Since the original Section 29 application on 23.2.98 (copy attached), work has focused on looking at a variety of accommodation options and employment and training opportunities.

Patrick left school in May 1998 and attended a voluntary C.S.V. training placement at Lamont Farm, Erskine. Patrick enjoyed this experience and was held in high regard by staff at Lamont Farm. Patrick sustained this placement until October 1998 when he decided to leave the placement and look at other employment and training options.

Between June 1998 and November 1998, Patrick considered a variety of accommodation options, i.e. Risdale, Clippens Farm, Tower Drive, Dundonald Road and a supported Throughcare flat. However, ultimately Patrick decided he wanted to live with his gran for the immediate future before moving to his own tenancy.

Therefore, on 30.11.98, Patrick's residential supervision order was terminated and Patrick went to live with his gran at 28 Drums Avenue, Paisley. Initially Patrick enjoyed living with his gran where he had his own bedroom and appeared to be getting on well. Recently, however, there had been tension within the household and Patrick had expressed a desire to move to his own tenancy.

Therefore, Patrick was pleased when the Housing Dept. made him an offer of housing at 6 Drums Crescent, Paisley. This is a two apartment tenement flat and is situated near to Patrick's gran and other extended family members.

Patrick continues to have a positive attitude towards support from the Throughcare Team and recognises the need for advice and assistance to help him live independently in the community.

Patrick is regularly attending the careers office and Job Centre and would like to work in a shop. In the meantime, Patrick's only source of income is Under 18 Hardship Allowance of £39.85 per week.

Therefore, if Patrick is to successfully sustain living in his own tenancy, it is important that he receives financial assistance to purchase the essential items of furniture as listed overleaf.

At a child care review on 26.1.98, it was agreed that Patrick should have overnight access at his grans three nights a week, i.e. Mrs Jean Bell, 28 Drums Avenue, Paisley. Mrs Bell requested financial assistance to accommodate Patrick. Liz Edwards suggested that a Section 29 application would be appropriate to help purchase some basic essential bedroom items.

### Background

Patrick has been known to the Social Work Dept. since 1991. He was received into care due to lack of parental care and accommodated at Gryffe Children's Home between 12.12.92 - 28.8.92. Patrick then returned to live with his mother, Ms Cecilia Bell. Patrick lived with his mother at various addresses until 26.4.94 when he was received into care on a voluntary basis as a result of Ms Bell's misuse of alcohol and nomadic lifestyle at the time.

Patrick was initially accommodated at Beech Avenue Children's Home until 17.6.94 when he moved to Newfield Resource Centre. On 9.12.94 Patrick was placed at Balrossie School

Patrick settled well at Balrossie and benefited from an environment which provided stability and emotional support. However, Patrick's behaviour at Balrossie deteriorated from May 1997 when he responded negatively to a referral to the Social Education Unit. Patrick's deteriorating behaviour culminated when he assaulted a member of staff at Balrossie. Patrick was then placed at Kibble school on a residential basis on 26.6.97.

Throughout his period of being looked after, Patrick has maintained contact with various members of his extended family including his mother, father and aunts. However, the most consistent family support has been his grandmother, Mrs Bell.

### Current Position

Patrick is residing at Kibble and has overnight access at his grans three nights a week. Patrick is working through four standard grades, English, Mathematics, Modern Studies and Science. He is also working through Scottish Qualification Authority (S.Q.A.) Modular courses in Construction, Electronics, Woodwork, Metal Work and Physical Education. Patrick will be leaving Kibble in May 1998.

### Throughcare

Patrick was referred to Throughcare on 22.1.98. Patrick has indicated that he is committed to working with Throughcare and recognises that he requires guidance and support to prepare for when he has left the Kibble.

Although Patrick's gran has offered to accommodate him when he leaves Kibble in May, Patrick has stated that he wishes to explore various other accommodation options to enable him to make an informed choice when the time comes.

In addition to exploring accommodation options, the work planned will focus on developing Patrick's independent living skills and employment/training opportunities.

Having discussed this application with Patrick, he feels very strongly that this money is necessary to enable him to stay at his gran's on a regular basis as planned. The bed Patrick is currently sleeping on is very uncomfortable and in a poor state, i.e. the springs have worn through the mattress. The room itself has no fitted carpet, the walls require painting and there are no curtains. With the exception of the paint and possibly carpet, Patrick would be able to take the items with him to any future accommodation.

