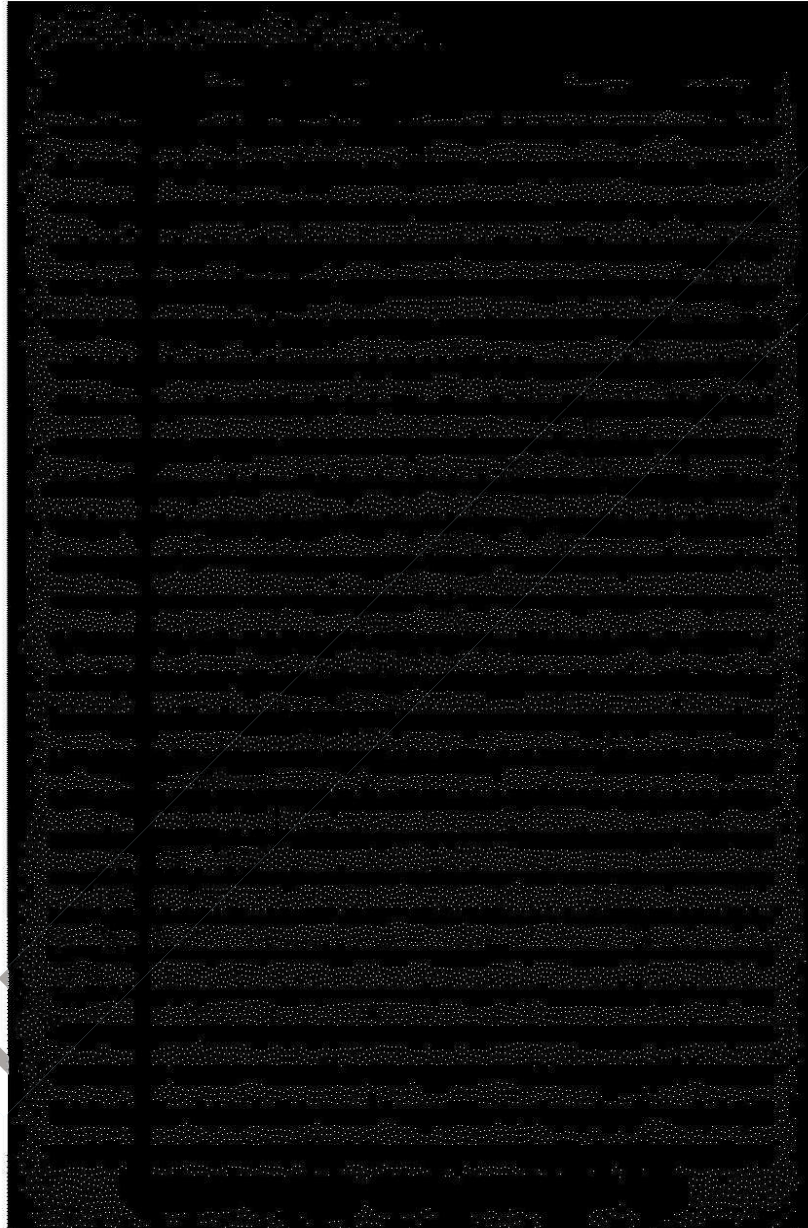

<b>Summary of assessment</b>	
<p>Writer saw Denys for review in Key Worker's absence. Denys was appropriately dressed, made good eye contact and was pleasant and appropriate throughout. Denys states that he lives alone, he has a son aged 18 who lives with Denys' dad and he has frequent contact with him and enjoys a good relationship.</p> <p>Urine screen showed positive for prescribed methadone and benzodiazepines, it also showed positive for opiates, Denys denies the use of opiates and the urine was retested, again with a positive result. Denys strongly denies the use of any illicit substances but did state he used some of this mother's pain relief a few days ago but did not know what it was.</p> <p>Denys states that he was previously tested for Hepatitis C and it showed positive but he has never received any treatment. Writer has referred him onto the Team's Blood Borne Virus Nurse, Carolann Lonie. He also stated that he suffers from sciatica and a trapped nerve for which his GP has prescribed Gabapentin, 4 x 300mg daily.</p> <p>Denys states that he suffers from panic attacks and anxiety for which he is prescribed mirtazepine 45mg daily. There was no evidence of anxiety present at time of review.</p> <p>Denys denies any pending court cases but states he has had previous prison sentences for drugs and violence, he states he was last liberated on 14.12.09.</p> <p>Denys declined offer of referral for ongoing support. States that he does self isolate but has done for a number of years due to being institutionalized stating he is happy this way and remains motivated to stay free of illicit substances.</p> <p>There were no presenting problems offered or observed at time of review. Denys questioned the possibility of coming off supervised and onto twice weekly pick up, writer will advise Key Worker.</p>

