The victim of the sexual offence was an adult female. Since the commencement of the Order there have been no issues in relation to his attendance or attitude. Stewart always presents as open and honest, with him working well with his supervising officer. Stewart has chosen to talk about his behaviour without encouragement with it evident that he feels a lot of regret and remorse for his involvement in the index offence. Stewart has considered the impact on the victim, with him worrying about how he has negatively impacted on her life. Stewart continually reports that he feels ashamed of his actions, and appears to consider the impact on others. He has spoken about how the offence has impacted on his marriage, with him feeling regretful for how he betrayed his wife and the upset he has caused her. Stewart also lost his employment as a result of his actions, which placed the family under great financial strain. However, he has returned to work in asbestos removal which has gave him much needed structure and routine. Of concern however was Stewart appearing to struggle to move on with his life. Although it is important to feel the regret and remorse that he does, it was impacting on his life on a daily basis with his mental health becoming affected. To this end, Stewart was encouraged to meet with is GP, which he was reluctant to do, as he didn't want to tell his GP what had happened. However, since returning to work there has been a noticeable difference in his presentation. Stewart appears to be handling this better now, through the support provided by his family and supervising officer. Significantly, Stewart has desisted from further offending/anti-social behaviour and reported no further incident, which was also supported by the absence of concern reports from partner agencies. Stewart successfully completed his unpaid work requirement without issue and maintained the required level of contact with the writer via Offender supervision, from inception to conclusion, and completely in keeping with the supervision requirement of his Order. He is going to try to find out about where he could complete the course. I advised that I would ask Julie Bennett to contact him on Monday to see if there is anywhere we can refer him to complete it as money is an issue for the family just now. I told Stewart that he appeared 'stronger' today compared to a few weeks ago when I met him for the 3 month review. with the gravity of he did and how this has impacted on the victim. Stewart appears to be handling this better now, through the support provided by his family and supervising officer. Stewart reports that some days he thinks about it a lot, which makes him anxious and stressed, while other days he is able to get through the day without considering this. Stewart reports that he feels that some days are better than others.

Stewart has recently returned to employment which is providing him with much needed structure and routine. Consequently, there has been a noticeable improvement in his confidence, with it apparent that being back at work is enable him to address issues at home due to the financial pressure they family were under following him losing his previous employment. Stewart advised that being busy at work also minimises the time spent thinking about his offence, which is helping his mental health.

Stewart's three month review was convened today. In attendance was Stewart, Team Leader Lucy Conner, Social Worker Julie Bennett and Offender Management Officer [REDACTED]

Since the commencement of the Order there have been no issues in relation to his attendance or attitude. Stewart always presents as open and honest, with him working well with his supervising officer. Although no official work has commenced in relation to the index offence, Stewart has chosen to talk about his behaviour without encouragement with it evident that he feels a lot of regret and remorse for his involvement in the index offence. Stewart has considered the impact on the victim, with him worrying about how he has negatively impacted on her life. Stewart continually reports that he feels ashamed of his actions, and appears to consider the impact on others. He has spoken about how the offence has impacted on his marriage, with him feeling regretful for how he betrayed his wife and the upset he has caused her. Stewart has also lost his employment as a result of his actions.

Of concern though is Stewart appearing to struggle to move on with his life. Although it is important to feel the regret and remorse that he does, it is impacting on his life on a daily basis with his mental health now affected. Stewart has been encouraged to meet with his GP in relation to this.

Stewart continues to attend unpaid work, with no issues in relation to conduct or attitude. He has 27 hours remaining which he will complete within the required timescale.

Meals are not provided and the placement should finish at 3:30pm. *(If we are unable to place you that day, you may be required to return the following day to commence your placement at 9am. Should this be the case you will be advised during interview and expected to make appropriate arrangements).*

5(a) Offending analysis - current
Analysis of current offence(s) Context: In an attempt to find a context for the index offence, Mr McFarlane discussed his situation prior to his involvement in the offence. Mr McFarlane said that he went to the store to buy some toys for his son. Also looking at the toys was today's victim [REDACTED]. Mr McFarlane claimed that he had never seen the victim before or spoke to her. He stated that he switched his phone's camera on and placed the phone in a basket which he placed on the floor next to where [REDACTED] was standing and started filming her underwear. When asked if he found [REDACTED] attractive, he said that he "wasn't thinking that way". He said that he got the idea to film her as he had watched a pornographic movie the night before and saw someone act in this manner. Mr McFarlane admits to acting in the manner accused.
What is the level of responsibility for the offence? Mr McFarlane takes responsibility for his actions saying that he has no-one to blame but himself. He further stated that he is angry with himself.

