5(a) Offending analysis - current

Analysis of current offence(s)

Context:

Mr Ashton advised, that at the time of the offence, he had been a resident with the Simon Community, in the organisations hostel at 25 Green Street, Saltcoats, for “a

few months". Mr Ashton reports a long-term period of homelessness.

What is the level of responsibility for the offence?

Mr Ashton denies the offence, stating that this was contrived by the victim. Mr Ashton was unable to provide a reason for his thinking.

What is the level of planning?

Mr Ashton declined to discuss the offence, and therefore any planning involved is unclear.

What is the individual's attitude and insight into the offence(s)?

Mr Ashton stated that the offence could not have taken place in a communal area, where witnesses were present. Mr Ashton refused to discuss the matter further.

What is the level of recognition by the offender on the impact/consequences of the offence(s) on the victim/community?

Mr Ashton appears to lack insight or concern, in terms of the impact of his offending on others.

5(b) Offending Analysis – Previous offending

Information provided by the Scottish Criminal Records Office conveys that Mr Ashton has been convicted of 46 criminal offences. Mr Ashton incurred his first conviction at age sixteen. Fifteen of the offences were of a violent nature. Other offences include Theft; Theft by Shoplifting; Theft by Opening a Lockfast Motor Vehicle; Culpable and Reckless Conduct; Breach of the Peace; Breach of Probation; Breach of Bail; Misuse of Drugs Act 1971; contraventions of the Road Traffic Act; and Vandalism.

6. Personal and Social Circumstances Relevant to Offending Behaviour and Sentencing

Accommodation

Liaison with prison records indicates that Mr Ashton has been held on remand since 30 July 2018. Mr Ashton informs that he previously resided in homeless accommodation, conveying that he has been homeless for approximately ten years. Mr Ashton stated that he has no interest in securing permanent housing, as he does not want the responsibilities attached to maintaining a home. Mr Ashton advised that his only motivation is taking illicit drugs.

Significant Relationships/Background

Mr Ashton informs that he was raised in the Kinning Park area of Glasgow. Mr Ashton was reluctant to discuss his background, stating that he was raised in children's homes, during which time, he had no contact with his parents. Mr Ashton recalls emotional neglect and physical abuse as a child in care. Mr Ashton advised that he had one brother, with whom he had minimal contact, who died on 31 July 2018. Mr Ashton reports minimal contact with his parents, as an adult.

Training/Education/Employment

Mr Ashton advised that he was deprived of education whilst being raised in care. Mr Ashton reports ongoing literacy issues. Mr Ashton informs that he joined the British Army, on leaving care, at age sixteen, and states that he was discharged, approximately three years later, owing to criminal convictions.

Mr Ashton reports a ten year period of working as a driver in the heavy haulage industry. Mr Ashton states that he has been unable to work, since amputation of his leg.

Financial Circumstances

During interview, Mr Ashton conveyed that he was unable to recall details of any income, prior to custody.

Leisure/Recreation

Mr Ashton does not engage in any hobbies or structured activity.

Health

Case records convey that Mr Ashton has experienced complex physical health problems for a number of years. Mr Ashton is wheelchair dependent, and advised that he had a leg amputated, owing to a car accident. Departmental records however indicate that this was the result of illicit drug use. Records further inform that Mr Ashton experiences limited use of one arm, and has been diagnosed with Hepatitis C and Pancreatitis.

A history of mental health issues is also apparent. Mr Ashton confirmed that his mental health can fluctuate, and states that he has suffered with anxiety and depression, since losing his leg. Mr Ashton advised that he has contemplated suicide in the past, and on one occasion, attempted to shoot himself. Case records indicate that Mr Ashton presented at A&E in 2009, having stuck a nail in his head. Mr Ashton conveyed that whilst he does not currently feel suicidal, he does not care whether he lives or dies. Mr Ashton reports to have declined to speak with a psychiatrist, whilst in custody.

At the time of interview, Mr Ashton stated that he was not being prescribed any medication. Mr Ashton however advised that he had been assessed by medical services the previous day, and thought that a prescription may have been organised at that time.

Drugs/Alcohol use

Mr Ashton reports to have commenced smoking Heroin at age thirty-eight. A history of alcohol abuse is also indicated. Case records convey contact with community

addiction and rehabilitation services in the past, which includes Mr Ashton having been prescribed Methadone. Mr Ashton advised that he is not currently motivated to address his addiction problems, stating that his only interest is “getting high”. Mr Ashton confirmed that he was under the influence of illicit drugs at the time of interview.

8. Review of Relevant Sentencing Options

Fine

Mr Ashton was unable to provide details of any regular income whilst at liberty. This would indicate that Mr Ashton is not in a position to meet a monetary penalty.

Community Payback Order

Mr Ashton advised that he has no interest in engaging with services at this time to address housing, addiction, and other issues. Case records convey ongoing complex physical and mental health problems. Mr Ashton responses indicate a transient and chaotic existence whilst at liberty, combined with his lack of motivation to address his difficulties, and ongoing health issues, conveys that Mr Ashton is unsuitable at this time to undertake a Community Payback Order.

Restriction of Liberty Order

Mr Ashton has no fixed address whilst at liberty, and therefore electronic monitoring does not appear feasible at this time.

Deferred Sentence

Mr Ashton reports a long-term history of mental health problems, and the Court may wish to defer sentencing, for the purpose of obtaining a Psychiatric and/or Psychological evaluation, to allow needs and risks to be determined, and if necessary, a suitable treatment intervention to be identified.

Custody

Mr Ashton is aware that the Court may decide to impose a period of Custody at this juncture. Mr Ashton also acknowledged that he may be subject to license conditions and supervised for a period, following his release from custody, owing to the sexual nature of the index offence.

