Denys has been attending the Townhead Centre for a long time for assessment of his heroin problem. As you probably know, he has a long-standing problem and has been in a lot of trouble over the years as a result of it. He is presently very keen to get custody of his son which appears to be his main motivation for reducing this time. He had a very large intravenous heroin use and is apparently Hep C positive. I have started him on this occasion on 40 mls of methadone which will probably have to be increased. He understands that he will have to undergo a fairly severe reduction programme but that it will be predetermined and non-negotiable, that it will be supervised throughout and that he has to attend counselling sessions weekly. I will let you know of his progress.

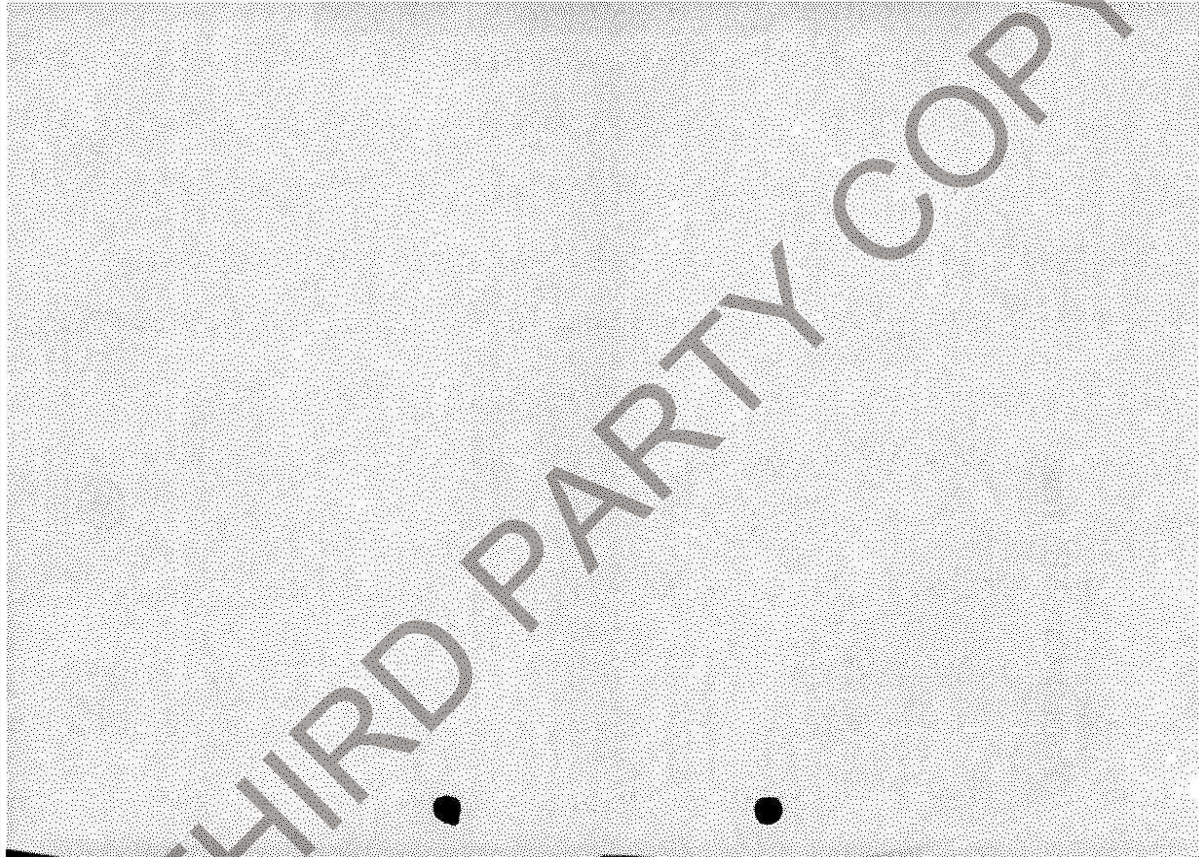

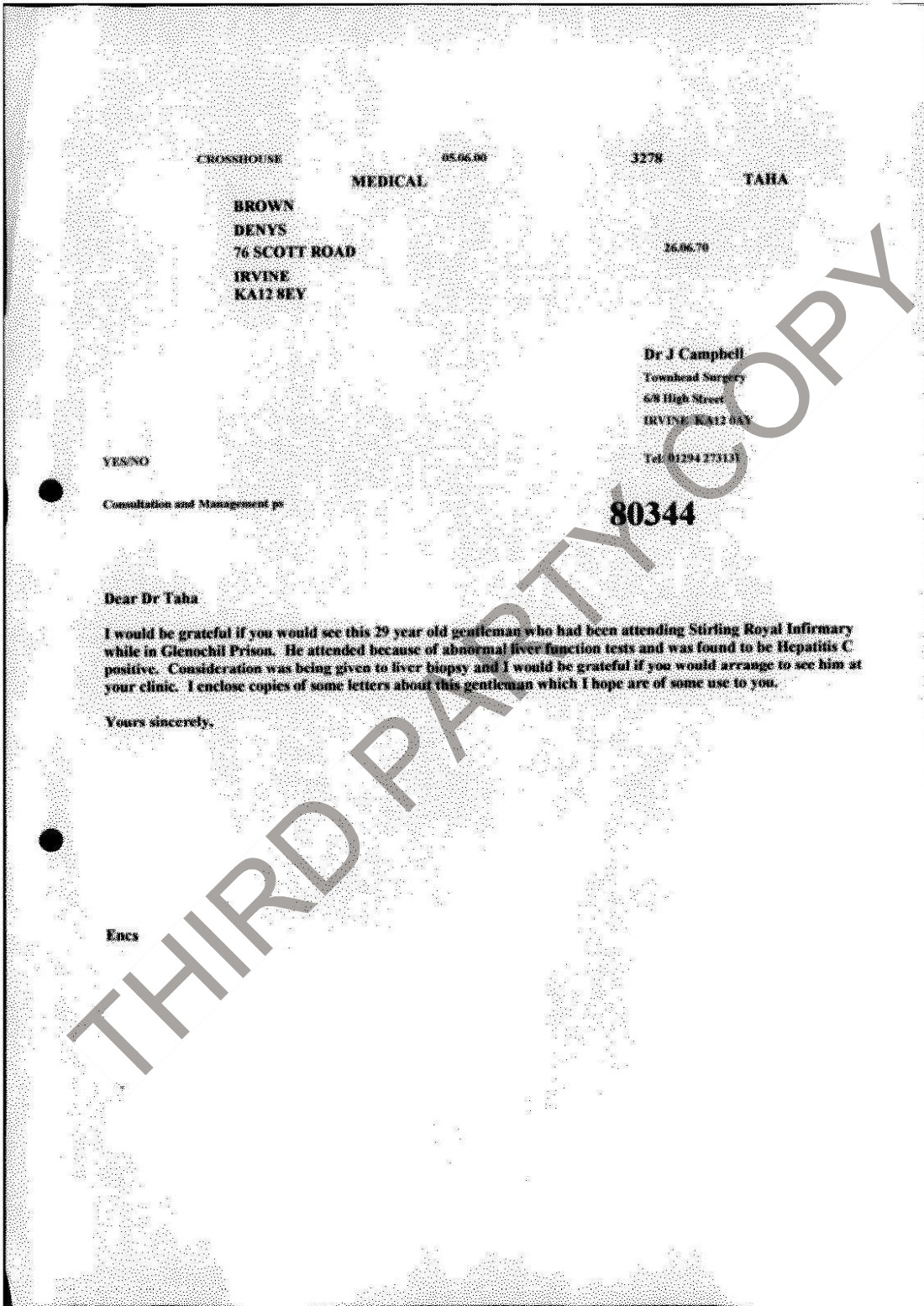

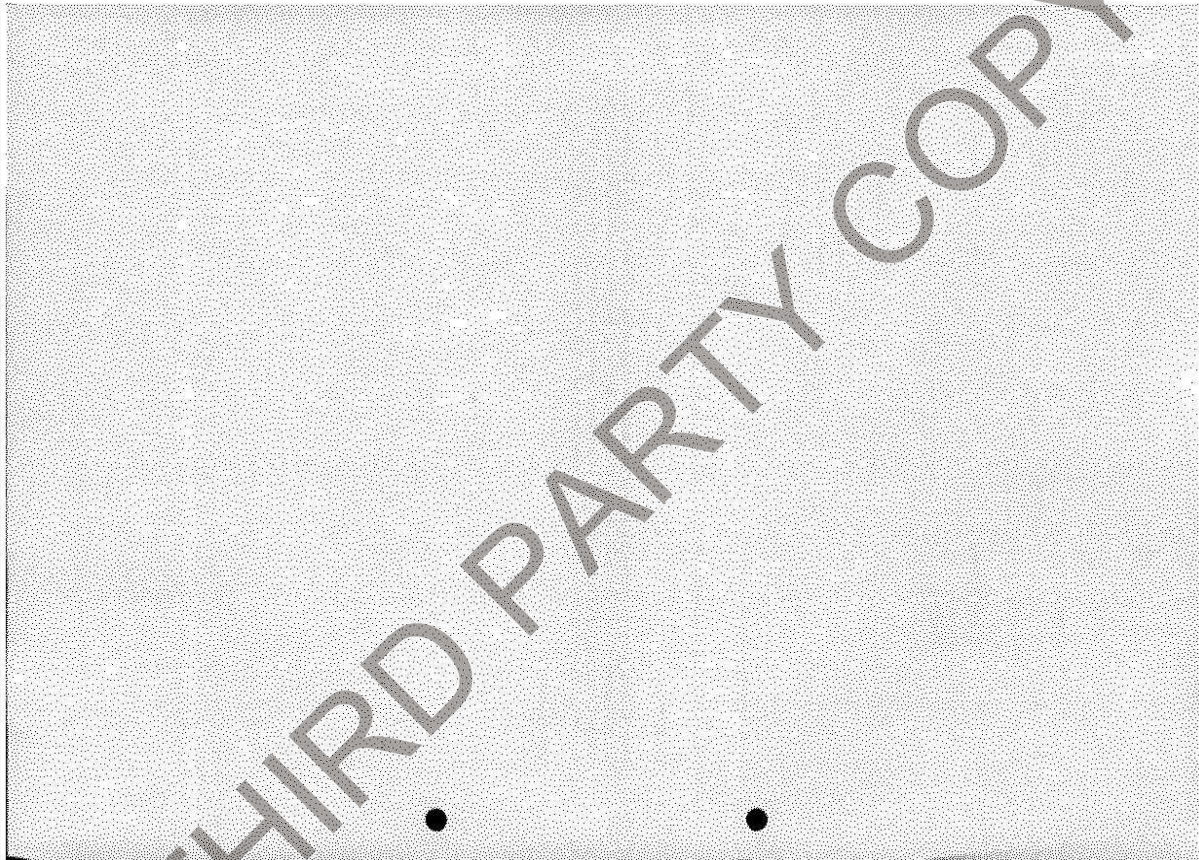

Thank you for your letter of 26th November asking about this man. He is indeed correct that we were investigating him for a sudden change in his liver function tests. I found that he was Hepatitis C PCR positive as well as having an acute Epstein-Barr viral infection and I felt his liver function tests were probably related more to the glandular fever rather than the Hepatitis C.

I did say that on release he should probably get investigated and that he may need a liver biopsy to see how much inflammation is going on in the liver and advised him to contact a GP and doctors once he got settled into a new area.