What is the level of planning?

Mr McFarlane claims that there was no planning on his part and that he acted in the "spur of the moment". He claims that he only thought about acting in this manner at the time of the offence.

What is the individual's attitude and insight into the offence(s)?

Mr McFarlane states that he was "definitely wrong" to behave in this manner. He appeared genuinely remorseful for his actions and feels as though he has let his family down. Mr McFarlane believes that he was selfish at the time of the offence as he was not thinking about the victim or his family.

Mr McFarlane is well aware of the losses he faces as a consequence of this offence. He believes that his marriage may be over and that he will lose his job. Mr McFarlane said that he had a good family life with his son doting on him.

Mr McFarlane was upset during the interview and it was clear that this matter has had a detrimental impact on him. I would suggest that his emotional state and losses he faces would serve as a deterrent for further offending.

What is the level of recognition by the offender on the impact/consequences of the offence(s) on the victim/community?

As noted above, Mr McFarlane appeared genuinely remorseful for his actions. He said that he feels "really bad" for what he put the victim through. Mr McFarlane believes that this offence would have had an impact on the victim psychologically and that she would have felt "invaded".

He was not without insight into the consequences of his actions and identified his family as indirect victims in this case. Mr McFarlane was apologetic for his actions and said that he feels powerless now as he does not know how to "sort" this matter.

5(b) Offending Analysis – Previous offending

What is the pattern/history of previous offending?

Scottish Criminal Records Office information indicates that Mr McFarlane has one previous conviction from 2012. At that time he was fined for a Criminal Justice and Licensing (Scotland) Act 2010 S38(1) offence.

The matter before today's Court is sexual in nature in that Mr McFarlane placed a mobile telephone within a shopping basket and placed the shopping basket under the victim's skirt to record footage of her underwear.

6. Personal and Social Circumstances Relevant to Offending Behaviour and Sentencing

Accommodation

Mr McFarlane usually resides with his wife of 2 years and his 8 year old son in an owner occupied house in the Sandyhills area of Glasgow. His wife however, has recently moved out as a consequence of this offence.

He is settled in his home and community and reports no issues in regards to his relationships with neighbours or others in the community.

Significant Relationships/Background

Mr McFarlane was brought up by both parents in the Ruchazie area of Glasgow. He has 4 brothers and 2 sisters. Mr McFarlane described his upbringing as "alright". No issues with drugs were reported for his parents. They were however, weekend drinkers and there were issues of domestic violence in his parent's relationship; violence he would witness. (Mr McFarlane would be most grateful if this is not read out on Court). Both parents are still alive and he remains close to both of them and his siblings. He is of the opinion that his formative years passed without major event or upheaval.

Mr McFarlane reports to experiencing no behavioural difficulties during his formative years and there is no record of any Social Work involvement during this period which would tend to support his claims. Departmental records indicate that the only contact between Mr McFarlane and the department prior to now was in 2004 when he claimed he was destitute.

Mr McFarlane left the family home aged 16 and has been self-sufficient ever since.

With regards to other significant relationships, Mr McFarlane has a 29 year old daughter from a relationship he started when he was at school. He has not seen his daughter since she was a child. As noted above he has an 8 year old son with his wife. Although they have only been married for 2 years, they have been together for 20 years. Mr McFarlane is concerned that this offence may cause his marriage to end. He was very upset during interview and it was evident that he wants to continue in his marriage.

Training/Education/Employment

Mr McFarlane attended mainstream schools. He claims that he was suspended on a few occasions for "stupid things". No expulsions were reported, nor were there reportedly any issues with his attendance. Mr McFarlane is dyslexic and left school aged 16 with no qualifications.

Following his departure from school he gained employment in the construction industry. He worked in the building trade intermittently for a number of years.

For the past 11 years he has worked as a porter for the NHS. He is currently employed in the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, however has been suspended since January from his post as a consequence of this matter. Mr McFarlane expects his employment to be terminated.

Mr McFarlane would appear to have a positive attitude towards employment given he has mostly always been in work.

