On Wednesday night at 12.30 a.m. we received a call from Mathlian. Bill knew who it was but because she was so upset couldn't make out what was wrong and advised her to come up to Glasclune. On arrival she was told she could sleep on the spare bed in the sitting room but she was still very upset. Next morning I asked her what had happened and she said all that was wrong was that she'd locked herself out of Colin Thomson's house by mistake.

—3rd Party Information—

It had been arranged that on Thursday afternoon Mathlian, Colin Mrs. Rose S/W and I would meet to discuss what was going to happen. Mrs. Rose and I had a short discussion first and were about to make our way over to the cottage when Mathlian appeared saying that Colin had asked to get away from work early and therefore couldn't come to the meeting. I thought this was rather suspicious so after a while 'phoned Colin myself. He answered but as soon as he knew it was from a call box he hung up. Presumably he thought it was Mathlian. So we decided to take a run up to his house to see him. When we arrived we could see through the window that he was sitting watching T.V. but as soon as he realised it was Mathlian he hid behind the curtain. We found Mathlian's stuff in a polythene bag on the doorstep with a note saying that the police had informed him that Mathlian was a run-away. We couldn't understand this as there was no apparent reason for Woodfield contacting the police. Mathlian was extremely upset naturally and she and I went back to the car. Meantime another car approached Colin's door - his friend coming to collect him for golf. Colin came out of his house and put his things in the car and Mrs. Rose introduced herself, asking if she could have a word with him. He refused, got into the car and drove off.

We all came back to Glasclune and Mrs. Rose made a few calls. Woodfield hadn't 'phoned the police so obviously Colin had used this as an excuse to get rid of Mathlian. We then spoke with Mathlian and decided that the only thing to do was for her to go back to Woodfield. Mrs. Rose gave her a lift.

I 'phoned Mathlian this evening and she sounded as if she was on the way to recovery.

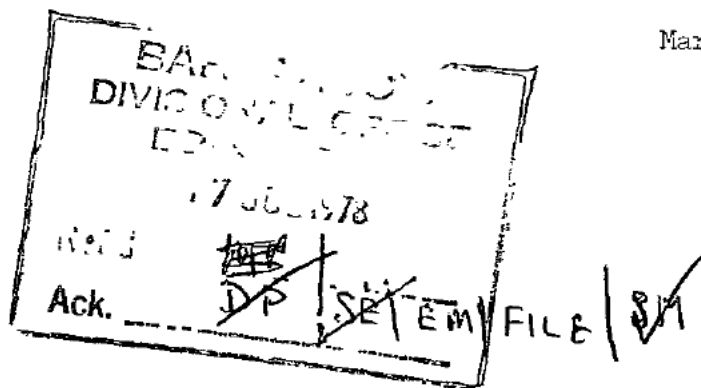

Mathlian was admitted to Woodfield Hostel, Edinburgh on Friday, 23rd June. She seemed to be settling in fine until the weekend of 8th-10th July when she visited here for the weekend. On the Monday morning the housemother from Woodfield 'phoned asking when Mathlian was coming back. Seemingly she had told Woodfield that she'd be staying at Glasclune for the weekend and was to have returned on the Sunday night, hence the 'phone call.

I said I had an idea that she could be at Colin ^{—3rd Party Information—} cottage which he has to himself. I went up and found Mathlian in. She said she hadn't settled in Woodfield, wasn't going back there and from now on would be staying with Colin. I contacted Woodfield and let them know what was happening and also informed Mrs. Rose, S/W.

There has since been a meeting set up for Thursday, 13th July between Mrs. Rose, Mathlian and myself.

Since Mathlian left school last summer she has had four jobs, three of which she lost through either not showing up on time or her general untidiness.

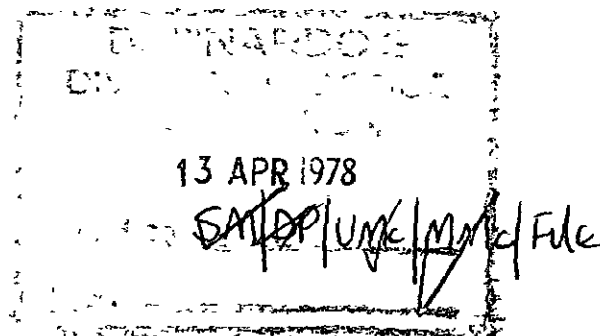
During her periods of unemployment Mathlian became very lazy around the house and was scapegoated by the other children. So in January of this year everyone was pleased to hear that Mathlian had gained a place on a ten week course at Stevenson College on "Caring for People". This included lectures on basic hygiene and first aid and day release to the Royal Edinburgh Hospital. Unfortunately, while at the Hospital Mathlian became over-friendly with a group of resident C.S.Vs who made life in the quarters very attractive to Mathlian. There seemed to be no limits set on them. Comparing their life style with her own, Mathlian's life at Glasclune looked very dull and boring and this led to her not coming in some nights. It seemed at one point that the only time members of staff spoke to Mathlian was to confront her with her behaviour. Some of the children also made life pretty miserable for her.