9. Conclusion

Mr Ashton reports to have experienced a damaging childhood, whilst being raised in care. Mr Ashton commented that he was subject to physical and emotional abuse, and his educational needs were unmet, resulting in ongoing literacy issues.

Mr Ashton is wheelchair dependent, having previously had one leg amputated. Available information suggests that this was drug related. Mr Ashton reports to have engaged in sustained employment within the heavy haulage industry, which may coincide with a period of desistance from offending between 1995 to 2005. Mr Ashton advised that his mental health has been significantly affected by the loss of his leg, and he has been prone to fluctuating mental health since that time. Mr Ashton discussed one previous incident of attempted suicide, and case records convey a potential incident of self-harm in 2009, when Mr Ashton presented at A&E with a nail in his head.

Mr Ashton's responses convey that he was homeless for a number of years, prior to his current remand, prompted by a chaotic lifestyle associated with the use of illicit drugs. Mr Ashton has completed successive periods in custody, as a consequence of his forty-six previous convictions. Mr Ashton demonstrates a pattern of persistent offending, which includes a significant history of violence. Ashton was evidently under the influence of illicit drugs at the time of interview, and the validity of his responses are thus unclear. Mr Ashton laughed inappropriately during interview, indicating that he does not take his offending behaviour seriously. Mr Ashton's responses convey that he has no plans to impact change in his lifestyle, and his ongoing illicit drug use and contact with pro-criminal influences, indicates a significant risk of re-offending. Mr Ashton has been assessed as presenting a very high risk of general recidivism at this time, including a high risk of violent offending. Alongside which, Mr Ashton's physical and mental health issues, appear to present a risk to self.

(This notice is not a complete statement of the law. It contains a summary of the principal notification requirements with which you must comply. For further explanation or advice you should consult a solicitor.)

You have been convicted of a sexual offence covered by the Sex Offences Act 2003. The details are set out in the certificate of conviction or finding which is attached to this notice or will be sent to you.

This means that you are now required by law to notify certain information to the police. Unless otherwise stated, that required information must be provided within the next 3 days (or, if you are in custody, within 3 days of your release)

You must notify the police

- (1) Of your name and any other names you use or have used, your date of birth, your home address (*i.e.* your sole or main residence in the UK or, if you have no such residence, the address or location of any place in the UK where you can regularly be found and, if there is more than one place, your choice of one of these places), and your national insurance number.

1. The accused was found guilty after trial of the following offence:-

"(001) on 22nd May 2018 at the premises of the Simon Community Hostel, 25 Green Street, Saltcoats, you MARK ASHTON did sexually assault [REDACTED] c/o Police Service of Scotland in that you did touch him on the body sexually;

CONTRARY to Section 3 of the Sexual Offences (Scotland) Act 2009"

2. The accused pled not guilty to this charge and the matter proceeded to trial on 23 August 2018. Sentencing has been adjourned to 25 September 2018 for the purpose of obtaining a Criminal Justice Social Work Report and Restriction of Liberty Order assessment. The accused continues to be on bail pending sentencing.
3. The complainer and the accused were both residents of the Simon Community Hostel as at 22 May 2018. They were acquaintances from their time there. Around 7pm that day they were both in the foyer area of the hostel where two computers are situated for the use of residents. The complainer was standing using one of the computers with the accused in his wheelchair around a foot away. There was a

verbal exchange between them with the accused calling the complainer "specky" and the complainer verbally retaliating in some way. The accused reached out with his hand and touched the complainer's groin. The complainer knocked the accused's hand away, jumped back and shouted "Keep your hands to yourself, you fat one legged bastard". A support worker came out of the office adjacent to the foyer upon hearing the shout. There was another resident present [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] The complainer then left to go into the lounge area. [REDACTED]

4. The accused was subsequently interviewed by police. During the interview he appeared confused and quasi-delusional at times. He denied having any sexual feelings towards the complainer or other males. He denied touching the complainer and indicated he knew there were CCTV cameras in the foyer area which would have seen him if he had done this (CCTV was played to the court of the accused and the complainer at the computer area in the foyer at a different time on 22 May 2018 but not at the time of the incident). In somewhat confusing answers, the accused indicated that the complainer had previously tried to strangle him with two other persons in an attempt to get his PIN number (which the accused said he had reported to the police); that the police were looking for the complainer whose real name was [REDACTED]; that he had heard that the complainer was gay and was going out with a footballer and that the accused had jumped in the River Clyde the previous day and had banged his head but had been returned to the hostel by the police in the early hours of that morning. Although initially the accused was very unclear about what happened and at one point denied being present, towards the end of the interview the accused indicated the third male had called the complainer a "specky bastard"; the complainer had thought it was the accused who had said this to him and so had hit the accused. The accused said he did not hit the complainer back.

Went home Monday 0/night but to pictures with mum. Mum says everything went well. Mum not at home to comment about Monday. Will contact her later today.
- 22-2-86 Mal much improved in school, reports a lot better, is doing O'Grade Science and English. Mal home for W/E but ill at home. 30-12-85 Mel has had a unsettled time with home. Communication with Mrs. Heller saying she feels Mel is too much of a liability. Mel at home for the holiday although now asked that he be picked up. We kept out and Mel was out.

30-11-85 Mel F.T.R. on 10-11-85 after W/E home. Thought Carl by the study. He lost part of W/E due to poor behavior. Behavior is not very good although school reports poor.

9/12/85 Review on 12-12-85. Feelings were that things were going well at home, reactions much better than could be expected. Classroom reports were not good and unit behavior although at the time was unsettled had greatly improved 100%. We talked about Mel's future career but it was felt that it was too early at this stage to make any plans. We did ask Mel to improve his time keeping and since the meeting this has been excellent. Mel has had a confrontation with D. Nield from next door. I have talked to D.N. Mel did not come in today and will not be in tomorrow. Mum says he has a upset stomach but it is probably the situation with D.N. Mel is now out until 6th January.