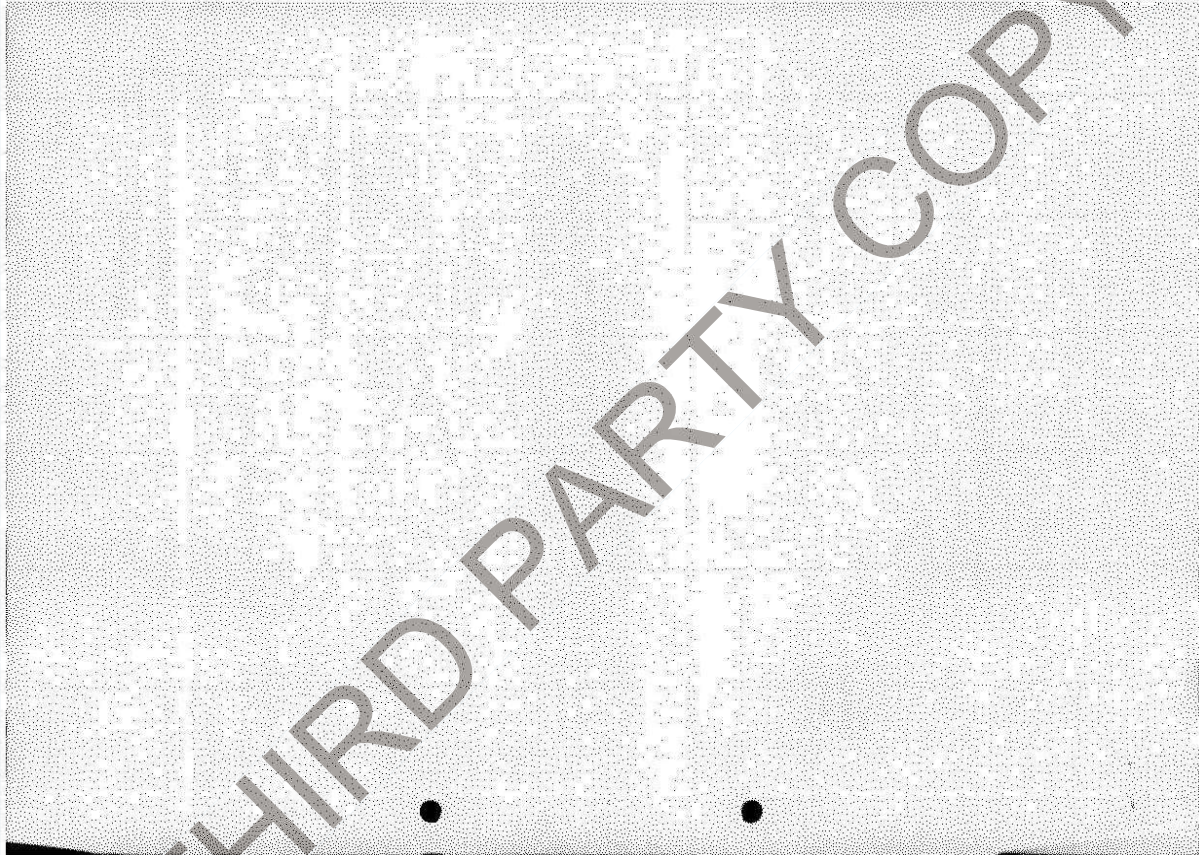

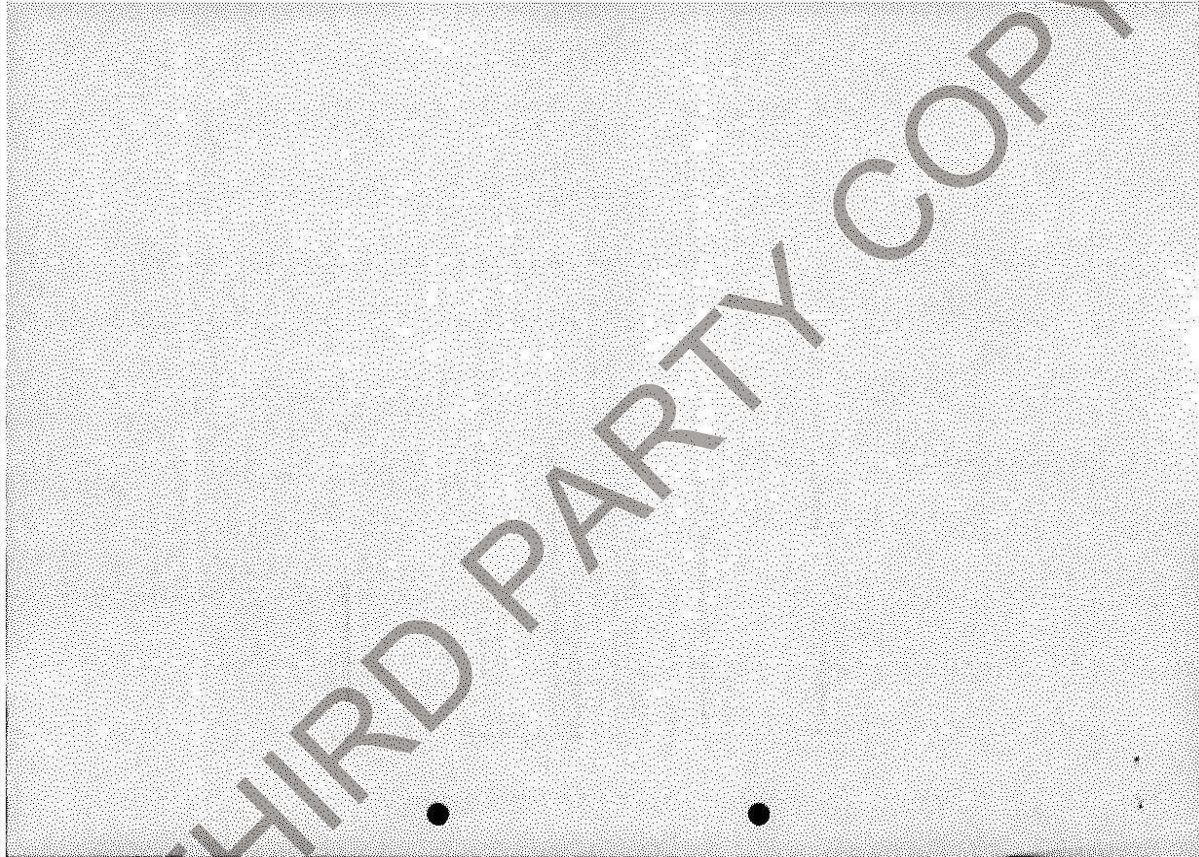

Thank you for referring this 28 year old prisoner, who has been complaining of discomfort and pain. Whilst having his thyroid function tests checked, he was found to have abnormal liver function tests with quite a marked hepato-cellular picture. He is on long term Meptinazole for back pain for the last 8 months. He has been on Inderal LA for 5 years on and off, for nerves and occasionally been on Prozac, but this was stopped 2 weeks after his blood test was noted to be abnormal, but it was only started after the blood test had been taken so this was not implicated in the liver abnormalities. He has not had any further contact with intravenous drugs since 7 years ago when apparently he had a period of injecting with a fresh needle, but he has regularly abused Temazepam, Temgesic, cannabis, LSD and smoked heroin and Temazepam on a frequent basis over the years. He has been on Methadone in 1995, 1996 and 1997, stopping in January 1998. He feels his weight has been quite normal and he has no other symptoms of note. There is a question about epilepsy and he is having an EEG performed next Monday.

On examination, there is no stigmata of chronic liver disease. He was slightly tender in the right upper quadrant radiating round to his back. I have checked his full blood count, bio-chemistry, a full liver screen including auto antibodies, Hepatitis C and viral screen and Immunoglobulins. I have also organised an abdominal ultrasound scan.

I will see him back in 8 weeks time. The diagnosis at the moment is in doubt. It is possible he may have Hepatitis C or another drug related cause for his hepatitis. He needs no specific treatment at the moment and I will report back further once I have seen his results.

