Comment	Brian commenced Buvidal treatment 22.12.2020 transferring from Espranor. He was maintained on Buvidal 96mgs PRS until 07.06.2023 when he defaulted and fell out of treatment. Brian re-commenced Buvidal treatment 24.09.24 (Buvidal 64mgs PRS) however thereafter defaulted then refused Buvidal treatment 16.10.24. Brian contacted myself in November 2024 requesting initially a Methadone detox and then a Diazepam detox-he was medically reviewed 28.11.2024 by Matt Donaldson, Prescriber and both requests declined. Brian was not receptive to any explanations regarding safe and managed Buvidal detox and left the service very disgruntled. Since this time Brian has not responded to letters to his listed home address or voice mails left on his listed contact number. Brian will now be discharged from South ADRS.

Comment	Brian visited ADRS today wanting to speak with me-he had been to his GP who declined to prescribe Diazepam and referred him back to addiction services. Brain was adamant that he did not want Buvidal despite describing his physical state as 'rattling'. The point of his visit was to complain about ADRS however the substance of his accusations were paranoid and at points nonsensical. Eventually Brian left disgruntled.

He does not want any form of OST and was only interested in getting diazepam and to speak to a Doctor as I was just a pharmacist. I told him this was not an option today and that I have the same prescribing rights and follow the same guidance as the ADRS doctors. He again became irrate and without having him to discuss diazepam usage he left the room and confirmed he does not want our service.

Brian originally commenced Buvidal (96mgs) treatment 07.12 2020, had an unsuccessful period of detox with restart Buvidal 64mgs 21.09.2023. Brian frequently reports illicit drug use, in particular illicit benzodiazepine and less frequently illicit opiates. He elected to enter detox again 28.06.24. Brian was seriously assaulted approximately 10 years ago and sustained serious leg injuries restricting his mobility. He has Chronic Pulmonary Lung Disease and is noticeably thin. What historical risk factors are there that it is important to be aware of? Brian has a adult history of poly-substance misuse and has relapsed whilst on Buvidal treatment. What are the obstacles to risk management/what risks can't be changed? Brian appears socially isolated and appears to have distanced himself from his previous church volunteering work. What factors are present that reduce risk? Brian has proceeded to detox in 2023 however relapsed after a few months-his lifestyle and social support is less robust than in previous years. Risk Management Under what circumstances are risks likely to increase (This information must be shared with service user/family/carers)? Increased risk if Brian associates with other illicit drug users which could be compounded by his current social isolation. In addition, his memory and cognitive function have shown a steady decline over the past few years. Authorisation from Matt Donaldson, Prescriber to administer. Brian reported using heroin (smoked) and was agitated throughout his consultation, had difficulty focusing on questions. I emphasised that he had to manage his Buvidal appointments otherwise abstinence would be more difficult to achieve. He appears to have ongoing harrasment from his nephew and I advised that he avoid contact and report him to the police if he was extorting money.