In February Mathlian decided to withdraw from the Course which meant that again she became lazy and lay around the house until the beginning of March when she started working as a waitress in a local hotel. Although this involves hard work and long hours she seems to be enjoying it.

What worries us now is Mathlian's future. She is extremely unhappy at Glasclune, has no friends here and some of the children are making life awkward and miserable for her.

Mathlian is ready to leave here and in my opinion the sooner the better for her sake.

Report on Mathlian Graham

Sunday, 23rd April, 1978

Mathlian has been working in a local hotel for the past five weeks. She is obviously liked by the owner and seems to get on well with the other staff. There are chalets available for the waitresses and it was agreed that Mathlian should move into one on a month's trial basis so she moved in on Friday, 21st April. Before she left Glasclune it was agreed that I would see her twice a week for supervision (Tuesdays and Thursdays). Talking to Mathlian and the hotel owner it seemed all was going well.

However, on Sunday 23rd April there was a 'phone call from the hotel. Mathlian was drunk and quite hysterical and we were asked if someone from here could go along. Bill Craig, Deputy Superintendent, and I went along to find Mathlian screaming. She could be heard in the street. We were taken to her chalet where she was lying in bed with her eyes fixed on the ceiling screaming that she saw the devil, that he was after her, etc. It was a horrific sight. When she knew we were there and I was holding her she shouted that she only wanted to come home to Glasclune, there and then. Bill Craig 'phoned the doctor but he wouldn't come out as there wasn't really much point as he could do nothing.

We dressed Mathlian and brought her home in the van. The only place for her to sleep was the sofa in the staff flat. As soon as she saw it she fell on it and flaked out completely and apart from the odd scream in her sleep, spent a comfortable night there. I made up a bed on the floor for myself.

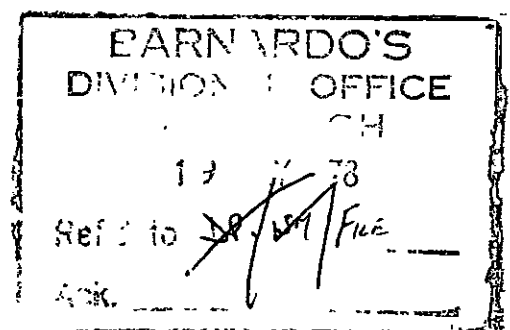
In the morning Mathlian felt terribly embarrassed and not too good physically. I had to tell her about the night's events as she couldn't remember much except that she'd been sitting in a car swigging whisky from a bottle with a man in Haddington.

At this point Mr. Falconer and I were making arrangements for Mathlian to come back to Glasclune as we felt certain that she'd lost her job and therefore her chalet. However, Mr. Falconer made arrangements for Mathlian to see the hotel owner in the evening. She asked me to go along with her. When we got there he just asked how she felt about the previous night. She answered that she was ashamed of herself and very, very sorry. He offered her the job back on the condition that she didn't drink any more.

This experience taught Mathlian one thing: it was obvious that she couldn't cope on her own outside. So we packed her cases and brought her home again. She started back at work the following day, travelling there and back from Glasclune.

It is now evident that Mathlian is going to need a more protective setting and the application for Woodfield Hostel is being chased up.

21. 2.78

Today's exercise for Mathlian was to 'phone and terminate her Course at Stevenson College. She did this.

22. 2.78

I didn't manage to see Mathlian today.

23. 2.78

My session with Mathlian started with me telling her that these sessions are very different from others we've had in the past and therefore she must be completely honest with me. She promised to do so.