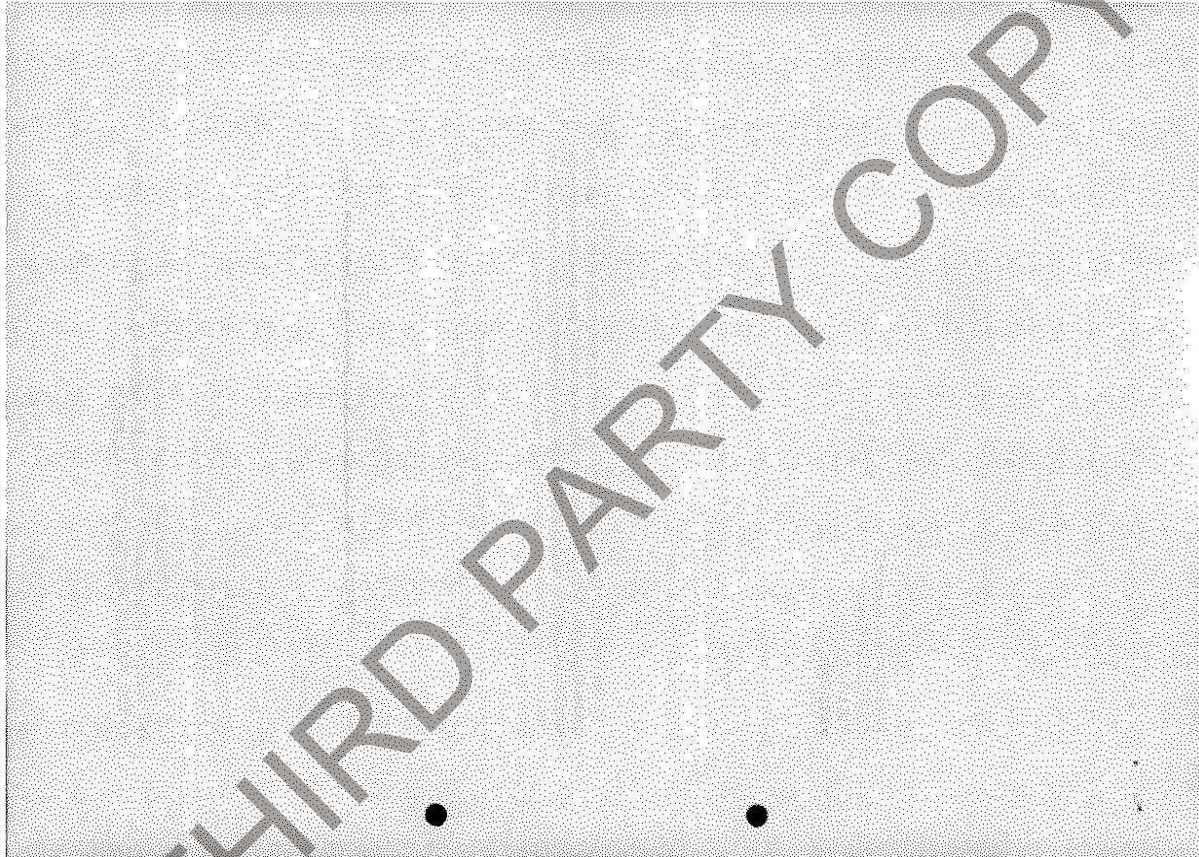

I am pleased to say that this man has been feeling reasonably all right. His liver function tests from the last clinic visit were a lot better than you had previously noted and I think the Hepatitis C has been present for a long time and the recent change in liver function has been due to the Epstein Barr virus which may take many more months to clear.

I would suggest that he should have his liver function checked over the next few months and we should then proceed onto a liver biopsy at the end of 6 months from now so that we will be seeing solely the changes due to the Hepatitis C in the liver biopsy to consider if he needs any Interferon therapy.

