Group were on a raft building exercise when Jordan decided it would be a laugh to push a fully clothed [redacted] off the wooden platform and into the water. This infuriated [redacted] who lashed out at Jordan.

Jordan had thought it would be laugh, but [redacted] did not see the funny side, and kicked out at Jordan. Jordan would not accept this in front of the peer group, and tried to hit back.