A small incident with [redacted] developed into nearly a full scale battle. Mah Adton managed to upset Preston with 5 words but just stood quite calm while Preston wanted a reward. He F.T.R. after verbal leave but I went to 'punish' him up. He now has a contract which he must follow at home. If he does not then he be brought back from W/E home early.

Basis of Report

I became Family Social Worker to the Ashtons in April of this year when the previous worker, Cathy Johnson, left. Cathy had been involved at a fairly intensive level with the family since Mark was placed at Thorntoun.

Since April, I have visited Mrs. Ashton at home on three occasions and have been involved in one meeting with her and Mark at Thorntoun. This report is based on this contact and on Cathy Johnson's case records.

Nature of Family Social Work Involvement since January, 1983

Since Mark's placement at Thorntoun there have been constant fluctuations in family relationships and Mark's behaviour. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED]
in view of this it was impossible to work consistently towards a planned course of action.

Mark's contact with his father has similarly been variable, changing from no contact for a lengthy period, to regular weekends and to a more intermittent pattern. Mark seemed to blossom when he had the regard of his dad and his behaviour settled accordingly for periods.

Mrs. Ashton has felt at different times that she could not cope any longer with Mark's disruptive behaviour and consideration has been given variously to a residential summer or holiday placement, a 52 week residential placement, a fostering arrangement and to Mr. Ashton's increased responsibility for Mark.

Recently, it seems, she has felt that she cannot influence or control Mark's behaviour and [REDACTED]

Mrs. Ashton feels that Thorntoun is geographically too near home to provide effective separation of home and school and that this encourages Mark to run away from his difficulties, rather than face them. Mrs. Ashton has a commitment to Mark but feels that it would now be in his interests to consider other residential options for him.

Mark attended Kirkmichael House from April 1979 until June 1982 when he returned to live with his mother and attend his local primary school.

I first became involved with Mark's case in October 1982 at the request of Mr. Cairns, Principal Psychologist, who had been dealing with the case. Mrs. Ashton was having difficulty controlling Mark and Mr. Cairns felt that I could offer support to her.

Unfortunately, relations between Mark and Mrs. Ashton had deteriorated so much by this time that it was necessary to remove him from home. Rather than put him into a children's Home it was decided that he should return to Kirkmichael until an alternative placement could be found.

We decided to apply for Thorntoun School because this meant that Mark could attend as a residential pupil initially and eventually become a day boy. He was accepted by them and started there in January 1983.

The placement at Thorntoun has had two main drawbacks. Thorntoun have had difficulty keeping Mark there and he keeps running home. Thorntoun has no 52 week provision which means Mrs. Ashton has had to cope with Mark for the holidays. She is finding this increasingly difficult.

I saw Mrs. Ashton and Mark on Wednesday 1st August and Mrs. Ashton said that she could no longer cope with Mark. [REDACTED]

As you can see, Mark's behaviour is fairly disturbed. Mrs. Ashton finds it difficult to control Mark and Mark, himself, seems unable to control his own behaviour.

Mark presents as a very unhappy, confused boy. I think he finds it difficult to judge how his mother feels about him. [REDACTED] feels guilty about this and overcompensates. Mr. Ashton in the past also totally rejected him which must add to his confusion.

Earlier this year, Mrs. Ashton had asked me to find a 52 week placement for Mark. After/

After discussion with those concerned, we decided to consider a foster placement for Mark as we felt that he needed to learn to live in a family who had control over him and were consistent with him. [REDACTED]

At present I feel that Mark is too disturbed for a foster placement to have a chance of success. The placement at Thornmount is not working for the reasons stated earlier. I would therefore recommend a 52 week placement for Mark away from this area. I feel that a placement at Balrossie List 'D' school would provide Mark with appropriate intervention for the present and also the opportunity of community parents in the long term.

BRIEF FAMILY HISTORY

This young boy first came to the attention of the Social Work Department in 1978 due to concern over his difficult behaviour at school and at home. At this time, he was already receiving psychiatric and psychological help at his school. [REDACTED]

In April 1979, the Education Department felt Mark's needs would be better served by removing him from home and placing him in Kirkmichael Residential School. This was to be a short period to try to overcome Mark's major difficulties, but it became obvious that more extensive problems exist with Mark and his family and the placement became long-term. Mark spent weekends and holidays at home but these proved to be very difficult for the parents. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] in the beginning of 1982. Around this time, Mark's behaviour was further deteriorating due to the uncertainty of his home life and involvement in offences, it was decided to remove Mark from Kirkmichael School and place him in Thorntoun School, Kilmarnock. He was admitted in January 1983. Since this time, Mark has not made much progress. Thorntoun School are not happy with his behaviour or their ability to offer anything constructive for him. His periods of leave at home have been difficult for Mrs. Ashton, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] In addition, Mark has been involved in further offences and a Residential Supervision Order was made by the Childrens Panel in July '83.

In conclusion, the current situation is that Mrs. Ashton is finding it difficult to cope with Mark and is now saying he is outwith her control again. Mr. Ashton has been making more contact with Mark over the past months and Mark has spent weekends with his father occasionally. Given Mark's deep seated problems and basic insecurities about himself, it is my view that yet another residential placement for Mark will again prove unsatisfactory as the large, impersonal nature of a school is not what Mark requires at the moment. It is my view that in order to try to give Mark an opportunity to develop close relationships and develop insight into his behaviour, it is necessary to create a warm and cosy atmosphere for Mark and this could best be achieved through the use of foster parents. Initial enquiries were made in March of this year to find suitable foster parents for such a difficult child as Mark and these were proving very positive and it is my suggestion that the time is right for these enquiries to be continued and developed in order that Mark may spend some time in a fostering situation.

