Clinical Indication

A few months of intermittent stabbing RUQ pain. Patient also reports can feel lump in this area. No clear lump palpable today. ?gallstones ?other pathology

Report:**Ultrasound abdomen.**

Sonographer performed and reported examination.

Reduced image quality due to patient habitus.

Unfortunately the patient did not fast and images are also degraded by excess bowel gas.

The left lobe of the liver and pancreas are obscured by bowel gas.

The liver appears normal in size and contour however demonstrates a mild increase in echogenicity suggestive of fatty infiltration. Parenchymal visualisation was poor however no gross focal abnormality demonstrated.

Unfortunately the gallbladder appears post prandial and contracted however there is a suggestion of several stones within the lumen although this is difficult to confirm. A further appointment will be sent out for a targeted fasted gallbladder scan. Normal appearance of the spleen, aorta and both kidneys.

I reviewed Mr. Brown in my outpatient clinic on 4th April 2017 at Woodland View. From an addiction point of view, Mr. Brown describes ongoing stability on his current prescribed medication. He denied any illicit drug use, nor any alcohol use. He appeared neither intoxicated nor in withdrawal at today's appointment. He attended with his partner who stayed throughout the appointment.

Mr. Brown described some recent physical health concerns. He had a mole removed from his chest which thankfully came back as benign, and does not require further treatment. He also describes ongoing knee and back pain which he has discussed with his GP. He was attacked in his close a few weeks ago, but from his description there does not seem to be any further involvement from the Police regarding this. His only other complaints were long standing descriptions of anxiety and agoraphobia and also difficulty managing his temper. Mr. Brown was quick to describe this in the context of his "depression", however, I felt it necessary to

explain to Mr. Brown that while his experiences of anxiety may make him more irritable, his difficulty managing his temper has been long standing, and that none of his previous convictions were as a consequence of his mental health. I suggested to Mr. Brown that if his temper causes problems in his relationship that he utilises similar techniques to manage his anxiety by distracting himself or giving himself some breathing space in order to control his emotions better. Mr. Brown's only other request was of a lifting of the supervision with his twice weekly collection. I do not think this is appropriate given the medication that Mr. Brown is on. He does not have any difficulty attending twice weekly for his medication, so I did not see any particular reason for the supervision to be changed. I will see him again in six months' time.

The skin lesion excised from your right chest on 23rd January 2017 has been examined under a microscope. As we had suspected, the lesion was found to be a dermatofibroma. Dermatofibromas are harmless overgrowths of fibrous tissue within the skin. They can occur following minor trauma to the skin (e.g. an insect bite), but also can occur out of the blue. They do not require treatment.

You have been discharged from the Dermatology clinic.

