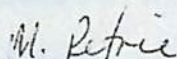

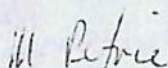

I collected [REDACTED] from school. [REDACTED] was chatty about her friends, school, her birthday. [REDACTED] asked if it was her mum she was going to see, then asking if [REDACTED] would be there. We were about 5 minutes late due to time [REDACTED] gets out of school and traffic. [REDACTED] carried bag of games into Child and Family Centre.

Linda (mum) was in Child and Family Centre. She had [REDACTED] birthday presents and cards laid out on coffee table. [REDACTED] ran over to her mum giving her a hug, both chatted together, Linda (mum) wishing [REDACTED] 'happy birthday' for Sunday, pointing out her presents [REDACTED] hadn't noticed them). Linda wasn't sure whether she should open them or wait until William and [REDACTED] arrived, she did decide to open her presents and we all spent the time doing this and playing with her toys.

I advised Linda (mum), William would be about 10 minutes late in arriving as [REDACTED] was brining him and she had an appointment arranged. She had no objection.

[REDACTED] was brought to visit by worker from Strathmore Cottages. Gave worker swimming consent form for [REDACTED] signed by Linda (mum).

[REDACTED] came in, happily acknowledging all of us, gave his mum a hug. All spoke about [REDACTED] birthday [REDACTED] keen to show [REDACTED] what she got and for him to play with her toys along with her. Linda (mum) interacted well with them, able to divert her attention between them, encouraging them to tell her what they have been doing. At times they weren't forthcoming and just seemed to want to play. [REDACTED] spoke about being bullied by [REDACTED] immediately said "I'll batter her". Linda (mum) and I talked [REDACTED] out of this, also getting [REDACTED] to say more. She said Auntie [REDACTED] knows about this and sorts it out. [REDACTED] told his mum he was going to the doctors tomorrow as he is passing blood when he goes to the toilet. I told Linda (mum) I didn't know anything about this but I will speak to Philip McGill, social worker, and he will keep her informed.

[REDACTED] had been held-up longer than intended and William was only at visit for 20 minutes. Linda (mum) was alright about this. I told her it could be arranged for her to have more time with William at another time. She said it was alright. William was pleased to see everyone, asked for his sweets then wandered about the room quite happily. [REDACTED] showed him her toys she got for her birthday and was keen to include him in their play. William was really happier wandering about eating his sweets, he wasn't very forthcoming when Linda (mum) tried to chat to him. Linda (mum) had a camera with her and took some photographs of them all. Towards the end of the visit, [REDACTED] started to get a bit hyper, climbing on the chairs, Linda (mum) and I tried to put a stop to this, at one stage [REDACTED] was a bit cheeky to me but stopped when told off for this by his mum. [REDACTED] also got a little upset when [REDACTED] started to act silly towards her, again Linda (mum) intervened and was able to put a stop to this, controlling the situation.

I collected [redacted] from school, she immediately said "I am going to see my dad today", asked "will he have birthday presents for me as I didn't get anything from him" [redacted] then went on to chat about school, her friends, aunt [redacted] her birthday party. She spoke about it being her brother's birthday soon. We were about 15 minutes late in arriving at the Child and Family Centre as I had to wait on [redacted] coming out of school [redacted] carried bags of games into the Child and Family Centre, she put them down on a chair.

Mr Tarbett was in the Child and Family Centre, he was sitting at the table. I apologised to Mr Tarbett for being late due to having to wait on [redacted] coming out of school, he did not comment. Mr Tarbett said to [redacted] her birthday present was on the table beside him. She went over and opened her presents, Spice girl bag a watch and a few other things, she didn't get the T-Shirt he had said he was getting for her. There was no mention of it from either of them. Time was spent with [redacted] playing with her gifts, her showing them to me, very little conversation between [redacted] and her dad as [redacted] was not very forthcoming when Mr Tarbett made brief conversation with her [redacted] did ask if [redacted] was coming, Mr Tarbett said that he did not know. Mr Tarbett gave [redacted] her bag of goodies, he had a bag for her, [redacted] and William.

