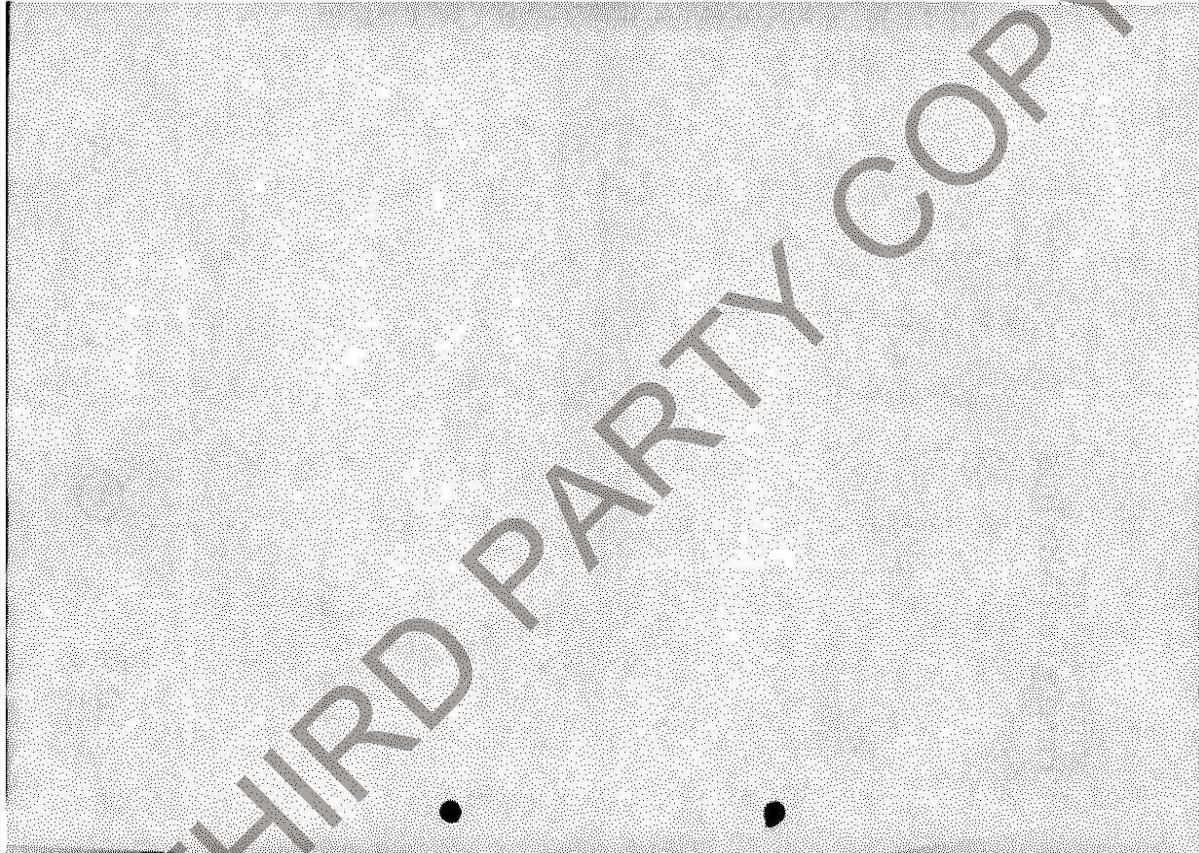

Denys presented himself to the Townhead Centre some time ago and has been getting counselling for his drug problem. He has been using Temgesic and Temazepam recently although in the past he had been using heroin.

He has a Court case pending and feels that he should get his habit under some form of control if there is a possibility he may end up in jail. He is also very worried about his health and as his wife also has a habit she has decided that she is requiring help so he has come along with her.

He has had a full assessment by his counsellor and by myself and we agreed between us that we would issue him with a prescription for methadone. He has been receiving 30 mls daily which he picks up daily from the chemist and he understands that he will only continue to receive this if he keeps his appointments. He has also agreed that he will receive no other prescriptions from yourself.

I reviewed him on 30 January 1996 and so far he has been doing quite well. He has managed to stop all Temgesic ingestion although his Temazepam consumption has gone up slightly. He has had no withdrawal symptoms and he continues to attend his counselling appointments and I will review him in due course.

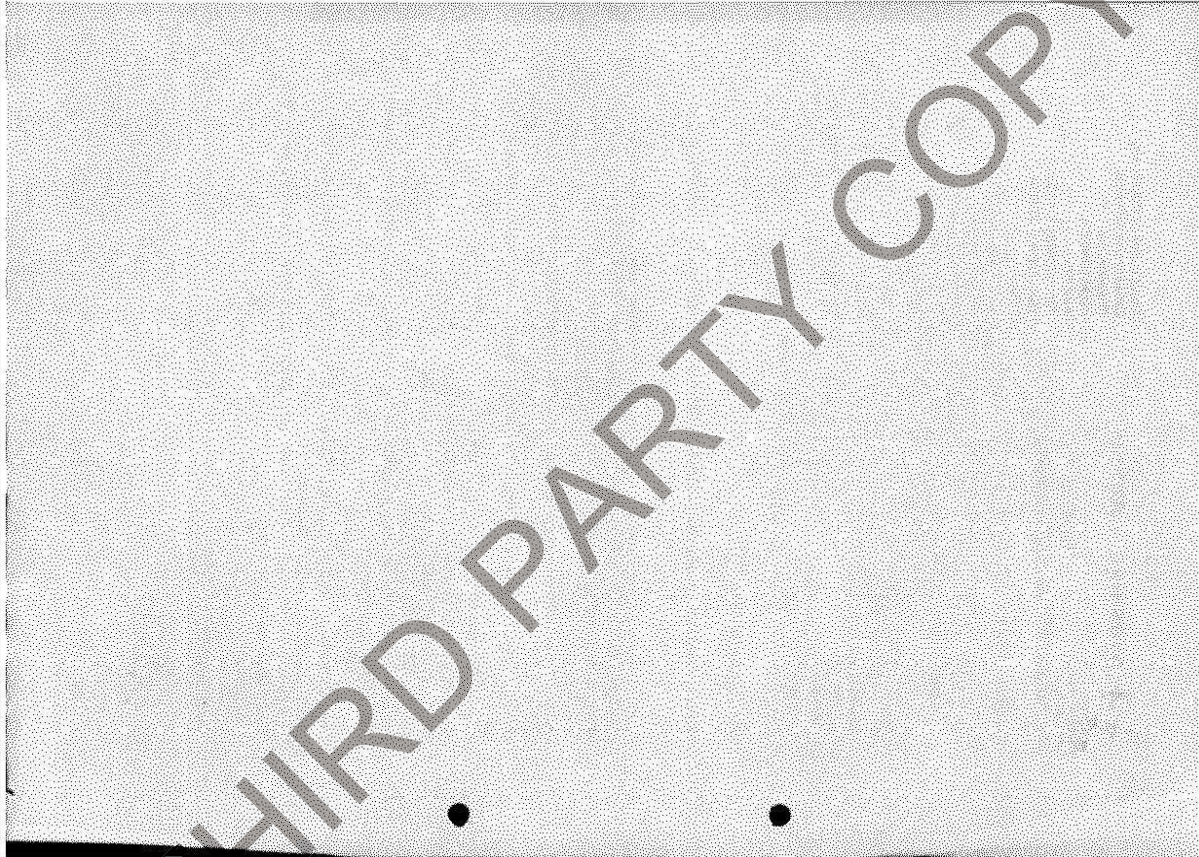
