

I, _____ agree that whilst I am a pupil of this school I will not:

1. Bring drink or drugs into the school at any time.

Reasons:

- a) Drink/drugs alter behaviour and make people act in an unreasonable fashion and create general excitement and unrest throughout the school.
- b) There are quite a number of younger boys in the school who should not be exposed to this kind of experience.
- c) If drink/drugs are coming into the school it leaves me open to being bullied or pressured into bringing drugs or drink in to supply other boys. This is not what I want.

2. I will not commit any offences in the local community.

Reasons:

- a) I agree that I should not be offending at any time but we receive as a school a lot of support from the local community and it is unfair for any young person in this school to offend against a community which supports us.
- b) Offending in the local community affects the whole of the school. It affects our reputation as good neighbours and leaves us open to the charge 'that it's only these boys at Ballikinrain again'.

In signing this agreement, I accept that if I break these conditions there will be consequences of my actions and a range of sanctions maybe imposed. The ultimate would be a referral back to a children's hearing, and the possibility that my place in Ballikinrain School would be in jeopardy.