Mr Tarbett said that he did want next visit to take place on Tuesday 23rd of December

[redacted] was brought to visit by worker from Strathmore Cottages [redacted] came in quite bouncy, he had his Christmas presents for his dad, [redacted] and William with him. Giving his dad and [redacted] theirs also giving [redacted] her birthday present. Mr Tarbett and I said there would be another visit with his dad before Christmas, but [redacted] would not listen, he wanted them to open their presents, he was verbally abusive towards me.

William arrived, he was brought to the visit by Phillip McGill, Social Worker. William was also given his Christmas present from [redacted] children were all quite hyper at the time while opening their presents, Mr Tarbett did not open his [redacted] gave his dad present for [redacted] Both boys asked if [redacted] would be coming to visit, Mr Tarbett told them he did not know. I managed to get [redacted] and William to play a game together but unfortunately this only lasted for a short time. Mr Tarbett asked [redacted] if he plays near Stack Leisure Park in Lochee as someone had told him he had seen him [redacted] did not seem to know where he was talking about and said he did not go there [redacted] spoke to his dad about [redacted] (brother) getting beaten-up. [redacted] speaking in a bravado manner said he, his older brother, his dad were going to get involved, get this person. William then joined in with this copying [redacted] Mr Tarbett did not discourage them from speaking like this or of any of them getting involved.

When I tried to discourage this [redacted] was again verbally abusive towards me [redacted] also spoke about being beaten up by staff at Strathmore Cottages to his dad. Mr Tarbett asked when and what happened, [redacted] said when he is being bad, hurting himself or staff, staff stop him by putting his arm up his back.

[redacted] asked if anyone would like to play a game and tried to do this but no one took any interest of her.

Throughout the visit [redacted] would run about the room hitting and swearing at William and [redacted] encouraging them to do likewise which they did which then ended up with William in tears several times. When [redacted] wanted to sit at the table to write and draw in her book, he annoyed and disrupted her until she too ended up in tears. Mr Tarbett tried to put a stop to this but [redacted] paid very little attention to him.

It continued to be chaotic when they were getting ready to leave but all happily said goodbye to their dad. Worker for Strathmore Cottages returned for [redacted] I returned William and [redacted] Home, they both chatted happily to each other in the car. William was keen to show [redacted] a certificate he had got from school, which was hanging up in the [redacted] and I both went in with William to see it, spent only a short time with him [redacted] continued to chat happily with me on the way home but became verbally abusive with me when I wanted her to put her coat on before leaving my car [redacted] became upset, she then calmed down.

[redacted] was quite changeable from getting on with everyone to being verbally abusive to everyone. Linda (mum) gave all the children £10 each [redacted] went on about this quite a bit and then on about all the money his mum had, showing off a £50 note of hers. Linda (mum) told him the £50 and the rest of her money was to pay a bill. Linda (mum) interacted well with all the children and at controlling [redacted] behaviour which he did respond to, often going to his mum to give her a hug and a kiss. All helped tidy up when told to although a bit chaotic, all happily said goodbye to each other. Philip McGill returned for [redacted] [redacted] was keen for Philip to give his mum a lift home which he did. ██████████ was brought to visit by Margaret Leslie, Social Worker. I met with them in Child and Family Centre. ██████████ and Margaret were sitting playing a game together. ██████████ chatted happily to both of us, she was looking forward to Christmas.

Mr Tarbett arrived approximately 10 minutes late, he said he had difficulty getting a bus. Mr Tarbett had two bags of goodies for the children which he took over to the table and sat down. Margaret Leslie left.

██████████ went back and forward between her dad and I instigating most of the conversation, occasionally helped with her dad to share out the bags of goodies between her, ██████████ and William. ██████████ asked Mr Tarbett if ██████████ and ██████████ were coming he told her they were, sweets were also put aside for ██████████. Mr Tarbett also told ██████████ was maybe coming. ██████████ got quite excited about ██████████ coming and continually asked when they would be coming. Mr Tarbett didn't have any Christmas presents with him, he said he couldn't manage to bring them, he will get them delivered to her. Mr Tarbett went on to tell ██████████ what he had for her. I told Mr Tarbett camera was there for his use for today's visit.