Financial Circumstances

Mr McFarlane continues to receive his £380 weekly wages. He has no outstanding fines, however he has credit card debts totalling £2,500 which he is currently repaying. Mr McFarlane does not have any savings and has a disposable income of £50 per week.

Health

Mr McFarlane generally benefits from good physical and psychological health. Two weeks prior to our interview he discovered a lump in his groin. He subsequently had blood tests taken and has to go for an ultra sound examination.

With regards to his psychological health, Mr McFarlane reports no current or previous involvement with psychiatric services nor has his General Practitioner treated him for any emotional or mental problems. Additionally, he has never experienced suicidal thoughts or self-harmed.

This offence however, has had a major impact on his mental health as he has difficulty sleeping and is worried about the outcome. He is also concerned that his marriage may be over as his wife has recently moved out of the family home whilst she comes to terms with the offence. Mr McFarlane claims that they are trying to work through this matter.

Leisure/Recreation

Mr McFarlane is not a member of any group or organisation. He enjoys attending football games and swimming with his son.

Drugs/Alcohol use

Mr McFarlane's drug use stated when he was 13 years old with his drug of choice being Cannabis. He continued to use this drug on a daily basis throughout his life, only stopping around Christmas last year.

Mr McFarlane also previously used LSD, Cocaine and Ecstasy. He used these drugs on a recreational basis and it has been a number of years since he last used these substances.

With regards to alcohol, Mr McFarlane said that he used to drink on a social basis at the weekends. He claims that his usage was non-problematic. He stopped drinking alcohol around Christmas time as he was angry with himself for committing today's offence.

7. Risk Assessment

Risk factors

Specific Risk Factors Identified by Risk Assessment present for the offender are as follows:

- No Risk Factors Identified

Protective factors

Mr McFarlane's accommodation appears stable and he has no interest in abusing substances. He has some family supports.

Analysis from risk assessment

Pattern:

Scottish Criminal Records Office information indicates that Mr McFarlane has one previous conviction from 2012. At that time he was fined for a Criminal Justice and Licensing (Scotland) Act 2010 S38(1) offence.

Nature:

The matter before today's Court is sexual in nature in that Mr McFarlane placed a mobile telephone within a shopping basket and placed the shopping basket under the victim's skirt to record footage of her underwear.

Seriousness:

Mr McFarlane's actions would no doubt have caused emotional and psychological harm towards his victim. This offence appears to suggest significant impulsiveness on Mr McFarlane's part. Given the nature of today's matter, I would suggest that the seriousness of his offending has increased.

Likelihood:

Mr McFarlane is a 47 year old male with 1 previous conviction, suggesting that he can generally live within the confines of the law.

Whilst Mr McFarlane scored a low risk of re-offending in the above noted risk assessment tool, there has to be consideration given to the nature of the index offence and therefore it could be suggested that there is the likelihood of further offending.

Serious Harm/Imminence

The Risk Management Authority has defined this as "a risk of harmful behaviour which is life-threatening and/or traumatic and from which the victim's recovery, whether physical or psychological, can be expected to be difficult or impossible". Through involvement in this matter, Mr McFarlane will no doubt have caused the victim to experience a degree of psychological harm and trauma. No physical harm appears to have been caused by his actions.

If indeed there was no planning involved, the spontaneity and impulsive nature of Mr McFarlane's behaviour on this occasion would be particularly concerning.

With reference to the [REDACTED] assessment tool, Mr McFarlane scores as a medium risk of re-offending. [REDACTED]

Suitability for community disposal/public protection issues

Taking into account Mr McFarlane's circumstances, his offending and the nature of today's matter (non-sexual contact), I would suggest that he is suitable for a community based disposal. The victim in today's case was unknown to Mr McFarlane and his behaviour could be viewed as precarious, therefore it could be suggested that there are some public protection issues in regards to Mr McFarlane.

Mr McFarlane would be subject to Multi Agency Public Protection Arrangements (MAPPA). MAPPA is a set of arrangements which the police service, local authority, prison service, health service and others are statutorily obliged to operate on a multiagency basis, with the objective of protecting the public from the risks that may be posed by sex offenders.

8. Review of Relevant Sentencing Options

Custody

The imposition of a custodial sentence at this stage may expose and integrate Mr McFarlane within a more serious and established offender group, and given his limited offending history, the Court may wish to consider the feasibility of community-based sentencing at this juncture.