We spoke about the Course for a while and Mathlian still sees no reason for her being asked to leave. I put forward a few suggestions for her - e.g. perhaps her behaviour in the C.S.V. quarters left a lot to be desired. She rejected any suggestions completely but as we talked more about the set-up of the Church Centre and C.S.V. quarters, little things came out e.g. that her friends and she had come in drunk at night and that Mathlian had been so drunk that she had had to be carried to bed. There were also times when she and Cathie had boys in Cathie's room. I kept picking her up on what she said, explaining that these things could easily have been interpreted as making a nuisance of herself.

But what Mathlian does think of as a good reason is that the Charge Nurse of the Church Centre was having an affair with one of the C.S.Vs and Mathlian kept stumbling over them in compromising positions so when she and Cathie were working with them in the Unit Cathie and she got all the running about to do while this couple sat about and talked all day long. Cathie didn't like this idea at all and set up cheek to the Charge Nurse and I suspect Mathlian did the same although she denies it.

From this we went on to talk about her relationship with Owen (They are waiting on an engagement ring from a catalogue.) Mathlian became very subdued and said: "I feel very mixed up. I've sat down and thought about him, marriage and all that goes with it. I really don't love Owen." After a lengthy discussion we came to the conclusion that to tell Owen now would be better than leaving it and trying to tell him when they were making wedding arrangements. So, as Owen intended coming down tonight, this would be as good an opportunity as any.

From this Mathlian took the lead and wanted to tell me about the big problem she could tell nobody about a year past Christmas. I told her she was only to tell me if she wanted to. She did and prepared me for a shock. Seemingly she had a miscarriage after a two month pregnancy. Judy helped her over these difficulties as nobody here would have understood. She told Owen and he immediately disowned her, gave her a kicking and went out with someone else. She was surprised to learn that I was not too shocked as I remembered her having been in bed ill. We then went on to talk about birth control etc. but Mathlian doesn't see why she should concern herself with this now as all sexual relations between her and Owen have ceased. We sat and had a general discussion after this and agreed to meet at 6.00 p.m. on Friday.

During this evening while I was off duty Mathlian came over to the cottage and asked for a cup of tea and a blether. She had finished with Owen and she was upset with him because he had hit her - she sported a red mark below her eye.

24. 2.78

Tonight our discussion centred round what happened last night. Mathlian was greatly excited about her friend, Cathie, coming to stay O/N.

25. 2.78

Today Mathlian has been as high as a kite with Cathie here. This afternoon Owen arrived demanding a record he'd loaned Mathlian. I asked him about Thursday and he denied hitting her. Later I got Mathlian and Owen in the office and asked for the truth about what happened. Owen told his version of the story - he had gone to push Mathlian but her face got in the way and he'd hit her face. This was all because Mathlian teased him with a letter she was writing to a boy. To top it all Mathlian agreed with everything Owen said.

This evening Mathlian left here to go to a party with the residents and staff of Humble Farm. A staff member 'phoned up at 9.20 p.m. to say that Mathlian hadn't arrived. They 'phoned again at 11.40 p.m. to say that she had just arrived. Seemingly she and Cathie had visited Mr. Graham.

26. 2.78

The arrangement with Mathlian was that she should be back at 5.00 p.m. at the latest in time for tea. Ofcourse she didn't return on time but 'phoned at 6.00 p.m. to ask if she might stay another night at Humble Farm. I refused her permission on the grounds that she can't cope with the freedom. According to Mathlian I'm very mean and nasty. I spoke to a Team leader at Humble and she said she'd put Mathlian out tonight. Mathlian agreed to be back for 10.45 p.m. and finally appeared, via bedroom window, at 11.50 p.m.

27. 2.78

When I spoke to Mathlian this morning she completely lost her head when I told her she couldn't go to Humble Farm next weekend. This resulted in her leaping about in a real temper, shouting and swearing as I've never seen her do before. I had to be very hard on her and keep tripping her up on everything she said.

She said she'd been to her father's on Saturday night before she went to the party but couldn't see why it had anything to do with anyone here. I kept trying to explain about contracts, etc. and even suggested to her that perhaps Eric Falconer would be able to explain it all better to her but she couldn't see the point as he would just take my side.

After our meeting Eric Falconer 'phoned Mr. Graham to confirm that Mathlian had been to see him. She hadn't. When confronted with this Mathlian denied it at first but then admitted having been up at Morningside for a few hours with the hope of seeing 2 boys but of course they didn't turn up.

Tomorrow Mathlian and I have an appointment with Mrs. Babiker when we shall discuss the weekend's events.

