[REDACTED] immediately said to me "I hate Marion and Steve it's because of them we're in care". I said to [REDACTED] this wasn't true, he kept saying it was, as his dad told him. Mr Tarbett said to me he had just been to see my boss and it was true, you didn't know anything about it. I suggested to Mr tarbett we didn't discuss this at this time as this was his time to spend with his children. Mr Tarbett did not make good use of his time with the children, he did not encourage them to play with the toys or behave. Mr Tarbett spent most of his time on the phone to the Social Work Department and his solicitor.

Mr Tarbett told the children their mother was in Dundee yesterday then went on about her not going to see them.

Mr Tarbett gave the children invitations to a party on Saturday, saying he would be for them to take them to the party. Mr Tarbett went to the gate of the FC to speak to a woman, taking the children to go with them. While Mr Tarbett was talking to the woman, [REDACTED] climbed over the fence went on to the road then into Mr Tarbett's car. Mr Tarbett did not try and stop him. William then went out of the gate and on to the road, again Mr Tarbett did not try and stop him.

Mr Tarbett told the children Social Workers were not allowing them to go to the party on Saturday. Mr Tarbett told them he would be for them to take them to the party adding I'll be down to smash the windows of the houses where you are staying and I'm going to get the people who are looking after you.

All three children got very upset when leaving the FC. They were saying they were to be in care for a year. They weren't going to see their dad again, their dad had said this to them. I told them this was not true, they were seeing their dad next week, I was taking them to see their dad.

Once in the car [REDACTED] asked me to put the music on. The children all immediately settled and sang along to the nursery rhymes. The children didn't mention their dad again.

William, [REDACTED] to Douglas FC. Mr Tarbett, Ms Archer and [REDACTED] were there. All children were very boisterous and at times girny, 'arguementative with each other. Parents were unable to control their behaviour or calm them down. [REDACTED] climbed over the furniture, jumped from chair to chair to table, he wouldn't sit down for any length of time and concentrate on any thing. Mr Tarbett and Ms Archer commented on his behaviour and wondered why he was behaving like this. Mr Tarbett then said his behaviour is no worse than other children's. Mr Tarbett said he beha behaves where he is living as he is like a stranger living with these people, they don't love him the way we do. Ms Archer made more of an effort to interact and speak to the children. Mr Tarbett made an effort to speak to the children, William was keen to sit with him. [REDACTED] showed some interest [REDACTED] very little.

About half way through the visit [REDACTED] (Mr Tarbett and Ms Archer said he was children's brother) arrived. I asked Mr Tarbett if it had been arranged for [REDACTED] to come today. Mr Tarbett said he doesn't have to make arrangements for him to come and see the children. There was no mention of this at the Panel. There was very little interaction between [REDACTED] and the children or conversation. [REDACTED] asked the children where they were staying, were they happy, were the people good to them, why weren't they all together. The children paid very little attention to him. [REDACTED] then directed his questions to Mr Tarbett. Ms Archer told them to stop talking about this which they eventually did.

All children were keen to leave with me and settled down once in the car. No mention of parents from the children.