Thank you for asking me to see this lad to provide you with a report prior to his appearance before the Children's Hearing. I have been able to interview him on one occasion on 11.8.84 at Kirkland Park Assessment Centre, Darvel. I have, in addition, been able to see previous Social Enquiry Reports provided by yourself and an Educational Psychologist's Report prepared by Ms. A.P. Cuthill. I have also been able to read a report provided by Thornthoun School which was available to a previous Children's Panel, and dated 8th June, 1984.

At interview, I found Mark to be a small lad for his 14 years who gave his story in an accurate and honest way. He told me he had been at Kirkland Park for 2 weeks and was not really happy there. Prior to that, he had been at Thornthoun School, Kilmarnock on a five day week basis but had taken to running away from the school of late. He told me that on these occasions he would go back to stay with his mother who lives in Girdle Toll. His 8 year old brother, Aaron, [REDACTED].

I understand from Mark and perusal of the records, that he has attended Annick Primary School and has on two occasions been admitted to Kirkmichael Residential School. He seems to have attended Thornthoun School for the past 2 years where he told me he had "got used to it". At interview he told me he had been "sent away" from Thornthoun two weeks ago and was not going back there. He was unable to tell me why this situation had arisen. He accepted that "something had happened" but was very agitated and anxious at this stage and was unable to tell me why he had been running away from school. He told me that he liked the art class best but disliked the art teacher.

He told me that his parents had split up three years ago and his father was now living in Glasgow. I understand he has had some weekend leaves with his father and these seem to have gone reasonably well. He seemed anxious that he could go and stay with his father after he had left Kirkland Park and informed me that his father was agreeable to this arrangement.

Throughout my interview with this young lad, he exhibited very clear signs of anxiety and unease. Initially it was difficult to follow his diction as he had a nervous habit of putting his hands in front of his mouth while he spoke. This cleared as he became more confident.

during the interview and his nervous mannerisms noticeably settled. There was only shifting eye contact but this again improved somewhat as he became less ill-at-ease. I felt he was of average intelligence and that much of his difficult behaviour is an expression of the high levels of arousal and anxiety with which he tries to cope.

As we discussed on the telephone, I have only seen this boy briefly and have not been able to see his parents. On the basis of my one interview with him and from my understanding of his previous history, I feel that he falls into the category of behaviour disorder caused by high levels of anxiety. His home background has been somewhat unstable and no doubt confusing for him. He impressed me as a rather sad, unhappy, and confused little boy who was in need of some adult to take control of him. I understand from yourself that it may be possible that he can go to stay with his father who is now perhaps in the position to provide this more stable base. If this is the case, I feel that it may well be worth trying this at this point in time. I note father's location near Shawlands and feel that a suitable educational placement might be Cartvale Educational Unit at Battlefield. This unit provides education for children with similar problems to Mark but I have no idea as to the availability of places there. I am sure Ms. Cuthill would advise us on that point.

My provisional assessment of Mark is of a likeable young man with many positive attributes but with high levels of insecurity and anxiety leading to his requiring education based in the maladjusted section of the educational system. I feel it unlikely he could cope with an ordinary school at this juncture. I do not, however, feel that he necessarily requires residential placement if a secure home base can be provided by his father.

As we discussed on the telephone, I would be happy to see Mark again on my return from leave and also make arrangements to discuss his future management with his father should the agreement be arrived at that Mark go to stay with him. I will contact you again on my return from leave.

Health and Appearance:- On admission to Kirkland Park Mark was accompanied by his parents and Social Worker Mr McAlpine. He was in a clean and tidy condition and throughout his stay has kept himself clean but only with prompting. He was later examined by our G.P. and passed as being fit but showed great reluctance at being examined. He is, however, troubled by a cough at nights and is having acted for this. He conducts himself badly in the dining room and is a very messy eater and is rather selective in choice of food.

Attitudes and Relationships:- Initially Mark threatened to run away from the Unit and it was explained to him that the placement was not a "secure" one but that running off would not solve anything as he would be immediately returned to the Unit by Police. This has so far been effective and he has not absconded. Mark has been visited by his mother and weekend leaves to his father have taken place. He returns from leave at appointed time and maintains he enjoys going to visit his father. His mother too has shown concern and has telephoned regularly regarding his progress. Within the Unit Mark shows up as a "loner". He has not made friends and is often belligerent towards his peers. He can, however, stand up for himself and is not intimidated by older more able boys. Towards staff he is uncommunicative and questions authority. He deliberately ripped up a pair of sandshoes and was horrified to learn that pocket money would be stopped because of this. He impresses as a child who is used to getting his own way and takes it badly when he is thwarted. He also lies readily even when confronted with evidence.

Activities:- Mark is a poor worker in his household duties and has to be carefully supervised to ensure he completes given tasks.

Teacher's report:- When Mark was first introduced to the class he was very upset, cried a lot and would not talk to me. A male member of staff removed him for a short time and, when he returned he was very quiet. His mother visited and, after the visit, he returned to class in tears. She promised to visit the next day but did not appear. 28.9.84 - Mark started talking to other boys but continued to ignore my attempts to bring him into conversation. It was noticeable at this early stage that he squirms things which I feel is a symptom of his insecurity. In the following week Mark opened up a little in class and started to ask questions about work. ^{his ability is poor and} his general lack of confidence reflects this. 5.10.84 - wrote name on toilet wall prior to going on weekend leave and was disgruntled at being told to clean the wall on return from leave. He did, however, do the task. 11.10.84 - Mark appears more confident in class - seems to like reading material about war and is always drawing Nazi pictures during Art period. In all his academic attainments are poor.