This morning Mathlian had an appointment with Mrs. Babiker at Rillbank, which I also attended. She has given Mathlian work to do each day - mental exercises really - which require Mathlian to sit down and think about why she has been asked not to return to the Royal Edinburgh Hospital. According to Mathlian she doesn't have the foggiest idea, but Mrs. Babiker is sure that if Mathlian could literally sit, think and talk it over with someone the picture would soon become very clear.

The exercise for Friday was supposed to have been Mathlian contacting the College Tutor to let her know whether or not she wants to try again on this course. Mathlian did not do this and unfortunately didn't tell anyone here about it. Mrs. Babiker told Mathlian that this was to be a condition of her seeing Mathlian and if she didn't do the exercises, etc. Mrs. Babiker would terminate due appointments.

Besides other things Mathlian spoke of David ^{—3rd Party Information—} apparent hate for her and how everyone here is trying to push her out into a hostel. It had to be pointed out to her that David and she were really only at loggerheads because they are both in the same boat - hanging about the house all day, no job prospects and knowing they're going to have to find alternative accommodation soon. She saw the sense, or at least seemed to, in what I was saying but would not budge from her decision to simply ignore him.

Mathlian then went on to speak of her future plans. All she wants is: 1. Woodfield 2. Marry Owen ^{—3rd Party Information—} 3. 2 children and 4. most important: a happy marriage like the Lenks.

At one point Mathlian was close to tears when Mrs. Babiker asked her if ever in her time at Glasclune she has felt totally unsupported. She said: "Yes. A year past Christmas." I racked my brains to think what it was she was talking about but couldn't come up with anything. Mathlian felt she still could not divulge the problem. She seemingly had to sort it out with a friend up the road.

The meeting finished with Mathlian promising to do all that Mrs. Babiker had asked of her. When we arrived back at Glasclune Mathlian 'phoned the Course tutor and I have made arrangements to see her every day this coming week. An appointment has been made for Mathlian and me to see Mrs. Babiker at Glasclune on Monday, 27th February.

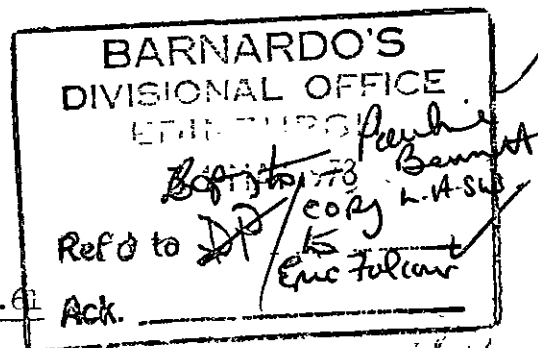

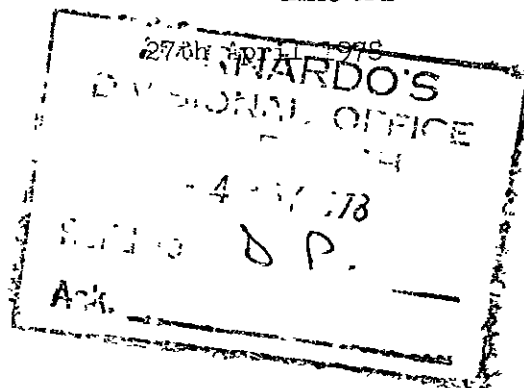

We reviewed Mathilian on Wednesday at Glasclune, and found it very difficult to get a clear picture of her social functioning. The staff at Glasclune presented two pictures of Mathilian - one of her inability to cope with even basic social functions, like use of money, personal care, hygiene, cooking, etc., and the other of a young lady who is able to cope with the rigours and aggressions of life in general.

As Mathilian wishes, in the very near future, to return to Winford, she is now 16, we felt that some hostel-type accommodation where she could continue to learn would be appropriate with this end in mind. We are meeting Ron Beasley from Woodfield to investigate a possible place in their new work in girls' unit.

While trying to put everything together of how to protect Mathilian to Woodfield, we became aware that we did not really know what Mathilian's capabilities were, and wondered if you might consider referring her to a psychologist in your department who might be able to help us recognise more clearly what her needs are in relation to developing her social skills.

