation to 0, internal rotation to the left of greater trochanter and abduction to about 45°.

X-rays show a severely degenerate shoulder with a retained screw probably from an anterior bone block. He has a scar over delta pectoral area and also the Axilla of the discharging sinus within the Axilla. Swabs show no organism, pus cells only and otherwise inflammatory parameters are normal. He tells me his main complaint is pain in the shoulder and the discharging sinus although an irritation does not bother him unduly. An arthrodesis may be the only way forward for his shoulder but an infection would be required to be controlled. I would like to get a hold of his Royal Alexandra notes and I'll discuss his case with New Shoulder Surgeon in Paisley before taking this further.

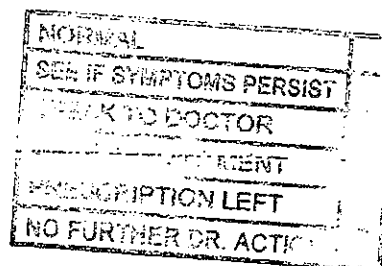

Your patient has claimed benefit due to incapacity and we now have to assess their capacity to perform work not just their own job using the Personal Capability Assessment procedures. People with certain severe medical conditions can be accepted as meeting the threshold of incapacity for benefit purposes without undergoing the Personal Capability Assessment or if the assessment has to be applied without undergoing a medical examination.

From the information you have provided on a medical statement (for example form Med 3) or information otherwise available to the medical officer, it appears that this may be such a case in order to advise the Department for Work and Pensions Decision Maker in accordance with the law the medical officer requires further factual information. We would be obliged if you would answer the medical officer's questions overleaf clearly indicating on a separate sheet any medical evidence that you think would be harmful to the patient's health. An example of what may be harmful information is a diagnosis that is not known to your patient such as malignancy, progressive neurological conditions or major mental illness.

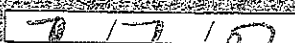

I saw Craig at our Out-Patient Clinic recently and the swab result from his left axilla shows that he has a moderate growth of staph aureus and a group B streptococcus. These appear to be sensitive to Flucloxacillin and Clarithromycin, if he is sensitive to Penicillin.

I would be grateful if you could give him treatment course of this and continue it until the discharge stops.

Thank you for referring Craig to our Clinic today. As you know he is a 38 year old gentleman who presented with a persistent discharging sinus on his left axilla. This has been happening constantly for the past 5 years after a flare up of what sounds to be an abscess in his axilla. He gives a history of an operation performed dislocating shoulders approximately 15 years ago, but cannot tell me the Surgeon. He tells me that he has pain that interferes with his daily life and he is bothered by the discharging sinus.

On examination, he has an extremely stiff shoulder with virtually no movement at the glenohumeral joint. He has a scar on his axilla and a small sinus and I have taken a swab from this today. He also has an anterior shoulder scar from his previous shoulder surgery.

X-ray show secondary OA which maybe due to infection or fracture. There is a screw near the articular surface of the shoulder.

I have taken some bloods including CRP and ESR to rule out any long standing infection in this area which, is most probably. I have also spoken to him about the possibilities of a fusion, but we would need to clear up the infection first. As Mr Hussain is not here today, we shall review him in 5 weeks time with the results of his blood results.

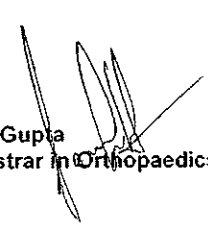
I reviewed your patient in our clinic today. His sinus appears to be healed and has not broken down. He gives a history of left shoulder stabilization 13 years ago in this hospital.

On examination, he has absolutely no movements in his shoulder joint. No distal neurological deficit.

X-ray of his left shoulder shows gross osteoarthritic changes in his left gleno-humeral joint. There was also the presence of a screw on the glenoid margin.

Mr Smith looked at his films and it was decided at that stage that because of repeated infections the screw has to be taken and then we may do a scan to decide on a further course of action. As we do not do shoulder surgery it was decided to refer him to Mr Hussain, Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon, Western Infirmary, Glasgow, who specialises in shoulder surgery.

Thank you asking me to see thirty eight year old Craig who I saw on behalf of Mr Smith presenting to us with pain and discharging sinus left axilla. In fact history dates back fifteen years when Craig sustained a dislocation of his left shoulder, which was reduced two or three days later under anaesthetic cover. However his shoulder became unstable following that and a Bankhart's repair was carried out in 1986. He was asymptomatic for four or five years but following that he started complaining of pain within the shoulder.