Recommendation:- We are of the opinion that Mark is in need of further residential care and would suggest that a small List 'G' establishment could very well be beneficial to him unless his father - who he appears to get on with - is able to accommodate him.

Present: Mrs. T. Beattie, Area Officer; Mr. David Wilson, Consultant - Assessment in Child Care; Mr. James McCracken, Senior Social Worker, Kilwinning; Mr. Ian McAlpine, Social Worker, Kilwinning; Miss A. Cuthill, Psychologist, Child Guidance Centre.

The meeting was informed that Mark first came to the attention of the Social Work Department in 1978 due to concern over his difficult behaviour at school. He was placed in Kirkmichael Residential School short term but it became more obvious that more extensive problems existed and Mark was placed in Thornton School, Kilmarnock. This placement has not worked out. Thornton are not happy with his behaviour but feel the end has come more because of his continued absconding and feel now they have nothing constructive to offer him. When confronted with anything at the school he just ran off.

The meeting discussed Mark's behaviour and it was suggested that much of it came through lack of stability and control at home. [REDACTED]

There is no consistent love and discipline in the home. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] and Mr. Ashton [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] He also is very inconsistent with Mark. [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] but he occasionally takes Mark out [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] Mark
is very keen to have a relationship with his father.

It was agreed that Mark had never experienced the consistent love and discipline of an ordinary family. To achieve this and obtain consistency the question of fostering was discussed, possibly in the Glasgow area where there was a day school for maladjusted children. However, Mrs. Beattie stated that after reading the reports and hearing of Mark's behaviour, she did not think that at this time a foster placement was appropriate. This was agreed.

Miss A. Cuthill, Psychologist, suggested to the group that Balrossie be considered and with the involvement with community parents it could be possible that Mark could eventually go to them. It was questioned and discussed how Mark would re-establish himself in another residential setting. Other alternatives suggested were Southanan and Ballinkinrain. It was agreed that a request be made to the Panel for a placement at Balrossie and that Ballinkinrain be an alternative.

Mrs. Ashton had today informed social worker Ian McAlpine that the situation at home with Mark was now intollerable. It was agreed that if Mrs. Ashton wished Mark to be removed now a placement in a children's home be found until Thornton School starts on the 18th August. Ian McAlpine and Alison Cuthill agreed to inform Mrs. Ashton of the decision.

At present there is a Residential Order to be at Thornton.

Recommendation:

Request be made to Panel for placement at Balrossie - Ballinkinrain to be a second choice.

If necessary Mark to be moved to a children's home until Thornton School opens 18th August.

Since this time, an application was made to Cartvale School, Glasgow but unfortunately no place was available until after Christmas. As a consequence, Mark was around the house all day and the relationship between Mark and his father deteriorated. Mark began running off to see his mother without permission whenever there was a difficult situation at home.

Mark and his father feel that they now cannot get on together, and he is outwith his control.

Although Mrs. Ashton has accepted Mark at the moment, she states she is not able or willing to let him stay with her permanently, and similarly feels he is outwith her control also.

In conclusion, as Mark is now not prepared to reside with his father and his mother is unwilling to take care of him, then a residential placement needs to be found for Mark and the order should be varied to a Section 44 (1)(B).

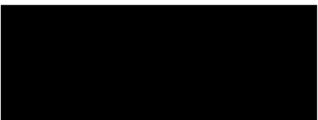

Since the last Children's Panel Mark's situation has deteriorated. Following the Panel Mark returned to Thorntoun to reside in a place of safety "pending the place at Balrossie List D. School".

This has made the situation worse in the following ways:-

1. Mark no longer has any sense of purpose or hope at Thorntoun and sees his future as completely uncertain. He has been violently destructive and needs almost constant supervision to keep within the simplest rules. He has continued to abscond.
2. Mark has continued to visit his mother and manipulate the situation there.
3. Mark has visited his father and [REDACTED]
4. Mark is, in effect, still outwith effective control by adults.

From October 10th to 22nd the school will be closed and no alternative provision has been made for Mark.

So that the situation can be brought to a head and, in the interests of Mark, we propose that from Wednesday 26th September (Date of next Panel?) Mark's place at Thorntoun will be terminated ~~for~~ which date an alternative place of safety must be found.

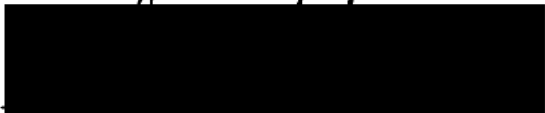

If we as a school are going to help Mark then we would require to know about specific incidents, which in turn will help us to understand his present behaviour and any future incidents. With the help of Dr. Clarke we may then be able to work out a treatment plan geared up to Mark's needs. I look forward to hearing from you.

- 1) PHYSICAL Mark is of small physical stature/a boy who takes an interest in his dress, although his personal hygiene is not perfect. He is a nervous boy, regularly bites his nails and has clawed large amounts of skin off his fingers. He has had a cough but other than this he is healthy. Mark admits to having difficulty sleeping at night, saying he cannot get to sleep until at least 1.00 a.m.
- 2) RESPONSE TO TREATMENT Mark has had great difficulty settling into the unit and presents as a quiet, introverted, boy with a very anxious, sad expression. He does not respond readily to direction and needs to be watched when told to do something, otherwise he will probably not do it. At night time his behaviour has been poor and on numerous occasions he has been pulled up about it.
- 3) RELATIONSHIPS WITH PEERS Within his peer group is neither liked nor accepted and is only now starting to be tolerated. Although, one feels, he wants to be part of the group his cultural group outside 'The Mods' is frowned upon by the rest of the group. He has tried to gain acceptance acting up and being silly in front of the group but this did not even get a laugh. Usually this would also gain status but in Mark's case it had the opposite effect. Initially he was the object of both verbal and physical bullying although the latter has not been seen. It is only now that Mark admits to it though he refuses to talk about it, probably through fear of retribution. Mark says that he does not like any of the boys in the unit.
- 4) RELATIONSHIPS WITH ADULTS Mark does not seek out adult attention but when under pressure from his peer group will usually keep in view of a member of staff. Mark needs firm but friendly handling with clearly defined limits otherwise, as has been shown, he will do what he wants, or as little as possible. However, on a one to one, Mark can relax and become quite articulate. Of all the staff in Kerelaw Mark says that he prefers the company of the only female member of staff in the unit.