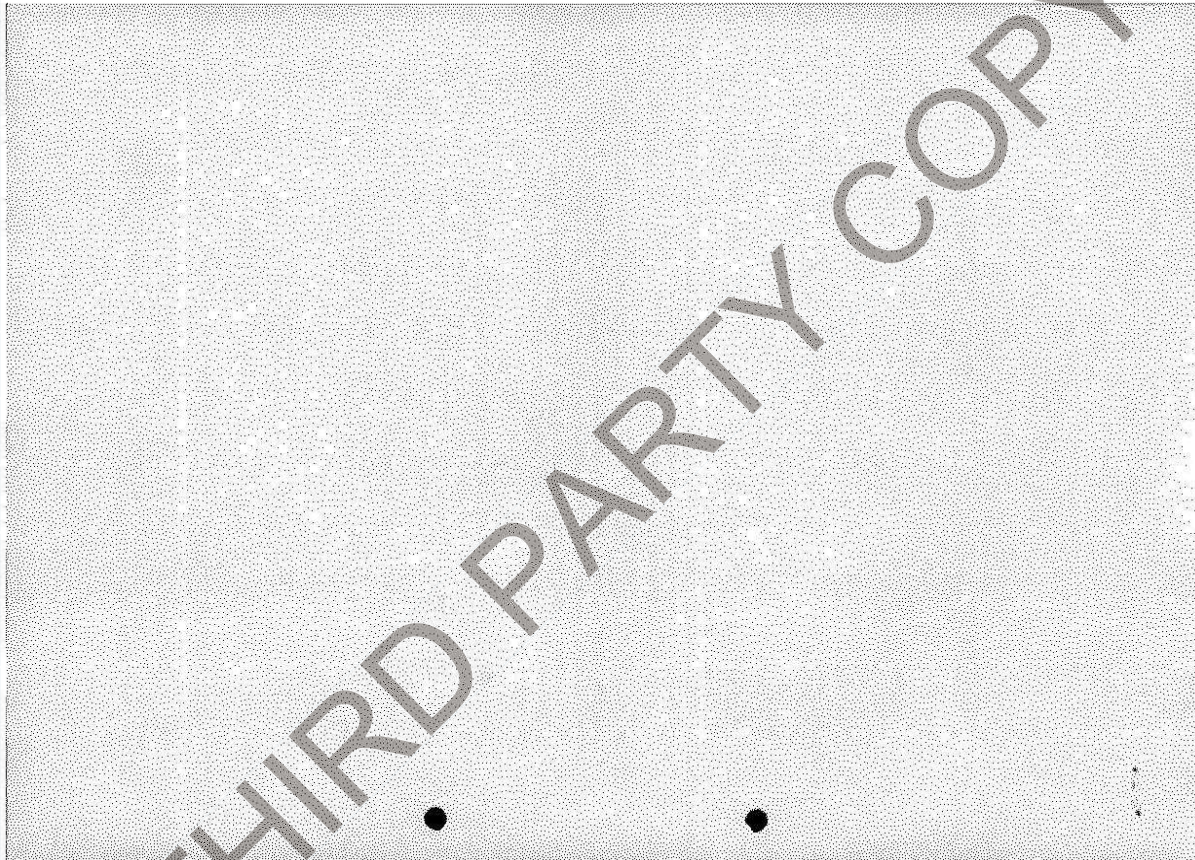
I understand he is heading down to Sheffield once he is released in 2 months time and I have told him I would be happy to release any information to the doctors in Sheffield once he has registered and is attending a Consultant Clinic.

Thank you for referring the above named gentleman to the Community Mental Health Team. Denys presented as feeling low in mood and experiencing thoughts of life not being worth living but with no real suicidal intent. He does appear to have an accumulation of stress in his life, mainly that of gaining custody of his young son. He feels anxious a lot of the time, has a poor sleep pattern and reduced appetite.

Denys also spoke of his fears of having been diagnosed with hepatitis C and is awaiting counselling for this. His family appear to be fairly supportive and Denys himself has positive goals for his future.

I discussed his case with the Team and it was agreed that I would offer Denys time limited intervention. I hope this is acceptable.