Community Payback Order - Supervision Requirement:

The Supervision requirement for a Community Payback Order was discussed with Mr McFarlane as have the responsibilities that such an Order would bestow on him. Mr McFarlane indicated that he would comply with a supervision requirement.

If a Supervision Requirement were to be imposed I would propose the following Initial Case Management Plan in respect of Mr McFarlane:

- Throughout the course of the Order strict monitoring of Mr McFarlane's compliance with the conditions of the Order, in line with National Outcomes and Standards.
- Throughout the course of the Order, Mr McFarlane would be engaged in offence-focussed work in relation to developing his consequential thinking and decision making. Victim awareness and victim empathy would also feature throughout the course of his Order.
- Mr McFarlane would be supported with his employment needs and referred to a local employability organisation if his current employment is terminated.

Although Mr McFarlane does not have many issues which could be targeted via a Supervision requirement, I believe he could benefit from such a disposal as this would give the department the opportunity to discuss the offence and consequences of his actions.

Community Payback Order – Programme:

I liaised with Claire Hughes from Clyde Quay as to the suitability for Mr McFarlane to attend the sex offender programme Moving Forward Making Changes (MFMC) either as part of a group or in one to one work. Ms Hughes states that given Mr McFarlane's circumstances/offending he would be unsuitable for the Clyde Quay group work programme. She stated that any focussed work could be carried out with Mr McFarlane on a one to one basis as part of a Community Payback Order with a Supervision requirement.

Community Payback Order - Unpaid Work:

The terms and conditions of Unpaid Work were outlined to Mr McFarlane who agreed to comply with this disposal.

I liaised with Margaret Henvey, Unpaid Work Supervisor who assessed Mr McFarlane as suitable for this disposal.

If the Court deemed this a suitable disposal as part of "other activity" Mr McFarlane could engage with a local employability organisation (if unemployed).

Fine:

Mr McFarlane has agreed to pay a fine.

Restriction of Liberty Order

The requirements of a Restriction of Liberty Order were explained to Mr McFarlane who advised that he would consent to this disposal.

A Restriction of Liberty Order would place limitations on Mr McFarlane's movements and might well also help him to avoid the circumstances associated with offending. This disposal would also provide him with an ongoing reminder of the requirement to avoid further transgressions.

Mr McFarlane claims that he does not have any commitments other than "the school run" currently. When taking his son to school he will leave his home at 8:30 am, returning at 9.15 am and he will depart from home at 2.30 pm, returning home an hour later when collecting his son from school Monday to Friday.

9. Conclusion

Mr McFarlane co-operated with the preparation of this report. He was open during interview and was visibly upset. It was clear that this offence has had a major impact on Mr McFarlane.

Mr McFarlane faces a number of losses as a result of this matter, as he will probably lose his job and his marriage may be in trouble. He appeared remorseful during interview and although some of his remorse was due to the losses he faces, he also appeared upset by the trauma and emotional pain he believes he caused the victim.

Mr McFarlane comes to the attention of the Courts for the second time. His first conviction which was disorderly in nature and was disposed of 7 years ago. He is therefore not involved in a pattern of offending. Despite his limited offending record and current circumstances, I would suggest that he could benefit from being supervised in the community as a period of supervision would give the department and Mr McFarlane the opportunity to discuss the offence. I would therefore respectfully request the Court to consider disposing of this case by means of a Community Payback Order with a Supervision requirement attached.

The above information is presented in the hope that it may be of assistance to the Court.

During this initial visit it became apparent that the subject had disclosed to his wife he had committed an offence but not the nature of the offence just seconds before police attended at his door. Both parties were then spoken too within the living room where the subject briefly explained the nature of his offence to his wife who was shocked. He then told her would explain the circumstances fully once the police left.

The subject was then advised of his requirements regarding his sexual offences notification requirements and that information would be shared with relevant interested agencies. He was also advised that police would revisit him over the next few days.

Given the nature of the subject offending and his victim being an adult female there is no immediate concern regarding him residing with his wife and son and this report has been submitted for information purposes.

The perpetrator was subsequently place on the sex offenders register and during an initial home visit it was revealed that he lived at home with his wife and 8 year old son. There are no obvious concerns given the nature of the perpetrators offence and this report has been submitted for information purposes.