<p>Writer to liaise with prescriber regarding twice weekly collection of medication as opposed to daily supervised. Denys to be reviewed again in 3 months time.</p>

I saw Denys for review at the Townhead Centre on the 2 November 2010 following a 3 year gap when he didn't receive an appointment (I am not sure why this happened). He did see Dr Stirling in April of this year through the Criminal Justice Service. Denys is currently on 110mls of Methadone and 30mgs of Diazepam having received some rises after assessment by one of our CAT counsellors. He used to be on Zopiclone but this has been stopped and Denys isn't particularly happy with this. He is stable on his dose of Methadone but has been using extra Diazepam up to 50mgs due to the fact that he can not sleep and also due to a list of bereavements he mentioned to me including his wife dying 6 weeks ago and his brother dying in May of this year. He does however receive support from his father and I note that he continues on Mirtazapine 45mgs from yourself. He also tells me that he is being investigated at the moment for sciatica but lost his x-ray card so I suspect he will be along to discuss this with you.

We discussed at length his use of Diazepam and felt it was important for him to receive a counsellor here at the Townhead Centre before we go about perhaps increasing his Diazepam. I would prefer not to and would hope that Denys would be able to reduce down to the 30mgs but he didn't seem very happy with this prospect. He tells me he is paranoid and has poor sleep but I note that Dr Stirling felt that this was anxiety related rather than anything to do with a psychotic illness. However Denys did express a desire to see Dr Stirling again and it may be that he might have to see him on one occasion as Denys needs an NCT002 form relating to a bus pass which may have to be signed by a Psychiatrist. I will discuss this with Dr Stirling. I did put it to him that he couldn't receive the bus pass due to his problem with his back which may mean a letter from yourself.

I saw Denys for review on the 22<sup>nd</sup> May at my outpatient clinic in the Townhead Centre. The plan was to discuss a Diazepam reduction but he does not seem to have responded well to his Prozac which Dr. Doig is prescribing. In addition he is having significant difficulty with sciatica and I believe is awaiting physiotherapy referral. He is currently stable on his 90mls of Methadone and 4 x 10mgs of Diazepam and I will leave this dose meantime. I would plan to review him again in two months to again discuss a Diazepam reduction. It may be unrealistic to get him off Diazepam altogether but it would be better for him to be on less than 40mgs daily.

I mentioned in my last letter about his HEP C referral and I wonder if you could let me know whether he has been referred back for assessment of his Hepatitis C.

I saw Denys for review at my clinic in Townhead Centre on the 30<sup>th</sup> March 2007. Denys tells me he's been started by yourself on Fluoxetine and has been on these for five weeks. He is having a couple of side effects in that he's been becoming forgetful and is not aware of doing simple things like tapping his upper thigh. I believe he's due to see you again in three weeks time. He is currently on 40mgs Diazepam along with his 90mls of Methadone and is not using anything illicitly on top of these drugs. I will leave his Diazepam dose at present and see him again in two months.

I saw Denys once again for review at my clinic in Townhead Centre on the 9<sup>th</sup> February 2007.