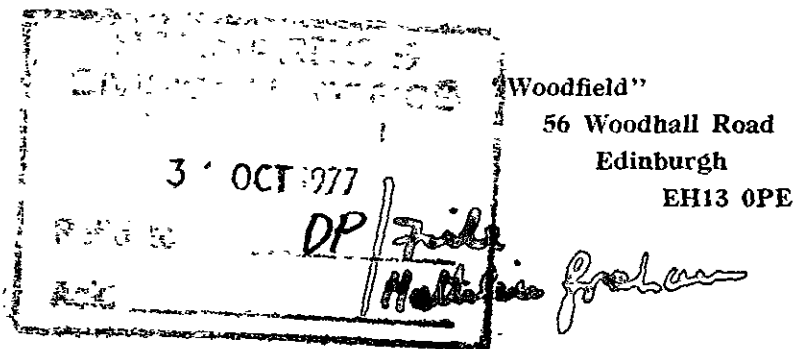

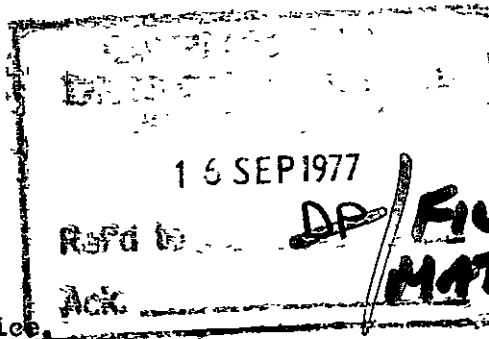

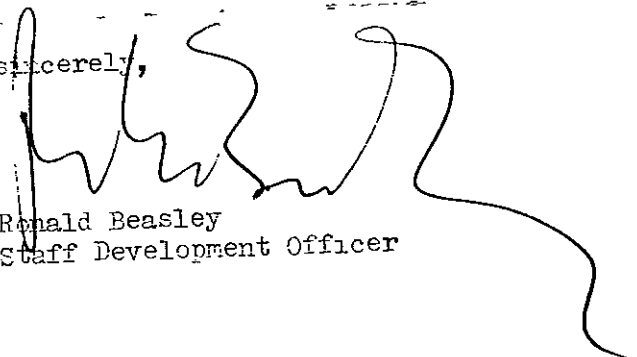

Woodfield - New Unit for working Adolescent Girls

Just over a year ago Woodfield opened a further Unit which was primarily concerned to provide care for adolescent girls who would be able to form a community core group into which we would be able to receive a small number of other girls needing short term and crisis care.

We are now making an additional development in our programme of diversification. This will be to resume again particular concern for young working girls, which was discontinued some years ago. We are setting aside a self-contained cottage within the campus at the Convent in Woodhall Road to accommodate up to six working girls. The cottage has a pleasant outlook with some privacy. It contains a large lounge, a kitchen, a utility room, two bedrooms, a toilet and bathroom on the ground floor. On the upper floor are three bedrooms, a toilet and a bathroom, with a bed-sitting room for staff use.

We will be able to offer accommodation to girls of 16 years of age and over. It will be designed for those who are seen primarily as inadequate rather than with disturbed acting-out behaviour. They would be girls requiring socialisation, assistance with weekly budgeting, and needing to live in a supportive environment. Hopefully the majority would be working, though we would not exclude from consideration girls involved in full-time further education. The task of this Unit within Woodfield would be to assist the girls to establish themselves so that with some independence they would move on to individual accommodation after a period of six, twelve or eighteen months.

The chores and running of the Unit would be undertaken by the residents. There would be an intention to provide sensitive and unobtrusive counselling, and it would be hoped that those resident would share with the staff the making of decisions about life together in the Unit. We would reckon that the contribution of religion to creating acceptable standards would be important.

Woodfield has appointed Miss K. Williamson to be housemother of this Unit. Other staff will be available as required.

Referrals for this Unit are expected from Social Work Departments and Voluntary Agencies. It would be expected that the normal funding arrangements would apply through the fees as agreed from time to time by C.O.S.L.A. Working girls would also be expected to make a realistic contribution towards board and accommodation. Applications for places would go through the present normal procedures at Woodfield, and should be addressed to the Co-ordinator.

With the present unsatisfactory high level of homeless young people in the south of Scotland, it is hoped that this provision will be a small step in helping to provide a particular range of accommodation at present in short supply.

We hope to be in a position to commence receiving applications by late August 1977, with the Unit itself actually opening early in September. Further enquiries should be addressed to the Staff Development Officer.