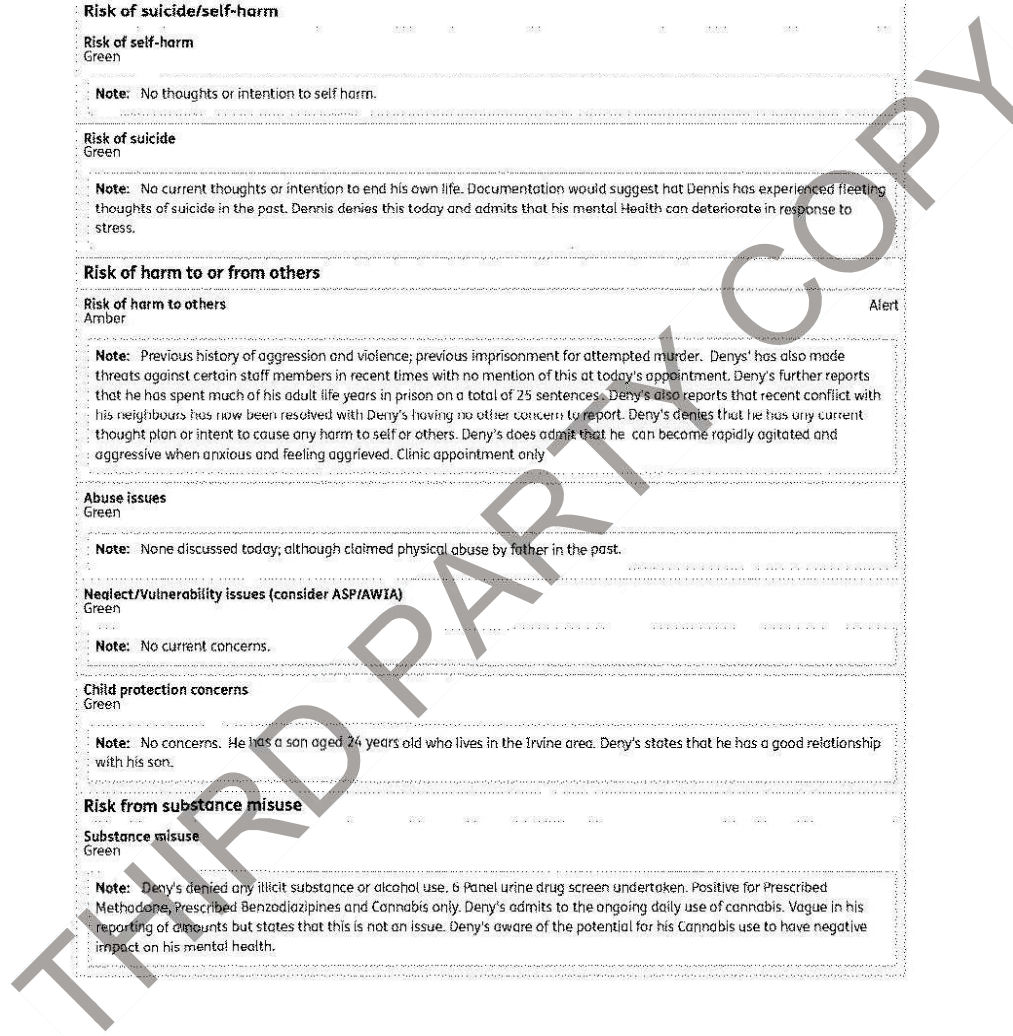

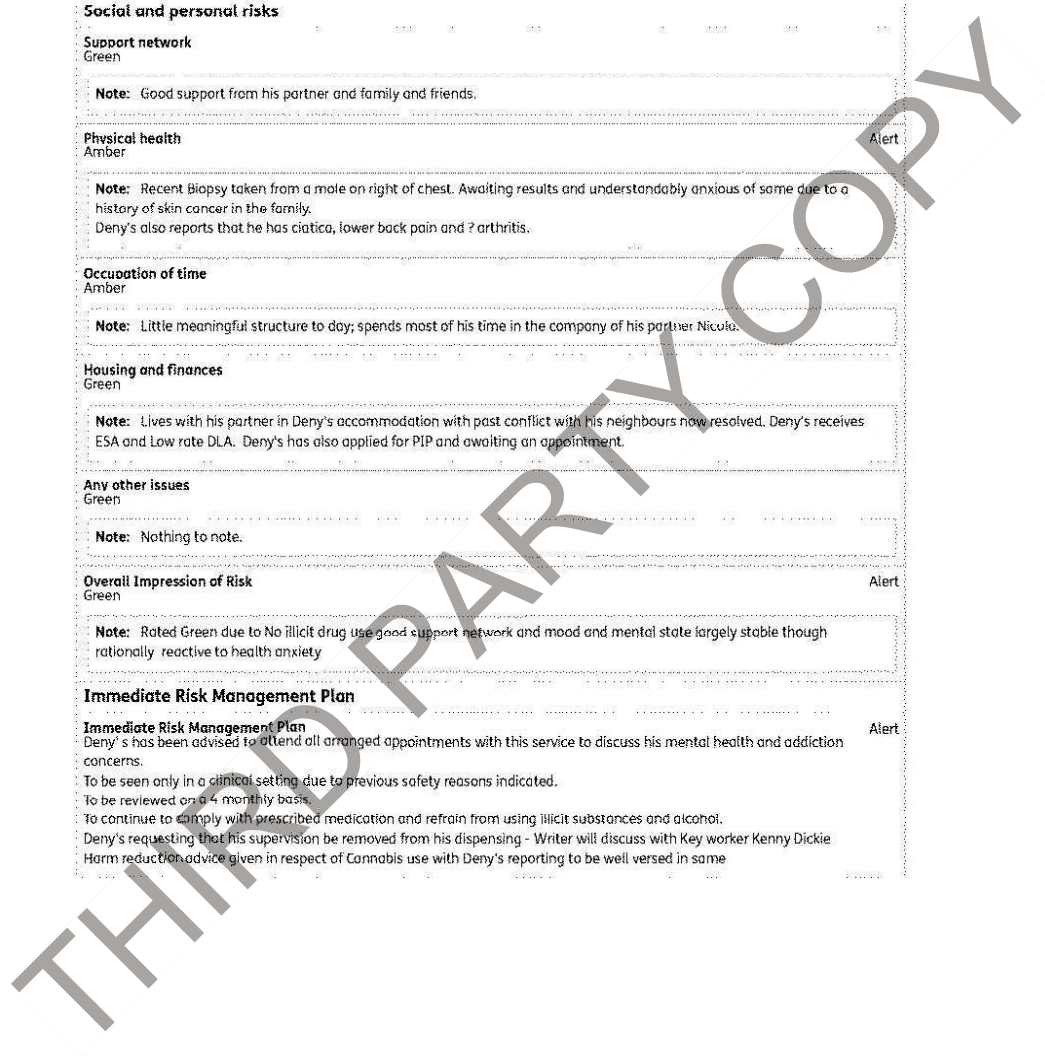

Recommendations/Plan:

I reviewed Mr. Brown in my outpatient clinic on 18th October 2016 at Woodland View. Things seemed to have remained relatively settled for Mr. Brown. He is stable on 110ml Methadone, and denies any illicit drug use, with the exception of Cannabis. He was looking to have his Quetiapine increased today, however the symptoms that he described of difficulty adjusting to life out with prison, having spent a number of years incarcerated, I did not feel would benefit from an increase in Quetiapine. I advised him to consider addressing these in a more practical way, and he agreed he would consider this. I suspect that he does not have a high level of motivation to do so. I will check with his worker, Kenny Dickie, that there are no concerns about changing his dispensing to twice weekly. I will see him again in clinic in six months' time.

2. Patient advised to start looking for community rehabilitation services and community help in connection with his high anxiety levels and his inability to communicate with other people due to his long prison sentence
3. All appointment letters to be sent to both the patient and his pharmacy
4. Patient to be reviewed in clinic in three months

Mr. Brown attended his appointment on 14th April 2015 at Caley Court Resource Centre. He informed me that currently he takes 110ml Methadone on a weekly pick up, and **his last ECG was carried out at the end of 2014 and the results were normal.** The patient told me that he has not taken any extra or non-prescribed medication on top of his current treatment. Mr. Brown informed me that currently his plan is to stay stable on his prescribed medication and that he has already been able to cut connections with his previous drug-related environment. He also informed me that currently he takes care of his partner who is epileptic. He gave me a convoluted narrative about temper management problems and paranoid thoughts. He was not able to give me any consistent explanation which could be suggestive of him suffering from paranoid delusions or any other kind of delusional manner of thinking. When I asked the

patient about his plans in connection with his medication, especially with Diazepam, the patient informed me that he does not want his Diazepam to be reduced at all. I explained to Mr. Brown that currently I am not going to reduce any of his medication, but I advised him to start thinking about a possible gradual Benzodiazepine reduction in the future, which the patient agreed to think about. In connection with his anxiety and temper management problem, I told the patient that medication is not the only way to address these issues. I explained to the patient that the best option for this is to attend community rehabilitation services, which I could offer him a one-to-one appointment for, and that this is the best place for him to solve his behavioural problems connected with his long stay in prison.

Mr. Brown will be reviewed in this clinic in three month's time.