Phillip McGill brought ██████████ and William to visit, they both came in quite happily, acknowledging everyone. ██████████ gave everyone Christmas cards while strutting about the room. Mr Tarbett told ██████████ and William ██████████ were coming to today's visit, they too like ██████████ continually asked throughout the visit when they would be arriving, they would even hang out of the window looking for them. Mr Tarbett told the boys he couldn't manage to bring their Christmas presents with him but he will get them delivered. ██████████ asked who would deliver them. Mr Tarbett told him Madge, my solicitor as she will get someone. Mr Tarbett then went on to tell them what he had for them. ██████████ said to his dad not to tell them what he had for them but Mr Tarbett just continued. ██████████ said several times not to tell them what presents he had for them. Children were all very boisterous throughout the visit. If I intervened ██████████ was verbally abusing me which William then copied. When ██████████ started spitting ██████████ copied him.

Throughout the visit it continued to be very chaotic. ██████████ stated he had been kicked by a member of staff at Strathmore Cottages earlier today, all wanted to know what had happened, Mr Tarbett said this is the third time this has happened. I tried to calm things down and get ██████████ to tell me, his dad what had happened. ██████████ told me he had been mucking around on the floor with a female member of staff, Phillip Yeaman came into the room and ██████████ said he accidentally kicked Phillip and Phillip kicked Michael back. ██████████ said he was lying on his back on the floor and Phillip kicked him around stomach/waist. Mr Tarbett and I both asked ██████████ to show us where he had been kicked but he wouldn't. ██████████ once again became very abusive and angry towards me, he left to go to the toilet and when he came back showed his dad and I a bruise on his back and said that was where he had been kicked. There was a small bruise, my clear impression was that this was an old bruise which I said to Mr Tarbett and ██████████. When I tried to question ██████████ more about this he became even more angry and abusive towards me, kicking chairs and throwing things at me, said he wasn't going to talk about this in his contact with his dad. I again tried to calm things down but to no avail, I therefore asked centre worker to phone office for me to ask Robin Duncan, Senior Social Worker to come over, which he did. See Robin Duncan's Detailed Record.

After Robin Duncan left children once again became quite boisterous when I tried to calm children down. ██████████ was verbally abusive to me which William copied. ██████████ said he does not want me in the room when he sees his dad, he is going to tell the children's panel this. William continually said he was going to run away, he was going to tell other people who were there. Mr Tarbett didn't discourage William from saying any of this, he would laugh, smirk at him. The children made very little use of the games, but they were never encouraged by Mr Tarbett, he wouldn't take part when the children did use them. Mr Tarbett did not use the camera even although he spoke about wanting a photograph of William (he had spoken about wanting a photograph of William as his hair is long - like Mr Tarbett's when he was young). The children ate very little of the goodies Mr Tarbett gave them.

██████████ (her partner) and ██████████ arrived about ten minutes before end of visit, I told ██████████ visit finished at four o'clock, she said she knew but she had had things to do. Children were all placed to see them. ██████████ gave the children a present each.

Event: Allegation made by [REDACTED] that he had been kicked by a member of staff at strathmore cottages.

Michael Tarbett attended a contact meeting with his father on 23/12/97 at around 3 pm in Kirkton Child and Family centre. The contact was supervised by Maureen Petrie (Social Work Assistant). [REDACTED] and brother William, were also present.

Shortly after the contact had started [REDACTED] said he had been kicked by a member of staff at Strathmore cottages earlier in the day. He named the member of staff as Phillip Yeaman.

Maureen asked him to say what happened and he said that he had been mucking around on the floor with a female member of staff when Phillip Yeaman came into the room. He says he [REDACTED] kicked Phillip by mistake and Phillip kicked him back [REDACTED] indicated that he had been lying on the floor and that Phillip had kicked him in the stomach.