**Financial Implications**

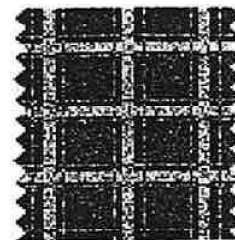
Patrick understands that any money given to him at this point would reduce the total amount of Section 29 money which he may be entitled to in the future.

### Introduction

Paddy has resided at Kibble Education and Care Centre for the past year and five months as a result of impending closure to Balrossi where he had been residential for some time. During his stay at Balrossi Paddy's leave was mainly to his Gran's (Mrs Jean Bell). On arrival at Kibble Paddy's initial care-plan identified two main areas of need, firstly to build and sustain his commitment to his academic education, secondly to build on his relationship with family.

### Education

Paddy has finished his formal education with his level of commitment being high. He took standard grades in English, Mathematics, Science and Modern Studies, Reports indicates he did well, Paddy has spoken of doing further education but for the present has put this on hold.

### Family

On arrival at Kibble Paddy's leave was to Gran's, who was identified as his legal guardian. September 1997 Paddy established contact with his mother and leave (liaison with Social Worker, Keyworker, and Family) was arranged at Mum's and her partners, this went well until December 1997 when a "Breakdown" meant further leave being arranged to Gran's and has been since early 1998. Paddy has been on Extended leave to Gran's (as Drums Avenue) since 14 October 1998. Regular contact with Paddy and Gran has been by phone and home visits during which Gran has said Paddy and herself are doing fine. Paddy's Uncle Gus has just returned from Ireland and Paddy talks very highly of Gus. After speaking to Gus and Paddy, I feel if Paddy's Uncle was to stay in Paisley he would be a good influence for Paddy.

### Work Experience

On leaving school Paddy attained a Community Service Volunteers Placement at Lamont City Farm, Erskine. Both Karl (C.S.V. Placement Officer) and workers at Lamont were very impressed with Paddy's work. Recently Paddy has decided he wishes some other area of work experience and has met with Karl (26 November 1998) with possible placements being looked into.

### In the Community

Whilst on leaves (and participating in arranged Kibble activities) Paddy presents no problems at all. He shows respect to both his peers and adults. He is familiar with the local area and spends a good deal of his time with his relations.

### Statement

This Children's Hearing is in response to Paddy's "Child in Care Review" 6 October 1998, When Paddy by his actions, (not attending) was, I feel saying he needed some "Support in Moving On". He is currently working with through-care and tried "Independent Living". The move from Communal Living to being "by himself" was for Paddy not the right one. He returned to Kibble and after some deliberation Paddy (with Gran, Social Worker, Kibble and Through-Care) has said he wishes to move to his Gran's on a home supervision order [section 70(B)], with agreements from all involved. Paddy has agreed to continue work with through-care and has just updated his application for Council Housing. With the added input from Social Work I feel Paddy would benefit on a home supervision order.

### Recommendations

- 1) Paddy's order to be continued to Sec 70(B) naming Mrs Jean Bell.
- 2) Through - Care to continue working with Paddy.

*Family*

Inconsistent home leave pattern by Paddy may be due to him not wishing to be at Gran's when Cecilia is there as he doesn't get on with his mum if she has been drinking alcohol.

*Particular reference to child in care*

Paddy observed to have difficulty communicating his feelings at this time about agreed plan in respect of his future move from Kibble. The assessment of current situation is that Paddy might benefit from pre independent living hostel/supported accommodation.

---

**Summary of Discussion:**

Janice O'Reilly, Senior Social Worker opened the review with introductions and indicated that the purpose of the review was to look at future plans for Paddy. The fact that Paddy had not moved on from Kibble as expected was highlighted - a fact that would be fully explored during today's meeting. The last Child in Care Review was in fact chaired by Iain Smith who made the decision for Paddy to move on from Kibble via Throughcare. Several months have now passed.

Paddy needs to understand that although he will be given options for accommodation, remaining in Kibble is not one of them. A time limit of 2-3 months will therefore be made.

It was noted that Paddy was invited to today's review but he refused to attend.