X-rays at that stage did show secondary osteoarthritis and also revealed a tracking sinus which had been explored by General Surgeons traversing as far as the shoulder.

Since then he has been discharging a greenish coloured fluid from his sinus every morning.

On examination today I could see a sinus at the centre of the axilla, which was not discharging at the moment as it was cleaned yesterday morning. Forward elevation was approximately 90° and rotations were restricted because of pain.

X-rays confirmed secondary osteoarthritis with query sequestrum at the inferior border of the acromium.

I have told him that as Mr Smith is not around in the clinic today I would have to discuss this problem with Mr Smith himself and have taken a note of his address and telephone number and we will get back to him next week when Mr Smith is around.

Mr Palmer presents with report of Frontal Headaches associated with television viewing. He has no personal history of eye problems, describes his general health as 'ok' and advises of present painkilling medication. There is no known family history of general medical conditions. Presenting visual acuity is good at R 6/5-2 L 6/5-1. A low degree of refractive error was found with slight resultant improvement in acuity. Muscle balance was normal for distance and the low amount of imbalance found for near appeared to be well compensated. Ophthalmoscopic examination shows clear ocular media and normal fundi appearance. Pupil reactions were present on a large initial pupil size and mild superficial conjunctival hyperaemia was noted.

Many thanks for asking me to see this 32 year old right handed gentleman. In 1986 I understand he had a stabilisation of his left shoulder performed under Mr Hay's care. He said everything seemed to be fine until about 2 years ago when he has been having a discharging sinus from his axilla which has been drained. He has developed increasing pain in the shoulder and an increasingly restricted range of motion. The wound in the front of his shoulder has remained quiescent but the axilla itself has a small discharging sinus.

On clinical examination this gentleman has a very limited range of shoulder movements. There is nearly no rotation. His radiographs reveal a most surprising picture of gross degenerative changes. This could be due to a septic joint. I note a screw in the inferior part of the glenoid from his previous stabilisation. There is also some flattening of the humeral head suggesting some avascularity.

Opinion: This gentleman has an extremely poor shoulder. I am not surprised he has significant problems. I think a CT arthrogram in the first instance would give me a bit more information with regard to the anatomy of the shoulder. He I think is going to require it explored, the screw to be removed and specimens taken to see if it is indeed infected. If it is we will need to get the infection settled as the first priority. Following that the harder decision will then be how to deal with his joint. Thanks for referring him.

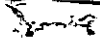

Craig Palmer presented as an emergency on the above date having experienced flu like symptoms and a pus like discharge from his tail-end. He was seen at my clinic last Friday and we arranged a course of Metronidazole. This was specifically for empirical treatment of what was thought to be perianal Crohn's disease. He ideally should take this course of Metronidazole for 8-12 weeks. We gather from the patient that he finished his initial course of Metronidazole and then his symptoms flared up.

On clinical examination he was able to tolerate full digital examination and was non tender with no evidence of any deep collection. There certainly is a pus like discharge with an indolent wound from his previous examination of the inter-sphincteric area. He still has a large chronic posterior midline fissure.

I would be grateful if you could arrange for him to have a continued course of Metronidazole. He should also have topical GTN cream 0.2% applied bd to the tail-end. He is going to return to see me at my Friday Clinic next week at 12 noon. We are also going to arrange an urgent MR! scan of his anal sphincter to try delineate any fistulous anatomy.

I now have Craig Palmer's full histology results to hand. Both the biopsies at the edge of the anal fissure and the prolapsed haemorrhoid ulcer confirm inflammatory changes but no evidence of granulomatous formation.

Since his irregular discharge he is continuing to be uncomfortable although I have to say it looked dramatically better today. Certainly on perianal examination his tail end has settled down very well. He was able to tolerate digital examination and a large fissure persists posteriorly. I have given him a hand written letter for Co-proxamol 2 tablets 4-6 hourly, Lactulose 10ml bd, GTN cream 0.2% topically bd and Metronidazole 400mg orally tds. In particular I have warned the patient not to take any alcohol while on the Metronidazole therapy. He will return to see me at my Friday clinic in one month's time.
