

Attainment Levels

The National Guidelines of the 5-14 Programme describe progression through 5 levels A-E.

- Level A:** should be attainable in the course of P1 - P3 by almost all pupils.
- Level B:** should be attainable by some pupils in P3 or even earlier, but certainly by most in P4.
- Level C:** should be attainable in the course of P4 - P6 by most pupils.
- Level D:** should be attainable by some pupils earlier than P7, but certainly by most in P7.
- Level E:** should be attainable by some pupils in P7 / S1 but certainly by most in S2.

This report indicates the 5-14 level your child is either working on or has achieved. If the report indicates >C this means he/she has already attained Level B and is working towards Level C. If a National Test has been given during the course of the school year (this confirms that a child has reached that level) this is shown on the report.

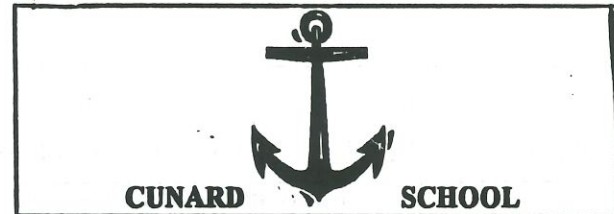
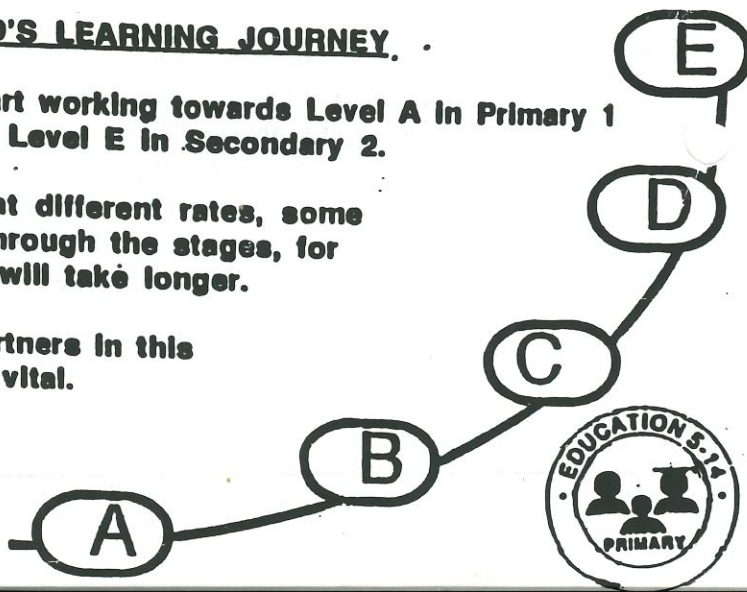
YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING JOURNEY

E N G L I S H L A N G U A G E	Listening	B	Very distracted during stories and when listening for instructions. Darren would make less mistakes if he listened at the proper time. He now repeats instructions back to me. This approach has had some success.	Expressive Arts	Music: This term: listening and inventing. Darren showed little interest in the listening activities and was easily distracted. However, he enjoyed the inventing aspect and worked with various tuned and untuned percussion to produce his own piece of music. P.E: This term: developing skills using equipment. Initially, Darren's behaviour in the gym was quite poor and this hindered his progress. Over the last few weeks however, his effort and behaviour have been very good. He has good co-ordination and control over his movements. Drama: This term: Mime in the context of their theme of the circus. Participated enthusiastically and appropriately.
	Talking	A	Tends to shout out answers. Discusses appropriately during various discussions. Initially, Darren tended to be very unsettled during group discussions and would try to disrupt other children. However, there has been a big improvement and although sometimes inattentive, he does not disrupt the other children.		
	Reading	B	Presently working on Link-Up Level 9. This is below the level at which he should be working for his age. Comprehension and reading are very good. Next term he will begin work on the Reading 2000 programme of work and if he copes well with this, he will then be at the appropriate level for his age.	Environmental Studies	This term: 'Materials' and 'Moving things'. Darren coped well with this work. With support, he was able to make good guesses at probable outcomes, carry out fair tests and discuss the inferences of these tests. He was also able to write a short report about his findings.
	Writing	A	Responds well during pre-writing discussions but does not like having to put his ideas down on paper. He is fairly good at his personal writing although he still has a lot of work to do in terms of organising his work into sentences. His handwriting and presentation are poor although his individual letter formation is correct.	Religious/Moral Education	The class theme this term is 'Caring for others' and 'Showing forgiveness'. Darren responded appropriately during the discussions.
M A T H E M A T I C S	Number Money & Measurement	B	Working on Henemann level 3, workbook 1 and coping well. Darren should be further on than this but if he keeps up this level of interest he should catch up.	Behaviour	This term, Darren's behaviour has been quite poor on a number of occasions. He has been verbally and physically abusive to adults and children alike. Quite often he has not wanted to work and has ran out of the class and even out of the school. Over the past few weeks however, he has been much more settled and has tried really hard to get his behaviour right. He is also more able to accept reprimands.
	Information Handling	B	Can collect, organise, display and interpret pictographs and simple bar graphs using appropriate language. Also used computer 'Graphers' package to create graphs.		
	Shape, Position & Movement	B	Completed all of the shape and measure work for Heinemann level 2 and coped well.		
	Problem Solving & Enquiry	A	Completed practical problem-solving activities for number, money and shape at level 2 with minimum support.		

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

If you need to see a doctor

Take this card with you and show it to your doctor if he asks to see it. If you cannot produce this card the doctor may charge a fee for which he will give you a receipt showing how to get this money refunded.

Accidents and Emergencies

First try to contact your own doctor, or a doctor who is covering for him. If he is not available, you can get treatment from any NHS family doctor.

If you are away from home within the UK FOR LESS THAN 3 MONTHS

You can apply for NHS treatment to any local family doctor. Just show this card or give your NHS number (which is on the front of this card).

If you intend to go ABROAD FOR MORE THAN 3 MONTHS

Please send this card back to your local Health Board (address on Page 1) with a note of the date you intend to leave this country. Our address is on the front. You will need to re-register with a doctor when you return home.

If you change your address

Tell your doctor your new address as soon as you can. This is in case your doctor has to write to you or visit you at home. Also tell your Health Board (address on Page 1) who may have to write to you about health screening programmes. If you have moved out of the area that your doctor covers, you should ask your doctor if he is still willing to provide you with general medical services. If not, you should transfer to the list of a doctor nearer to your new place of residence as soon as possible.

You and your Doctor

Your doctor will have a practice leaflet containing information to help you, such as consulting times and the services available to patients.

Home visits

Please do not ask the doctor to make a home visit unless the patient is too ill to attend the surgery. Unless it is an emergency, please contact the surgery as early as possible preferably before 10 a.m., as this helps the doctor to plan his visits.

IF YOU WANT TO CHANGE YOUR DOCTOR

You can do this at any time - you do not have to have a special reason. Just complete Page 4 of this card and give it to the doctor whose list you wish to join. If the doctor is willing to accept you, he will sign the card and send it to the Health Board. We will send you a new card showing your new doctor's name. You may go to your new doctor for treatment as soon as he has accepted you. If you are under 16 years of age, you will need to have this application completed by an adult representative.