Maureen and Mr Tarbett asked [REDACTED] to show them where he had been kicked but he wouldn't and became very angry towards Maureen. He then went to the toilet and when he came back, showed Maureen and his Dad a bruise on his back and said that was where he had been kicked.

Maureen saw a small bruise but her clear impression was that it was an old bruise. When she asked him further questions he became angry and abusive again and said he wasn't going to talk about this in his contact with his Dad. He refused to say anything further about the matter throughout the contact.

At the end of the contact [REDACTED] Social Worker Phillip McGill, collected the children from the family centre in order to take them home. Mr Tarbett spoke to Mr McGill about the allegations. Mr McGill suggested that as he and Maureen were needing to transport all the children home, it would be best if Mr Tarbett came across to the office next door and discussed his concerns with Robin Duncan SSW, so that any necessary action could be taken.

Tarbett did not come to the office

I had discussions with Maureen Petrie, Margaret Moyes (Manager Family Placement) and Fred McBride (Manager Young Peoples services) on Wednesday morning, 24/12/97, and agreed that it would be appropriate to contact CAFCS to arrange a joint interview with Michael

Madge Geddes, Mr Tarbett's solicitor, phoned the office on Wednesday the 24th at around 10.30 am, to say that Mr Tarbett had been in to see her and was concerned about the allegations. She wanted to know if any action was being taken to follow up these allegations. I told her an investigation would be carried out and that she would be informed once we were clear what the outcomes were

Joint interview set up for 3 pm at Seymour lodge with Sgt Dougie Gray

Staff at Strathmore informed that [REDACTED] would be collected to go for an interview. Staff agreed to tell [REDACTED] that I was coming to see him at 2.30 but to leave discussion about the nature and purpose of the interview, until then.

[REDACTED] making it very clear that he did not want to speak I arrived. I insisted on having a discussion to make it absolutely clear to [REDACTED] that if he was not prepared to talk about this, we would not be taking any further action on the allegations he made yesterday [REDACTED] very angry and adamant that he would not speak to me or the police

Contacted CAFSES to say that [REDACTED] was refusing to discuss the allegations, didn't want to talk about them and was refusing to come to Seymour lodge. CAFSES stated they would not be prepared to take any further action in these circumstances.

[REDACTED] then became chatty about school, her friends, it being Uncle [REDACTED] birthday. [REDACTED] was keen to recite to me a poem she had learned at school. [REDACTED] asked if it was her dad she was seeing today. I told her yes, she asked if [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] would be there, I told her I didn't know, she then asked if any of her big brothers would be there, told her I didn't know, she then said [REDACTED] and William will be there, which I agreed with. [REDACTED] carried games into the Family Centre.

Mr Tarbett arrived 5 minutes late. [REDACTED] happily played with the toys while waiting for him to arrive. Mr Tarbett went over to the table with bags of goodies, asked [REDACTED] if she would like to help him share them out, which she did, there was very little conversation between them. Mr Tarbett asked [REDACTED] where the jewellery was he gave her for Christmas. [REDACTED] shrugged her shoulders then said in the house. Mr Tarbett asked [REDACTED] if she had got her ears pierced yet, she told him no. Mr Tarbett went on to say Robin Duncan had told him he would see to this, Mr Tarbett said he wanted to pay for [REDACTED] to get her ears pierced and Robin Duncan told him it would be paid for by department. I told Mr Tarbett I didn't know anything about this. [REDACTED] told her dad she is not allowed to wear jewellery to the school apart from rings and watches. [REDACTED] wandered about the room, looking for the others to arrive, asking when they would be arriving. [REDACTED] occasionally played with the toys while making brief conversation with her dad and I.