**Summary of Discussion (continued):**

*THROUGH-CARE REPORT*

Scott Robertson, Resource Worker indicated that there has been considerable progress with Paddy. He has visited several places for accommodation. Paddy indicated that he would not wish to visit Dundonald Road as an option for him. Other options such as Clippens Farm, Raisdale and Tower Drive were also visited. Paddy opted for the accommodation at West Court.

Scott indicated that Paddy had visited West Court on several occasions and seemed to like the house. However he was worried about staying on his own and has since refused to consider moving there.

*KIBBLE REPORT*

Tony Kane, Keyworker stated that Paddy is doing well although he is apprehensive about living on his own and was asking about what accommodation Kibble had to offer him. Tony indicated that Paddy is not a management problem within the unit and no health issues were raised, however his behaviour of late has been giving some concern within the unit where he has a tendency to push limits and be somewhat disruptive.

Gerry Daly, Unit Manager indicated that Paddy is capable of living on his own but is afraid of doing so. If Paddy has a fear about this he is not talking to staff about it. At this stage it is time to make a decision about what the future is for Paddy, a time scale has to be made.

*CSV REPORT*

Karl Monsen-Elvik indicated that Paddy worked very well at CSV and stated that a place for him is still available if and when he wishes to return. It was noted that Paddy was a hard worker and was interested in his work.

*SOCIAL WORK REPORT*

Liz Snodgrass, Social Worker indicated that Paddy stated a wish was to live on his own when leaving Kibble. He can look after himself, he gets himself up and dressed each day, he has household skills and is mature enough for this move. During Paddy's trial period for a move to West Court, it became clear that Paddy was resistant to plans for independent living, as he missed appointments and refused to discuss the issue. Therefore it is time to set deadlines for Paddy to move on with continued supports.

Janice O'Reilly outlined that Paddy has worked very well with Throughcare and that he has reached the stage where he needs to be helped to move on. Scott will play a vital role here with Liz co-ordinating with everyone concerned given Paddy's dislike of social workers and repeated refusals to meet with Liz.

**Summary of Discussion (continued):**

*MRS BELL*

Mrs Bell agreed that Paddy is afraid to leave Kibble, as he has been in care for a long time. She wants the best for him and whatever Paddy wants she is agreeable to. Paddy has not asked outright to live with his Gran on a full time basis, however, Mrs Bell indicated that she would be happy for Paddy to live with her. It was also noted that Paddy does not like being at Grans house when his mum is there and has been drinking.

*GENERAL DISCUSSION*

Everyone acknowledged that Paddy was indeed feeling some anxieties about the prospect of change and leaving Kibble. However, there is no reason for Paddy to remain in his current placement. He has repeatedly refused to discuss his feelings and anxieties and of late, his behaviour within the unit is becoming disruptive.

Paddy refused to attend the review today despite being encouraged to do so.

Considerable time has now passed since the last review where the decision to move towards independence was made.

Janice O'Reilly therefore proposed a time-scale of 8-10 weeks at which point Paddy would be discharged from Kibble.

In the meantime, all options will be fully explored again ie Throughcare provision; Mrs Bell (Grandmother) or Local Authority Housing.

It was agreed that contact with Mrs Bell should be built up with Social Work giving financial assistance to Mrs Bell. Kibble agreed to supply food parcels for Paddy when he is going to Mrs Bells house.

Janice went on to say that Paddy should be informed of today's decisions as soon as possible. Liz Snodgrass and Tony Kane agreed to do this. All agencies to work closely over the next 8 weeks to support Paddy in these decisions for his future. In 8 weeks, Paddy will be discharged from Kibble and Liz Snodgrass will request a Review Hearing.

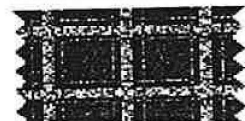

## SUMMARY OF GOALS SET

### 14.04.98 - Child in Care Review Decisions:-

- 1) Second week of holidays leave to be increased to include Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday overnights at Gran's. Leave to revert to Thursday overnight, Friday in Kibble, Saturday and Sunday overnights at Gran's.
- 2) Paddy to remain in Kibble.
- 3) Through-Care to keep working with Paddy.
- 4) Recreation monies to remain at £10.00 per month.
- 5) Tony (with Paddy) to look into how much Paddy owes for reparations.