Denys is currently on 90mgs of Methadone and 40mgs of Diazepam and this has stabilised both his Opiate and Benzodiazepine use. He has not used any Opiates for ten to eleven days and is in a similar situation with the Diazepam. We then discussed the Diazepam in more depth; Denys has been using Diazepam since the age of fourteen when he was started by his own GP according to Denys. Apparently he was in a distressing incident when his cousin died following being run down and Denys was actually involved in this accident also and didn't admit this until much later on. The accident occurred when he was seven. Apparently there was a further distressing incident when Denys and his brother were involved in an incident where a woman jumped off a flyover and they inadvertently ran her over. However, despite these incidents, I put it to him that there were other better treatments for anxiety; apparently he used to be on Fluoxetine when in prison. I've asked him to come and discuss this with you and I will hold his Diazepam at 40mgs for the next two months. I would then plan to start some reductions at that stage at least to get him below 30mgs daily.

I saw Denys for further review on 19 December 2006 at the Townhead Centre. Denys has had increases of 20mls over two weeks and this has allowed him to reduce his habit to one bag of Heroin only over and above his now 80mls daily supervised Methadone. This bag he has been smoking only. He is still being maintained on 40mg of Diazepam and he feels he needs this due to his continuing panic attacks. Happily he has stopped buying the 40mg of illicit Diazepam since he has had the increases of Methadone. He continues on Zopiclone at night.

I have decided to increase his Methadone further to stabilise him by 10mls to 90mls of Methadone. I plan to discuss the Diazepam with him but this may prove difficult in that Denys has apparently been on prescribed Diazepam since he was 14 years of age. He claims he was prescribed this because of a tremor in his hands. I would hope to try and reduce his Diazepam from 40mg at least once within the accepted therapeutic range.

I will see him again in January.

I saw Denys for the first time at the Townhead Centre on 5 December 2006. Denys has been on Methadone for a considerable length of time having been first started in 1993. He has recently been discharged from prison in August of this year having been in prison for four years. His prescription was continued in prison and he did get an increase sanctioned by Dr Stirling to 60mls of Methadone, 40mg Diazepam and Zopiclone 7.5mg two at night. He had been using a considerable amount of Heroin on top of his script and managed with this reduction to reduce this by half to 2-3 bags daily which he smokes only. He has not injected recently. He claims the reasons for using the extra Methadone is because he had custody of his son but has not been able to see him due to inadequate housing and that his father is not allowing him to see him during the week either. Due to this he is also using four extra 10mg of Diazepam.

He has used Diazepam since he was 14 for anxiety/panic attacks. He was diagnosed Hep C in 1997 apparently he acquired this through a fight with a Hep C positive sufferer and became infected through a cut. He also claims to have had depression long term also.

He currently lives in Irvine with his partner who only uses occasionally and does not have a problem with this. He is unemployed having last worked in 1991. Since that time he has been in prison frequently mainly through drug use and also violence. He is currently out on licence.

He began using gas and glue aged 13. Aged 15 he used cannabis and amphetamines and later ecstasy. He began using Heroin aged 20 and first injected the drug when he was 29. As I said before he has never shared.

Denys seems to have a long term problem with Diazepam and this may need to be increased also but I did put it to him that once we stabilise this he will be getting a Diazepam detoxification as long term Diazepam is not an option. I will see him again for review in two weeks.

He was released from prison in December 2009. He told me that he saw Gary Liddell but not since February 2010. Denys said he had a Methadone increase some weeks ago and this reduced his Heroin use. He regularly uses street Diazepam and Cannabis. He has been abstinent from alcohol since release from prison.

He is prescribed:

Methadone 120mg daily  
Mirtazapine 45mg nocte

He complains of panic attacks which he gets most days and which can be triggered by crowds and loud noises. He feels paranoid going out and this was anxiety not psychosis driven as far as I could determine. He feels constantly under threat when in public places and although there is some reality to this the response is excessive. He gives a history of physical abuse as a child, past assaults on him but also he has a history of violent behavior himself. Denys is currently homeless in temporary furnished accommodation and has a housing outreach worker involved (Joanne Price).

He is also still having problems with back pain but I gather he is on the waiting list for physiotherapy. Happily he is stable on his current 60mls of Methadone and 40mgs of Diazepam and he has only used on two or three occasions in the last two months. We therefore discussed his Diazepam and he has agreed to reduce this over the next month to 6 X 5mgs of Diazepam. Due to his long term use I will leave it at that dose and review a month later.

Due to his continuing problems with back pain he is also currently off supervision and I told him we will keep this situation for a further two months.