5a) EDUCATIONAL PROFILE Short term assessment

In English Mark is a fairly competent reader. He is not interested in correcting his mistakes and thus his written work is poor. He works quietly but does not ask for help if stuck.

In Maths Mark can add, subtract and manage the simplest of multiplication.

In Science Mark shows a poor standard of written and practical work. He has difficulty with some basic concepts. He does work away quietly.

In Art Mark's ability is hampered by his behaviour. He finds the less formal layout of the classroom difficult and rarely gives good work. He is a very negative influence in the Art room and rarely participates in the work.

In the Paintshop Mark shows very little genuine interest and his work can be quite careless. He is easily distracted.

In the Workshop(Woodwork) Mark is limited in his ability to listen to instruction and carry out simple tasks. This can be quite worrying as safety is extremely important and Mark does not seem to have any natural awareness of danger or respect for machines.

The comments are mainly concerning Mark's attitude as he has not been with the education side long enough to judge his ability more fully.

5b) BEHAVIOUR Mark's behaviour within the more formal classrooms causes no real management problem. His attitude towards education is quite negative though and he can be insolent and lazy. In the more practical classes however Mark's behaviour can deteriorate quite markedly. There, he can be devious and disruptive and he shows a need for one to one attention to ensure that the class dynamics do not suffer unduly.

5c) RELATIONSHIPS Mark does not seem to be very popular with his peers though this does not cause any problems in the classrooms. He seems happier since the recent arrival of a friend from a previous placement. Perhaps this will help Mark to settle more into the unit and school. Mark can be cheeky and insolent to staff and seems to take his own time to accept and relate to staff. He seems wary of authority figures but it is early days in terms of relationships with staff.

6) HOBBIES Mark's leisure time is not particularly well occupied but he does enjoy watching television, playing snooker and table tennis, going swimming, or reading.

7) AREAS WHICH APPEAR TO NEED SPECIAL ATTENTION

- a) Mark's poor relationship with his peers
- b) His general behaviour, especially night time
- c) His behaviour when at home and out in the community
- d) Mark's peer group at home.

8) PRESENT AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The chairperson expressed disappointment when Mrs. Ashton declared her expectation of Kerelaw keeping Mark until he is 16 years old. Mark also expects to remain in Kerelaw until he is 16 years old. Concern was expressed regarding Mark's behaviour in classes particularly Art. Mrs. Ashton expressed her surprise as Mark has some natural artistic ability.

10) RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1) Continued emphasis on behavioural contract jointly formulated by Mr. Frow, Mrs. Ashton and Mark.
- 2) Contract to be reviewed in May 1985.

1) PHYSICAL Mark is a boy of small stature who takes an interest in his appearance and personal hygiene. Since his last review Mark's nervous habit of nail biting and skin chewing seems to have diminished. His health is generally very good although he still has difficulty getting to sleep at night and as a result is very tired in the morning.

2) RESPONSE TO TREATMENT Mark needs a lot of attention but due to the large number of children in the unit this can be difficult at times. As a result his behaviour deteriorates to gain this attention resulting in Mark being told off. Linked with this attention is Mark's response to direction, often needing to be watched when told to do something. His night time behaviour has improved. Generally Mark will co-operate with staff when he is settled within the unit.

3) RELATIONSHIPS WITH PEERS One of Mark's biggest problems is his inability to mix within his peer group. Within a large group Mark is bullied and put upon by the other boys. He best operates within a small group but even then has difficulty in being accepted. Mark's relationships within the group fluctuate. If the group is settled he tends to be tolerated more but as things become unsettled, being at the bottom of the pecking order, Mark is the first one to be blamed or verbally bullied. He appears to have no close friends in the unit and is often seen on his

5a) EDUCATIONAL PROFILE It must be stressed that this educational profile is based mainly on last term's attainment and attitude as this new term has not been running long enough for an up to date profile.

In English Mark when concentrating can work reasonably well though he has little grasp of the English basics. His work is careless as he makes mistakes even when copying spelling from a book. He seems interested in reading on occasions though at other times he has no wish to settle to any activity.

In Maths Mark can add and subtract. He has grasped the concepts of

5a)...multiplication and division and little more. It is difficult to gauge his true potential as his behaviour and attention seem to fluctuate with the tides.

In Science Mark tries hard to please and has a basic understanding of knowledge though this is hampered by his inability to write fluently. He lacks patience with the practical side of the subject.

In Art Mark's behaviour is showing significant improvement. He shows good all round ability in design and expressive modes of work. He concentrates well when motivated and has now realised the boundaries and limitations of the art room set-up.

In the Paintshop Mark when interested and in the correct frame of mind can work well but if the job is not to his liking he will show very little interest in it. He does not have a great deal of practical skill and cannot persevere if the job requires any degree of thought.

In the Wood/Metalwork shops it is extremely difficult to get Mark to settle down to any work and what he does produce is of a very poor standard.

In P.E. Mark rarely concentrates on anything for any length of time. He did however work hard at athletics and cricket and gained respect by his skill as a batsman.

5b) BEHAVIOUR Mark's behaviour fluctuates markedly. Normally he "floats" through the school happily doing his own thing but he can be unpredictable. He is easily distracted and affected by others around him and cannot handle any slugging. He quickly rises to any bait and can be difficult to reason with.