Philip McGill brought [REDACTED] and William to the visit, both boys came strutting in going over to their dad. [REDACTED] spoke about this being the last time they are all going to see their dad together and then went on about being restrained by someone at school a few days ago. I tried to make sense of all this but [REDACTED] became verbally abusive to me so I didn't try any more hoping it would calm down which it eventually did. Mr Tarbett did ask [REDACTED] why he didn't mention this at his meeting. [REDACTED] said he forgot. William spoke in a bravado sort of way about battering people and throwing things about at school. Mr Tarbett didn't try to put a stop to any of this, it was [REDACTED] who eventually told him to stop. Mr Tarbett told [REDACTED] he would see him at school next week as it was discussed at the review he could visit him at school.

Laura Dunbar, Centre Worker, joined us to assist with supervising the contact visit. Laura was met with verbal abuse from [REDACTED] and William about what was she doing her, they didn't want her in the room like they don't want me. Mr Tarbett told them she is alright as she worked at the nursery they went to, boys calmed down and said they remembered her.

Boys continued to sit at the table, [REDACTED] making most of the conversation. Mr Tarbett told William he would be getting his Christmas presents delivered to him tonight. William asked if he would be bringing them. Mr Tarbett told him no as he is not allowed to come to the house but he is getting someone to deliver them. Mr Tarbett went on to tell William what he had got for him. Throughout the visit William asked his dad about his presents and Mr Tarbett reassured him each time they would be delivered tonight.

The visit went reasonably well with the children making use of the games, toys, keen to include Laura and myself in this play. [REDACTED] and William moved more about the room taking games with them. [REDACTED] stayed more at the table where his dad was sitting. [REDACTED] played happily, keen to include me in what he was doing. I encouraged [REDACTED] to include his dad, which he did and Mr Tarbett made an effort and showed a bit of an interest.

All helped tidy up at end of visit.

Philip McGill returned for [REDACTED] I told him about [REDACTED] speaking about having been restrained at school. Phillip McGill said he would look into this, he didn't know anything about it. As [REDACTED] was leaving the room I overheard him asking his dad for money, when Mr Tarbett questioned this [REDACTED] replied he gets money from his mum.

Children all happily said goodbye to their dad. I returned William and [REDACTED] home, they were both chatty in the car, although to begin with [REDACTED] was a little hyper. [REDACTED] went in to the house with William to say hello to everyone.

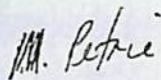

We then talked about her seeing William and [REDACTED] today and what she thought they would like to do together. We then went on to collect William from Mr and Mrs [REDACTED] he was happy to see us and keen to know where we were going and what we would be doing. While waiting for [REDACTED] to arrive, [REDACTED] and William were keen to get out the games to play with including me in their play, we were also then joined by Laura, and [REDACTED] and William were both happy to see her and for her to join in our play.

[REDACTED] told William she was going to see [REDACTED] with their mum next time she sees ^{their} mum. William didn't comment.

[REDACTED] was brought to visit by Phillip McGill. He came in and wanted to take over, didn't want to listen to any one about what we can do but when he heard we can play pool he insisted we go to resource centre to play pool which we did. [REDACTED] continued to dominate and didn't want to discuss or even allow us to talk about all the things we can do or make any suggestions as to what he would like to do or what the others would like to do. To begin with [REDACTED] and William were keen for [REDACTED] to take control and do what he wanted but they eventually became bored and lost interest. William climbed on the furniture and [REDACTED] acted silly. They wanted to talk about different things we could do but [REDACTED] wouldn't allow this. We suggested we all return to the child and family centre where we could all get something to do but [REDACTED] wouldn't agree, eventually [REDACTED] and William said they wanted to return to child and family centre. Laura took them there while I stayed with [REDACTED] allowing him to finish playing pool. When [REDACTED] and I went over to the child and family centre, [REDACTED] and William were playing happily with the toys. We managed to talk a little about what we can do next time they all see each other. William and [REDACTED] said they wanted to bake cakes. [REDACTED] wasn't keen to begin with, he wanted to play pool but eventually agreed to bake. While we were all talking, [REDACTED] wanted to become involved with the others playing with the toys but again wanted to take control.

Phillip McGill returned for [REDACTED] continued to be boisterous wanting to be in control. Phillip eventually managed to get him to leave with him.
