Description: Ongoing claudication and leg pain.

Comment: This 50 year old chap with severe arterial disease would be grateful for an appointment for review in the vascular clinic.

He was being seen until he had an MI in 2016 and feels that 'nobody was interested' in his leg pain after he had the heart attack. I assured him this was not the case.

He has ongoing claudication and leg pain, and reports that when his beta blockers were recently increased this made things considerably worse.

In fact, he is unable to continue on the advised increased dose. Also, he reports that every few months when his leg pain gets bad, he stops his beta blockers altogether and this resolves the leg pain, albeit temporarily, and he generally restarts them in a month or so.

Many thanks for seeing him - in the interim I would be grateful for any advice regarding medication that may benefit him.

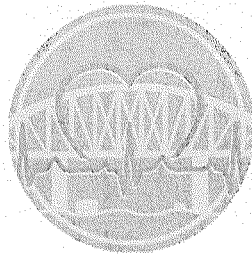

I wonder whether I could ask your advice regarding David Standish who I think is a well known patient to yourself.

Mr Standish attends the surgery today following a recent psychology appointment. The Psychologist has suggested medication for anxiety and we had a discussion regarding this today in the surgery.

My question to yourself is that Mr Standish tells me he previously had "Escitalopram" stopped due to GI issues he tells me following a scope.

My inclination would be to use an SSRI in his case but he is somewhat anxious about this and his stomach and I wondered what your thoughts on the matter are. He is currently on Zopiclone, Lansoprazole, GTN, Ramipril, Aspirin, Brilique, Bisoprolol, Salbutamol and Folic acid.

Many thanks for your letter regarding the above patient. Unfortunately, Esomeprazole is not recommended with Clopidogrel as it can reduce the antiplatelet effect. I have requested advice from our Pharmacist regarding this, however I am aware due to having consulted her recently regarding a patient with a similar medication clash that Lansoprazole is usually recommended instead of Omeprazole or Esomeprazole.

I am waiting for an update on other PPI's as one of those may be more suitable.

I thought I should just let you know.

You may remember this patient from your clinic in September. He presented today with his copy of your recent letter. He was keen to start a prescription for Diazepam, less keen to consider increasing his dose of Atorvastatin or adding in Ezetimibe.

Mr Standish is relatively new to this Practice but on perusal of his previous GP notes it is apparent that he had been on previous long term prescriptions of Diazepam for no obvious clinical reason that is indicated in the BNF nor indeed licensed. When he was put off the list of the prescribing doctor his next GP has weaned him off of this long term prescription.

It is with some surprise that I see a recommendation for this medication in this instance with no obvious clinical indication and Mr Cavendish's past medicinal history.

Mr Standish tells me that the abdominal pain that he experiences with medication is presumed to be "intestinal muscle spasm" as advised by Dr Dick. With this in mind I have prescribed Buscopan to see if this helps with his symptoms.

I hope this meets with your approval. If you have any other suggestions then I would be happy to consider them.

This episodic pain tends to settle for a few days then suddenly recur. I gave him an IM voltarol injection and his pain subsided over 24 hours. Urinalysis was clear. 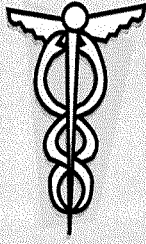