It seems at times that Mark deliberately sets out to annoy by doing things he knows are "out of bounds". He sometimes craves attention at any cost occasionally ostracising himself to achieve it.

5c) RELATIONSHIPS Mark's relationships with most staff seem to be on a superficial level. He does not relate well to the staff and finds meaningful communication very difficult. He does not seem to be popular with his peers though we feel there has been an improvement in this area. When Mark is not attention seeking he can be very witty and pleasant. I hope (O.Frazer) this side of Mark will develop during his stay here and by his next review we will have a positive development in his profile.

4) RELATIONSHIPS WITH ADULTS Mark needs and wants staff attention. He is grossly attention seeking to the extent of hiding in the unit so that the staff will look for him. 10) RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1) Extended weekend leave to include Sunday nights at home
- 2) Eventual midweek overnight visits home
- 3) If leave programme runs successfully, then 'unofficial day boy status' will be considered
- 4) Continued contact with psychologist (including contact with Mrs. Ashton).

- 1) PHYSICAL Mark has changed very little in stature since arriving at Kerelaw. He still takes an interest in his personal hygiene but his appearance over the past three months has deteriorated. Mark's nervous habits of nail biting and skin chewing seem to have almost stopped. His general health is good.
- 2) RESPONSE TO TREATMENT At the last review it was agreed that staff could try to ignore Mark's negative attention seeking. This seems to have worked in that this negative behaviour has almost disappeared although we should never underestimate Mark's understanding of the situation. That is to say, self awareness of the situation could have been sufficient. Mark's general attitude within the unit is a lot more positive although his bad language leaves a lot to be desired. He now goes home two nights during the week, Wednesday and Thursday, but is experiencing some difficulty getting in for 9 p.m.
- 3) RELATIONSHIPS WITH PEERS Mark continues as before within his peer group. Nothing seems to have changed. As the group fluctuates so does Mark and his behaviour. He is still bullied, more verbally than physically, and because of his past behaviour tends to be blamed for any problem in the unit. He has no close friends but operates better within a small group.
- 4) RELATIONSHIPS WITH ADULTS Mark still needs staff attention but not to such a degree as before. During the past three months Mark has been made more aware of his problems and through discussion seems to have tackled them with some success. 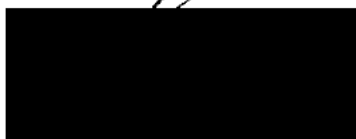

Mark was admitted into Fleming Unit at Kerelaw School on 20 2 85. Initially he had great difficulty settling into the unit, did not respond readily to staff direction, and needed constant supervising. Staff were very concerned with Mark's disruptive behaviour at night time and some bizzare behaviour he showed during the day. However, over the past eleven months Mark's behaviour has generally improved and staff are pleased with his progress, although there is still room to improve.

Within his peer group, in the unit, Mark has had difficulty integrating. Initially he was neither liked nor accepted and was the object of both verbal and physical bullying. As time has passed this has died down and he is now tolerated although this toleration fluctuates with the mood of the group. In the past Mark has tried to gain acceptance through "acting up" and immature behaviour directed at staff. This usually would gain status among his peers but in Mark's case it had the opposite effect. Mark operates best within a small group but even has difficulty being accepted. For the most part Mark is an isolate and counselling sessions seem unable to help this situation.

Mark needs and wants staff attention. He has, in the past, been grossly attention seeking, using negative behaviour to this end. However, through a treatment programme of ignoring the negative but praising the positive behaviour, Mark's relationships with staff have improved and his negative behaviour diminished. During the past 4 months, through counselling sessions, Mark has been made more aware of his problems, not only for the present but future. Mark seems to have tackled these with some degree of success. He communicates more on an adult level and a lot of his silly childish talk has disappeared. However, Mark is going to need a lot of support from adults in the future.

Over the past eleven months, in the classrooms, Mark has made good progress. His behaviour has improved as has his school work. He found great difficulty concentrating for a whole lesson but now finds this no problem. He shows some talent in art and can be outstanding at times in P.E. Mark operates best in a well structured class.

Since his arrival at Kerelaw Mark's contact at home has been erratic. He could go home every weekend but due to his poor behaviour in school or at home - he has lost about one third of his weekends. Mrs Ashton has contacted the school on a number of occasions saying his behaviour is so poor she does not want him home.

A lot of the problems seem to relate to Mark's inability to get on with his younger brother. If something goes wrong in the house Mark usually gets the blame, [REDACTED]

At the time of writing this report Mrs Ashton has again said she doesn't want Mark home. [REDACTED]

For Mark's future it was hoped that he would become a day boy, that is living at home but being educated at Kerelaw. He was on a treatment programme of gradual integration back into the home over the past three months but this broke down two weeks ago and at present there seems no chance of this starting up again. Mark has expressed an interest in being a motor mechanic, which shows he is thinking about the future, but at present he has more important things to concentrate on.

To conclude we at Kerelaw are happy with Mark's progress, given what he was like initially. We feel that we have more to offer Mark and would like to keep him at Kerelaw until he is sixteen. However, we are very concerned about his home situation and what, if anything, this has to offer him in the future.

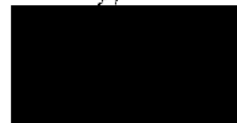

- 11-9-85 At his review it was decided that we would start Mark on a gradual program leading towards day boy. By the next W/E he would come back on Monday. Mother very apprehensive about this. We expect Mark's behavior to improve.
- 16-9-85 Mark 25 minutes late back from W/E on Monday.
- 3-10-85 Mark has now been home for 3 days W/E. Bringing back slightly late but no problem. His behavior has improved. He's liked not only the day boy program but also his rise in the pecking order.