### Children's Hearing - 22.07.98

- To remain on 70 (9) 3 Order, changed residence condition naming both Kibble Education & Care Centre or Supported Accommodation at their discretion, planning meeting to discuss time scale, etc when flat is ready.

### Overnights to Gran since April 1998

14.04.98	Gran asked as she was not well. Permission given.

Paddy chose to take passes to Gran's (short visits).

Gran offering leave from Thursday to Monday, 4th to 8th June and 12th to 15th June.

21st June leave broke down as mum was staying at Gran's. Paddy felt he would be targetted to blame whilst mum was drinking at Gran's.

Regular visits to Gran's between 18.07.98 to 14.08.98.

Overnight on 14/08, 15/08, 16/08, 17/08, 18/08 at Gran's.

Regular visits with phone contact between 19.08.98 to 22.09.98.

Overnight on 22.09.98. PM on 23.09.98 at Gran's.

## HEALTH

Paddy's health has been of little or no concern. He has enjoyed a clean bill of health except for a few minor ailments. His personal hygiene is of a high standard in terms of his personal appearance. However, there has always been an ongoing need to encourage Paddy to keep his room tidy.

## STATEMENT

Work Experience - Paddy started work experience through contact with Community Service Volunteers. His placement was at Lamont City Farm near Erskine. He started on 09.06.98 and gave a high commitment until 14.09.98. A meeting was held at the farm to review his placement. Kibble (myself) were unable to attend this meeting but feedback from his Placement Officer (Karl) who did attend was very positive. As was mentioned earlier, Paddy's commitment wained as from 14.09.98. Trying to encourage Paddy to contact work to let them know, proved a hopeless task. Eventually, leading myself to inform Paddy's work and the CS Volunteers in Glasgow. Paddy has recently contacted Careers.

Working with Through-Care - Scott Robertson (Through-Care) has been involved in working with both Paddy and Kibble in securing accommodation for Paddy. Scott's input has involved regular contact since January 1998. This has included visiting possible prospective accommodation and securing section 29 monies in order for Paddy to furnish his own flat (usually Council property) when he will be ready and the opportunity arises. During this period, Paddy had been invited to three planning meetings. The first, on 11.08.98, which he refused to attend, was to arrange a meeting with Social Worker, Supported Accommodation and Kibble. However, a meeting was planned for 19.08.98, which Paddy attended. Decisions from this meeting were:-

- 1) Paddy to have first overnight, Wednesday, 26th <sup>August</sup> September. Tony Caine to pick him up from work, shop for dinner, take to flat, have dinner with Paddy. (Paddy to go to work from flat on 27th am.
- 2) 1st September and 3rd September, both overnights at flat. Tony or Through-Care to assist only on 1st September.
- 3) Meeting - update Friday, 4th September, 9am to 9.15am (Paddy's request) Janice from Through-Care to pick up Paddy from flat 4th September for meeting at Kibble.
- 4) Visits from Through-Care to assist week of two overnights.

Paddy did not keep his agreement to attend meeting on 4th September.

## **Decisions from Meeting on 4th September 1998**

- It was agreed that Paddy and Scott should visit a number of accommodation options before the next scheduled meeting on 21st September and Scott to write "Report on Visits" as Paddy was not successful in completing all his overnights at flat.

## **Meeting held on 21st September 1998**

Attendance - Social Worker, Through-Care, Keyworker. Again, Paddy refused to attend. After some discussion, a member of staff from the Kibble-based "Preparation for Independent Living Unit" attended, as, prior to meeting, Paddy had voiced (and attended informal meeting with Unit Leader) his interest in wanting to move into the unit. Decisions from this meeting:-

- 1) Tony to contact Community Service Volunteers.
- 2) Social Worker to liaise with Senior with regard to arranging Young Person's in Care Review (YP in CR).
- 3) Kibble repossessed West Court flat keys.
- 4) Social Worker to speak with Gran regarding possibility/reality of Paddy going onto Gran's.
- 5) Offer of flat still alive to be reviewed at YPCR.

Since the last planning meeting on 27th September 1998, I have persuaded Paddy to have dinner at his flat on one occasion with myself. Firstly, doing shopping with him and again going to flat to cook dinner. After that, Paddy stated he is too afraid to be alone in flat. Paddy is now clearly saying he wishes to move onto Gran's to stay, but wishes this to be in conjunction with being on a Home Supervision Order.

