David last appeared at Dundee Children's Hearing on 14th June, 1984, when he was made subject to a home supervision requirement in terms of Section 44(1)(a) of the Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968. This followed a three week period of assessment in Burnside House, at the end of which it was felt that David and his family were in need of family therapy and ongoing social work support. David has remained at home to date, and now eleven months after his last Hearing appearance, it is necessary to review his situation and the appropriateness of the current supervision requirement.

I first became involved with David and his family at the beginning of July, when this case was transferred to me for supervision from Intake Worker, Steve Bowden. It was encouraging to learn that by this time there had already been a marked improvement in David's behaviour, and in the home atmosphere in general, since his return from Burnside House. Mr. and Mrs. Standish seemed pleased to be able to report a considerable change in David's attitude and his willingness to co-operate within the home, and they themselves appeared more relaxed and in control of their family situation. From the time of the last Hearing, the Standish family had been attending the Child Psychiatry Clinic at Dundee Royal Infirmary for therapy sessions with Dr. Will and over the next few months, they continued with these appointments, despite their expressed reservations about the value of family therapy. Whether or not David and his parents felt themselves to have benefited from Dr. Will's work with them during the period June - September of last year, there can be no doubt that relationships in the family have shown significant and sustained improvement throughout the past eleven months. It is perhaps an indication of the degree of stability and cohesion which the family have achieved that not only have they been able to experience a very enjoyable holiday abroad together (in October), and they have also coped

- (1) with a change of employment by Mr. Standish back to his trade of panel-beating, followed by his precipitous loss of the job because of lack of work and a subsequent period of unemployment (August - November);
- (2) with Mrs. Standish being admitted to hospital for an operation and then readmitted following complications (November - December). Throughout these difficult four months, David's behaviour remained relatively unproblematic and there were no signs of stress causing undue tension in family relationships.

This year to date, David and his parents have not experienced further serious trauma and they have continued to cope satisfactorily with any problems which have arisen. It is unfortunate to have to report that Mr. Standish has recently found out his job may once again be in jeopardy, but there appears to be no reason to believe that he and his family will not be able to continue to enjoy a stable life together, as they proved in the same circumstances last year.

As far as David's behaviour and progress outwith the home is concerned, he has over the past year shown some commitment to avoiding the kind of activities which contributed towards his initial referral to the Children's Hearing system. David's main interest is in football and he is currently a member of a competing Dundee team. He is otherwise not involved in any youth or community clubs and he appears to spend much of his spare time playing snooker or with his girlfriend (depending on the stage of their on/off relationship!). In the early months of David's supervision, I tried to interest him in becoming involved in a social work organised motor cycle group, feeling that this might be a possible direction in which he could channel his energies, but David eventually declined the opportunity to become a group member.

It has at least been a sign of the degree of control that David has over his own behaviour, that he has not, as feared in the past, become more involved in a delinquent peer sub-culture. David has in fact only been charged with one offence during his period of supervision: on 7th November, 1984, he was caught urinating in a common close. Although no formal action was pursued, his parents did not hesitate to make it clear to him that they did not approve of his behaviour. There was only one other known incident in which David was involved this past year. On 10th November, 1984, he was stopped by the Police in the Dura Street area, carrying a box containing bottles of alcohol. He was questioned by the Police, but was not charged, as it seems they accepted his statement that he agreed to carry the box for some youths in return for payment, and that the youths had run off at the appearance of the Police. Over the past year, there has otherwise never been any suggestion that David might be drinking alcohol again, or might be involved in offending.

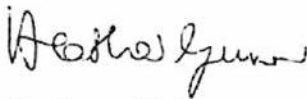
The report from Guidance Teacher, Mr. McArthur, from Morgan Academy will provide details of David's performance and conduct at school since the time of his last Hearing, to which I can add little. However, I would like to emphasise that it would seem David's behaviour has shown some improvement over the last school year. Despite lateness being an ongoing problem, there can be little doubt that the level and degree of difficulty he has presented in school compares favourably with his behaviour during the previous session. I would suggest that the fact David's parents have only been contacted twice this session (the second time with regard to late-coming) is a clear indicator that his behaviour has progressed in a positive way and that the school have been able to contain it appropriately.

ASSESSMENT & RECOMMENDATION

David is now 15 and has one further year to complete at school before leaving in summer 1986. It is my view he has shown over the past year that despite some persisting behavioural and attitudinal difficulties, he can function manageably within the school environment. At home and elsewhere, there have

been even greater signs of improvement both in David's own behaviour and in his relationships with his parents. Mr. and Mrs. Standish themselves have proved themselves capable of imposing appropriate controls over their son when necessary. As I feel that David's needs now appear to be adequately met within his own family and school systems, I would suggest that supervision is no longer relevant for him and that his requirement should therefore be terminated. I would add, however, that David and his parents can be reassured that further social work support would be available to them on a voluntary basis in the event of difficulties arising in the near future.