Mark Ashton: (2-7-70)

This is a report compiled for an emergency review following Mrs Ashton expressing a view that she wants her son to be moved to a 'List G' school and Kerelaw's concern about Mark's behaviour.

Mark was admitted into Kerelaw on 20th February 1985, 21 days ago. During this time he has presented himself as a quiet, introverted, boy with a very anxious, sad expression. At times he appears to be in a world of his own, day dreaming, totally unaware of his surroundings. He regularly bites his nails and has clawed large amounts of skin off his fingers. Although his personal hygiene is not perfect he clothes are clean and he takes a personal interest in his dress. At present he has a cough but other than this he is healthy.

Within his peer group Mark is neither liked nor accepted and is near the bottom of the pecking order. Although, one feels, he wants to be part of the group Mark has difficulty in making appropriate approaches. Acting up and being silly usually gains status and a laugh from the group but this seems to have had the opposite effect. He is the object of verbal bullying and probably physical though ^{the latter} this has not been seen. Mark refuses to comment on this, ~~and~~ which is understandable as it could lead to further

retribution from his peers.

Mark does not seek out adult attention but when under pressure from his peer group will usually keep in view of a member of staff. With Mark needs firm but friendly handling with clearly defined limits otherwise, as has been shown, he will do what he wants, or as little as possible. However, on a one to one Mark can relax and becomes quite articulate.

During his leisure time Mark likes to watch the television, play snooker, play table tennis or go swimming.

As was expressed before Mark's behaviour was causing some concern within Keelaw. The following is a documented list of the incidents that have occurred since Mark was admitted.

Day ①:- Misbehaving in dorm just as lights were about to go out. Stopped when told.

Day ②:- Misbehaving in dorm 15 minutes after lights day staff had gone off duty. Stopped but 20 minutes later found in another dorm jumping from bed to bed.

Day ③:- Outwith a group at Byr balls hit an 8 year old boy for no apparent reason. Lost his weekend leave for this.

Day ⑦:- Incident with another boy where Mark threw the snooker cue across the room and broke it. No reason given.

- 4-10 April Mark for the most of the time only one in the unit due to Easter holidays. Well behaved
- 11-15 April Mark at home. Returned 1/2 hr late.
- 20-21 April Mark out for W/E leave. F.T.R.
- 23 April Mark eventually returned to Keelaw. Stated he was being bullied by [redacted] and made a statement to this effect.
- 26-28 April Mark lost this W/E leave. Problem with Mark and some does. Mark telling different stories. We choose to accept the story that he stole them. He will pay the shop back out of his own money.
- 27 April Home visit with Neil.
- 29 April Acting up in dorm
- 30 April Mark took a file from the metalwork room. Had it with the intention of attacking [redacted]. No reason given but denied all.
- 1st May Mark carrying a [redacted] in dorm. Found dormsters until others asleep.
- 2nd May Mark smoking upstairs. Pigs stayed until Sat p.m.
- 3rd May Mark involved with another in the breaking of window in the port room. Staff on duty 95% certain that he threw the ball which hit the window.
- 6th May Mark involved in shy smoking and setting off of alarm to next door. Lost smokes for 24 hrs.
- 3-6 May Lost W/E due to does and bad behaviour.
- 11-12 May Mark home for W/E leave. Did not arrive back until 9.40 p.m. on the Sunday.
- 30-5-85 Mark seen to be more integrated with the group and is getting some good reports from class and unit. He lost W/E matter has said on the phone that Mark stole money. He is up tomorrow, when the matter will be discussed further.
- 6-5-85 Mark lost last W/E due to default at home. At the spot Mark & Mother has talk. Mark lost his rag and ripped out a string of abuse at her. Mother refused to see Mark at home. Friday night he ran away but was picked up immediately and returned. Petitioned well in the spots. Sunday very bad day!! Wednesday locked himself in staff toilet due to peer pressure. Taking a lot of pressure from his peer group.

Mark has now been in Fleming one week. He soon started showing his true colours jumping about from bed to bed in [redacted] room after lights out. On 22nd he went swimming and during his time in the pool he hit a 8 year old boy. Nearly had Kerelaw banned from the pool. Because of this he lost his weekend leave. Since then he has become the object of verbal bullying. However, at the weekend he was asked to abscond but in conversation to me he stated that he did not want to run away but to earn his next weekend. f

6-3-85

Another week but Mark still gives presents behavior for concern. An incident with [redacted] ended up with Mark throwing the smokes cue at Jim. The cue was broken. Mark offered no reason for this incident. Night time he still likes to carry on. 5-3-85 himself a [redacted] carrying on. Got up early and later cleared round the outside of the unit. His parcel was on 27-2-85. What should have been a 5 minute leaving turned into 50 minutes. Out of the meeting came stories of bigger brawls over the past few months. The parcel wanted Mark to be placed in a 'List A' school but S.W. ~~was~~ stated that none would touch him. Generally within the unit Mark has not been accepted by the rest of the group and is the object of a lot of verbal threats. f

27-3-85

Mark continues to cause concern with his behavior. The group are not prepared to accept him and he is continually threatened by them. He also the object of ridicule. His behavior within the unit is far from good. Night time he misbehaves, in the dorms, during the day he regularly does silly things. A small incident with [redacted] developed into nearly a full scale battle. Mark Ashton managed to upset [redacted] with 5 words but just stood quite calm while Presta roared & raved. The F.T.R. after verbal leave lost. I went to pick him up. He now has a contract which he must follow at home. If he does not then he be brought back from W/E leave early.

- 1) Tidy bedroom every day.
- 2) The door handles to stay on the door.
- 3) Must be in by 11 p.m. or 11.30 p.m. if there is a disco.
- 4) Do not lock yourself in any room of the house.