## **Within Mossedge North Unit**

To be just in writing this part of the report, Paddy, for 95% of his residence at the unit, has given full commitment to working on all his review decisions relating to Kibble's residential expectations. However, since August of this year, Paddy has refused to accept boundaries and expectations the unit sets out. This has caused conflict and disruption within the everyday running of routine, and of late is having a negative affect on other residents. Paddy has deliberately and calculatively refused home leave to Gran's knowing he will not be entitled to a 16 Year Old, Mature Young Person's Priviledge Conclusion.

I feel a lot of Paddy's "immature behaviour" is his way of creating deflective methods to avoid dealing with "moving on". Speaking with Paddy on occasions will reveal his feelings. He has stated he does not want to leave or he can stay until he is seventeen and only of late, that he is scared to stay at the flat by himself. Our response to this was to try with Paddy to plan how we all can help with the transition from Kibble to flat. Paddy is very insecure about being on his own and I feel he is not ready for independent living at present.

## Recommendations

1. Paddy's Order to be changed to home supervision naming Mrs Jean Bell (Gran).
2. Supported Accommodation continue to be involved.
3. Possibility of option to move to Kibble Hostel when ready.

## PATRICK BISHOP - ACCOMMODATION OPTIONS

At a Planning Meeting on 4th September, it was agreed that Patrick and I should visit a number of accommodation options before the next scheduled meeting on 21st September.

The resources which it was agreed to visit were:

1. Tower Drive, Renfrew (Y.M.C.A.)
2. Clippens Farm, Linwood (Blue Triangle H.A.)
3. Raisdale, Barrhead (Salvation Army)
4. Dundonald Road, Paisley (Housing Dept.)
5. Supported Carers (Social Work Dept.)

### 1. Tower Drive, Renfrew - 9.9.98

Patrick found this a very negative experience. He was very disappointed with a number of aspects at Tower Drive, namely -

- a) General appearance of the surrounding area
- b) Poor amenities at the complex
- c) The levels of furniture and decoration were very unsatisfactory, and the flats generally appeared untidy and not very clean.
- d) The worker showing us round the complex was not very positive about it and was unable to give much information regarding the resource or who uses the resource.

Patrick stated categorically that he would not be willing to live at Tower Drive.

### 2. Clippens Farm, Linwood - 10.9.98

Patrick and I were given a very thorough tour of Clippens Farm by the assistant manager there. She was able to give Patrick a lot of information relating to the resource. Patrick appeared to be impressed by Clippens and satisfied with its cleanliness, facilities and its general appearance. Patrick did express some concern about the number of rules and regulations, however was generally quite positive about this resource.

### 3. Raisdale, Barrhead - 17.9.98

Patrick and I were given a very comprehensive tour of Raisdale by staff. Patrick was not very forthcoming, either during or after the visit, about his first impressions of Raisdale. However, Patrick appeared to be quite positive about this resource in general. However, he did state that he thought the bedrooms would benefit from more modern furniture and new carpets being fitted.

4. Dundonald Road, Paisley

Patrick decided that he did not wish to view the Dundonald Road complex. He based this decision on the basis that the accommodation is similar to the West Court flat and he would rather live in the West Court area as he is familiar with the accommodation and the area.

Unfortunately, there are no supported carers available at present.

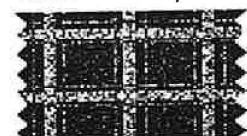

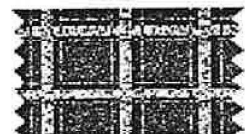

Patrick will take up a fourth year Graphic Design Course which complements his work in Art. Throughout this year he will complete the Scotvec module 'Poster Design'. To this date, Patrick has shown ability in this subject.

Patrick will continue to follow the general woodwork course involving woodwork skills and production of furnishings. If he demonstrates an interest in this work, he will be given the opportunity to undertake the Scotvec Module: 'Introduction to Wood.'

Patrick will continue with the general metalwork course offered. If he wishes to further develop his skills in this area he will be given the opportunity to undertake a Scotvec Module in 'Metal Removal Techniques.'