RESCINDING OF RESOLUTION ASSUMING PARENTAL RIGHTS

Margaret, Mathlian, Alexandra and Charles Graham
children of Mrs. Margaret Edmond (formerly Graham)

Your memo ref: DPB/CH/SW/3 dated 14 March refers. I have discussed this case with Mr. McEwan, Divisional Director, Mrs. Ross, Senior Social Worker of this office, Mrs. Lowson, the Social Worker employed by Dr. Barnardo's, who has the main involvement in this case. Mr. McEwan has suggested I write to you direct before replying to the Solicitors.

Mrs. Lowson was advised of this recent approach by Mrs. Edmond and has now had the opportunity to discuss the matter fully with the three younger children Mathlian, Alexandra and Charles. None of these children wish to live with mother at this point in time and particularly while she is living with Mr. Edmond. Having regard to the ages of the children, particularly Mathlian, I would suggest that we have to respect their wishes and not rescind the resolution. However, Mrs. Lowson suggests, and I would agree with her, that responsibility for this decision should not be seen to rest with the children.

The reasons for their decision and our wish to support this are perhaps clear on examination of Mrs. Edmond's performance as a mother, during the present period of care. Throughout that time, she has visited the children at the Children's Home at most 4 times in any one year, usually after encouragement by the Social Worker. The children have visited her on a similar or less number of occasions and since 1974 have been expressing their present view that they do not wish to visit when Mr. Edmond is around. Looking at the last twelve months as an illustration of the level of contact, Mrs. Edmond has visited the children on two occasions on 26 April 1976 and 2 May 1976 and Mathlian and Sandra spent a day at her home on 26 June 1976. Phone contacts are not recorded individually but are said by staff at the Home to be very few. The eldest child, Margaret, did go to live with her mother in September 1976 but after some six weeks, this arrangement broke down and since November she has lived with her Grandmother.

Mrs. Edmond's relationship with her husband may have stabilised insofar as they do not appear to have separated in the last twelve months and the department does not have recent examples of the criminal and/or bizarre behaviour of Mr. Edmond which formed part of the grounds of the resolution. However, I would suggest that Mrs. Edmond's failure to maintain regular or meaningful contact with the children constitutes a continuing failure to discharge the obligations of a parent and therefore the Resolution assuming Parental Rights should not be rescinded.

A point/.....

A point about which I would seek clarification is the manner of the Solicitors approach in this case. He seems to propose raising an action in the Court of Session referring back to the Divorce. Should he not in fact be preparing to challenge in the Sheriff Court, the Resolution under Section 16?

In view of the foregoing, I would suggest that the Council would wish to object to the mother's request and append a draft of the reply I would propose sending to the Solicitors. Can you please advise as to whether you approve this reply?

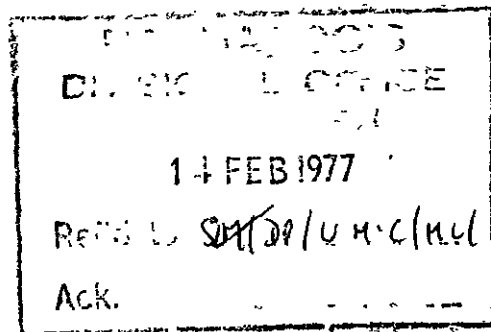

History

The second of five children, Mathlian spent her first four years at home in a parental atmosphere of struggle against financial and emotional difficulties.

Aged four - Mathlian was boarded out temporarily in Gullane, and transferred to the care of a foster mother where she remained for five months. This was an unhappy and unsettled placement for her, she indicating distress by wetting and soiling - eventually moved to Barnardo's, Ravelrig, to join her brother Charles, when she settled and her symptoms disappeared.

Aged six - Mathlian and Margaret were transferred to Glasclune until she was eight, when all the children were restored to parents for the birth of their sister Marion.

During the following year the home gradually disintegrated. Increasing financial problems together with parents' inability to cope with the children resulted in the parent's separation.

During this time, Mathlian, aged eight carried a great deal of mothering responsibility for the younger children.

In August 1970 the four older children were readmitted to Glasclune. Father and Marion moved to live with his sister, and mother returned to her own family.

Mother

A small, lively woman, youthful appearance. The youngest of five in a problem family. Witnessed her father's suicide when 14. Always needed a paternal protector in her marriage, which eventually broke down under the strain of caring for five children plus an immature, unstable husband.

She has for several years gone through several relationships surrounded by crises and indecision.

Two years ago she married a man older than herself who fulfils her needs for a somewhat harsh parental figure. The marriage is stable in that it meets their mutual needs, but it confirms Mrs Edmonds in her adolescent role, which conflicts with her growing adolescent children. Any attempts to restore them to their mother's care has failed, as she cannot maintain a separateness between herself and them enough to care for them consistently, but only responded/

responded on her own impulses which rivalled and reflected theirs. Mathlian writes to her mother, sees her rarely. She dislikes and fears her mother's husband, who she alleges sexually assaulted her on one occasion.

I think that Mathlian's understanding of her mother's position has grown, and she has transferred some of the anger towards her mother to George Edmonds.

There is still an element of self-blame around for Mathlian, and sadly she sees herself resembling her mother in certain aspects, for instance her seeking love and affection in a desperate, promiscuous way.

Father

Youngest of five children - strongly attached to his mother, who died in 1969. Like his wife, he sought parenting within marriage, and when unfulfilled he became erratic and irresponsible, drinking heavily and being involved in persistent petty crime. Care and control of the children was impulsive and sporadic; Mr Graham, like his wife, maintained an intermittent contact with the children, which was always surrounded by tantalising and unfulfilled promises about the restoration of the family.

Of all the children, Mathlian's attachment to, and need for, affection and approval from her father was the most pronounced.

Parenting parents at an early age, along with unmet basic emotional needs, has left Mathlian with an insatiable need for love and recognition, part of which is satisfied in a situation where others need her.

In this sense her ego is fragile and dependent on frequent affirmation of her usefulness, resulting in a tendency to self abnegation and general exploitation by others.

Mathlian's sense of identity fluctuates. Her real position in her peer group is often that of the victim. Her naivete and frankness occasionally endears her to others, but her lack of self esteem leads her contemporaries to attack her vulnerability in defence of their own.

One of Mathlian's strengths is her core of optimism, which though often rooted in fantasy helps her to enter with hope into new settings, jobs, friends, etc.

I feel that the recent period of intensive psychological assessment has boosted Mathlian's belief in herself and her capacities. She has now finished a two-year relationship with a boyfriend which she has stuck through lack of any other alternatives, and this move seems to represent a Mathlian who is capable with help of asserting her own needs.

Conclusion

I feel that Mathlian is ready to move out of her present environment where she has been nurtured but where recognition of any change in her will be blocked by her peer group who see her in a fixed role.

My recommendation is that she lives as one of small community where there is opportunity for individual counselling and continuous realistic affirmation of Mathlian's attributes.

In this I hope she may be offered a place at Woodfield hostel and continue to attend the weekly after-care group to maintain contact with family news and friends.

3.2.78 - Phone call from Donna Ferrier to say Mathlian had phoned from a house in grounds of Craig House to say she was not returning to Glasclune as there was a party on to-night.

As Mrs. Barberkerr (Psychologist) who is seeing Mathlian had expressed concern that the group of young CSV's with whom Mathlian was friendly, Donna wondered what we should do.

We decided that as she was over 16 we would leave things to-night, but I would go round tomorrow morning and see "Kathy" - one of the CSV's named.

Checked with David Pomfret that he did not think we should do more.

4.2.78 - Checked at enquiry desk at Craig House - Kathy ^{—3rd Party Information—} seemed to be the CSV mentioned. I found her and Mathlian eventually at Hospital Church Centre with other CSV's preparing a jumble.

Kathy ^{—3rd Party Information—} who Mathlian asked if I could get into Woodfield with her.

Mathlian said she had permission of her Charge Nurse, Mr. Neilson to stay the night. She had also phoned Glasclune to say where she was - Why wouldn't we let her? I said staff, and I were concerned about her as we didn't know where she was, although we were pleased she had phoned.

I asked her to give personal promise to me that she would be back at Glasclune by 8 p.m. Sunday. She and Kathy agreed and Kathy said she would "look after Mathlian" - the party is tonight.

Comment - I can imagine that this group of CSV's are older and have a rather sophisticated social life which is very unsuitable for both Mathlian and Kathy may be. I do not see, however, that we can put effective pressure on Mathlian unless we have more information about them.

I suggest we contact Mrs. Barberkerr (Psychologist), Mr. Neilson (Charge Nurse), Keith Adams (CSV Agent), or 2 people mentioned by Mr. Barberkerr as being involved with CSV (at Craig House) - Mr. Evan.

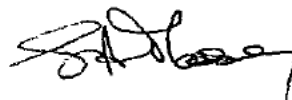
